REGULATIONS.—TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.—  
CHAPTER IX.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Chapter IX. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

## PART II.—ALLOWANCES TO CERTAIN OFFICERS.

## FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1925 for Free Places in a course for any degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these Free Places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the

subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his Free Place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his Free Place, and, if his Free Place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his Free Place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the Free Place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, and progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

Forms of application are obtainable at this office. Each application must be made on the prescribed form, and must be forwarded through the Permanent Head of the Department in which the applicant is employed, to the Secretary, Education Department, Melbourne, not later than 1st December, 1924.

## BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1925.

By virtue of the Water Acts, By-law for Imposing, Levying, and Receiving Water Rates and Charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1925, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.).

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Seventeen shillings shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of One Shilling in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Seventeen shillings be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid.

6. Every consumer of water must provide meters; all excess water over allotment covered by the valuation rate to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 3d. per 1,000 gallons.

The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1925.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

## TONGALA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1925 WITHIN THE TONGALA URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Tongala Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1925, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes, such rates and charges to be paid half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1925. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum in advance on 1st January, 1925.

1. On every house or tenement, vacant or unoccupied land according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement or vacant or unoccupied land during the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation, with a minimum of Twenty shillings.

2. Water supplied to Government Departments, police station, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special arrangement.

3. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, the charge for every one thousand (1,000) gallons, or portion of same, to be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand (1,000) gallons, with minimum of Sixpence for any one tank or load.

4. Supplies of water for any purposes not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.

5. Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an unauthorized manner, or who does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises, the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be re-connected to the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of eight (8) o'clock p.m. and six (6) o'clock a.m. For the purposes of conserving the supply during dry weather, the Trust, in its discretion, may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

## LEATHER GOODS BOARD.

## VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of a Resolution passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 10th day of December, 1901, the Governor in Council, by Order made on the 17th day of December, 1901, appointed a Leather Goods Board: And whereas the Governor in Council, by Order made on the 1st day of October, 1924, varied the aforesaid Resolution and Order, so that the Board was given certain powers in substitution for the powers previously given to such Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Resolution passed on the 10th day of December, 1901, and the said Orders made respectively on the 17th day of December, 1901, and the 1st day of October, 1924, by directing that in substitution therefor a Wages Board shall be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of manufacturing—

- (a) Articles made of leather or a substitute for leather, such as—

Bags,	Packetbook covers,
Braces,	Portmanteaux,
Cases,	Purses,
Crickets balls, pads, or	Trunks,
other sporting goods,	Wallets;
Garters,	

- (b) Machine belting;  
(c) Any other kind of leather goods;

but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boot Board, the Rubber Trade Board, or the Saddlery and Harness Board; such Wages Board to consist of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers, and five as representatives of employees.

Also that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, Determination, Order, Instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Leather Goods Board, and the area or locality within which the Determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the Towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

## PLATE GLASS BOARD.

## VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Resolution passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 11th day of October, 1900, the Plate Glass Board was, by Order in Council made on the 7th day of November, 1900, appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of glazing or bevelling plate glass, or of silvering plate or sheet glass, or of embossing plate, sheet, or stained glass, or of cutting plate or stained glass, or of glazing stained glass in lead: And whereas in pursuance of a Resolution passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 22nd day of November, 1910, and by the Legislative Council on the 6th day of December, 1910, the powers of the said Plate Glass Board were, by Order in Council made on the 21st day of December, 1910, extended so that it may fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed either inside or outside a factory or workroom in the process, trade, or business of—

- (c) cutting sheet glass or brilliants;  
(d) packing plate or sheet glass;

including any labouring work in connexion with any operation subject to the Determination of the Plate Glass Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Resolutions and Orders so that in substitution for the powers conferred thereby the said Plate Glass Board shall be given power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

- (a) designing, bevelling, cutting, embossing, glazing, painting, silvering, or otherwise working all kinds of plate, sheet, or stained glass, or glass lenses or prisms;  
(b) fixing in position all kinds of plate, sheet, or stained glass, or glass lenses, or prisms;  
(c) packing all kinds of plate, sheet, or stained glass, or glass lenses or prisms;

including any labouring work in connexion with any of such operations.

## BOILERMAKERS BOARD.

## VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

- (a) Boilermaking.  
(b) Iron or steel working in connexion with—  
  - (1) Ship or bridge building.
  - (2) Girder, tank, waggon, or truck making.
  - (3) Wrought-iron or steel pipe making.
  - (4) Structural iron or steel work.

## DENTAL MECHANICS BOARD.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood or charcoal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. Charcoal must be of the very best description for the purpose for which it is required, and subject to approval of the officer ordering.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood or charcoal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood or charcoal at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width of the length of the firewood specified in the various schedules, with space between stacks for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. Firewood for the Yarra Bend need not be stacked, but must be weighed on the Asylum weighbridge.

6. The acceptance of the firewood or charcoal shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood or charcoal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood or charcoal may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the article so rejected or returned.

7. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood or charcoal as to the quality, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

9. If the board shall decide that the firewood or charcoal is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 3.

10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood or charcoal as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected



article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood or charcoal, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of firewood or charcoal by the Commonwealth Government.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the Contractor; and the hours of employment of any person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall be in accordance with those provided by the Fuel and Fodder Board or the Country Fuel and Fodder Board, as the case may be, appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts, and every such person shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be therein determined; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the Contractor. ## (Building Regulations.)

