FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1926 for Free Places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these Free Places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his Free Place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his Free Place, and, if his Free Place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his Free Place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the Free Place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, and progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

BY-LAW No. 1637—continued.

Such minimum charge shall be computed at the rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling according to the municipal valuation of the property so supplied. For all water supplied in excess of such quantity the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound fifteen shillings.

4. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1926, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1926.

5. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

DRIED FRUITS ACT 1924.**REGULATIONS.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the 16th day of

WHEREAS the Governor in Council is empowered by the *Dried Fruits Act 1924* to make Regulations for all matters and things necessary and convenient to be prescribed for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following regulations:—

State of Victoria.

Dried Fruits Act 1924.

GRADING AND PACKING REGULATIONS.**PART I.—PRELIMINARY.**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Dried Fruits Act 1924* Short title.
(Grading and Packing) regulations.

2. These regulations are divided into Parts as follows:—

Parts.

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—Inspection of stores, packing sheds and drying grounds and conditions under which stores and packing sheds may be registered.

Part III.—Packing and branding of dried fruits and packages.

Part IV.—Grade standards for dried fruits.

Part V.—Powers and duties of inspectors.

Part VI.—Penalties.

3. For the purposes of these regulations—

Definitions.

“Act” means the *Dried Fruits Act 1924*;

“Board” means the Victorian Dried Fruits Board;

“Clean” in relation to dried fruits means free from stalks, dirt, sand, and other other foreign substances, and

“Cleanness” has a corresponding meaning;

“Disease” in relation to dried fruits means any abnormal condition of or in dried fruits, whether consisting of the presence of or caused by or due to the operation, development, growth or decay of any insect or fungus;

“Dried fruits” means dried currants, dried sultanas, dried lexias, and such other dried fruits as are declared from time to time to be dried fruits for the purposes of the *Dried Fruits Act 1924*, and regulations;

“Foreign substances” means dirt, gravel, sand, stalks or stones; insects; insect refuse, and other foreign substances.

“Fresh” in relation to dried fruits means that the goods are the product of the latest crop, or that the condition of the fruit has not been materially impaired by age or other cause, and

“Freshness” has a corresponding meaning;

“Grade” shall have relation to colour, cleanness, freshness, kind, maturity, number, soundness, and variety, and

“Graded” and “grading” shall have a similar meaning;

“Inspector” means any inspector appointed under the provisions of the *Dried Fruits Act 1924*;

“Lexias” means dipped dried fruits produced solely from the varieties of the White Muscatel and Waltham Cross (sometimes known as Malaga) grape.

"Marks" in relation to dried fruits means any brand, description, information, label, marks, statement or words; or any suggestion, direct or indirect—

- (a) As to the grade or weight of dried fruits;
 - (b) As to the capacity, dimensions or measurement of packages;
 - (c) As to the place, locality, or packing shed, in or at which the dried fruits were produced or packed, or the packages were made;
 - (d) As to the name, address or registered brand of the producer of the dried fruits, or the name and address or registered brand of the person or firm or corporation by whom the dried fruits were selected, graded, packed, or in any way prepared for sale or market; and
 - (e) Includes any mark which according to the custom of the trade, or of common repute is taken to be an indication of the aforesaid matters, and "marked" and "marking" shall have a similar meaning;
- "Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture, or any person acting as such for the time being;
- "Package" means any box, case, sack or receptacle used or capable of being used, or intended to be used for containing dried fruits;
- "Packing shed" means any building or erection in which dried fruits are stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of trade or sale, whether such building or erection is or is not used for any other purpose;
- "Person" includes body of persons, corporate or unincorporate;
- "Prescribed" means prescribed by the Act or regulations;
- "Registered brand" means a brand registered under the *Commonwealth Trade Marks Act 1905-22*;
- "Registered packing shed" means any packing shed registered with and approved by the Board;
- "Seedless-jexias" means dried fruits produced solely from dipped White Muscatel and Waltham Cross grapes, containing not less than 80 per cent. of seedless berries;
- "Seedless muscatels" means dried fruits produced solely from undipped White Muscatel grapes, containing not less than 80 per cent. of seedless berries.
- "Sell" includes barter or exchange; and also includes agreeing to sell, or offering or exposing for sale, or having in possession for sale, or receiving, sending, forwarding or delivering for or on sale in Victoria; or causing, suffering or attempting any of such acts or things; and "sale" and "sold" shall have a corresponding meaning;
- "Sound" means free from disease as defined in these regulations, and from damage or decay, and
- "Soundness" has a corresponding meaning;
- "Store" means any store, warehouse, building or other erection where dried fruits may be stored.

