THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to amend the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Acts."

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1925.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Water-
 works Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been
 proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water
 Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities
 conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers
 of lands and tenements within the Urban District of Alexandra
 Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said
 Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value
 of Fifteen pounds or over, according to the municipal valua-
 tion, an amount of Two shillings in the pound of such valua-

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant unoccupied allotments of land shall also be Ninepence (9d.) in the pound of such municipal value, provided that no rate be less than Fifteen shillings.
4. The minimum rate to be charged to livery stables shall be as follows:—

Where there are not more than six horses, the sum of Two pounds.

Where there are more than six horses, the sum of Four pounds.

5. Where water is laid on to a vacant block of land, the minimum charge, if trough with ball tap is provided, shall be Two pounds; without ball tap, Four pounds.
6. The minimum charge for septic tanks shall be as follows:—

For private houses, the sum of One pound five shillings.

For boarding houses, the sum of Two pounds.

7. Water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by special agreement at such price as may be fixed by the Trust.

The foregoing rates and charges are hereby made, payable yearly in advance, on the first day of January, 1925, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and receive such rates and charges.

THE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW No. 20.

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year ending the 31st December, 1925. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable in advance on the first day of January, 1925, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by two instalments payable on the 1st January and the 1st July of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate. The rates and charges are as follow, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of £22 or under, situated on any street or road in which water supply pipes are laid, or, if not so situated, supplied with water from such pipes by reticulation: Fifteen shillings.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of £22, situated on any street or road in which water supply pipes are laid, or, if not so situated, supplied with water from such pipes by reticulation, a rate of Eightpence in the pound on the valuation: Provided that any land in excess of one rood, rated in one assessment with a house or tenement under this or the preceding clause, shall be subject, in addition, to the minimum rate imposed by clause (c) hereunder.
- (c) On every vacant piece of land (being any area in one contiguous holding) situated on any street or road in which water supply pipes are laid, a rate of Eightpence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation, with a minimum charge of Six shillings.

- (d) On every piece of land supplied with water, whether rated with a house or not, on which there is a trough or other facility for watering stock, a rate of Eightpence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings.

- (e) On all land and tenements situated elsewhere than in a street in which water supply pipes are laid down, but being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, a charge of one-half of the rates above specified; and on all such land and tenements situated over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from any such stand-pipe, a charge of one-quarter of the rates above specified.

- (f) For water supplied by measure, One shilling per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of the quantity allowed on the ordinary rate; such allowance to be 1,000 gallons for every Shilling of the rate amount.

2. The Trust may require a meter to be affixed to the service pipe of any consumer; and upon a consumer being requested in writing from the Trust so to do, he or she shall forthwith arrange for a meter to be installed at his or her own cost. Should the consumer fail to comply with the request within one month after receiving notice the Trust may cut off the water.

3. For special services the Trust may supply water, by agreement, at special rates.

4. The Secretary of the Trust for the time being is hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover, on behalf of the Trust, the rates and charges imposed by this By-law.

 5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land. Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings per annum.
 6. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.
 7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every thousand gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements).
 8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable for watering during the year.
 9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly in advance on the first day of January, 1925.
 10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. A rate of Ten shillings (10s.) on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre and not exceeding half an acre on all unoccupied land within the Trust District not previously rated under this By-law, and being situated more than 5 chains, but not exceeding 10 chains, from a Trust main.

5. A rate of Six shillings (6s.) on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre and not exceeding half an acre on all unoccupied land within the Trust District, not previously rated under this By-law, and being situated more than 10 chains from a Trust main.

The foregoing rate is hereby made for the year 1925, commencing on the first day of January and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1925.

6. Such rate is hereby made payable in two half-yearly instalments, one half on the first day of January and the other half on the first day of July, 1925.

