Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 15 (GROCERS).

NOTE.—This Determination on the 12th November, 1925, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely.—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the business of a grocer, including a seller of tea," has made the following determination, namely;—

(1) That on the 12th November, 1925, the Determination of the Court of Industrial Appeals, dated the 4th March, 1924, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) **ORDINARY WEEK'S WORK.**

The number of hours which shall constitute an ordinary week's work shall be as follows :—

All others .. .. . 48 hours

(6) **TIME RATE.**

Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours of an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed in this Determination for an ordinary week's work be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of forty per centum.

(7) **SPECIAL RATES.**

Time and a half shall be the special rate payable for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Royal Agricultural Show Act), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day; but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE SAND PIT BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 13th November, 1925, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in connexion with:—

A sand pit at labouring work, excavating sand, handling sand, or removing sand for trade or sale, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Carters Board," has made the following determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 13th November, 1925, the previous Determinations of the Sand Pit Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done:—

(a) Outside the hours fixed as times of beginning and ending work } Time and a quarter.  
(b) Within the hours fixed as times of beginning and ending work in excess of 48 hours in any week }

(5) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Years Day, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Good Friday, or Easter Monday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
