THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

By-Law No. 10.

Water Supply.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on them by the Water Acts and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in anywise enabling them in that behalf, doth hereby make the by-law following:—

1. By-laws Nos. 3 and 4 relating to water supply, passed by the Ballarat Water Commissioners; on the 2nd December, 1892, approved by the Governor-in-Council, on the 12th December, 1892, and By-law No. 9, passed by the Ballarat Water Commissioners, on the 19th October, 1906, approved by the Governor in Council, on the 7th November, 1906, shall be and the same are hereby repealed as from the date of coming into operation of this By-law, but nothing herein contained shall relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the said By-laws; nor abrogate or alter the power of the Ballarat Water Commissioners to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; nor withdraw any permission given; nor cancel any licence granted or order made, nor invalidate any act or thing done, nor annul or stay any proceedings taken, prosecution commenced, or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said By-laws prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation; but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion and all offences against any provision of the said By-laws committed before the date of this By-law coming into operation may be prosecuted for and punished as if this By-law had not been made and passed.

MARGINAL NOTES.

2. The marginal notes shall not be deemed to be a part of this By-law.

INTERPRETATION.

3. In the construction of this By-law the meaning which in the Water Acts is assigned to any word shall be the meaning of the same word when occurring in this By-law unless inconsistent with the subject matter or context.

"Commissioners" shall mean the Ballarat Water Commissioners.

"District" shall mean "the Ballarat Water Supply District."

"Engineer" or his representative shall be deemed and be taken to mean the Engineer or an officer or servant of the Commissioners duly authorized in that behalf.

"Person" shall extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole public or private.

"Proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commissioners, authorized either specially or generally to perform any act, matter, or thing, or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commissioners.

SUPPLY BY MEASURE.

4. Every owner or occupier of lands and tenements, or other persons supplied with or using water for private water troughs, steam boilers, engines, building purposes, brickwork, concrete, masonry, syphons, hydraulic power blasts, watering of horses, cattle or other stock, glass washing machines, cooling windows, washing or cleaning vehicles, or watering gardens, yards, pathways or drives, or for use in any trade, industry or business, or for any other than domestic purposes solely, shall be supplied by measure.

Charges for water supplied by measure.

The amounts to be charged for the supply of water by measure shall (subject to section 215 of the *Water Act 1915*) be as follows:—

- (a) Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, up to an amount equal to that which the Commissioners would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.
- (b) For water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes unless otherwise specified, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (c) For water supplied to mining companies, manufacturers, and others, for steam boiler purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons. And the minimum charge for water so supplied to any such boiler shall be 10s. per month.
- (d) For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (e) For water supplied for ground purposes to cricket, bowling, croquet, and tennis clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
- (h) For water supplied for private fountains, shall be by meter at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
- (i) For water supplied to troughs in streets, Ten shillings each per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
- (j) In all cases, unless otherwise provided in this By-law, the supply of water for other than domestic purposes solely shall be by measure, and charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

Compulsory
fixing of
meters.

5. The Commissioners may by notice in writing require any person being the owner or occupier of premises supplied with water other than for domestic purposes solely, to be supplied by measure, and to fix a meter in a position or place to be approved of by the proper officer of the Commissioners, to register the quantity of water so supplied. Any person so required, who shall not within fourteen days after the service of such notice duly and properly fix a meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after the expiration of the said period of fourteen days during which he shall fail or neglect to fix such meter in accordance with such requisition.

MINIMUM METER CHARGE.

Minimum
charge for
water supplied
by measure.

6. Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement where water is supplied to any lands and tenements by measure shall be the quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons will produce an amount equal to the amount of the water rate which under the provisions of any By-law of the Commissioners, for making and levying rates, would be payable for the said lands and tenements, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

Save as aforesaid, in every case where the supply is by measure the minimum charge shall be a sum of Five shillings for any continuous period of three months.

SPECIAL RATES AND CHARGES.

Charges for
special supplies.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in clauses 4 and 6 of this By-law the Commissioners may, if it shall think fit, grant special supplies of water according to the following terms and charges which shall be payable in advance, viz.:—

Water troughs.

To private water troughs at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

For building or other structural purposes, in the case of buildings or structures not exceeding Three hundred pounds estimated capital value, the charge shall be Ten shillings. In the case of buildings or structures exceeding Three hundred pounds estimated capital value, the supply shall be by measure only, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings.

Supplies of water for purposes not otherwise specified in this By-law must be paid for at such rate as the Commissioners shall in each case determine, and a preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Commissioners before a supply can be taken or used.

