WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the twelfth year of the reign of His present Majesty King George V., entitled the *State Savings Bank Act 1921* (No. 3145), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on such day as the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* proclaim: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation proclaim Wednesday the eleventh day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, as the date on which the *State Savings Bank Act 1921* (No. 3145) shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

 - (a) the wheat-grower;
 - (b) the millers and traders;
 - (c) transport interests, including railways and shipping.
4. The variation in extent of utilization of the facilities from year to year since the completion of the initial installation, and the reasons for such.

Dried Fruits Act 1924 (No. 3380).

NOTICE.

IN accordance with the provisions of section 9 of the above-named Act, notice is hereby given that all persons (including bodies of persons corporate or unincorporate) within the State of Victoria, having on 18th March, 1925, more than 10 cwt. each of Dried Currants, Dried Sultanas, or Dried Lexias owned by them or in their disposal or under their control for the purposes of trade or sale, are required to make, on forms prescribed for that purpose, returns of all such dried fruits so owned or controlled by them.

These forms may be obtained from the Secretary, Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Department of Agriculture, Melbourne, and the returns must be lodged with that officer on or before the 21st day of March, 1925.

The penalty for failure to make such return is a sum of money not exceeding One hundred pounds (£100).

This return need not be supplied by growers whose dried fruits (currants, sultanas, lexias) will be delivered to and processed by a packing-shed registered with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board.

REGULATIONS FOR DECLARING WEIGHT BY MEASUREMENT OF CERTAIN CLASSES OF GOODS, SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.

WHEREAS by section 570 of the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for declaring the weight of any specified descriptions or classes of goods by measurement: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council

thereof, doth by Order made on the 3rd day of March, 1925, make the following Regulation to apply within the Shire of Warrnambool, viz.:—

The whole of the above routes are proscribed for the period ending the 31st December, 1925, and will be reviewed at the end of the period specified.

Stopping Places on Routes.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

REGISTRATION OF PACKING SHEDS.

General.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the Registration of Packing Sheds, and shall come into operation on the 10th day of March, 1925.

Definitions.

2. For the purpose of these Regulations—

"Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias."

"Packing shed" means any building or erection in which dried fruits are stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of trade or sale, whether such building or erection is or is not used for any other purpose.

3. "Registered packing shed" means any packing shed registered with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board and approved by the Department of Agriculture.

4. Applications for registration, which must be accompanied by a fee of £1, must be lodged with the Secretary to the Board, Department of Agriculture, Treasury Gardens, Melbourne, before or on 21st March, 1925, and be in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations.

5. Applications for registration must be made in the name of the occupier of the packing shed, or where the occupier carries on business under the name of a registered firm, or under the name of a public company, in the name of such firm or company.

6. Registration by the Board of any packing shed shall, amongst other things, be subject to any conditions which the Department of Agriculture may impose with respect to—

- the inspection and regulation of packing sheds;
- the suitability of the premises for the stemming, processing, grading, sorting, and packing of dried fruits;
- the fixing of standards of quality for different grades of dried fruits;
- the granting of certifications as to the quality of dried fruits intended for sale.
- the branding or labelling of coverings; and
- the grade descriptions and grade marks of dried fruits.

7. Every packing shed which commences operations after the coming into force of these Regulations shall, within seven days of its commencing operations, apply for registration with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board.

RETURNS TO BE FURNISHED BY PACKING SHEDS.

1. These Regulations shall come into force on the 10th day of March, 1925.

Definitions.**2. For the purpose of these Regulations—**

"Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias.

"Packing shed" means any building or erection in which dried fruits are stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of trade or sale, whether such building or erection is or is not used for any other purpose.

3. Every occupier of a packing shed shall, not later than the Wednesday following each Saturday during the whole of the packing season, furnish to the Board—

(a) a return of the quantities of dried fruits received by him since the date of the previous return;

(b) a return of the quantities and grades of dried fruits forwarded by him to agents, dealers, or purchasers since the last previous return, specifying separately when required the quantities of fruits forwarded for consumption within the Commonwealth and for export overseas.

4. Such returns shall be furnished in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations, and the particulars contained therein shall be verified by statutory declaration when required.

5. Any person to whom this Regulation applies who fails, neglects, or refuses to make such a return shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

SHORT TITLE.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the Registration of Dried Fruit Dealers, and shall come into operation on and from the 10th day of March, 1925.

DEFINITIONS.**2. For the purpose of these Regulations—**

"Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias.