PART II.—INSPECTION OF DRYING GROUNDS, STORES AND PACKING SHEDS, AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH THESE SHALL BE CONDUCTED.

Conditions with respect to drying grounds, packing sheds, &c.

4. All drying grounds, drying racks, packing sheds, stores or other establishments whereon or wherein dried fruits are prepared or manufactured for sale shall be constructed and operated in such a way as in the opinion of the Board will admit of the dried fruits being properly prepared, processed, graded, and stored, and will facilitate hygienic treatment of those dried fruits.

5. (1) No person shall prepare, process, grade, stem, pack or store dried fruits for sale unless—

- (a) During the time the fruit is exposed on the drying ground or drying racks, adequate measures have been continuously taken by the owner or person in charge of the dried fruits to—
 - (i) Minimize the depredations of insect pests by the use of lures and other means approved by the Board;
 - (ii) Protect the fruit as far as possible against contamination by foreign substances by the preparation of the drying ground, and the ground immediately surrounding same in a manner suitable for this purpose.

- (b) The dried fruits have been packed in a registered packing shed;
- (c) The dried fruits are packed and graded as prescribed;
- (d) The dried fruits are packed in packages of the sizes, dimensions and materials prescribed, and are branded as prescribed.

(2) All dipped dried fruits shall be delivered to packing sheds in wooden containers only. Undipped dried fruits may be delivered to packing sheds in clean, sound bags which have not been previously used for carrying any deleterious substances.

(3) Immediately after the completion of each drying season the owner or person in charge, or some person or persons acting under his direction shall cleanse all drying plant and material from all dried fruit or débris, which shall be burnt or otherwise disposed of.

6. (1) The following conditions and methods are prescribed as those to be observed and followed by the owner or person in charge in connection with the construction and maintenance of stores, packing sheds, and appurtenances—

General conditions in connexion with construction and maintenance of stores, packing sheds, and appurtenances.

- (a) The general construction of the store or packing shed shall be of such a nature as to minimize as far as possible any harborage for insects; any contamination of dried fruits by access of foreign substances from without the store or shed; any contamination of dried fruits by foreign substances within the store or shed during the operations of storing, stacking, handling, loading, stemming, processing or grading;
- (b) The store or packing shed shall be so constructed as to admit sufficient light and ventilation for the purposes of efficient inspection; and for the operations of the store or packing shed;
- (c) The floors of the store or packing shed shall be constructed of concrete or other suitable material which shall be impervious as a harborage for insects, and which shall permit of rapid and effective cleansing.

(2) Immediately prior to the commencement of each packing season, or at any other time the Board or an inspector shall indicate, the store or packing shed shall be cleansed throughout; the walls shall be sprayed with an approved insecticide, and when dry shall, when an inspector so requires it, be whitewashed, or alternatively the store or packing shed shall be fumigated with hydrocyanic acid gas if the inspector so directs.

(3) During the continuance of the packing season the following conditions and methods shall be observed and carried into effect:—

Conditions and methods to be observed in packing sheds during packing season.

- (a) The floors of the packing shed shall be cleansed of all fruit débris, washed out and sprayed with an approved insecticide at least once during each week;
- (b) The packing sheds and immediate surroundings shall be kept free from fruit débris, which shall be burnt or otherwise disposed of at least once during each week;
- (c) Low-grade fruits and screenings awaiting processing shall be stored in a place approved by an inspector, and shall be finished off when ordered by an inspector;
- (d) All machinery shall be thoroughly cleansed of all dried fruits and dried-fruits débris—
 - (i) During periods when any one kind of dried fruit only is being processed, at least twice weekly at intervals of not more than three days, and at any cessation of work, should such cessation be for more than three days; and
 - (ii) Immediately after the processing of any one kind of dried fruit has been completed, and before any other kind of dried fruit is passed through the machinery.

(4) Adequate accommodation shall be provided at all packing sheds for the maximum number of employees engaged at such packing shed at any one time, and shall include—

- (a) Dressing-room;
- (b) Lavatory with adequate wash basins;
- (c) Adequate privy accommodation.