- (a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £24 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no buildings), the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) sterling.
- (b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £24 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of Six pounds five shillings (£6 5s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Three pounds two shillings and sixpence (£3 2s. 6d.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Thirty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Ten shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
- (f) For water supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic purposes, not including garden use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) Water supplied by meter and consumed for domestic and garden purposes shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate due for the year in respect of the premises supplied, and for all water used in excess the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (h) For water supplied by meter solely for purposes other than domestic, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons per half-year. The Trust may, in cases where deemed necessary, supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (j) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1925, and the first day of July, 1925, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE MIDWIVES' ACTS.

REGULATIONS

RELATING TO THE

TRAINING AND REGISTRATION OF MIDWIVES.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifteenth day of
December, 1924.*

UNDER the powers conferred by the Midwives Acts and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Midwives Board, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Midwives Regulations 1924," and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. All Regulations previously in force relating to matters herein provided for are hereby repealed.

Proceedings of the Board.

3. The meetings of the Board shall be held and the business for transaction thereat shall be conducted in accordance with the procedure prescribed in the First Schedule hereto.

Registration.

4. No woman shall be registered as a midwife unless she is entitled to registration under the Acts, or under Section 3 of the *Nurses Registration Act 1923*, and unless she—

(a) lodges with the Registrar an application in Form A in the Second Schedule hereto accompanied by two certificates of good character in Form B in the Second Schedule hereto; and

(b) has paid the prescribed registration fee of Five shillings.

5. Every midwife whose application for registration is granted shall receive a Certificate of Registration in Form C or in Form CA, as the case may be, in the Second Schedule hereto, and her name shall be entered in the register.

Training.

6. The course of training shall be as prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto.

7. Every public or private hospital approved by the Board for the purposes of these Regulations, and at which courses of training as prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto are provided, may be recognized as a training hospital, provided that no private hospital shall be so recognized unless the proprietor, occupier, or conductor is also approved by the Board.

Examination.

8. Every application for permission to sit for examination shall be in Form D in the Second Schedule hereto.

9. Every applicant for permission to sit for examination shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that she—

(a) has completed the several prescribed courses of training; such evidence shall be in Forms E, F, G, H, and I, or in Form IA, as the case may be, in the Second Schedule hereto.

- (b) has been educated up to the standard certificate of merit at a Primary School within the Commonwealth of Australia, or its equivalent, or otherwise satisfies the Board of her educational attainments.

10. The scope of the examination shall include the subjects prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto, and such written oral and practical tests as will enable the examiners to determine whether the examinee is competent to carry out the duties of a midwife.

Regulating the Practice of Midwives.

11. No midwife in charge of a case of labour shall leave the patient without giving an address by which she can be found without delay; and, after the commencement of the second stage shall stay with the patient until at least one hour after the expulsion of the placenta, and as long after that as may be necessary. In cases where a doctor has been sent for on account of the labour being abnormal, or of there being threatened danger, she shall await his arrival, and faithfully carry out his instructions.

12. No midwife shall use forceps nor administer to a patient any anæsthetic, nor any drug other than a simple aperient, or after the completion of the third stage of labour, ergot, except under the supervision or on the written authority of a qualified medical practitioner.

13. No midwife who has contracted any infectious disease shall attend any midwifery case until she has ceased to be liable to convey infection, as certified by a medical practitioner, and received the permission of the Board to resume practice.

14. No midwife who has been attending a septic case or a case of infectious disease, or has been in contact with any one so suffering, or who has an inflamed or septic wound on any part of her body shall attend any fresh midwifery case until she has disinfected herself, her clothing, her instruments, and her appliances in the manner prescribed in Clause 30 herein, and received the permission of the Board to resume practice.

15. The midwife shall wash the patient's external genital parts with soap and water, and then swab with an efficient antiseptic solution on the following occasions:—

- (a) Before making the first internal examination.
- (b) After the termination of labour.
- (c) During the lying-in period daily.
- (d) Before passing a catheter.
- (e) After passing a catheter.

For this purpose the midwife shall on no account use ordinary sponges or flannels, but material which has been boiled or otherwise disinfected before use.

