IN accordance with the provisions of section 9 of the above-named Act, notice is hereby given that all persons (including bodies of persons corporate or unincorporate) with-in the State of Victoria, having on 18th March, 1925, more than 10 cwt. each of Dried Currants, Dried Sultanas, or Dried Lexias owned by them or in their disposal or under their control for the purposes of trade or sale, are required to make, on forms prescribed for that purpose, returns of all such dried fruits so owned or controlled by them.

PRESCRIBING ROUTES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN AREA ALONG WHICH MOTOR OMNIBUSES FOR WHICH "REGULAR SERVICE" LICENCES ARE GRANTED MAY PLY FOR HIRE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of March, 1925.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Allan Sir A. J. Peacock Dr. Argyle Mr. Downward Colonel Bourchier Mr. Crockett.

H IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Motor Omnibus Act 1924 (No. 3378), doth by this Order prescribe a further route within the metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the Motor Omnibus Act may ply for hire, also sections and terminal points and stopping places on such routes, time-tables to be observed by owners of motor omnibuses plying for hire, fares to be charged, and the maximum number of motor omnibuses which may be licensed to ply for hire on such prescribed route, as set forth in detail in the Schedule hereunder:—

The whole of the above routes are prescribed for the period ending the 31st December, 1925, and will be reviewed at the end of the period specified.

Stopping Places on Routes.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The farce to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the farce charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 11 (1) (c) of the Motor Omnibus Act 1924, the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the licensing authority full power and authority for carrying into effect by the said licensing authority all of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

And the Honorable George Louis Goudie, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AMENDMENT OF BY LAW No. 4, MADE BY THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN TRAMWAYS BOARD, PRESCRIBING TOLLS, FARES, AND CHARGES.

H IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of Section 55 (2) of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Transvays Act 1918 (No. 2995), doth by this Order further amend By law No. 4, made by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Transways Board and approved by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of March, 1921, in the manner following, that is to say:—

- 4. Every person who, after the date on which these Regulations came into force, engages in the business of a dealer in dried fruits shall register with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board. Such registration must be made within seven days after the date on which he commences to engage in such business.
- 5. Every dealer as aforesaid shall apply for registration in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations, and shall furnish the particulars therein required, which shall be verified by statutory declaration.
