Act No. 2713, Section 71 (1). REGULATIONS.—PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.— CHAPTER II.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Chapter II. of the Public Service Regulations as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:— I. Add-

4A. Assistant, Public Library.—A candidate for appointment to the position of Assistant, Public Library, must be not less than fifteen nor more than twenty-one years of age, and must have passed examinations qualifying him to enter the University of Melbourne, or such examinations as the Commissioner may deem equivalent, and must at some such examination have passed in English and two other languages.

A candidate selected for the office of Assistant, Public Library, shall be appointed at the minimum salary assigned to the position as set forth in the schedule.

to the position as set forth in the schedule.

Such appointment shall be on probation only, and may be terminated at any time during probation. Period of probation shall not exceed twelve months.

An Assistant shall be required to pass in at least six subjects in either the arts or the science course for a degree at the 'University of Melbourne (or such examination as the Commissioner may deem equivalent) within three years of his appointment. Should he fail to do so, he shall not, except as hereinafter provided, be considered eligible for promotion to a higher class.

An Assistant, Class "E," shall be eligible for promotion to Class "D" on attaining the age of twenty-three years, provided he has graduated at the University of Melbourne or other University of similar standing, or can satisfy the Commissioner that he has linguistic or other special educational qualifications that may be regarded as equivalent to the possession of such a degree, and has had experience as an Assistant for a period or at least two years, and is able to satisfy the Commissioner as to his suitability for library work.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust. the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursannee of the provisions of the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges herein specified are those which the ce upiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1925 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1925:—

I. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the rate shall be of such percentage on the valuation in each case as shall produce the sum of Twenty-seven shillings and sixpence.

II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the time being, the sum of Two shillings and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

III. For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated separately from any building, Two shillings and ninepence in the pound of the municipal valuation thereof.

IV. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe and not supplied with a service-pipe from the main shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.

V. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile but within half a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter of the assessed rate.

VI. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement shall be paid as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates.

T is recommended to His Excellency the Governor in Council that clause 2 of the Partial that clause 3 of the Regulations under the above Act, made on the seventh day of March, 1923, be rescinded, and that the following new clause be substituted in lieu thereof:—

- 3. The following procedure shall be followed in the selection of persons for nomination as members of the Board by the subsidized institutions and benevolent societies within the metropolis (other than hospitals) and the subsidized institutions and benevolent societies outside the metropolis (other than hospitals) respectively. pitals), respectively :-
 - (a) The committee of each institution or benevolent society may submit to the Treasurer of Victoria, under the heads of its president and its secretary, not later than the 30th day of April in each year in which nominations are to be made, the name of one person qualified for appointment. In cases in which there is not a committee, the nomination may be signed by such person or persons who are recognized by the Treasurer as the controlling authority.
 - (b) Should the total number of names submitted by all the committees or controlling authorities of the various institutions and benevolent societies concerned, within and outside the metropolis respectively, exceed the number of three, the Treasurer shall cause ballot-papers to be prepared with the names of all persons submitted for nomination by the committees and controlling authorities concerned printed thereon in alphabetical order, and cause one of such ballot-papers to be forwarded by registered letter to the committee or controlling authority of each institution and benevolent society. and benevolent society.
 - (c) Upon the receipt of the ballot-paper the committee or controlling authority of each institution or benevolent society will vote for not more than three persons, named thereon, indicating its preference by placing the figures 1, 2, and 3 opposite to the names of the persons for whom it desires to vote in order of preference. preference.
 - 'd) Each ballot-paper must be signed by the president and the secretary to the institution or benevolent society concerned (or in cases where there is not a committee, the ballot-paper will be signed by the person or persons referred to in sub-clause (a), and must be forwarded by registered letter so as to reach the Treasurer not later than the 15th day of June in the year in which nominations are to be made.
 - 'e) The Treasurer shall appoint some persons to count the votes and report the result to him. The three per-sons whom the officer so appointed reports as having been elected shall be deemed to have been nominated by the subsidized institutions and benevolent societies
 - 'f) In counting the votes the officers appointed shall, so far as is practicable, follow the procedure laid down under the preferential system for the time being in force for the election of senators for the Common-wealth of Australia.
 - y) In the event of two or more candidates obtaining an equal number of votes at an election, the officer counting the votes shall determine by lot which per-son or persons shall be nominated.
 - (h) Should any difficulty or dispute arise in regard to the election or nomination of persons nominated as members of the Board, the same shall be submitted to the Treasurer of Victoria for his determination, and his decision shall be final.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

A By-law of the Shire of Glenelg, made under section 635 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 17, for regulating the Market place and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the Market is to be held.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President. Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Glenelg order as follows:—

1. The Market shall be known as the "Glenelg Corporation Cattle Market," and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purpose of such Market situated east of Robertson-street, Casterton, and being part of suburban Crown allotment 46, and allotments 47 and 48, Town and Parish of Casterton, County of Dundas, and the said Market shall be used for the sale of cattle as defined by section 3 of the Local Government Act 1915.

2. The said Market shall from sunrise to sunset be open for the sale of cattle on every Thursday. 7. On the afternoon of the day prior to "Market Day" when sales are to be held in the said Market all suctioners.

On the afternoon of the day prior to "Market Day" when sales are to be held in the said Market, all auctioneers and salesmen, or their deputies, shall attend at the Shire Secretary's office, at 2 o'clock p.m., to draw lots for the order of priority of selling, firstly cattle (excluding sheep and including lorses and pigs); and secondly, sheep. And on sale day the auctioneers entitled to sell cattle (other than sheep and including horses and pigs) shall first sell or offer for sale, in the order of priority determined as aforesaid, cows in milk and springing cows and springing heifers.

And after all the cows in milk and springing cows and heifers yarded shall have been sold or offered for sale, the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell or offer for sale, in the order of priority determined as aforesaid fat cattle as deemed

And after all the store cattle yarded shall have been sold or offered for sale, then the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell or offer for sale, in the order of priority determined as above, horses.

And after all the horses yarded shall have been sold or offered for sale, the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell or offer. in the order of priority determined as aforesaid, pigs. And after all the pigs yarded have been sold or offered for sale, then the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell or offer for

sale, in the order of priority determined as aforesaid for sale of sheep, any other cattle for which no special order has been sufficiently defined above or about which there is any doubt in the opinion of the inspector as to when such cattle shall be sold, and the decision of the inspector as to the order of such sales and the time thereof shall be binding on all parties all parties.

No person shall remove cattle from pen or yard to another without the consent of the inspector. In case of any dispute arising as to the overcrowding of pens or yards, or as to priority of occupancy, the inspector alone shall be competent to decide, and the disputants shall be bound by the decide. shall be competent to decide, and the disputants shall be bound by his decision. The inspector shall have authority to remove, or order to be removed, cattle from one pen or yard to another, and any order he may give in that respect shall be promptly carried out and obeyed by any auctioneer, salesman, or other person placing or who has placed cattle in the said pens or yards or any of them.

12. The inspector shall, two minutes before the expiration of the time limit for selling any kind of cattle, give the auctioneer selling notice of the time, and shall at the expiration of the said time ring a bell, and thereupon the auctioneer selling must immediately cease selling.

13. No auctioneer shall offer or attempt to offer any kind of cattle for the second time on the same sale day unless such cattle are offered in conjunction with another lot not previously offered.

14. No person shall on any day sell or offer for sale by auction in the said Market any kind of cattle before sunrise

21. The word "cattle" as above used shall (except where the context otherwise requires) include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, buils, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, caives, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, rams, lambs, wethers, goats, and swine.