Special rate may be fixed in cases not provided for.

METERS.

8. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested and approved by the proper officer of the Commissioners, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each $\frac{3}{4}$ inch; and 1 inch meter must be capable of registering any flow not less than 15 and 30 gallons per hour respectively.

Meters to be tested and approved.

Every meter must be fixed truly level, with connexions above ground, approved by the Commissioners' supervising officer, in an easily accessible position, and properly protected on a proper foundation of timber, stone, brick or concrete, approved by the Commissioners' supervising officer, which must wherever practicable be level with the surface of the ground and within 3 feet of the building line of the property. If it be impracticable to place the meter above the surface of the ground, it may be fixed in a pit approved by the Commissioners' supervising officer, which must be properly constructed and drained.

Meters, how to be fixed.

Two galvanized wrought iron quarter bends must be fixed on each side of the meter. The use of elbows will not be permitted.

Wherever washers are necessary for meter connexion couplings, leather washers must in all cases be used.

Leather washers to be used.

Every meter must be fixed to register the whole of the water supplied to any tenement or premises.

Whole supply to property to be registered.

Every person desiring to remove or alter the position of a meter must, six days prior to such removal, make written application for the consent of the Commissioners to such removal or alteration, and no such removal or alteration may be effected until the Commissioners' permission in writing shall have been given.

Removal of meters.

No person shall construct, place, stack, store, or permit to be constructed, placed, stacked, or stored, any building, erection, materials, or goods, over or upon any meter through which water is supplied by the Commissioners or do or permit anything which shall prevent or interfere with the inspection at any time by any officer of the Commissioners of any such meter.

Meters to be available for inspection.

Every meter must be fixed by a licensed plumber at the cost of the owner, or hirer on his premises in the position directed by the officer of the Commissioners. No work in connexion with the fixing, removal, or alteration of a meter shall be done by any person other than a licensed plumber or officer of the Commissioners.

Notwithstanding the foregoing all hired meters will be repaired, altered, removed or otherwise dealt with only by an officer of the Commissioners.

9. If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported as out of repair, or registering inaccurately the Commissioners may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until it is repaired and re-fixed, (1) by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or half-year, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or (2) on the basis of subsequent consumption after repairing, or (3) the Commissioners may insert a check meter on the service pipe and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

Where meter ceases registering, &c., average may be charged.

In all cases of fixing and re-fixing 2-inch meters and meters of larger sizes, provision must be made for testing the working of the meters in position by the affixing of a stop tap or valve on the outlet side of the meter, with a stop-cock ferrule between the stop-tap and the meter. No branches are to be taken off between the stop-tap or valve and the meter.

Testing large meters in position.

The sizes of the stop-cock ferrules must be as follows:—

For 2-inch and 3-inch meters— $\frac{3}{4}$ inch.

For 4-inch meters—1 inch.

For meters larger than 4 inch— $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch.

Meters removed owing to being out of order must be repaired, adjusted, and submitted to the Commissioners for test by a licensed plumber employed for the purpose with the least possible delay. For any unnecessary delay in re-fixing the meter, such licensed plumber shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 or suspension of his licence.

Refixing
of meters.

Any meter fixed prior to this By-law coming into operation shall if removed for any purpose whatever, be re-fixed in manner and position in strict accordance with the provisions of this By-law.

Check meter.

The Commissioners by its officers may at any time attach a check meter to the service pipes of any consumer either inside or outside the premises of such consumer, and may for such purpose enter such premises at any time between the hours of 10 in the forenoon and 4 in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

HIRE OF METERS.

Hire of meters
and rate of
rent thereof.

10. The Commissioners may, if they so think fit, let for hire water meters, the rent of which, if inferential meters, shall be at the rate per annum of:—

For $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter—Five shillings.

For any meter of larger size than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per cent. upon the cost of such meter fixed complete.

Meter rent
exclusive of
rate.

Such rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid on the date provided for the payment of rates under the rating By-law.

Testing meters.

In the event of the hirer of a meter up to $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter being dissatisfied with the registering of a hired meter, he may by notice in writing, require the Commissioners to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Seven shillings and sixpence sterling, which, if the meter be found to register correctly within a margin of 5 per cent., shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register or be found to register incorrectly, after allowing such margin as aforesaid, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it, at cost of the Commissioners, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Owners of meters over $\frac{3}{4}$ inch shall pay the actual cost of removing, testing and replacing same.

