## DETERMINATION OF THE COUNTRY AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS BOARD.

Nore.—This Determination on the 16th February, 1924, applied to the whole of the State outside and excepting the following parts of Victoria na edy: The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ralarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol; and the shire of Braybrook.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in--

- (1) The process, trade, or business of a maker of-
  - (a) Agricultural machinery or implements;

  - (a) Agricultural machinery or implements;
     (b) Parts of agricultural machinery or implements;
     (c) Bag filling machinery, bone-crushers, butter-making machinery, chaff-cutters, corn-crushing machinery, cream separators, hay presses, horse works, iron feeding troughs, lawn mowers, machinery for treating flax or hemp, maize shellers, windmils; or
- (2) Assembling or putting together any parts of machinery or implements of classes or kinds (whether the same have been made inside or outside the State) same or similar to those mentioned in paragraph (1)," has made the following Determination, namely :-
- (1) That on the 16th February, 1924, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

<sup>(3)</sup> OVERTIME.—That any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter for the first six hours, and thereafter time and a half.

<sup>(4)</sup> Special Rates.—Time and three quarters shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New, Year's Day, 21st April Eight Hours Day), Good Friday. Easter Monday and Christinas Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for the above holidays the special rate shall be payable only on the day so substituted.

<sup>(5)</sup> PIRCK-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the Rectories and Shop's Act 1915 that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that any such employers half base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can carn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.