All packing sheds shall be properly drained, and the arrangements for the disposal of the drainage shall be subject to the approval of an inspector. Means whereby an adequate supply of water may be always available in any part of the packing shed shall be provided.

(5) No person who is a carrier of disease, or who is suffering from any infectious disease, venereal disease, cancer, open sore, or any inflammatory or communicable affection of the skin, or who is wearing unclean bandages shall engage in the production, manufacture, preparation, handling, packing, storage, carriage, or delivery of any dried fruits liable to contamination by handling.

PART III.—PACKING AND BRANDING OF DRIED FRUITS AND PACKAGES.

Packing
conditions for
all dried fruits.

7. Dried fruit intended for sale shall be packed in accordance with the following provisions:—

Outer cases.

(a) Cases containing dried fruit (whether or not such cases enclose dried fruit packed in immediate containers such as closed tins, jars, or cartons) shall be clean, new, and securely constructed of sound, well-seasoned softwood or hardwood that has been smoothly sawn or dressed.

Strapping of
cases.

(b) Cases containing dried fruit shall be strapped with metal strapping or wire—

(i) Where the contents exceed 30 lb., and

(ii) Where the contents are 30 lb., or under, and an inspector orders such strapping.

Specifications
for cases.

(c) Cases containing over 30 lb. of dried fruit, in addition to complying with paragraphs (a) and (b) of this regulation, shall have end boards not less than five-eighths ($\frac{5}{8}$) of an inch in thickness, and sides, tops, and bottoms made of boards not less than five-sixteenths ($\frac{5}{16}$) of an inch in thickness when softwood is used. When constructed of hardwood the sides, tops, and bottoms shall not be less than one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of an inch in thickness;

(d) Cases containing 30 lb. or under of dried fruit shall in addition to complying with paragraphs (a) and (b) of this regulation, have end boards not less than one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of an inch in thickness, with side boards not less than five-sixteenths ($\frac{5}{16}$) of an inch in thickness when softwood is used, and not less than one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of an inch in thickness when hardwood is used; and the lids and bottoms shall be made of boards not less than one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of an inch in thickness;

Net contents
of cases.

(e) Each case containing dried fruit which is not enclosed in immediate packages (such as tins, jars, or cartons) shall contain one kind of dried fruit only. The minimum net contents of such cases shall be 56 lbs.

(f) The minimum net contents of packages containing dried fruits in immediate containers shall be one or other of the following quantities, namely, $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz., 2 oz., 8 oz., 12 oz., 14 oz., 1 lb., 2 lb., 5 lb., or 10 lb.

Packages to be
branded with
certain
particulars.

(g) Cases containing dried fruits shall be branded with the name and address of the owner or packer of the dried fruits, or his registered brand and the name and grade of the dried fruits. Such grade marks shall be expressed wholly in words, e.g., "Four Crown," in black lettering three-quarters of an inch in height.

(h) Immediate packages or containers of dried fruit shall be branded legibly with the name and address of the owner or the packer of the dried fruit, or his registered brand, and the name of the dried fruit.

PART IV.—GRADE STANDARDS FOR DRIED FRUIT.

General
conditions as
to ripeness,
purity,
cleanness, &c.

8. Dried fruit intended for sale (whether of a kind specifically mentioned in these regulations or not) shall comply with the following provisions:—

(a) The outer layers or shown surfaces of the fruit shall be a true indication of the average grade of the contents of the case;

(b) The fruit shall be prepared from sound, naturally-ripened fruit, and shall possess the flavour characteristic of its respective kind;

(c) The fruit shall be thoroughly cured and free from fermentation, mould, damage, decay, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever;

(d) The fruit shall be free from foreign substances and shall be free from disease;

(e) The size of dried fruits in any one package shall be uniform.

9. Currants intended for sale shall be in accordance with such one of the following sets of conditions as is applicable to the description of the currants:—

*Currants—
preparation
quality,
blemishes, &c.*

Currants.

