Minimum charge, One pound.

The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1925, and shall be due and payable on the first day of July, 1925. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect rates and charges hereby made.

- (d) For water supplied by measure, the sum of One shilling per thousand gallons of water consumed—30,000 gallons to be the minimum quantity to be charged for under this section.

2. The rate hereby made shall be due and payable on the 15th day of January, 1925, at the Shire Office, Wedderburn.

3. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. Waste of Water.—Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### MORWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.

When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would equal the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

7. The Trust may by notice in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

8. In all cases not herein provided for the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of February, 1925.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such provision as may be deemed necessary.

No. 8. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 9. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance, on the first day of January, 1925.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

**T**HE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

##### PART I.

1. A rate for year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1915* within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council, according to the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes other than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

##### PART II.

#### *The Beaufort Water Supply.*

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water) save as hereinafter provided, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden upon a tenement and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement. For each water trough (public) supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings; for every steam-boiler supplied, the sum of Fifteen shillings. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

(b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and the Goldfields Reservoir, situate to the north and south respectively of the Township of Beaufort, and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

##### PART III.

#### *The Joint Water Supply.*

4. The rates and charges hereinafter mentioned are those which the owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the joint water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council and which is supplied by the Council with water from the race by pipe having a tap attached thereto, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

5. "The Joint Water Supply" means the race running from the springs at Mt. Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

##### PART IV.

#### *The Waterloo Water Supply.*

6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of One pound per annum.

7. "The Waterloo Water Supply" means "The Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the Parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about five miles in a northerly direction from the Township of Beaufort.

##### PART V.

8. Such rate as aforesaid is made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of October, 1924, and ending on the thirtieth day of September, 1925, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the Water Acts.

9. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

# REGULATIONS UNDER THE INDUSTRIAL AND PROVIDENT SOCIETIES ACT 1924.

## REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Industrial and Provident Societies Act 1924* and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the regulations following, that is to say:—

### Applications to Register Societies or Amendments of Rules.

Section 5 (2), Form A.

1. Every application to register a society under the *Industrial and Provident Societies Act 1924* (in these regulations termed "the Act") shall be in Form "A" subjoined to these regulations, and shall be sent to the Registrar.

### Section 10 (2).

2. An amendment of the rules of a society may be either—

(a) a partial amendment, consisting of the addition of a new rule or rules, or part of a rule or rules, to the existing rules, or the substitution of a new rule or rules, or part of a rule or rules, for any of the existing rules, or any part thereof, or a rescission of any of the existing rules, or any part thereof, without any substitution thereof, or more than one or all of the foregoing;

(b) a complete amendment, consisting of the substitution of an entire set of rules for the existing rules, and bearing at the beginning the words "All previous rules rescinded."

### Forms B and C.

3. An application to register a partial amendment of rules must be made by the secretary of the society in Form B, and must be sent to the Registrar, accompanied by a statutory declaration in Form C, and by a printed copy of the existing rules marked to show where the alterations occur, and what they are, and by the following documents:—

(a) If the partial amendment consists of the addition or substitution of a new rule or rules, three copies of such new rule or rules, each copy being marked "O" and signed by five members and the secretary.

(b) If the partial amendment consists of the rescission of any of the rules without any substitution, three copies of the resolution for such rescission, each copy being marked "O" and signed by five members and the secretary.

### Form D.

4. An application to register a complete amendment of rules must be made by the secretary of the society in Form D, and must be sent to the Registrar, accompanied by a statutory declaration in Form C and by a copy of the existing rules, and by three copies of the new rules, each of the latter copies being marked "P," and signed by five members and the secretary.

### Cancelling and Suspension of Registration.

#### Section 9, Form E.

5. Every request to cancel registration must be sent to the Registrar in Form E, and shall name some newspaper circulating in or about the locality in which the registered office of the society is situated, wherein it is desired that the cancelling of registration shall be published, and shall be accompanied by the sum requisite to defray the cost of such publication in such newspaper and also in the *Government Gazette*.

6. When application is made to cancel registration under the compulsory powers of the Registrar, he may require it to be made in duplicate in such form and supported by such evidence by statutory declaration as he may direct, and the Registrar shall transmit one copy of such application to the Minister for his consent.

#### Form F.

7. Notice before cancelling or suspending registration shall be in Form F.

#### Forms G and H.

8. The cancelling of registration shall be in Form G, and the suspension or renewal of suspension of registration shall be in Form H.

#### Form I.

9. The advertisement of cancelling or suspension of registration shall be in Form I.

### Registered Office.

#### Section 12.

10. Notice of the situation of the registered office of a society on first registration shall be deemed to be given by the rule providing for the place of office. Where a society has been registered and notice of its registered office given before the 11th day of November, 1924, such office shall be deemed to be its registered office unless and until notice of change of office, duly sent as herein provided, has been or may be received by the Registrar.