Meters other than such as are hired from the Commissioners shall be kept in repair by and at the cost of the owner, and will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Commissioners and a fee of Five shillings shall be charged for each test.

Any person hiring a meter from the Commissioners who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given in writing at least six days' notice to the Commissioners of his intention to leave the premises shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

ALLOWANCE FOR SANITARY FLUSHING.

Water supply
to closets.

11. Every consumer of water who shall receive his supply of water through a meter, and shall pay for such supply by measure an amount exceeding the sum which he would be required to pay upon the rating of his premises, shall, out of such excess, be allowed, so far as such excess will admit thereof, a deduction equal to Five shillings per annum on account of each water closet on his premises, the supply of water for the flushing whereof shall pass through, and be recorded by such meter, provided always the total deduction allowed to any such consumer shall not in any case exceed Twenty shillings in respect of such premises.

TAPPINGS AND SERVICES.

Application
of provisions
regarding
connexions, &c.

12. All work, connexions, fittings, apparatus, and material in connexion with the supply of water from the pipes of the Commissioners shall be in strict accordance with the provisions of this By-law, and where any service existing at the time of the coming into operation of this By-law, and supplying water from the pipes of the Commissioners, or any fitting or apparatus connected therewith, is not in accordance with the provisions of this By-law, such alterations as are necessary must be effected to comply with the provisions of this By-law.

13. One service pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted. The bore of such service pipe must not be less or exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ inch, unless permission for a larger service shall have been applied for and given in writing by the Commissioners, and the supply be taken through a meter. Ordinary connexions.
Special size services.

14. Upon any person giving notice of his desire to lay a pipe to connect with the pipes of the Commissioners, necessitating the tapping of the main, such work, exclusive of excavating and filling in, shall be carried out by the Commissioners, the cost of all labour and material necessary for such connexion shall be paid by the person requiring execution of the work, and shall pay in advance to the Commissioners the expense of such tapping, as follows:— Tappings under pressure by an officer of the Commissioners, at cost of consumer.

For $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch Fifteen shillings, for all tappings over $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter the cost in each and every case shall be decided by the Commissioners.

Each applicant requiring a main to be tapped shall, in addition to paying a specified fee, give two days' notice of his requirement, stating the day and hour the necessary excavation will be made and the main exposed for tapping.

Each person excavating in the street for the purpose of service pipe laying shall be responsible for the protection and restoration of the ground to the satisfaction of the local authority.

If it becomes necessary to effect repairs, removals, or replacements to any such tapping as aforesaid, the fee of Ten shillings must be paid on each occasion where the main is 16 inches in diameter or less.

15. All connexions with or between lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. Connexions, brass couplings.

All jointing between tubes, bends, couplings, elbows, and cocks to be made with flax only, and other jointing to be made in an approved manner.

16. A high pressure screw down stop cock properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron box or cup must be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line, at a uniform distance of 6 inches from the building line when the paths are tarred or paved; or they shall be placed 3 feet inside the building line or as ordered by the Engineer. Stop cock and cover box.

17. Except where otherwise permitted by the Commissioners, service pipes shall be laid at right angles to the main. Every service which does not enter the building line of the tenement supplied at a point at right angles to the main to which such service is connected shall be provided with two high pressure screw down stop cocks and approved cast-iron covers, one of which shall be fixed opposite the main and the other in a position approved by the Commissioners' supervising officer, immediately outside the building line where the service enters the tenement. Position of stop cocks.

18. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, and any plumber who by himself or his workmen shall break this clause of this By-law shall in addition to any other penalty for which he may be liable, be liable to have his licence cancelled. All lead joints to be wiped.

19. Excepting with the permission of the Commissioners, not more than one tenement shall be supplied from a single service pipe. The Commissioners may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one service pipe, but in such cases the sub-service shall be so arranged that the supply to each tenement shall be independent of the supply to the remaining tenements, and be controlled by a stop cock fixed in a public thoroughfare on such sub-service. One service pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted. Services to be separate, except by permission.

Whenever any service existing at the time of the coming into operation of this By-law supplies more than one tenement, and such service is not laid in accordance with the provisions of this section, repair of such service will not be permitted should the repair involve the replacement of more than 10 feet in length of the service, but the service must be renewed strictly in accordance with the before-mentioned provisions. Renewal of services.

Any person offending against the provisions of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by permission of the Commissioners.