- (a) Currants describable as "Four Crown"—The currants shall consist of dark-coloured fruits which still retain their natural lustre and bloom, and are free from shotty and pin-head specimens. They shall be of good texture and flavour. No case shall contain more than 5 per centum by number of red and unripe currants, nor more than 5 per centum of seeds, nor more than 22 per centum of moisture;
- (b) Currants describable as "Three Crown."—The currants shall consist of dark-coloured, seedless fruits, which still retain their natural lustre and bloom, and are free from shotty and pin-head specimens. They shall be of good texture and flavour. No case shall contain more than 15 per centum by number of red and unripe currants, nor more than 22 per centum of moisture.
- (c) Currants describable as "Two Crown."—The currants shall consist of dark-coloured, seedless fruits of good flavour, and shall be free from shotty and pin-head specimens. No case shall contain more than 25 per centum by number of red and unripe currants, nor more than 22 per centum of moisture.
- (d) Currants describable as "One Crown."—The currants shall consist of dark-coloured, seedless fruits of good flavour, and shall be free from shotty and pin-head specimens. No case shall contain more than 35 per centum by number of red and unripe currants;
- (e) Currants describable as "M.F." (manufacturers' fruit).—The currants shall consist of seedless fruit in sound condition suitable for manufacturers' purposes.

10. Sultanas intended for sale shall be in accordance with such one of the following sets of conditions as is applicable to the description of the sultanas:—

*Sultanas—
quality, size,
colour,
blemishes.*

Sultanas.

- (a) Sultanas describable as "Four Crown."—The sultanas shall be of bright amber appearance, high quality, good flavour, and free pliable texture. No case shall contain more than 5 per centum of brown or blackened sultanas;
- (b) Sultanas describable as "Three Crown."—The sultanas shall be of amber appearance, high quality, good flavour, and free pliable texture. No case shall contain more than 15 per centum of brown or blackened sultanas;
- (c) Sultanas describable as "Two Crown."—The sultanas shall be of good appearance, of any colour natural to the fruit, and of good flavour and texture;
- (d) Sultanas describable as "One Crown."—The sultanas shall be of dark appearance, of any colour natural to the fruit, and of good flavour and texture;
- (e) Sultanas describable as "Plain" or "M.F."—The sultanas shall consist of fruit in sound condition, suitable for manufacturers' purposes.

11. Lexias, Walthams, and Seedless Muscatels intended for sale shall be in accordance with such one of the following sets of conditions as is applicable to the description of the fruit:—

*Lexias,
Walthams, and
Seedless
Muscatels—
preparation
quality, size,
blemishes, &c.*

Lexias, Walthams, and Seedless Muscatels.

- (a) Lexias and Walthams describable as "Five Crown."—The fruit shall be of such a size as shall pass over a sieve the circular meshes of which measure seventeen thirty-seconds (17-32nds) of an inch in diameter. They shall be of a firm, full texture, rich flavour, and a uniformly bright golden colour. Clear brown berries may be included to the extent of not more than 10 per centum by number in any case;
- (b) Lexias and Walthams describable as "Four Crown."—The fruit shall be of such a size as shall pass over a sieve the circular meshes of which measure seventeen thirty-seconds (17-32nds) of an inch in diameter. They shall be of a uniformly brown colour, firm texture, and full sweet flavour. Dark sound berries may be included to the extent of not more than 10 per centum by number in any case.

- (c) Lexias and Walthams describable as "Three Crown."—The fruit shall be of such a size as shall pass over a sieve the circular meshes of which measure seventeen thirty-seconds (17-32nds) of an inch in diameter. They shall consist of brown-coloured fruits of good flavour.
- (d) Lexias and Walthams describable as "Two Crown."—The fruit shall be of such a size as having been passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 17-32nds of an inch in diameter, shall pass over a sieve the circular meshes of which measure thirteen thirty-seconds (13-32nds) of an inch in diameter. They may be any colour or flavour natural to the fruit.
- (e) Seedness lexias and seedless muscatels describable as such.—The fruit shall be of such a size as having been passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure thirteen thirty-seconds (13-32nds) of an inch in diameter, shall pass over a sieve the circular meshes of which measure five thirty-seconds (5-32nds) of an inch in diameter. The fruit shall be of good flavour and texture, and no case shall contain less than 80 per centum by number of seedless berries.

Dried fruits used for food or drink to comply with prescribed conditions.

12. Except by permission of the Board, no dried fruits used for food by man, or used in the manufacture of articles used for food or drink by man, shall be sold or brought for sale to any wharf or place, unless the conditions prescribed by these regulations as to the preparation, manufacture, grading, packing, and storage of such goods have been complied with.

PART V.—POWERS AND DUTIES OF INSPECTORS.

Powers and duties of inspectors.

13. (1) For the purposes of the Act and regulations and subject to the Public Service Acts, the Minister may employ such and so many inspectors as he thinks fit, and may remove any such inspectors.