### Form J.

Every notice of a change in the situation of the registered office of a society shall be sent to the Registrar in triplicate in Form J within fourteen days after every such change, and the Registrar shall return to the society one copy bearing a memorandum of his receipt thereof.

### Section 16 (4), Form K.

11. The certificate of the Registrar required by section 16 (4) of documents sent or given to or registered with him shall be in Form K.

### Inspection of Books by Order of the Registrar.

#### Section 20, Form L.

12. Every application to the Registrar for the appointment of an accountant or actuary to inspect the books of a society and to report thereon shall be in Form L.

### Nominations.

#### Section 24.

13. Every registered society shall keep a record or register of all nominations made by its members under section 24 of the Act, and of all variations and revocations of the same; and for the recording or registering of every such nomination, variation, or revocation the rules of the society may require, the member nominating to pay a sum not exceeding Sixpence.

### Disputes.

#### Section 40, Form M.

14. Every reference of a dispute to the Registrar shall be written on foolscap paper in duplicate in Form M, and upon receipt of the reference the Registrar shall transmit one copy thereof to the Minister for his consent.

### Form N.

15. Every notice of hearing by the Registrar, and every requisition for the attendance of parties and witnesses and the production of books and documents, shall be in Form N.

### Section 40 (3), Form O.

16. When it is necessary to enforce the attendance of a particular witness, or the production of a particular document, notice shall be given in Form O.

### Form P.

17. If an order for discovery is necessary, it shall be in Form P.

### Form Q.

18. The determination and order of the Registrar shall be in Form Q, or as near thereto as the circumstances of the case may in his judgment permit.

### Inspectors and Special Meetings.

#### Section 41, Forms R and S.

19. An application for appointment of inspectors, or for calling a special meeting, shall be sent to the Registrar written on foolscap paper in duplicate in Form R, and shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in Form S by three at least of the applicants.

20. The Registrar may, immediately upon receipt of the application, transmit one copy thereof to the Minister for his consent, or may before such transmission give notice of the application to the society, and transmit to the Minister, with a copy of the application, any answer the society may make.

### Form T.

21. The appointment of inspectors shall be in Form T, or as near thereto as circumstances may permit.

### Form U.

22. The notice of special meeting shall be in Form U, and shall be given by letter addressed to every member, or by advertisement, or in such other manner as the Registrar may direct.

23. The chairman of the special meeting shall report to the Registrar the resolution or resolutions passed thereat, and any other matters he may think proper to report.

### Special Resolutions.

#### Section 43, Forms V and W.

24. Every application for approval of change of name must be made in duplicate in Form V, and must be sent to the Registrar accompanied by a statutory declaration in Form W. If approved, the word "Approved" shall be written at the foot or end of each copy, and the same shall be signed by the Registrar.

### Section 44, Form X.

25. Every application to register a special resolution for the amalgamation of societies must be made by each of the societies in duplicate in Form X, and must be sent to the Registrar accompanied by statutory declarations by officers of each society in Form W. No acknowledgment of registration of such special resolution shall be given to either society until special resolutions in the like terms have been submitted for registration by the other or others.

## Forms Y and Z.

26. Every application to register a special resolution for the transfer of the engagements of a society to another must be in duplicate in Form Y, and must be sent to the Registrar accompanied by statutory declarations in Forms W and Z.

## Section 45, Form AA.

27. Every application to register a special resolution for converting a society into a company must be in triplicate in Form AA, and must be sent to the Registrar accompanied by a statutory declaration in the Form W.

## Form AB.

28. An application to register a special resolution for amalgamation with or for transfer of engagements to a company must be in duplicate in Form X, or Y, as the case may be, with the necessary modifications to suit the facts, and must be sent to the Registrar accompanied by statutory declarations in Forms W and AB.

29. A special resolution shall be registered by writing at the foot or end of each copy thereof the word "Registered," and by affixing thereto the seal of the Registrar.

30. When the special resolution is for conversion into, amalgamation with, or transfer of all the engagements of a society to a company, the following words shall be added:—"The registration of the society called.....is hereby cancelled."

## Sections 48 and 49, Forms AC and AD.

31. Every instrument of dissolution shall be in Form AC, and shall be signed in duplicate and accompanied by a statutory declaration in Form AD, and by a statement naming some newspaper circulating in or about the locality in which the registered office of the society is situated, wherein it is desired that the notice of dissolution shall be published, and by the sum necessary to pay the cost of such publication, and of the publication of such notice in the *Government Gazette*.