16. Every midwife before touching the generative organs or their neighbourhood shall on each occasion disinfect her hands and forearms. No more internal examinations shall be made than are absolutely necessary.

17. The midwife shall in all cases of labour examine the placenta and membranes before they are destroyed, and shall satisfy herself that they are completely removed.

18. The midwife shall remove all soiled linen, blood, fæces, urine, and the placenta from the lying-in room as soon as possible after the labour, and in every case before leaving the patient's house.

19. The midwife shall be responsible for the cleanliness, the daily washing of the mother and the infant, the dressing of the umbilicus, and other necessary attentions, and shall give all necessary directions for securing the comfort and, where a medical practitioner is not in attendance, proper dieting of the mother and child during the lying-in period, which shall be held in a normal case, to mean the time occupied by the labour and a period of ten days thereafter.

20. Should the midwife for any reason continue her attendance after the tenth day, the fact shall be noted in her record, with the explanation of the reason.

21. The midwife shall take and record the pulse and temperature of the patient twice daily, and oftener if necessary, and enter same on chart.

22. In the case of a child being born apparently dead, the midwife shall carry out the methods of resuscitation which have been taught her.

23. As soon as the child's head is born, and, if possible, before the eyes are opened, the eyelids shall be carefully cleaned by the midwife in the manner prescribed in the Sixth Schedule hereto.

24. On the birth of a child which is in danger of death, the midwife shall inform one of the parents or nearest available relative of the child's condition.

25. Every midwife shall allow any person authorized by the Board for the purpose to inspect her instruments and appliances.

26. Every midwife shall keep a record of cases in Form O in the Second Schedule hereto, and such record shall be submitted for inspection to any person authorized by the Board to inspect same.

27. The midwife shall be scrupulously clean in every way, including her person, clothing, appliances, and house. She shall keep her nails cut short, and preserve the skin of her hands, as far as possible, from cracks and abrasions; and when attending to her patients she shall wear a clean dress of washable material that can be boiled, such as linen, cotton, &c., and over it a clean washable apron or overall. The sleeves of the dress shall be made so that the midwife can tuck them up well above the elbows.

28. No midwife shall lay out the body of any person on whom she has not been in attendance at the time of death, or a body upon which a post-mortem examination has been made, unless she forthwith report such case to the Board in Form Q in the Second Schedule hereto, accompanied by a medical certificate that she has undergone adequate cleansing and disinfection.

Instruments and Appliances.

29. Every midwife shall have in her possession, and when called to a confinement shall take with her in a bag or basket, or other suitable receptacle, furnished with a removable lining, which can be disinfected—

- (a) A suitable appliance for washing out the vagina.
- (b) A suitable appliance (other than (a)) for clearing out the bowel.
- (c) A catheter for drawing off the water from the bladder.
- (d) A pair of scissors.
- (e) A clinical thermometer.
- (f) A bath thermometer.
- (g) A nail brush.
- (h) Sterilized tape for tying cord.
- (i) Dressing for cord.
- (j) Antiseptic soap.
- (k) Efficient disinfectants for disinfecting hands, for douching, and for cleansing infant's eyelids.
- (l) Rubber gloves.
- (m) Drop bottle for disinfection of eyes.

30. Every midwife who has been exposed to infection in the manner described in clause 14 hereof shall—

- (a) remove all her clothing and take a bath in a hot disinfecting solution;
- (b) treat the hair with an efficient disinfecting lotion;
- (c) immerse all washable clothing in an efficient disinfecting solution for half-an-hour prior to washing;
- (d) suspend all clothing that cannot be washed in a closed chamber, and subject same to the fumes of formaldehyde for six hours;
- (e) boil for half-an-hour all instruments and appliances that are not injured by heat;
- (f) immerse all instruments and appliances injured by heat in an efficient disinfecting solution for half-an-hour.

Disinfecting processes shall be carried out as prescribed in the Sixth Schedule hereto.

