BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1925.

By virtue of the Water Acts, By-law for Imposing, Levying, and Receiving Water Rates and Charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1925, namely:—

- 2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.).
- 3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound of such valuation
- 4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Seventeen shillings shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of One Shilling in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no ease shall a rate of less than Seventeen shillings be paid.
- 5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid.
- 6. Every consumer of water must provide meters; all excess water over allotment covered by the valuation rate to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 3d. per 1,000 gallons.

The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1925.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

TONGALA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1925 WITHIN THE TONGALA URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Tongala Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do bereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1925, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes, such rates and charges to be paid half-yearly in advance, in equal moleties, on the first day of Jamary and on the first day of July, 1925. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum in advance on 1st January, 1925.

1. On every house or tenement, vacant or unoccupied land according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement or vacant or unoccupied land during the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation, with a minimum of Twenty shillings.

- 2. Water supplied to Government Departments, police station, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special arrangement.
- 3. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, the charge for every one thousand (1,000) gallons, or portion of same, to be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand (1,000) gallons, with minimum of Sixpence for any one tank or load.
- 4. Supplies of water for any purposes not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.
- 5. Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an inneuthorized manner, or who does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises, the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be re-connected to the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of eight (8) o'clock p.m. and six (6) o'clock a.m. For the purposes of conserving the supply during dry weather, the Trust, in its discretion, may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.
- 6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS in pursuance of a Resolution passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 10th day of December, 1901, the Governor in Council, by Order made on the 17th day of December, 1901, appointed a Leather Goods Board: And whereas the Governor in Council, by Order made on the 1st day of October, 1924, varied the aforesaid Resolution and Order, so that the Board was given certain powers in substitution for the powers previously given to such Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Resolution passed on the 10th day of December, 1901, and the said Orders made respectively on the 17th day of December, 1901, and the 1st day of October, 1924, by directing that in substitution therefor a Wages Board shall be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of manufacturing—

(a) Articles made of leather or a substitute for leather, such as-

> Packetbook covers, Bags, Portmanteaux, Braces, Cases, Purses, Cricket balls, pads, or Trunks, other sporting goods, Wallets; Garters.

(b) Machine belting;(c) Any other kind of leather goods;

but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boot Board, the Rubber Trade Board, or the Saddlery and Harness Board; such Wages Board to consist of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers, and five as representatives of employees.

Also that such Wages Board may in any Regulation. Determination, Order, Instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Leather Goods Board, and the area or locality within which the Determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the Townsof Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

PLATE GLASS BOARD.

VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

Whereas in pursuance of the Resolution passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 11th day of October, 1900, the Plate Glass Board was, by Order in Council made on the 7th day of November, 1900, appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of glazing or bevelling plate glass, or of silvering plate or sheet glass, or of embossing plate, sheet, or stained glass, or of cutting plate or stained glass, or of cutting plate or stained glass, or of cutting plate or stained glass, or of plazing stained glass in lead: And whereas in pursuance of a Resolution passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 22nd day of November, 1910, and by the Legislative Council on the 6th day of December, 1910, the powers of the said Plate Glass Board were, by Order in Council made on the 21st day of December, 1910, extended so that it may fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed either inside or outside a factory or workroom in the process, trade, or business of—

- (b) fixing leadlights or glass signs, or putting made-up glass into the window frames, window sashes, doors, or door frames of buildings;

(c) cutting sheet glass or brilliants;
 (d) packing plate or sheet glass;

(d) packing plate or sheet glass; including any labouring work in connexion with any operation subject to the Determination of the Plate Glass Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth libreby vary the said Resolutions and Orders so that in substitution for the powers conferred thereby the said Plate Glass Board shall be given power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

- (a) designing, bevelling, cutting, embossing, glazing, painting, silvering, or otherwise working all kinds of plate, sheet. or stained glass, or glass lenses or prisms:
- prisms;
 (b) fixing in position all kinds of plate, sheet, or stained glass, or glass lenses, or prisms;
 (c) packing all kinds of plate, sheet, or stained glass, or glass lenses or prisms;

including any labouring work in connexion with any of such

BOILERMAKERS BOARD.

And whereas the Governor in Council, by Order dated the 13th day of January, 1913, extended the powers of the said Board so that it may fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the process, trade, no business of plating or riveting, or caulking or angle-iron smithing in connexion with structural iron or steel work: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth herdby vary the said Resolution and Orders so that in substitution for the powers conferred thereby the said Boilermakers Board shall be given power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

(a) Beilermaking.(b) Iron or steel working in connexion with—

Ship or bridge building.
 Girder, tank, waggon, or truck making.
 Wrought-iron or steel pipe making.
 Structural iron or steel work.

DENTAL MECHANICS BOARD.

VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order made on the 27th day of March, 1923, appointed the Dental Mechanics Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

(a) a dentist's mechanic;
(b) making any article to be fitted in a human mouth;
(c) a dentist's attendant.

And the Honorable John Lemmon, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

That outbuildings must be erected at certain distances from dwellings.

Part VI. provides—
That buildings of the warehouse and shop class shall comply with certain conditions as to fire provisions, lighting, staircase provision, thickness of walls and mode of construction.

Part VII. provides—
That buildings shall have sufficient ventilation and light.

That buildings for storage of petroleum or other products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids, must comply with certain requirements.
