FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the nineteenth day of May, 1925:

Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the sixteenth day of June, 1925.

Given under my Hand and the Scal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and in the sixteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V