In connexion with every application to lay a water service of 2 inches and upwards in diameter, or to alter the position of any such water Extensions subject to consent of the Commissioners. Plans.

service, the plumber's notice must be accompanied by a properly dimensioned plan, showing the locality of the premises at which the work is to be effected, and the position in which it is intended to lay the pipes and fix meters, plugs, stop taps, &c., thereto.

If it becomes necessary to shut off a main 9 inches diameter or over to repair, remove, or replace any tapping, such special fee as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Commissioners shall be paid to cover the expense of such shutting off.

Service pipes
to be repaired
by owner or
occupier.

21. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenement supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any) or (if none) the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same; and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default of so repairing he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day such pipe remains out of repair after service of such notice; and the Commissioners may stop the water from flowing into such tenement either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the Commissioners may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

WASTE OF WATER.

Waste water.

22. Any person supplied with water by the Commissioners who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Commissioners.

TAKING OR SUPPLYING WATER WITHOUT AUTHORITY.

Water not
to be used
or supplied
without written
authority.

23. Any person receiving water from the Commissioners who without the written permission of the Commissioners shall take or carry away such water from his tenement, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Unlawful
taking of
water.

24. Any person who shall without the written permission of the Commissioners take or carry away water from the premises of any other person supplied by the Commissioners, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Supply may
be cut off.

25. If any person supplied with water by the Commissioners does or causes to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay on demand any rate, charge or sum due to the Commissioners, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commissioners may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied, or such rate, charge, or sum due remains unpaid.

LICENSED PLUMBERS.

Unlicensed
persons not
to interfere
with pipes or
services.

26. No person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Commissioners, or alter, repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Commissioners, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commissioners unless (a) he is the holder of a "Working Plumber's Licence" under any By-law which may now or hereafter be in force within the Sewerage District relating to sewerage, or (b) he has obtained from the Commissioners a licence to execute Water Supply work; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Licences to
plumbers,
expiration of.

27. Every such licence issued hereunder shall expire on the 30th day of June in each year, and may be renewed, but shall be subject to review from time to time, and the Commissioners may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being adjudged by the Commissioners to be incompetent, or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, or being guilty of any conduct which the Commissioners may regard as improper.

Proof of
fitness to be
given by the
applicant
before granting
or renewal
of licence.

28. Before any such licence to execute Water Supply work shall be granted or renewed by the Commissioners, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Commissioners that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Commissioners relating to Water Supply, and with the sections of the "Water Acts" applicable to the Commissioners; but the Commissioners may, if for any reason it so see fit, refuse to grant or renew such

licence, and shall not be bound to give any reason for such refusal. All current licences to plumbers to execute Water Supply work issued under By-laws 3 and 4 of the Ballarat Water Commissioners shall expire on the 31st day of July, 1925.

29. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, grant special licences to pipe-fitters in continuous employment of large firms who require their services on the premises or in the business. Where the supply is through meter the licensed fitter shall only be permitted to work upon water supply pipes and fittings within the premises, and on the outlet side of the meter, and he shall not be permitted to execute any lead work. The special licence as aforesaid shall be subject to review from time to time and also to cancellation, as provided in Clause 27 of this By-law. Special licences to pipe fitters.

30. A licence issued in conformity with the provisions of the Water Acts, or any Act repealed thereby or any By-law or regulation thereunder (including this By-law) shall not authorize the holder thereof to do any kind of work connected with the sanitary fittings of houses or the sewerage system. Licence to Plumbers under Water Act and by-laws not to apply to sewerage.

NOTICES.

31. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Commissioners, without giving two days' notice to the Commissioners or their proper officer, of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commissioners without the permission in writing of the Commissioners being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Commissioners, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable for each such offence to such penalties as are provided in the Act. Notices of work proposed to be given.

Notices must be signed by the licensed plumber actually engaged in carrying out the works referred to on the notice, or by a licensed plumber employing another plumber to carry out the work under his supervision. Notices to be signed by licensed plumber.

Any licensed plumber signing a notice for work which is not actually done either by himself or by a plumber employed under his supervision, or carrying out work under a notice not signed by himself, shall be guilty of an offence.

32. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commissioners, or who shall alter, repair, or replace pipes or fittings in communication with the pipes of the Commissioners without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such work is to be carried out, or who shall make such communication, alteration, repair or replacement, except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commissioners, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipes of the Commissioners of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commissioners, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable for each such offence to such penalties as are provided in the Acts. In the case of service communication with the pipes of the Commissioners being made through the intervening medium of storage tanks, the provisions of this clause shall have as full application as if the communication were by direct service. Notice to lay service to be given.
Material to be approved and work inspected.