Any inspector may at any reasonable time enter any place whatever used in any way in connexion with dried fruits for sale, open any packages, or order the person or persons in charge for the time being, to open any packages, take samples of, or seize the whole or any part of any dried fruits and do all other things necessary to enable him to ascertain whether the requirements of the Act or regulations are being complied with.

(2) If the inspector is of the opinion that with respect to any drying ground, packing shed, dried fruits, or package there is any contravention of or failure to comply with any part of these regulations, he may direct the owner or person for the time being in charge to take all such measures, or do all such acts, as the inspector determines to be necessary for the proper observance of these regulations.

Power of inspector to detain dried fruits for the purposes of inspection.

14. (1) Any inspector may detain for the time being necessary to complete his inspection or examination, any dried fruits, if he has reasonable grounds for believing that with respect thereto there is a contravention of or failure to comply with the Act or the regulations.

(2) Such dried fruits shall at all times during the detention thereof be at the risk and charges of the owner thereof.

(3) Any inspector so detaining any dried fruits shall give the owner, when ascertained, notice orally or by letter, or telegram, that such dried fruits are detained in storage or otherwise (as the case may be).

Giving of notice.

15. The person whose name is marked on the outside or inside of any package of dried fruits, or on any slip or label thereon or therein as the packer thereof shall (until evidence to the contrary is given) be deemed to be the packer thereof.

16. Any notice under which the Act or the regulations may be given by letter or telegram shall be deemed to have been given, if it is shown that the letter was properly addressed, and was prepaid, registered, and posted, or that the telegram was properly addressed, and was prepaid and delivered at a post office for dispatch.

Liability of vendor's servant, &c., for offences committed without authority.

17. When an offence for which a vendor is liable to a penalty, has in fact been committed without the authority of the vendor, by some agent, servant, workman, or other person, such agent, servant, workman, or other person shall be liable to the like penalty as if he were the vendor.

Proceedings by inspectors.

18. Proceedings may be taken in respect of offences against the Act or the regulations by any inspector if so authorized by the Minister.

PART VI.—PENALTIES.

19. Any person who—

- (a) Wilfully obstructs any inspector in carrying out any duties under the Act, or under the regulations; or
- (b) Refuses to give information or knowingly gives false information in answer to any reasonable inquiry made by an inspector for the purposes of the Act or the regulations; or
- (c) Disobeys or fails to comply with any reasonable direction given by an inspector under the Act or the regulations—

shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

20. (1) Where a vendor is charged with an offence he shall be entitled, upon information duly laid by him, to have any other person whom he charges as the actual offender, brought before the court at the hearing of the charge, and if after the commission of the offence has been proved, the vendor proves to the satisfaction of the court:—

Exemption of vendor on conviction of actual offender.

- (a) That he used due diligence to enforce the execution of the provisions of the Act and the regulations; and
- (b) That the said other person committed the offence in question without his knowledge, consent, or connivance, and in contravention of his orders, the said other person shall be summarily convicted of such offence, and the said vendor shall be exempt from any penalty. The person so convicted shall in the discretion of the court be also liable to pay any costs incidental to the proceedings.

(2) Where it is made to appear to the satisfaction of any inspector at the time of discovering an offence—

Exemption of vendor in certain circumstances.

- (a) That the vendor has used all due diligence to enforce the execution of the provisions of the Act and the regulations; and
- (b) By what person the offence has been committed; and
- (c) That it has been committed without the knowledge, consent, or connivance of the said vendor, and in contravention of his orders—

the inspector shall proceed against the person whom he believes to be the actual offender, without first proceeding against the said vendor.

21. In any proceedings in respect of offences against the Act or the regulations—

Evidence in proceedings under the Act.

- (a) No proof shall be required of the authority of an inspector to take proceedings, or of the appointment of an inspector; and
- (b) It shall lie on the defendant to prove that in respect of any dried fruits or packages of dried fruits, the provisions of the Act and the regulations have been complied with.

22. Every person who does not do anything directed to be done, or does anything forbidden to be done by or under the Act or the regulations, shall be liable to the penalty expressly provided therefor; and if no penalty is expressly provided therefor, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

General penalties.

23. The occupier of every packing shed shall cause a copy of these regulations to be conspicuously displayed in such packing shed, and there constantly maintained clean, visible, and legible.

And Colonel the Honorable Murray William James Bouchier, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
