Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE (BEDDING) BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 23rd October, 1925, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria. IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person employed in the manufacture of mattresses or bedding" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 23rd October, 1925, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination,

(a) Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work

(b) Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 48 hours in any week for males, and 44 hours in any week for females

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted. Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE BOARD.

(PLANNING CARPETS, ETC.)

NOTE.—This Determination on the 23rd October, 1925, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria. IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which, since the 13th October, 1924, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any—

(a) females employed as upholstresses, whether as carpet hands, table hands, or drapery hands;
(b) males employed in planning and laying floor coverings, or fixing draperies, blinds, or screens;
(c) males or females employed in making blinds;

but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Tentmakers Board," has made the following Determination, namely:-

(1) That on the 23rd October, 1925, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done:-

(a) Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work

(b) Within the hours fixed as the time of beginning and ending work in excess of 48 hours in any week for males and 44 hours in any week for females

(5) Travelling Rates.—Any employee who works away from his employer's place of business shall for time occupied in travelling between the employer's place of business and work be paid pro rata at the following rates:—