"Dealer" means every person who in any one year sells on his own behalf or on behalf of any other person more than 5 tons of dried fruits, and includes growers who stem, process, grade, sort, or pack dried fruits for sale; or sell dried fruits on their own behalf or on behalf of any other person after such dried fruits have been stemmed, graded, sorted, or packed.

REGISTRATION OF DEALERS.

3. Every person who on the date on which these Regulations came into force was engaged in business as a dealer in dried fruits shall register with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board on or before the 21st day of March, 1925.

4. Every person who, after the date on which these Regulations came into force, engages in the business of a dealer in dried fruits shall register with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board. Such registration must be made within seven days after the date on which he commences to engage in such business.

5. Every dealer as aforesaid shall apply for registration in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations, and shall furnish the particulars therein required, which shall be verified by statutory declaration.

6. Every person to whom this Regulation applies shall furnish such returns relating to the dried fruits owned by them or in their disposal or under their control, as may be prescribed from time to time.

7. Any person to whom this Regulation applies who fails, neglects, or refuses to register as a dealer shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Dried Fruits Act to make Regulations for all matters and things necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the Act into effect, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

RETURNS OF STOCKS OF DRIED FRUITS.

1. All persons (including bodies of persons corporate or unincorporate) within the State of Victoria, having on the eighteenth day of March, 1925, more than 10 cwt. each of dried currants, dried sultanas, or dried lexias, owned by them or in their disposal or under their control for the purposes of trade or sale, are hereby required to make returns of all such dried fruits so owned or controlled by them.
2. Returns relating to such stocks of dried currants, dried sultanas, or dried lexias as aforesaid shall be furnished in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations, and all particulars contained therein shall be verified by statutory declaration.
3. The forms must be completed and lodged with the Secretary, Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Department of Agriculture, Treasury Gardens, Melbourne, on or before the twenty-first day of March, 1925.
4. Persons whose stocks of dried fruits (currants, sultanas, and lexias) will be delivered to and processed by a packing shed registered with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board are exempted from furnishing a return as required by clause 1 of these Regulations.
5. Any person to whom these Regulations apply who fails, neglects, or refuses to make such a return shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

For appointing subject to the limits prescribed in the said By-laws the several sums to be paid for Licences for Motor Omnibuses plying for hire as Municipal Stage Carriages:

For regulating the manner in which the name of the Municipality and the number of each carriage corresponding with the number of its licence shall be displayed thereon:

For regulating the conduct of the owners, drivers, and conductors of motor omnibuses plying as Municipal Stage Carriages within the common prescribed space in their several employments, and determining whether such drivers or conductors shall wear any and what badges, and for regulating the days and hours within which they may exercise their calling:

For regulating the number of persons to be carried by motor omnibuses plying for hire as Municipal Stage Carriages, and in what manner such number is to be shown upon such carriage, and in what position and manner the lamp where required hereby to be placed inside Municipal Stage Carriages is to be placed therein:

For fixing the rates or fares as well for time as for distance to be paid by passengers in motor omnibuses plying for hire as Municipal Stage Carriages, and the mode in which such rates or fares are to be painted or marked on every such carriage:

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sebastopol, and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shires of Ballaarat, Bungaree, Buninyong, and Grenville respectively, make the following regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the common prescribed space of the above named Municipalities, that is to say:—

1. Throughout this regulation the following words and expressions shall have the meaning hereinafter respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

"Conductor" shall include every person other than the driver who attends upon the omnibus and upon the passengers in any omnibus.

"The Inspector" shall mean any person who by appointment of any of the said Councils shall be an Inspector or Assistant Inspector of Hackney Carriages and Municipal Stage Carriages.

"Municipal Stage Carriage" shall mean a motor vehicle registered under the *Motor Car Act* 1915, and used in standing or plying for hire for passengers at separate fares, and which upon every journey goes from or comes to any place within the common prescribed space for the said Municipalities to or from any other place within such common prescribed space.

"Omnibus" and "Motor Omnibus" shall mean a motor vehicle duly registered under the *Motor Car Act* 1915 and licensed to ply for hire as a Municipal Stage Carriage.

"Owner" includes every person who either alone or in partnership with any other person keeps or is concerned otherwise than as a driver or attendant in the keeping, employing, or letting to hire of any omnibus licensed to ply for hire as a Municipal Stage Carriage, and includes also an owner acting as a driver or attendant.