## Form AE.

32. The Registrar shall return one of the duplicates to the society with an acknowledgment of registration in Form AE.

33. Alterations in the instrument of dissolution shall be signed, declared to, and registered in like manner.

## Form AF.

34. The advertisement of dissolution by instrument shall be in Form AF.

## Section 49 (a), Form AG.

35. The award of the Registrar for appropriation or division of funds and property shall be in Form AG.

## Forms AH and AI.

36. Notice of any proceedings to set aside a dissolution shall be in Form AH, and notice of any order setting aside a dissolution shall be in Form AI.

## Fees.

## Section 66.

37. The following fees shall be paid in advance for matters to be transacted, for the inspection of documents, and for certified copies or extracts of documents:—

38. No fee is payable for the registration or recording of—

- Any notice of change of office.
- The cancelling or suspension of the registration of a society.
- Any instrument of dissolution, or any alteration therein.
- Any document in respect of which a fee is already chargeable under or by virtue of the Act or any other Act.

39. The sum of Two shillings and sixpence out of every fee exceeding Two shillings and sixpence in amount payable under these regulations in respect of matters transacted by the Registrar shall be payable to such person as may be for the time being appointed by the Registrar, by writing under his hand, to be his clerk, for the proper use of such clerk.

40. For every copy or extract of any document in the custody of the Registrar there shall be payable the reasonable stationer's charges for making the same, and the amount so payable shall be paid to the Registrar for the use of such person as he may employ to make the copy or extract, in addition to any fee payable in respect of such copy or extract.

## Modification of Forms.

41. When anything is required to be in any of the forms hereto annexed it shall be sufficient if it be to the like effect, and such forms may be modified by the authority of the Registrar to suit particular cases.

The Registrar may require further evidence by statutory declaration in addition to that expressly prescribed by these regulations in any case in which he may deem it expedient.

## Offences.

42. Every duty imposed by these regulations upon any society shall be deemed to be a duty imposed upon every officer charged by the rules of the society with the performance thereof, and upon every member of the committee of management thereof (by whatever name called) who is not proved to have been ignorant of or to have endeavoured to prevent any breach of any such duty complained of.

43. Every society and every officer or member thereof guilty of any act or default contrary to these regulations shall for every such act or default be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR SHOW AND RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF KANIVA.

**W**E, William Henry Bond, Edward Sharp, Theodore Philip Kelly, Fredrick Thomas Sherriff, John Mann Goldsworthy, James Crothers Leason, Charles Edward Daniels, John Hicks, and Thomas Fredrick Chatfield, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Kaniva Show and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 25 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Three shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve, and Two shillings and sixpence for every motor car or vehicle admitted.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without permission from the committee of management first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The committee of management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained, and when a charge is made at the gate the committee has the power to make a charge equal to 10 per cent. of the gate takings for the use of the Reserve.

9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

11. Any society or club may be called upon to make good any damage done during the time the Reserve is being used by such club or society, and may be required to deposit a sum of £10 by way of guarantee that any such damages will be made good.

12. Any club or society wishing to erect permanent buildings on the Reserve or make any alterations to any permanent buildings, must submit plan and specification showing the proposed building or alterations for approval to the committee of management.

13. Any club or society using the Reserve may be called upon to pay 5 per cent. on all members' tickets to the committee of management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending.

### CITY OF BALLAARAT.

By-LAW No. 106.

A By-law of the City of Ballarat made under the Health Acts, and numbered 106 for the purpose of prescribing the fees to be charged for the registration of certain premises required under the said Acts to be registered and for the renewal of such registrations and for any transfer of registration thereof pursuant to the said Acts.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballarat, make this By-law and order as follows:—

1. The fees to be charged, received and taken by the Council of the City of Ballarat for the registration of the premises described in the Schedule hereto and for annual renewals thereof, and for any transfers of such registrations respectively, pursuant to the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*, shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto.
2. Such fees shall be paid to the Town Clerk by any person making application for such registration, renewal, or transfer respectively.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Ballarat.

#### SCHEDULE REFERRED TO IN THIS BY-LAW.

(a) For every registration and for every annual renewal of registration of premises—

#### Nature of Premises, Fees Payable.

- Offensive trades premises (other than piggeries)—Five pounds.
- Piggeries (where the usual number of pigs does not exceed ten)—Two pounds two shillings.
- Piggeries (where usual number of pigs exceeds ten)—Five pounds.
- Cattle sale yards—Five pounds.
- Boardinghouses—Ten shillings.
- Common lodging houses—Ten shillings.
- Eating houses—Ten shillings.

