Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the State Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, the 31st October, 1925. An entry on the proper form must also, on or before such date, be lodged with the Registrar of the Melbourne University, and candidates must state therein that they have entered for the Public Service Examination, and indicate the subjects they desire to be examined in for that examination.

The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School Leaving or School Intermediate Examination, as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which, and forms of application (both Public Service and University) may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, on or before Saturday, the 21st November, 1925, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Fifteen shillings (15s.). No fee is payable to the University if a candidate enters for the Public Service Examination only.

Fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks (25 from those who pass the School Leaving and 25 from those who pass the School Intermediate Examination). Candidates must, on the first day of the examination, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty-one years at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £91, rising to a maximum of £273 a year, with a long-service increment of £13 a year.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any eligible returned sailor or soldier. Provided his certificate of discharge is furnished with his application, he may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £234 a year.

The whole of the above route is prescribed for the period ending the 31st December, 1925, and will be reviewed at the end of the period specified. Stopping Places on Routes.

- (6) No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, (0) No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or poultry without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- (7) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- (8) No person shall camp in the Reserve or any part thereof, nor erect therein any dwelling, booth, tent, or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the said Committee of Management.
- (9) No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.
- (10) Persons shall be allowed to train borses on the racing track each year from first January to thirty-first March only, the fee for each term to be One pound for each horse, payable in advance.
- (11) Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and is or may be in possession of, a ticket of admission:—
 - (a) Assaulting any other person.(b) Being drunk.

- (a) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or any part of it, during a race meeting or when the horses are preparing or are prepared to start, or are running for any race.
 (d) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
 (e) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
 (f) Behaving improperly or riotously.

- (g) Being in the Reserve and not producing upon demand (or if required not surrendering), to any gatekeeper, servant, or any other person having authority from the Committee of Management or those authorized by such Committee to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the Committee, or those authorized by such Committee, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him or her, and that the ticket has been lost or surrendered.
- (h) Obtaining admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof, when disentitled to such admission under these Regulations.
- Remaining on the Reserve, or any part thereof, after having been warned off any part of the Reserve.
- (12) The maximum scale of fees which may be charged for admission to the Reserve on such days as may be granted by the Chief Secretary for racing or trotting meetings shall be as follows:-
 - For the admission of every adult to the first division,
 - For the admission of every adult to the second division.
 - For the admission of every horse, without or with vehicle, to the first division, 2s.
 - For the admission of every motor to the first division, 2s.
 - For the admission of every person to the Reserve when used for sports on holiday amusements such a sum as-the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 3s.

Provided that all members of any racing club using the Reserve, and the officials, officers, and employees thereof, the officials and members of committee of the North-eastern District Racing Association when wearing their official badges shall be admitted to any part of the Reserve with their horses, carriages and horses, and motor vehicles without payment of any of the above tolls and charges for admission on any day the club is holding races on the Reserve.

- (13) No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portion as may be respectively, set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall comply with the following conditions:—
 - (a) That he be registered as a bookmaker by the committee or stowards of the race club or sporting club having the use of the Reserve for the day.
 - (b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the committee or stewards of the race club or sporting club, or those authorized by such committee or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.
- (14) No person, except the judge and timekeeper, or any person the judge may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box or the approach thereto. No person shall enter the istewards' stand or the stewards' room, or approaches thereto, except the stewards of the club and such persons as they may invite to do so.
- (15) No person shall enter the weighing stand or the weighing yard, or the approaches thereto, except the committee and stewards of the club, or those authorized by such committee, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses whose jockeys are being or about to be weighed. weighed.
- (16) No person unless otherwise permitted under these Regulations or by the Committee of Management, or the committee of the club, shall enter upon the reserve, or any division or part thereof, unless such person shall have a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.
- authorizing him in that behalf.

 (17) No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management of the Reserve or the committee or stewards of the club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonest, corrupt, fraudulent, or improper practices on the turf, or dishonorable action or conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management, committee or stewards, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, to be a defaulter shall enter upon the Reserve, or any division or part thereof, or remain upon the Reserve or any division or part thereof, and nay be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by or on behalf of the Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, or by any person appointed by them for that purpose:

- (18) Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting or other purpose the Reserve, or any part thereof, or any booth, building, or enclosure upon the Reserve, shall abide by any order or direction given by the Committee of Management of the Reserve or the committee or stewards of the club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committeee, or stewards in reference to the Reserve, and the buildings and other creations thereon. other erections thereon.
- (19) The expulsion or removal of any person from the said Reserve or any division thereof, or any building or crection thereon, for committing a breach of or offending against any of these Regulations shall not exempt such person from any penalty to which he would otherwise be liable for such breach or offence.
- (20) No cart or vehicle used for the conveyance of goods, or for any purpose of trade or business other than conveying passengers into the Reserve on race days, shall, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management, be driven into or through the Reserve.
- (21) No person shall play football, cricket, or any other game in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in such place or places as may be first approved and pointed out or fixed by the Committee of Management.
- (22) No person shall remove or carry away from the Reserve wood, soil, gravel, earth, sand, mullock, or débris.
- (23) The Committee of Management shall have full power (23) The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve, with all power incidental to that status within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1915.
- (24) No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game within the Reserve on Sundays.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty or not more than Ten pounds (£10).

- (iv) Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which

an offence against this By-law is continued after notice has been given by the Council to the offender of the commission of the offence or after a conviction or order of any Court in respect of such offence.

Once a week, on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council.

7. A charge of One shilling and threepence per month, payable half-yearly in advance, will be levied on each householder.

8. No person shall place, or cause to be placed, any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

9. If any person or the Council commin a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
