PROCLAMATION

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act relating to Undertakings of the Melbourne Electric Supply Company Limited and for other purposes."
- "An Act to make further provision with respect to Motor Omnibuses and for other purposes."
- "An Act to make further provision with respect to Highways and Country Roads Motor Cars and Traction Engines and for other purposes."
- "An Act relating to Dried Fruits and Dried Fruits Packing Sheds and for other purposes."
- "An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Works and Undertakings of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria."
- "An Act to increase the Borrowing Powers of the Council of the Town of Mildura for the purposes of Works and Undertakings for the Supply of Electricity."
- "An Act to declare the Rate of Land Tax for the year ending the thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five and to amend the Land Tax Acts."
- "An Act to amend Section Nineteen of the *Housing and Reclamation Act 1920* and Section Twenty of the *State Savings Bank Act 1920* (No. 2)."
- "An Act to provide for the Closing of portions of certain Streets in the City of Footscray and for the Reservation from Sale of the said portions as a Site for Educational purposes."
- "An Act to authorize the raising of Money for State Forests and to sanction the Issue and Application of such Money."
- "An Act to amend Section Six of the *Cattle Compensation Act 1924*."
- "An Act to amend the provisions of the Local Government Acts relating to by-laws for or with respect to Residential Areas and the Erection and Construction of Buildings."
- "An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament."
- "An Act to declare the Rates of Income Tax for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five and to amend and continue the Income Tax Acts."

RULES OF THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES TO PRACTISE AS BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS; AND FOR THE ADMISSION OF SUCH CANDIDATES TO PRACTISE.

The Seventeenth day of December, 1924.

IN pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1915*, the said Council hereby makes the following Rules and alterations to Rules.

1. The Rules of the said Council dated the 20th day of October, 1921, as amended by the Rules dated the 27th day of June, 1922, to the extent to which the same are hereinafter expressed to be repealed or amended are hereby repealed or amended accordingly but unless the contrary intention appears such repeal shall not—

- (1) revive any Rule of the said Council or Statute or Rule of Court not in force at the time at which the repeal takes effect; or
- (2) affect the previous operation of any Rule so repealed or anything duly done thereunder; or
- (3) affect or abridge any right or privilege acquired under any Rule so repealed.

2. The Rules dated the 20th day of October, 1921, are amended as follows:—

(1) In Rule 14 the words "Save as otherwise expressly provided where a candidate requires more than one subject to complete his course he shall not receive credit for any subject" are repealed, and the following words are substituted therefor:—"Two of the nine subjects prescribed may be passed singly, but save as is otherwise expressly provided a candidate shall not receive credit for any other subject."

(2) In Rule 16, proviso 1, before the words "a Judge of the Supreme Court" are inserted the words "the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria or", and after Rule 16 is added the following rule:—

16A. (1) The said Council, in lieu of granting or refusing its sanction under proviso (1) of Rule 16, may refer the application to a Judge of the Supreme Court. If the Council refuses its sanction, or for one calendar month fails to grant its sanction to any person applying therefor, such person may, within two months after such refusal or failure, apply to a Judge of the Supreme Court for his sanction. The proceedings before such Judge shall be in the nature of a re-hearing, and the said Council shall be entitled to be represented thereat, and shall receive at least one week's notice in writing thereof.

(2) An application for sanction under Rule 16 shall be made in the first instance to the said Council, shall be in writing signed by the applicant, shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration setting forth the grounds of the application, and shall be lodged with the Secretary of the said Institute.

(3) In Rule 18, the words "within three" are repealed, and the words "for three" are substituted therefor; and the words "within one month" are repealed, and the words "within three months" are substituted therefor; and there are inserted at the end the words "and shall receive at least one week's notice in writing thereof."

(4) In sub-rule (a) of Rule 20, the word "thereafter" is repealed.

(5) Rule 21 is repealed, and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

21. (a) Service under articles shall be dispensed with where any person has completed a term of ten years' service in the offices of the Supreme Court, or of the Registry of the High Court of Australia, or of the Attorney-General, Solicitor-General, or Crown Solicitor for Victoria, or the Commonwealth (or partly in one and partly in another), and obtains from the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria, or from the Full Court of the Supreme Court, a certificate that the said Council or the Full Court is satisfied that during the last four years of the period aforesaid the duties of such person, and the work performed by him, have been such as to require a knowledge of the law, and to give a training in the practice of the law which may reasonably be accepted in lieu of service under articles.

(b) The said Council, in lieu of granting or refusing a certificate, may refer the application to the Full Court of the Supreme Court. If the Council refuses a certificate, or for three calendar months fails to grant a certificate to any person, such person may, within three months after such refusal or failure, apply to the Full Court for a certificate. The proceedings in the Full Court shall be in the nature of a re-hearing, and the said Council shall be entitled to be represented thereat, and shall receive at least one week's notice in writing thereof.