Reports and Notifications.

31. Every midwife shall send to the Board notice in Form J in the Second Schedule hereto of her intention to practise as a midwife.

32. Every midwife shall in the month of December of each year notify the Board in Form K in the Second Schedule hereto of her intention to continue in practice, and shall at the same time pay a fee of One shilling for renewal of registration.

33. Every midwife shall without delay notify the Board in Form L in the Second Schedule hereto of any change of her address.

34. Every midwife shall notify the Board in Form M in the Second Schedule hereto of every case of death which occurs in her practice.

35. Every midwife shall notify the Board in Form N in the Second Schedule hereto of every case of stillbirth which occurs in her practice.

36. Every midwife shall immediately report to the Board if she contract any infectious disease, or has been in attendance on any case of infectious or septic disease.

General.

37. In the case of an emergency as defined in the Fourth Schedule hereto, the midwife shall (where no medical practitioner engaged by or on behalf of the patient is in attendance) call in to her assistance a medical practitioner.

38. The midwife shall report forthwith to the Board each case of emergency which occurs in her practice, and such report shall be in Form P in the Second Schedule hereto.

39. Any midwife who disobeys these Regulations, or who is guilty of misconduct or malpractice may be suspended from practice for such period as the Board orders, or her name may be removed from the register by the order of the Board; but before the enforcement of any suspension or removal such midwife shall have an opportunity of giving an explanation either personally or in writing.

Fees Relating to Examination and Registration.

40. The fee to be paid by each candidate for examination shall be One guinea for the first examination and Five shillings for every subsequent examination.

The fee to be paid by each applicant for registration shall be Five shillings.

The fee to be paid for annual renewal of registration shall be One shilling.

The fee to be paid for every certificate shall be Two shillings and sixpence.

Remuneration of Examiners.

41. The remuneration which shall be paid to the examining body conducting the examinations shall be Ten shillings for each new candidate presenting herself for the first time.

Remuneration of Medical Practitioners in Cases of Emergency.

42. The remuneration payable by the Board to medical practitioners for attending cases of emergency shall be in accordance with the scale prescribed in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

Forms, Notices, Applications, Certificates, &c.

43. The forms of applications, notices, certificates, prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto varied as the circumstances may require shall be sufficient for the purposes to which they relate.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Procedure, &c.

1. *Meetings.*—The Board shall from time to time appoint the day and the hour when it will meet for the transaction of business, and the chairman may at any time convene a meeting of the Board.

2. *Notice.*—Not less than three days' notice of any meeting shall be given to any member of the Board directed to such address as he may from time to time furnish to the Registrar.

3. *Voting.*—Every question before the Board shall be decided by a majority of the members present and voting, and the chairman, in the event of an equality of votes, shall have a casting vote.

4. *Order of Business.*—The order of business shall be as follows:—

- (a) Minutes of last meeting.
- (b) Correspondence.
- (c) Consideration of applications for Certificates of Registration.
- (d) Consideration of reports and recommendations of Board of Examiners for Certificates of Registration.
- (e) Miscellaneous business.

Provided that the Board may at any meeting vary the order of business on the ground of urgency or convenience.

5. *Conduct of Business.*—Business shall be transacted in the manner provided for councils in Part XI. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act* 1915.

6. *Cheques.*—Cheques shall be signed by the Registrar and one member of the Board, or by any two members of the Board.

7. *Bank.*—Account shall be kept at the Head Office of the State Savings Bank, and money may be invested in Government securities.

*Practical Instruction.***2. Practical instruction shall include practical training—**

- (a) in the duties of a midwife;
- (b) in the preparation of infants' food;
- (c) in invalid cookery; and
- (d) in general nursing so far as it applies to lying-in women and infants.

Practical Experience.

3. Every candidate for examination shall have—

- *(a) personally conducted at least twenty cases of labour; and
 - (b) nursed at least twenty patients during the ten days following labour.
- “Personally conducted” shall include personal attendance under competent supervision.