The giving of two days' notice as aforesaid will only be dispensed with in the event of urgent repairs being required to stop the waste or escape of water, in which case notice must be sent to the Commissioners by the licensed plumber concurrently with, or immediately after the execution of such urgent repairs. The penalty for not giving notice as required by this paragraph shall be as mentioned for an offence against the first part of this clause. Urgent repairs.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

33. No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, bib-cock, ball-cock, valve, closet cistern, service box, bath tap or valve, meter, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Commissioners, which is not of the best quality, tested, stamped, and approved by the Commissioners. Fittings to be of the best quality and subject to approval.

34. No person shall use any stop or bib cocks which are not screw down, high pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gunmetal, and in every respect of the best quality and workmanship, tested, stamped, and approved by the Commissioners.

The whole of the tubes, tees, bands, or other fittings to be perfectly new, sound, and free from all defects and capable of standing a hydrostatic pressure of 200 lbs. per square inch. Nevertheless all taps, save ball taps, shall be capable of standing a hydrostatic pressure of 300 lbs. per square inch.

Lead piping.

35. Lead piping shall be of the following weights:—

Galvanized iron piping.

Except with the written consent of the Commissioners, only galvanized iron piping of approved quality, tested and stamped by the Commissioners, will be allowed for external and internal services. The fixing of lead pipes on water supply to filters will not be permitted. Tin-lined lead pipes or galvanized wrought-iron pipes of approved quality must be used.

All jointing between tubes, bends, couplings, elbows, and cocks to be made with flax only, and other jointing to be made in an approved manner.

36. All water services inside the boundary line to be laid in the ground at least 10 inches deep, and between the boundary line and the main they must be at least 20 inches deep except where permission has been granted by the Engineer to lay them at a lesser depth.

CISTERNS AND TANKS.

Equilibrium ball valves to be provided.

37. No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball-valve, and with the overflow pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner, open to inspection and in a position approved by the Commissioners. Every such cistern or tank must be constructed, protected, made accessible and provided with inlet and outlet pipes, as required by the Commissioners, so as to reduce the risk of pollution and waste of water to a minimum.

URINALS.

Urinals.

38. Water closets and urinals will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the pipes of the Commissioners, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2½ gallons can escape at one flush.

BATHS.

Holding capacity of baths.

39. Baths supplied from the pipes of the Commissioners, except when the supply is by measure, must not exceed 6 ft. 3 in. in length along the centre line by a mean width of 2 feet, and a depth of 1 ft. 9 in. with ends sloping inwards.

AUTOMATIC SYPHONS, ETC.

40. No person shall fix any water ejector, hand syphon, automatic syphon, or other water power pumping appliance without the permission in writing of the Commissioners being first obtained. If approved, any such fitting shall be fixed only under such conditions as the Commissioners shall notify in writing.

FIRE SERVICE.

Private fire services.

41. Subject to the previous written consent of the Commissioners, private fire services will be allowed, but every such service must be sealed, except in cases where the proper officers of the Commissioners shall have certified in writing that sealing is unnecessary. For each such fire service there shall be paid a sum of One pound per annum after the fixing thereof. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of such service except for extinction of fire. Except in the case of fire no person shall, without authority of the Commissioners, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service, and in the event of any such seal having been broken, accidentally or otherwise, the occupier of the tenement shall, within twenty-four hours thereafter, give notice in writing of the fact at the office of the Commissioners, and failing to do so shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and to a further penalty of Ten shillings for every day during which he shall neglect to give such notice.

GENERAL.

Reflex valve to be fixed in steam services.

42. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Commissioners.

43. No person shall, without the written permission of Commissioners, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrant or hose attached to fire plugs, but for such purpose water carts or some other method approved by the Commissioners shall be used. Any person offending against the provision of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Street watering.

44. The water supply of all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Commissioners, and any person not duly authorized who shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Supply to public parks and gardens.

Filling of public baths will be permitted only between the hours of 8 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m., and then only subject to 72 hours' previous notice to the Commissioners, in writing, specifying the time and place where such operation is to take place, and subject to the hours being approved by the Commissioners. Filling of public baths.

45. Any person who uses a hose attached to any tap or pipe for any purpose whatsoever, except where authorized by this By-law, unless a meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to such penalties as are provided in the Acts. Hose not to be affixed without meter.

46. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Commissioners before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing, addressed to the Secretary of the Commissioners, and delivery at his office, of such length of time as is required by the Water Acts or by this By-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work; and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Commissioners' consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Consent of the Commissioners. Notice to be addressed to the Secretary. Conditions as to Notice.

Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the Commissioners, the Secretary, or the Engineer of Water Supply, or other proper officer of the Commissioners who, severally, shall be competent to give the Commissioners' consent, and on behalf of the Commissioners to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. Consent may be given by the Chairman, Secretary or Engineer of Water Supply.

PENALTY.

47. Any person who is guilty by act or omission of any contravention or evasion of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and where no other penalty is provided shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by The Ballarat Water Commissioners on the 18th day of June, 1925.

Water Acts.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

PROPOSED LEITCHVILLE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Water Acts, I hereby declare that the lands included in the area defined hereunder, and shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted an Irrigation and Water Supply District.

The area hereinbefore referred to is defined as follows:—

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 23, section 4, Parish of Gunbower; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that allotment to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 12, section 5; thence easterly by a line, the northern boundary of that allotment, and a line in continuation of that boundary to the Gunbower Creek; thence generally south-easterly and south-westerly by that creek to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 15 of said section 5; thence westerly by a line and that boundary to the south-western angle of said allotment 15; thence south-easterly by the eastern boundary of a main road to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 7 of no section; thence westerly by a line and the northern boundary of a one-chain road to Taylor's Creek; thence generally north-westerly and south-westerly by that creek to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 11, section 6; thence westerly by a line and that boundary to the northern boundary of the road through the southern part of said allotment 11; thence generally north-westerly by the last-mentioned boundary and the western boundaries of allotments 11, 9, 8, and 4A of said section 6 and a line connecting those boundaries to the western boundary of said allotment 4A, all in the Parish of Gunbower; thence westerly by a line to the south-eastern angle of 11c, section 6, Parish of Gunbower West; thence generally north-westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 11c and 11b and a line connecting those boundaries to the south-western angle of said allotment 11b; thence northerly by the western boundary of that allotment to the north-western angle of allotment 11b; thence north-westerly by a line to the south-eastern angle of allotment 16; thence generally south-westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 16 and 17, all of said section 6, to the western boundary of the Macorna Channel Reserve; thence generally north-westerly by that boundary to the south-western angle of

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND GARDEN IN THE PARISH OF ASHENS, AT MURTOA, KNOWN AS "LAKE MARMA RESERVE."

THE Murtoa Waterworks Trust, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Public Park and Garden in the Parish of Ashens, at Murtoa, known as "Lake Marma Reserve," having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person or persons shall be allowed to catch fish in Lake Marma between the hours of Ten p.m. and Four a.m.
2. No person shall use ground bait of any kind whatsoever in Lake Marma for the purpose of attracting fish to any particular spot, or for any other purpose whatsoever.
3. No person shall angle for, or by any other means endeavour to take fish from Lake Marma on any Sunday.
4. No person shall deposit any weight, stone, tin, or other obstacle in Lake Marma.
5. No person shall angle for or otherwise endeavour to catch fish in Lake Marma without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ..." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 5 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 1.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

2. No person shall in any such residential area use any land, or erect, or adapt for use or use any building for the purpose of any trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement, except the business of dressmaker, milliner, teacher, dentist, barrister, solicitor, or medical practitioner, or a business or trade carried on by an individual without any employee or assistant in a private dwelling on which no advertisement or sign is displayed indicating the nature of the business or trade carried on therein other than a plate approved by the Council and affixed to the front of such dwelling.

3. If any person erects, adapts for use, or uses any building contrary to this By-law it shall be lawful for the Council to serve on the owner or occupier of such building a notice requiring him to pull down and remove such building within a time to be named in such notice, and in the event of such owner or occupier refusing or neglecting to comply with such notice the Council may pull down and remove such building and sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing

the expenses of such pulling down and removal and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building.

4. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence or after a conviction or order of any Court in respect of such offence.

5. By-laws Nos. 147, 150, and 157 are hereby repealed.

BY-LAW No. 161.

RESIDENTIAL AREA.

A By-law of the City of Prahran, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered one hundred and sixty-one, for prescribing an area within the Municipal District as a residential area and prohibiting within such area the use of any land or the erection, adaptation for use or the use of any building for the purposes of certain trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran, order as follows:—

1. The area herein described within the Municipal District of the City of Prahran shall be a residential area; that is to say, all land abutting on each side of Chapel-street from Toorak-road to the Church-street-bridge and to a depth of 400 feet from the frontage of such land to that part of Chapel-street hereinbefore specified.

