REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A PORTION OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISHES OF NEERIM AND NOOJEE EAST.

WE, John Young Woolstenoroff, Thomas Prescott, John Britten, Thomas Goodbody Robinson, Edgar Joseph James Jenkins, and John Lynch, the duly appointed Committee of Management of portion of a Reserve for Public Purposes in the Parishes of Neerim and Noojee East, and indicated by pink colour on plan marked N.E./4.10.22 attached to lands correspondence C.68388, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, ferns, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals.
6. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPERANNUATION FUND.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1915, the Pilot Superannuation Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. *Short Title.*—These Regulations may be cited as "The Pilot Superannuation Regulations 1923."

2. *Commencement.*—These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with "The Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations 1909," made by the Board on the 25th day of October, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of November, 1909, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations," and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1923.

3. *Lump Sum in Lieu of Pension.*—Paragraph 8 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

"8. *Lump Sum in Lieu of Pension.*—Where any pilot shall have become entitled to a pension, and he is desirous of accepting a lump sum in lieu thereof, he shall be entitled to be paid a sum calculated at the rate of £40 for the first year of completed service, £41 for the second year of such service, £42 for the third year of such service, and so on, increasing One pound for each additional year of completed service up to thirty-five years, provided that such pilot grants a release to the Board from all future claims against the fund on behalf of himself and of his wife and of his children (if any), and provided further that no payment shall be made for a greater length of service than thirty-five years."

4. *Provision for Children of Pilots.*—Paragraph 10 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

"10. *Provision for Children of Pilots.*—If a pilot shall die leaving a widow and child or children him surviving, a capitation allowance shall be made in favour of each child at the rate of £10 per annum until such child shall have attained the age of fifteen years. On the death of any widow, she leaving any child or children under the age of fifteen years her surviving, the capitation allowance, if there be but one child, shall be increased to a sum of £20 per annum. In the case of more than one child, the pension payable to the widow shall be divided into as many equal portions as there are children, and each such portion shall be continued as a yearly allowance in addition to the capitation allowance payable as aforesaid to each such child, to be continued until the age of fifteen is attained, but without benefit of survivorship between the children, and subject to the further proviso that no child shall, in any case, receive a larger allowance (capitation money included) than £20 per annum.

In the event of a pilot dying leaving a child or children under fifteen years of age, but no widow him surviving, the allowance to each child is to be calculated as if the pilot had died leaving a widow surviving him for a period of 24 hours."

5. *Pensions for Pilots.*—Schedule I. to the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

"SCHEDULE I.

CITY OF NORTHCOTE.
BY-LAW No. 30.

A By-law of the City of Northcote made under section 197 (21) of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 30 for regulating or controlling quarrying and/or blasting operations.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Northcote order as follows:—

1. No person shall fire or discharge, or cause, permit, or suffer to be fired or discharged, any shot or blast in connexion with any quarrying operations within the limits of the City of Northcote except upon such days, and at or between such hours, and at such distance from any highway, as shall be appointed or approved from time to time by the Council of the City of Northcote.

2. No person shall carry on, or cause, permit, or suffer to be carried on, any quarrying operations for the removal of any rock, stone, gravel, clay, soil, or other material except at such place or places and to such extent as shall be appointed or approved by the Council of the City of Northcote.

3. All surface and underground workings connected with quarrying operations or in which blasting operations are carried on shall be subject so far as may be reasonably practicable to the general rules for the regulation and inspection of mines and mining machinery contained in the *Mines Act 1915*, or in any amendment thereof, and shall be under the supervision and control of the Council of the City of Northcote.

4. This By-law shall apply to, and have operation throughout, the whole of the City of Northcote.

5. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Five shillings and not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is a continuing one to a further penalty of not less than One pound per day for each and every day such offence is continued.

6. By-laws Nos. 3 and 19 of the City of Northcote and hereby repealed.