**TOWN OF MORDIALLOC.**

**BY-LAW No. 53.**

A By-law of the Town of Mordialloc, made under Division 1 of Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and under section 58 of the *Explosives Act 1915*, and numbered 53, for preventing and extinguishing fires and for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in Part VII. (2) of the Thirteenth Schedule to the first-mentioned Act, and for regulating or prohibiting the storage of inflammable materials. Whereas the unrestricted storage within the Town of Mordialloc of building material, firewood, coal, and other materials hereinafter mentioned, in the opinion of the Council by reason of their inflammable nature and their likelihood to cause the spread of fires in the said town would be dangerous to tenements in proximity to the place of storage thereof respectively:

And whereas in the opinion of the said Council it is necessary to make provision for preventing and extinguishing fires within the said town as hereafter provided:

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and the *Explosives Act 1915*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Mordialloc order as follows:—

1. No person shall within the Town of Mordialloc pile, stack, or store or cause or permit to be piled, stacked, or stored or leave piled, stacked, or stored or deposited any cut or uncut

timber, lathwood, firewood, casks, barrels, cases, or inflammable material in or on any timber yard—

- (a) so as to prevent or impede in case of fire, access to or exit from any adjoining land or tenement;
  - (b) adjoining a dwelling house which is not in the same occupation as such timber yard unless the owner or occupier of such timber has within such time as may be appointed by the Council provided a wall of brick or fireproof material to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, certified in writing under his hand for preventing the spread of fire from such timber yard to such dwelling house;
  - (c) so that there is a distance of less than 10 feet between any part of such building material and any furnace other than a furnace designed for seasoning timber;
  - (d) to a height exceeding the shortest distance from any part of such building on land which is not in the same occupation as the said timber yard or to any street or right-of-way on which the said timber yard adjoins, if under 33 feet in width, unless enclosed with a wall of brick or other fireproof material erected within the time mentioned in paragraph (b) of this clause to the satisfaction of the said Surveyor in manner aforesaid;
  - (e) to a height exceeding four-fifths of the height of any such wall as aforesaid;
  - (f) to a height exceeding 20 feet; or
  - (g) upon the roof of any building construction or erection.
2. (a) For the purpose of extinction of fire there will be provided in every timber yard one or more fire plugs with water laid on thereto from the street mains with such hydrants and hose properly fitted with couplings and such other appliances as the Surveyor shall, by written notice to the occupier of such place direct and so placed respectively as shall be required by the said Surveyor.
- (b) Such plugs, hydrants, hose couplings, and other appliances and each of them shall be kept in good order and condition to the satisfaction of the said Surveyor and ready for immediate use.
3. (a) From and after the date of the coming into operation of this By-law no person shall occupy or use any place as a timber yard or any extension of any existing timber yard without obtaining a licence to occupy such site from the Council of the said town under the hand of the Town Clerk or acting Town Clerk in the form set out in the Schedule hereto with such variations (if any) as circumstances may require.
- (b) Such licence shall not be granted if in the opinion of the said Council the storage of building material in such timber yard or extension as aforesaid would be dangerous to dwelling houses or tenements in proximity to such timber yard or extension in case of fire.
- (c) Such licence may be revoked at any time by the said Council if the provisions of this By-law or any of them are in its opinion not observed or performed by the licensee.
- (d) Notwithstanding the grant of such licence the provisions of clauses 1 and 3 of this By-law shall apply to such timber yard or extension and the owner or occupier thereof.
- (e) Paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of this clause shall not apply to any timber yard in existence on the coming into operation of this By-law.
4. (a) No firewood, coal, coke, or other fuel exceeding in measurement 200 cubic feet shall be deposited in or on any timber yard in any manner so that there is a distance of less than 10 feet between any part of such firewood, coal, coke, or other fuel and any other dwelling house or tenement which is not in the same occupation as such timber yard unless a brick wall at least 9 inches in thickness and 6 feet in height is within the time mentioned in paragraph (b) of clause 1 of this By-law erected on the boundary of such land adjoining any such dwelling house or tenement and such wall is of such length as shall be determined by the Surveyor in writing under his hand.
- (b) The height of such firewood, coal, coke, or other fuel referred to in paragraph (a) hereof shall not exceed five-sixths of the height of such wall.
5. This By-law shall not apply to any timber yard or tenement occupied by a person engaged in carrying on any trade or business which he was carrying on in such timber yard or tenement on the 1st day of January, 1886.
6. In this By-law "building material" means timber, lathwood, or wood of any description capable of being or intended to be used for or in the construction or renovation of any building, erection, or fencing, or for the manufacture of any chattel, and whether cut or uncut, or seasoned, partly seasoned, or unseasoned. "Deposited" includes kept, placed, stacked, or stored, and "deposit" has a corresponding meaning. "Timber yard" means any place or part of a place or in which building material is deposited. "Surveyor" means the building surveyor of the said town, and words importing the singular include the plural and the plural the singular, and the word person includes a corporation.
7. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty

of not more than £20 nor less than 10s. and to a further penalty of not more than £5 nor less than 5s. for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

9. This By-law shall come into operation from and after the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