2. No person shall in such residential area use any land or erect or adapt for use any building for the purpose of any trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement, except business of a class usually carried on in a shop.

3. Provided that nothing in this By-law shall apply or affect the right of any person being a barrister or solicitor or a medical practitioner, dentist, or teacher to carry on the practice of his profession in any dwelling house or prevent him from so doing.

4. If any person erects, adapts for use, or uses any building contrary to this By-law it shall be lawful for the Council to serve on the owner or occupier of such building a notice requiring him to pull down and remove such building within a time to be named in such notice, and in the event of such owner or occupier refusing or neglecting to comply with such notice the Council may pull down and remove such building and sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of such pulling down and removal and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building.

5. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence or after a conviction or order of any Court in respect of such offence.

BY-LAW No. 13.

A BY-LAW OF THE BOROUGH OF KOROIT UNDER SECTION 75 OF THE HEALTH ACT 1919.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1919, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of Koroit, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Borough for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-Laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

PART I.

As to Earth Closets, Etc.

3. This part of this By-law shall apply to and have operation, within the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Koroit.
4. No person shall after the coming into force of this By-law, construct or cause to be constructed within the Borough of Koroit any privy except in the form of an earth closet which shall consist of a suitable privy building and shall have the necessary apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and cleansing the same. Access to the pan for the purpose of removal shall be from the exterior of the closet building. The orifice in the closet seat must be at least three and a half inches behind the riser or casing more or less surrounding the pan, the space under the seat must not allow of a larger interval than one and a half inches between the pan and the seat and it must be so fitted with guides and stops that the pan may be easily introduced into its proper position. The floor of the whole closet shall be of approved non-absorbent material horizontal beneath the seat but sloped forward from the riser to the front wall half an inch per foot and no where less than three inches above the surrounding ground level. The space beneath the seat shall be provided with a fly proof air grating situated in the lowermost part of an external wall and having a clear air way of at least twenty-four square inches and an upcast outlet ventilator three inches in diameter extending from beneath the soffit of the seat to above the roof. The orifice in the closet seat shall be provided with a hinged lid or cover. The entrance door of the closet shall be three inches short of floor and of lintel.
5. Every owner or occupier of premises within the Borough of Koroit shall within three months after the coming into force of this By-law make existing privies or closets or cesspools situate on such premises fly-proof by providing a hinged lid or cover so constructed as to fall forward with its own weight for the orifice in the closet seat and by making the trap doors fit closely and shall within such period put such closet building or cesspool in good order and condition to the satisfaction of the proper officer of the Council.
6. Every owner or occupier of premises within the Borough of Koroit shall keep all privies closets or cesspools situate in or upon such premises fly proof as hereinbefore provided and shall maintain such privies closets or cesspools in good condition and repair to the satisfaction of the proper officer of the Council.
7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such closet to be immediately upon the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.
8. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized-iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight and with handles thereto and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet and provided with a closely fitted cover of a pattern to be approved of by the proper officer of the Council.
9. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.
10. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every seven days or oftener if ordered by the proper officer of the Council empty and cleanse or cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth closet, privy and place in the nature of an earth closet for the reception of night-soil or belonging to such premises.
11. No person shall empty an earth closet except by means of a suitably covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance danger to health or offensiveness.
12. Where any nightman is employed or licensed by the Council such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom and no other person shall remove the same.
13. All night-soil blood offal or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Council from time to time for the final reception of the same but with the consent of the Council or the proper officer thereof night-soil may be buried deposited or used in any portion of the borough except within the boundaries specified in Part II. of this By-law. Provided that such night-soil shall be so buried deposited or used not less than 150 feet from any dwelling house and shall be covered with at least 6 inches of clean dry earth.
14. The said Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil to make an annual charge on such occupier as aforesaid for such removal and also to make a charge for pans supplied and in default of payment such charges shall be recoverable in any Court of Petty Sessions.
15. No person shall empty or assist in emptying or cause or permit to be emptied any earth closet or cesspool except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m. unless otherwise permitted by the Council (of which the proof shall be on such person) or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth closet shall cause the night-soil to be removed as soon as it is emptied.
16. No person shall empty or cause or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying any earth closet or cesspool or place for the deposit of night-soil blood offal or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer or so that the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any drain or sewer.

PART II.

Double Pan Service.