"Passenger" includes every person carried by any omnibus licensed to ply for hire as a Municipal Stage Carriage except one driver and (where there shall be a conductor to such Municipal Stage Carriage) one conductor.

2. For every licence for an omnibus there shall be paid to the Council granting the same, before the issue thereof, the licence fee of £2 for each in which the licence is granted, and if such licence be granted for part only of a year, such licence fee shall be apportioned accordingly, but the minimum licence fee for any portion of a year shall be 15s.

3. For every licence as a driver or conductor of an omnibus there shall be paid to the Council granting the same, before the issue thereof, the annual fee of 10s.

4. The application for a licence by an owner of an omnibus and the licences of owners, drivers, and conductors of omnibuses, shall be in such of the forms contained in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect as shall be applicable.

5. All licences in respect of omnibuses granted under the said By-laws or this Regulation shall be issued by the Council of the City of Ballaarat at the office of the Town Clerk of such city.

6. Every owner of an omnibus shall cause the number of such omnibus corresponding with the number of its licence to be painted, marked, or fixed in figures not less than 1 inch in height and of a proportionate width on a plate affixed in a conspicuous position both on the inside and outside of such omnibus.

7. Every owner of an omnibus shall cause to be painted or marked in figures of not less than 1 inch in length and of a proportionate breadth the number of passengers the licence for such omnibus permits to be carried, and such figures shall be painted on the omnibus on the outside and inside thereof, or on plates affixed to the outside and inside of the omnibus, and in each instance in conspicuous places and in legible letters.

8. Every owner of an omnibus shall at all times when such omnibus may be plying for hire, whether on an authorized stand or on a route, cause a statement in legible letters and figures of the fares to be demanded and received from the persons using or carried for hire in such omnibus to be exhibited on a suitable board or place affixed to the inside of the door or otherwise in some conspicuous position on the inside of such omnibus.

9. Every owner, driver, and conductor respectively of an omnibus shall conform to the following provisions:—

(1) He shall not at any time when such omnibus is plying for hire cause or suffer any part of any plate on which the number of such omnibus corresponding with the number of its licence shall be displayed to be concealed from public view, or any part of the statement of fares which shall be exhibited on such omnibus to be concealed from the view of any passenger, or any such plate or statement to be inverted.

(2) He shall in every case where he shall knowingly have carried in such omnibus any person afflicted with any dangerous infectious disorder forthwith give information thereof to the Inspector.

(3) He shall not cause such omnibus to loiter on the public thoroughfares within the City of Ballaarat or Borough of Sebastopol or the said Shires, or to stop in any such thoroughfare (except upon an authorized stand or for a period of not more than three minutes on an authorized stopping place) for any longer time than is necessary for the taking up and setting down of passengers desirous of entering or leaving such omnibus.

(4) He shall bring such omnibus or cause the same to be brought to a standstill whenever to his knowledge any person shall be desirous of leaving such omnibus, and whenever any intending passenger shall be desirous of entering such omnibus, or when such omnibus is plying for hire and is not already occupied by the full number of persons authorized to be carried by such omnibus.

(5) He shall not whenever any person shall be entering or leaving such omnibus wilfully start such omnibus or cause the same to be started before such passenger shall be seated in or upon such omnibus, or shall have alighted from the same, as the case may be.

(6) He shall not use or permit such omnibus to be used for the conveyance of merchandise, goods, or wares other than the luggage of passengers, and no driver shall be obliged to take any luggage unless the same be clean and not calculated to injure the omnibus.

10. Every driver and every conductor respectively of an omnibus shall conform to the following provisions:—

(1) He shall at all times when driving or being in attendance upon such omnibus and such omnibus is plying for hire wear attached to his outer clothing in such manner as to be plainly and distinctly visible a badge or other distinguishing mark on which shall be plainly and legibly marked the number of the licence granted to such driver or conductor, and in the case of a driver the words "Licensed Driver," and in the case of a conductor "Licensed Conductor."

(2) He shall not cause, suffer, or allow a greater number of passengers to be carried by such omnibus at any one time than the number specified on the licence issued in respect of such omnibus.

(3) He shall, when such omnibus is plying for hire but is not actually being used for the conveyance of passengers, station such omnibus in an authorized stand (not being one already being occupied by the full number of omnibuses authorized to occupy such stand).

- (4) He shall at all times between sunset and sunrise, when such omnibus is plying for hire, provide a lamp or lamps denoting the direction in which such omnibus is proceeding, and keep such lamp or lamps properly trimmed or lighted.
