Medical Act 1915, Part III.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 86 of the *Medical Act 1915*, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or rescind Regulations for the purpose of carrying Part III. of the said Act into effect; and whereas, in the opinion of the Board, it is desirable to alter the subjects of examination for the preliminary examination referred to in Appendix A of the Pharmacy Regulations 1917 and also the pass standard referred to in Appendix C of the said Regulations: Now therefore the said Board doth amend the said Appendices A and C as follows:—

APPENDIX A.

The subjects of examination specified in Appendix A are hereby repealed and in lieu thereof the subjects of examination following shall be substituted therefor, namely:—

Latin.—(a) Translation into English of Cæsar, De Bello Gallico, Book I., chapters 1-29 inclusive; or of a prescribed alternative. The prescribed alternative, for the examinations in June, 1924-March, 1925, inclusive, is Iulium Sidus (Kerry), sections IV., V., VI., VII., VIII. In June and September, 1924, passages will be set from the first half of these sections; and in November, 1924, and March, 1925, from any part of these sections.

(b) Grammar, accidence, and syntax. Easy Latin prose composition and translation into English of an easy or simplified "unseen" passage from a Latin author.

English.—Essay, grammar, and composition. Literature, mainly, as prescribed for the University intermediate examination.

(a) An essay of about one and a half pages, or 400 words.

(b) Accidence; leading rules of syntax; analysis of sentence into clauses, stating the grammatical function of each clause; principal English metres. Any recognised scheme of analysis will be accepted.

(c) The meaning, style, and metre of the following selections from *The Golden Treasury*, all of which are to be memorised:—Nos. 71, 213, 240, 166, 255, 188, 341. (See *University Hand-book*.)

(d) Discussion of: "Twelfth Night," or "As You Like It," or "The Merchant of Venice," or "Henry V."

(e) Discussion of *Kenilworth* or *Martin Chuzzlewit*.

N.B.—The works prescribed in (c), (d), and (e) will first become subjects for examination in June, 1924. Candidates in June will not be required to have studied more than the first half of the literature prescribed in (c), (d), and (e).

GENERAL NOTE.—The prescribed Latin prose translation and the English poems, plays, and novels will be current for the period beginning with the preliminary examination in June of each year and ending with the examination in March next following.

Arithmetic.—First four rules, simple and compound; vulgar and decimal fractions; simple and compound proportion; profit and loss; simple and compound interest; commercial discount and present worth; extraction of square root; British and metric system of weights and measures; problems relating to lineal, square, and cubic measurements, averages, and simple graphs.

Algebra.—Notation, symbolic expressions, addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division; highest common factor and lowest common multiple; fractions, cycli; order; extractions of square root; proof of algebraical identities; simple equations of one and two variables; quadratic equations of one variable; equational problems and simple graphs.

Geometry.—The definitions of Euclid, Books I. and III.; the postulates and axioms, and the substance of Euclid, Books I. and III. (propositions 14 to 32 inclusive).

APPENDIX C.

The pass standard specified in Appendix C is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof the standard following shall be substituted therefor, namely:—

The Pass Standard.

The percentage of marks necessary to secure a pass in the final qualifying examination shall be not less than 50 in each section or sub-section, as the case may be, except in section 1 (b)—practical dispensing—in which the pass standard shall be 60 per cent.

Conditions under which Partial Pass may be obtained.

Any candidate obtaining not less than 60 per cent. of marks in three of the five sections or sub-sections into which the final qualifying examination is divided and not less than 40 per cent. in the remaining section or sub-sections shall be

eligible to present himself at any subsequent examination in the section or sub-section in which he has failed. Provided always that the candidate in order to secure this concession must pass in section 1 (b)—practical dispensing.

The above alterations of Appendices A and C were made by resolution of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria at the meeting held on the 12th day of December, 1923.

AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPER-ANNUATION FUND.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1915*, the Pilot Superannuation Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. *Short Title.*—This Regulation may be cited as "The Pilot Superannuation Regulation 1924."

2. *Construction.*—This Regulation shall be read and construed as one with "The Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations 1906," made by the Board on the 25th day of October, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of November, 1909, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations."

3. *Amendment of Clause 9 of Principal Regulations.*—As on and from the 1st day of July, 1923, for the figures "£45" occurring in the ninth line of clause 9 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the figures "£50," and for the figures "£55" occurring in the thirteenth line of the same clause there shall be substituted the figures "£60."