(c) An application to the said Council may be renewed from time to time (at intervals of not less than six months) upon further material.

(d) An application for a certificate under this Rule, whether original or renewed, shall be made in the first instance to the said Council, shall be in writing signed by the applicant, shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration setting forth the grounds of the application, and shall be lodged with the Secretary of the said Institute.

(6) In Rule 22 (h) the word "abroad" is repealed.

(7) In Rule 26, before the words "one of the Judges of the Supreme Court" are inserted the words "the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria or", and before the word "Judge" wherever it occurs the words "Council or" are inserted, and after Rule 26 is added the following Rule:—

26A. (1) The said Council, in lieu of granting or refusing its sanction under Rule 26, may refer the application to a Judge of the Supreme Court. If the Council refuses its sanction, or for one calendar month fails to grant its sanction to any person applying therefor, such person may, within two months after such refusal or failure, apply to a Judge of the Supreme Court for his sanction. The proceedings before such Judge shall be in the nature of a re-hearing, and the said Council shall be entitled to be represented thereat, and shall receive at least one week's notice in writing thereof.

(2) An application for sanction under Rule 26 shall be made in the first instance to the said Council, shall be in writing signed by the applicant, shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration setting forth the grounds of the application, and shall be lodged with the Secretary of the said Institute.

(8) In Rule 27, the words "and no more" are repealed, and the words "and in case of illness be allowed leave of absence not exceeding seven days in all in each year" are substituted therefor.

(9) Rule 28 is repealed, and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

28. An articulated clerk, without obtaining an order from the Supreme Court, may serve under special provision in the articles, or under fresh articles, for such term as is necessary to complete the full term of service required by these Rules, where he has been absent from the service of the person to whom he is bound—

- (a) on compulsory military duty;
- (b) on optional military duty for any period not exceeding 21 days in each year;
- (c) for any further period not exceeding 30 days in each year with the consent of the person to whom he is bound.

(10) In Rule 34 (b) after the words "served under articles" are inserted the words in brackets "(or served as a clerk or managing clerk)".

(11) In Rule 35, the words "every Commonwealth and every British practitioner applying to be admitted to practise as a barrister and solicitor shall, not less than

two months before the first day of the sittings in which he proposes to apply" are repealed, and the words "Every Commonwealth practitioner applying to be admitted to practise as a barrister and solicitor shall, not less than two months, and every British practitioner so applying shall, not less than three months, before the first day of the sittings in which he proposes to apply" are substituted therefor.

3. Rules (2) and (3) of the Rules of the 27th day of June, 1922, are repealed.

4. The schedules to the Rules, dated the 20th day of October, 1921, are amended as follows:—

(1) In Schedule A, the words "to said S.S." are repealed, and the words "to the said S.S." are substituted therefor.

(2) In Schedule A, in the first note in brackets, the words "on military duty" are repealed, and the words "(a) on compulsory military duty; (b) on optional military duty for any period not exceeding 21 days in each year; and (c) for any further period not exceeding 30 days in each year, with the consent of the said S.S." are substituted therefor.

(3) In Schedule A, the words "practice of profession" are repealed, and the words "practice or profession" are substituted therefor.

(4) In Schedule B, the words "profession and practice" are repealed, and the words "practice or profession" are substituted therefor.

(5) In Schedule D, after the words "fourteen days' holiday in any year" are inserted the words "nor leave of absence on account of illness exceeding seven days in any year, or on any account exceeding days in all, or 30 days in any year"; after the words "The said B.A. was not," are inserted the words "during the term (or term and period) of service above mentioned"; after the words "compulsory military duty more than days" are inserted the words "in all"; and after the words "optional military duty more than days" are inserted the words "in all or more than 21 days in any year."

(6) In Schedule E is inserted the following paragraph:—

4. That I am a natural-born (or naturalized) British subject of the full age of 21 years.

(7) In Schedule G, after the words "the service of his articles" are inserted the words in brackets "(or his term as a managing clerk)"; after the words "to be modified if" are inserted the words "Rule 16 (1) or".

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2686), sections 472 and 473, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Nunawading has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making a street within the said city be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved, used, or acquired for the street hereinafter named and described, and situated within the Shire of Nunawading aforesaid, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

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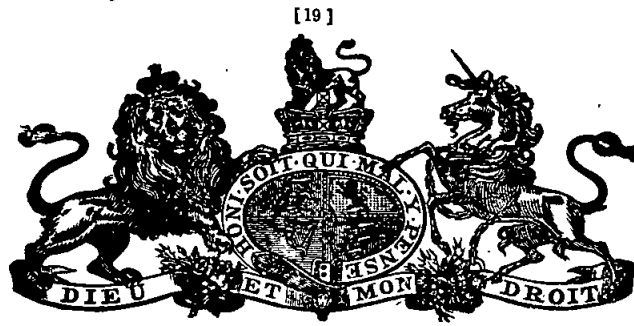