IT is hereby notified, that the Shire of Mornington, at a meeting held on the 12th day of April, 1923, passed a resolution adopting a By-law, No. 31, for regulating and restraining the erection of buildings within certain parts of the Municipality of Mornington, and that such resolution was confirmed at a meeting of the said Council held on the 11th day of September, 1924, and was approved by the Governor in Council on the 22nd day of October, 1924. And it is hereby notified further that a copy of the By-law is deposited at the office of the said Council, and is there open for inspection free of charge.

This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the following portion of the Shire of Mornington:—

- (a) That portion situated between the Government road known as Beleura-road on the east and the Government road known as Strahan's-road on the south-west, and from the Point Nepean-road to the sea, and including the whole of the township of Mornington, and
- (b) All allotments abutting on the road known as Beleura-esplanade, and
- (c) All allotments abutting on the eastern boundary of the Government road known as Beleura-road, and
- (d) All allotments for a depth of 250 feet abutting on the Point Nepean-road, from the junction of the Government road known as Strahan's-road to the intersection of the Government road known as Boundary-road, at Nyora Corner.
- (e) All allotments abutting on the esplanade from intersection of Strahan's-road to intersection of Estate-road.
- (f) All allotments abutting on the Marine-drive.
- (g) The village of Osborne.

## Part I.—Interpretation of Terms.

## Part II. provides—

- That the plans of every new building must be first submitted to the Council for approval and how such plans are to be submitted and the requirements respecting the same and what fees are payable.
- That notice of intention must be given before any building is demolished and how demolished.
- That no tent or tents must be erected or commenced to be erected without first delivering notice to the Surveyor and conditions applicable thereto.

## Part III. provides—

Materials to be used and payments for tests.

## Part IV. provides—

- Test loads for foundations and footings and that all excavations must be taken down to solid foundations, also provides for damp-courses and proper drainage.
- Thickness of external and party walls for all brick, stone or concrete buildings according to heights and other conditions.

## Part V. provides—

- That the site upon which a building is to be erected must be in a healthy condition graded and properly drained.
- That all buildings with certain exceptions must be erected a defined distance from the building line and other boundaries of the allotment intended to be built upon.
- That roofs in certain areas must be tiles slates or other approved materials.
- For minimum area to be covered by buildings.
- That the allotment upon which a dwelling is to be erected shall have a superficial area of at least 7,500 feet and frontage of not less than 50 feet to a street or road.
- That the By-law shall apply to alterations and additions to existing buildings.
- That outbuildings must be erected at certain distances from dwellings.

## Part VI. provides—

- That buildings of the warehouse and shop class shall comply with certain conditions as to fire provisions, lighting, staircase provision, thickness of walls and mode of construction.

## Part VII. provides—

- That buildings shall have sufficient ventilation and lighting.
- That buildings for storage of petroleum or other products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids, must comply with certain requirements.

## Part VIII. provides—

- That plans must be submitted for temporary buildings.
- That signboards can only be erected on buildings under certain conditions.

## Part IX. provides—

- That consent of the Council must be first obtained to erect any verandah or portico, then fixing the conditions when consent is given.

## Part X. provides—

- That wooden dwelling houses in specified areas are to be a certain height and to cover certain areas.
- That removed buildings after being approved must be re-erected to comply with the By-laws.

## Part XI. provides—

- That insanitary ruinous or dangerous buildings must be removed or made secure to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

## Part XII. provides—

- For enforcement of By-laws and penalties.

- C. Defines tiled roof and slate areas.

## CITY OF BRUNSWICK.

## BY-LAW No. 64.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick, numbered 64, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, as amended by section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921* and section 228 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, to alter By-law No. 63 of the said city.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick do hereby order as follows:—

1. Sub-clause (h) of clause 1 is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following sub-clause be substituted:—

(h) All that piece of land commencing at a point on the west side of Pearson-street 100 feet south of Victoria-street; thence northerly along Pearson-street to a point 100 feet north of Pearson-street; thence westerly and parallel with Victoria-street to a point 100 yards east of Melville-road; thence southerly and parallel with Melville-road to a point 100 feet south of Victoria-street; thence easterly to the starting point.

2. After sub-clause (j) of clause 1 there shall be added the following sub-clauses:—

(k) All that piece of land commencing at a point at the south-west corner of Albion and Hanover streets; thence westerly along Albion-street to a point 100 feet west of Pearson-street; thence southerly to a point on the north side of Newman-street 100 feet west of Pearson-street; thence easterly along Newman-street to a point 100 feet east of Pearson-street; thence northerly and parallel with Pearson-street to a point 100 feet south of Albion-street; thence easterly and parallel with Albion-street to Hanover-street; thence northerly along Hanover-street to the starting point.

(l) All that piece of land commencing at a point on the north-west corner of Patterson-street and Albion-street; thence westerly along Albion-street to Shamrock-street; thence northerly 100 feet; thence easterly and parallel with Albion-street to Patterson-street; thence along Patterson-street to the starting point.

(m) All that piece of land commencing at a point on the north side of Hope-street 100 yards west of Melville-road; thence westerly along Hope-street to Duggan-street; thence northerly 100 feet; thence easterly and parallel with Hope-street to a point 100 yards west of Melville-road; thence southerly to the starting point.

(n) All that piece of land commencing at a point on the south side of Hope-street 100 yards west of Melville-road; thence westerly along Hope-street to Henderson-street; thence southerly 100 feet; thence easterly and parallel with Hope-street to a point 100 yards west of Melville-road; thence northerly to the starting point.