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Pilot Superannuation Board, held this twenty-ninth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

Marine Act 1915.

AMENDMENT OF THE PASSENGER (SAILING AND MOTOR) BOAT REGULATIONS 1915.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Marine Act 1915*, to make and to amend Regulations for the licensing of all boats plying for hire or let out for hire or valuable consideration in any port in Victoria, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of the Governor in Council of the said State, doth make the amended Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1924" and shall take effect as on and from the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be read and construed with "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1915", hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations".

2. There shall be substituted for sub-clause (b) of clause 22 of the Principal Regulations, as amended by "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1921", the following new regulation:—

"(b) A motor boat plying on any river or on any lake or other land-locked water only must be furnished with two (2) approved life buoys, an approved life belt for every person licensed to be carried on board including the person or persons in charge and with a lantern similar to that described in subdivision (a) hereof unless in the case of a motor boat intended to ply in shallow waters exclusively the Board in its discretion think fit to dispense with the obligation to provide all or any of such furnishings."

3. Clause 7 of "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1922" is hereby revoked and in substitution therefor it is ordained that after clause 22 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the new clause following:—

"22a. *Buoyancy*.—No motor boat other than one intended to ply in shallow water exclusively in respect of which boat the Marine Board has determined the requirements hereby prescribed are unnecessary, shall be licensed under these Regulations unless such boat is provided with internal buoyancy fittings equal to 25 per centum in excess of the weight of the propelling machinery, ballast and all equipments of a non-buoyant nature, either in the form of muntz metal or copper casings, or enclosed water-tight air spaces. Sealed oil drums secured in position to the boat will according to their capacity nevertheless be accepted as portion or the whole of the buoyancy fittings required, provided they are painted or otherwise prevented from rusting and are readily removable for periodical inspection and testing."

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BEECHWORTH.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Beechworth, within the municipal district of the Shire of Beechworth, shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 98 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, so far as the closing hours on Saturday, Friday, and Wednesday are concerned.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each and every week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BEECHWORTH.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Township of Beechworth, within the municipal district of the Shire of Beechworth, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the Township of Beechworth, within the municipal district of the Shire of Beechworth, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

- (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
- (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
- (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

BOROUGH OF CARRUM.

BY-LAW No. 7.

By-law of the Borough of Carrum made under Part 7, Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and also the rules and regulations under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, for regulating street traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and of all other powers thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Carrum order as follows:—

1. "Council" means the Council of the Borough of Carrum. "Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Borough of Carrum habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Borough of Carrum other than a footway.

2. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his right-hand side of the footway, and shall upon meeting or overtaking any person pass on the left-hand side of such person.

3. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon to the annoyance of passers-by.

4. Every person in the borough shall in any footway or street at all times obey and conform to any notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Town Clerk or other authorized officer of the Council or the officer in charge of the police in the borough, and shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable order or direction of any member of the police force or officer of the Council.

5. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footway or any street crossing habitually used by pedestrians.

6. No person shall put, throw, or allow to fall and remain upon any footway the skin or peel or stem of any fruit, or the leaves of any part of any vegetables.

7. No person shall wear or carry in any street or footway any pin or other article or any implement in such a manner as is likely to inflict injury by coming in contact with any other person.

8. No person shall at any time between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 6 o'clock p.m. on any day cause interruption or annoyance to pedestrians upon any street or footway by raising or discharging dust or causing water to flow upon or across such street or footway, whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

9. No person shall place in any street or footway to the obstruction or annoyance of any member of the public, or carry on any vehicle, or otherwise, any protruding board or other things unless he has obtained from the Town Clerk a permit so to do.

10. No person shall litter any street or footway by scattering or throwing down hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, bills, pamphlets, or papers.

11. No person upon any street or footway shall sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing or harangue, after being required to desist by any member of the police force or by any officer of the Council, or by any inmate of any house within 50 yards of such person.

12. No person shall sell or offer for sale any goods in any street or footway in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use thereof.

13. No person selling or offering for sale any goods in any street or footway shall, without special permission from the Town Clerk, occupy any fixed stand or shall loiter in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use of such street or footway, and every such person shall move on being so required by any officer of the Council or any member of the police force.

14. Any contravention of the foregoing sections by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

15. Every person who is guilty of any offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5.

16. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the Borough of Carrum.

5. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding One pound for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
