NOTICE OF INTENTION RE BOATS AND NETS ON THE NORTH ARM AT LAKES ENTRANCE.

SHIRE OF WARANGA.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE FROM SHIRE OF WARANGA AND ANNEXATION TO SHIRE OF GOULBURN.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2686, section 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Waranga described in the petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Waranga and constituted (together with additional area proposed to be severed from the Shire of McIvor) a new Riding, to be called the Western Riding of the Shire of Goulburn.

Area described in petition:—

Commencing at a point in the boundary between the Counties of Rodney and Dalhousie, at the intersection of the Whroo to Graytown road; thence north-easterly by such road to the northern angle of allotment 44, in the Parish of Whroo; thence in a straight line to the northern angle of allotment 42 of said parish; thence south-easterly and east by a road forming the southern boundary of the State Forest known as the Buffalo Forest, and forming the northern boundary of said allotment 42, allotments 41, 40, 38, 36, 34, 33, 32, 31, 30, 29, 28b, 27, 25, and 24b, in the said Parish of Whroo, to the boundary between the Parishes of Whroo and Murchison; thence east, south, and east by a road forming the north boundary of allotments 2, 5, 8, 11a, 14, 17a, and 19, in the Parish of Murchison, the east boundary of part of said allotment 19, and the north boundary of allotments 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1, in the Parish of Noorilim, to the Goulburn River; thence south-westerly by that river to Sandy Creek; thence westerly and north-westerly by that creek to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that, owing to the geographical situation of the area above described, a large majority of the rate-payers residing therein have the Town of Nagambie, in the Shire of Goulburn, as their centre for commercial, marketing, and social purposes. The greater part of the traffic of all kinds from the said area leads to the said Town of Nagambie (which is the seat of the municipal government of the Shire of Goulburn) and the railway station at Nagambie. For the reasons aforesaid the Council of the Shire of Goulburn would be a more suitable and proper body than the Council of the Shire of Waranga to administer the income arising from the rates raised upon the rateable property in such area.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Waranga and constitute such area (together with additional area proposed to be severed from the Shire of McIvor) a new riding to be called the Western Riding of the Shire of Goulburn.

## BY-LAW No. 33.

BY-LAW of the Shire of Lillydale, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and section 314 of the *Health Act 1915*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered thirty-three, for the purpose of amending and adding to the principal Building By-law (No. 31), as set forth hereunder:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and such sections of the principal Building By-law No. 31 as are contrary or repugnant to this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. Minimum area of land for dwelling—

Section 17, sub-section (a), is hereby repealed, and the following substituted:—

The site or curtilage of such dwelling house or tents shall have a superficial area of at least 9,000 feet, and have a frontage of not less than 60 feet to a street or road, and that, except in cases of corner sites, the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site. This sub-section shall not apply to existing sites, but shall be enforced in all future subdivisions of land.

3. Areas to which By-law applies—

The following area shall be added to those set out in section 36 of the principal By-law:—

In the South-western Riding—

(a) Along the Mount Dandenong-road from the foot of the mountain to Olinda, within 150 feet of the road on either side.

(b) Within a radius of 20 chains of the Post Office at Mt. Evelyn.

4. The following amendment shall be made to section 37 of the principal By-law:—

Main-street, Bangwood, from Ringwood-street to Church of England shall be repealed and the following substituted:—

“Main-street, Ringwood, from New-street to Mt. Dandenong-road.”

5. The following new section shall be added:—

Crossings over footpaths—

Before commencing any building operations or cartage of material on to site of building, a proper culvert crossing must be constructed over all street channels and drains, and the footpath protected with timber planking. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of this provision of the By-law will be liable for such offence to a penalty of not less than Two pounds, and if such offence is a continuing one, to a penalty of One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

The above By-law was adopted by the Council of the Shire of Lillydale at its meeting held on the 22nd day of October, 1923, and confirmed at its meeting held on the 26th day of November, 1923.