In the case of a pupil nurse the training shall be not less than twelve months.

In the case of a nurse registered under the Nurses Registration Act, Victoria, or registered or eligible to be registered by the Royal Victorian Trained Nurses' Association as a trained nurse, the period of midwifery training shall not be less than six months provided that such nurse shall be exempt from such of the prescribed courses as shall have been included in her training as a general nurse.

Provided that if such nurse has served whether inside or outside Victoria during the war, which commenced in 1914, as a nurse with His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces, or with the Naval or Military Forces of the Commonwealth, the period of midwifery training shall be such as may be approved by the Board.

Every pupil nurse shall, prior to the commencement of her training, produce a certificate of education of the standard prescribed in clause 9 (b) herein.

Every pupil nurse shall serve a probationary period of one month, and shall on the completion thereof obtain a medical certificate as to her fitness, and a certificate from the matron as to her general fitness to undergo the prescribed course of training. Such month's probation shall be included in the twelve months' training.

Certificates, in Forms E, F, G, H, I, in the Second Schedule shall be issued to every pupil nurse who satisfactorily completes the prescribed courses of training, or any part of them. No certificate will be considered satisfactory which does not show an attendance of at least three-fourths of the total number of lectures delivered in each course.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

Emergencies.

I. *Pregnancy*.—In the case of a pregnant woman—

- (a) when abortion or miscarriage threatens or occurs;
- (b) if the patient is a dwarf or deformed;
- (c) when there is excessive loss of blood;
- (d) when there is any abnormality or complications such as—
 - excessive sickness;
 - puffiness of hands or face;
 - fits or convulsions;
 - dangerous varicose veins;
 - purulent discharge;
 - sores of the genitals;
 - persistent headaches;
 - dimness of vision;
 - illness or abnormality or stillbirth in a previous pregnancy.

II. *Labour*.—In the case of a woman in labour at or near term when there is any abnormality or complication, such as—

- fits or convulsions;
- a purulent discharge;
- sores of the genitals;
- a malpresentation;
- presentation other than normal;
- when no presentation can be made out;
- where there is excessive bleeding;
- where, two hours after the birth of the child, the placenta and membranes have not been completely expelled;
- in cases of rupture of the perineum, or of other injuries of the soft parts;
- in cases where labour has been prolonged more than 24 hours;
- where general condition of the patient is unsatisfactory.

III. *Lying-in*.—In the case of a lying-in woman, when there is any abnormality or complication such as—

- fits or convulsions;
- abdominal swellings and tenderness;
- offensive lochia;
- rigor, with raised temperature;
- rise of temperature above 100.4 degrees F., or quickening of pulse above 100 for more than 24 hours;
- unusual swelling of the breasts with local tenderness or pain;
- secondary post-partum hæmorrhage;
- white leg.

IV. *General*.—In all cases in which a woman during pregnancy, labour, or lying-in appears to be dying or dead.

V. *The Child*.—In the case of the child, when there is any abnormality or complication, including—

- injuries received during birth;
- any malformation or deformity in a child;
- dangerous feebleness;
- inflammation of, or discharges from, the eyes, however slight;
- serious skin eruptions;
- inflammation about, or hæmorrhage from the navel;
- premature birth endangering the child's life.

"By Day," to which the above fees refer, shall mean that the practitioner has been called from his residence between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m.

"By night," for which 10s. 6d. in addition to the above fees may be claimed, shall mean that the practitioner has been called from his residence between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m.

Mileage rate, chargeable one way only, and to be reckoned from the practitioner's residence—

For every mile or portion thereof after the first mile, up to 3 miles—

By day, 2s. 6d. per mile.

By night, 5s. per mile.

For every mile or portion thereof after 3 miles—

By day, 5s. per mile.

By night, 7s. 6d. per mile.

Claims under this Schedule shall be lodged with the Board within three months from date of attendance.

SIXTH SCHEDULE.

Disinfection.