17. This part of this By-law shall apply to and have operation within the following area of the Borough of Koroit commencing at point being the intersection of the railway line from Warrnambool to Koroit and Port Fairy with the Government road leading from Koroit to Southern Cross thence on the north along the said railway line to its intersection with Nine Mile Creek-road thence on the west by the said Nine Mile Creek-road and Belfast-road to O'Brien's-lane thence south easterly along O'Brien's-lane to Barkly-street thence on the south by Barkly-street bearing easterly to Lake-street thence on the east along Lake-street and McVicar-street to the commencing point.
18. The occupier of any premises on which there is erected a closet shall cause the space under the seat of each closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for and shall cause each closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.
19. The Council shall cause all closets to be supplied with pans for the reception of night-soil and lids to closely fit such pans and shall (except when being exchanged) cause one of such pans to be always kept under the seat of each closet.
20. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized-iron of not less than 22-gauge or other approved material or materials presenting on the inside and outside an impervious smooth hard and durable surface and those surfaces which come into contact with night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be strongly constructed and watertight and provided with properly attached side lifting handles. Each pan shall have a capacity of not less than 1 nor more than $1\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet, shall have an internal depth of 14 inches a diameter of not less than 14 inches and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an airtight lid to be affixed. The seams of the pan shall be folded grooved and sweated with solder. Across the exterior face of the bottom of the pan there shall be two straps swaged and riveted thereto made of $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch by not less than 20 gauge galvanized hoop iron.
21. The occupier aforesaid of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
22. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops water or rubbish in any pan.
23. The occupier of any premises whereon there is a closet or urinal shall
 - (a) maintain such closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition and
 - (b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof and effect any repairs thereto that he may deem necessary.
24. The Council shall at least once a week and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 24 inches of the brim thereof cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order to be left in its place.

25. The servants or contractors of the Council or the servants of such contractors removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

26. The Council shall remove all pans in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance danger to health or offensiveness and forthwith conduct such vehicle to the approved dépôt.

27. The servants or contractors of the Council or the servants of such contractors shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the dépôt and disposed of in such manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

28. If such night-soil is authorized to be disposed of in trenches such trenches shall not be less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth nor exceed 2 feet in width and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than six inches deep and it shall be left at such depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean thoroughly broken up soil upon the night-soil and pan washings when covered in.

29. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil when the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

30. Immediately after the deposit of the night-soil and washings in any trench such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

31. Ground into which night-soil has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

32. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall immediately on being emptied be either directly or through the medium of a pipe or channel thoroughly washed or otherwise cleaned and the resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

33. Every pan after the disposal of its contents and after being cleaned in manner aforesaid and before it again leaves the dépôt or disposal ground shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed by one of the following methods:—

- (a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water the subjection of the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60 lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam tight box or chamber, or
- (b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water then rinsing in clean water and finally submergence for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than one per cent of accol cyllin kerol izal hysol or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or
- (c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water and afterwards submergence for not less than five minutes in boiling water or
- (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

34. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

35. The servants or contractors of the Council or the servants of such contractor shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the dépôt or disposal ground to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly swabbed down daily with approved disinfectant at the dépôt or disposal ground and maintained in a proper state of repair and provided with all necessary means of haulage or propulsion.

36. No occupier or any other person shall remove any night-soil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

37. No occupier or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall bury or cause to be buried any night-soil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

38. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans and receptacles, and other similar things and places, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

PENALTIES.

39. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Resolution for the passing of this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the twenty-second day of April, 1925, and confirmed by the Council on the twenty-fifth day of May, 1925.

14. Provision re inner walls and ceilings, and materials used.
15. Provision for proper ventilation and lighting.
16. Defining minimum size of buildings within prescribed area.
17. Consent of Council necessary before erection of verandahs.
18. Regulating sign boards under verandahs.
19. Skylights must be properly glazed and protected.
20. Provision for bath room and bath in every dwelling.
21. Fowl-houses must be not less than 50 feet from building.
22. Privies and closets must not be less than 25 feet from any door or window or less than 50 feet from street.
23. Stables must be paved with impervious material, provided with manure pit of impervious material, and be not less than 50 feet from the door or window of any dwelling.
24. Proper drainage before and after erection of building, and provision of grease traps.
25. Council's authority (by its officers) to inspect at all times.
26. Power of Council to pull down buildings and dispose of same if wholly or partly built contrary to By-law.
27. Builder to give surveyor seven days' notice to inspect framing.
28. Provisions regarding erection of sleeping-out rooms.
29. Council's permission necessary before a house can be removed and re-erected.

33. This By-law shall not apply to Municipal or Government buildings.
34. Definition of terms used in wording of By-law.