"Antiseptic" means any substance which has the power of preventing the growth and multiplication of germs. Disinfectants of weak strength are antiseptic in action.

"Asepsis" means a condition free from infective germs.

"Aseptic" means belonging to or pertaining to asepsis.

"Deodorant" means any substance which has the power of neutralizing bad odours. Some deodorants act by destroying the germs which produce the odour; others act by absorbing the odour, e.g., charcoal, and are not necessarily disinfectants.

"Disinfectant" means any substance which is capable of destroying the germs which cause infection, and includes heat, formalin, lysol, perchloride of mercury, permanganate of potash, carbolic acid, &c.

"Fumigant" means any substance which, when suitably treated, yields gas or fumes which act as an antiseptic or disinfectant.

"Germicide" has the same meaning as "disinfectant."

"Sepsis" means an infective condition of the body produced by disease germs.

"Septic" means belonging to or pertaining to sepsis.

"Septicæmia" means a condition of the body when the germs of infection or their toxins are in the blood.

"Sterile" means free from germs.

Personal Disinfection.

The disinfecting solution referred to in clause 30 (a) may consist of 1 oz. (two tablespoons) to 2 gallons of water, of Accol, Kerol, Cyllin, Hycol, Izal, or other standardized disinfectant of equivalent strength.

The hair may be treated with the following disinfecting solution:—

Formalin—2 drams.

Spirit rect.—1 oz.

Rose water—to 10 ozs.

The liquid is to be applied and thoroughly rubbed in so as to come in contact with all the hair.

Disinfection of Clothing.

The clothing referred to in clause 30 (c) may be disinfected in a similar solution to that recommended for a bath in the preceding paragraph.

To generate the formaldehyde fumes referred to in clause 30 (d) proceed in the manner indicated below:—

(1) Place a bucket or similar receptacle on the floor of the fume chamber.

(2) Place crystals of permanganate of potash in the bottom of the bucket;

(3) Mix the formalin with an equal quantity of water, and pour over the crystals.

(4) Close door of fume chamber tightly.

For every 100 cubic feet of space, use 2 oz. of formalin, 2 oz. of water, and 1 oz. of permanganate of potash.

A cupboard or wardrobe may be used as a fume chamber.

Disinfection of Instruments.

All instruments and appliances that are injured by boiling in water should be immersed for thirty minutes in a solution containing 1 teaspoonful of accol to 1 pint of water, or other standardized disinfectant of equivalent strength.

Liquor cresolis saponatus, lysol, pacolol, &c., may be used, but as the strength of these is about one-fifth of the germicidal strength of accol, the quantity of disinfectant required to be added to the water should be increased accordingly.

Instruments and appliances disinfected by chemical disinfectants should be thoroughly washed in freshly boiled water before use.

The midwife should be very careful that instruments and appliances are disinfected immediately before use in every case.

Disinfection of Arms and Hands.

Turn sleeves well above the elbows and fasten there.

Wash hands and arms thoroughly in hot water, using soap freely, or in a 1 per cent. solution of lysol or similar disinfectant (2 teaspoonfuls in a pint and a half of water).

Pay special attention to the nails, and use a nail brush vigorously.

Wash off all trace of soap in fresh water, and immerse hands, for one minute at least, in a solution of perchloride of mercury (1 in 500), or of biniodide of mercury (1 in 1,000).

Cleanliness and Disinfection of Eyes.

As soon as the head is born, and, if possible, before the eyes are opened, the eyelids should be cleansed by gently wiping them with a cotton wool swab moistened with a weak solution of boric acid (a small teaspoonful to a pint of boiled water).

This should be repeated after the child is washed.

If there be any reason to suspect that the mother may be suffering from gonorrhœa, then drop with a special drop-bottle, two drops of a 1 per cent. solution of nitrate of silver into each eye.

NOTE.—The foregoing particulars as regards disinfection are given only as a general guide for midwives; they should consult the medical attendant in all matters relating to the use of disinfectants.
