### RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and any other powers hereunto enabling, the following rules are made and shall take effect as from the 1st day of June, 1925:—

### RULES OF PROCEDURE IN CIVIL PROCEEDINGS.

### ORDER XLIA.

- 1. Any application under Section 3 (1) of the Supreme Court Act 1923 The application. for leave to have a judgment obtained in a superior Court in England or Scotland or any Court in Ireland which may be declared by the Governor in Council to be a superior Court within the meaning of the Act registered in the Supreme Court shall be made to a Judge on summons.
- 2. The application shall be supported by an affidavit of the facts The affidavit exhibiting the judgment or a verified or certified or otherwise duly authenticated copy thereof and stating that to the best of the information and belief of the deponent the judgment creditor is entitled to enforce the judgment and the judgment does not fall within any of the cases in which under Section 3 (2) of the Act a judgment cannot properly be ordered to be registered. The affidavit must also so far as the deponent can do so give the full name, title, trade or business and usual or last known place of abode or business of the judgment creditor and judgment debtor respectively. The affidavit shall set out where necessary the calculations by which the amount of the judgment has been arrived at.
- 4. The summons for leave to register shall (unless otherwise ordered by service of a judge) be served in the same manner as a writ of summons is required to be served.
- 5. Any order giving leave to register shall be drawn up by or on behalf The order. of the judgment creditor.
- 6. The order giving leave to register the judgment shall state the Form of order. time within which the judgment debtor is to be entitled to apply to set aside the registration. Such time where the judgment debtor is or is ordinarily resident within the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court shall ordinarily be fourteen days after service of the notice of registration hereinafter mentioned and when the judgment debtor is or is ordinarily resident out of the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court shall depend on the distance from Melbourne of the place where the judgment debtor resides, and the postal facilities between Melbourne and that place and shall ordinarily be the same time as is limited for entering appearance after service out of the jurisdiction of a writ of summons or notice thereof.
- 7. The register of judgments ordered to be registered under the Act The register. shall be kept in the Prothonotary's office by or under the direction of the Prothonotary. The judgment shall be registered therein in accordance with the order giving leave to register it.
- 8. The register shall be arranged in alphabetical order in the surname required of the judgment debtor and there shall be entered in the register the date of the order for registration and of the registration the name, title, trade or business and usual or last known place of abode or business of the judgment debtor and judgment creditor and the amount for which the judgment is signed and any special directions in the order for registration as to such registration or execution thereon and the particulars of any execution issued thereon.

Notice of registration.

9. Notice in writing of the registration of the judgment together with a copy of the order giving leave to register must be served on the judgment debtor within a reasonable time after such registration. Such service shall be in such manner as the judge may at any time direct and the judge may direct service out of the jurisdiction or substituted service either within or without the jurisdiction. If there be no direction by the judge service shall be personal.

Form of notice.

10. The notice of registration shall contain full particulars of the judgment registered and of the order for such registration and shall state the name and address of the judgment creditor or of his solicitor or agent on whom and at which service of any summons issued by the judgment debtor may be served. The notice shall state that the defendant is entitled if he has grounds for doing so to apply to set aside the registration and shall also state the number of days for applying to set aside the registration limited by the order giving leave to register.

Endorsement of service.

11. The party serving the notice shall within three days at most after such service endorse on the notice or a copy or duplicate thereof the day of the month and week of the service thereof otherwise the judgment creditor shall not be at liberty to issue execution on the judgment; and every affidavit of service of such notice shall mention the day on which such endorsement was made. This rule shall apply to substituted as well as other service. The three days limited by this rule may under special circumstances be extended by order of a judge.

Application to set aside registration. 12. The judgment debtor may at any time within the time limited by the order apply by summons to a judge to set aside the registration or to suspend execution on the judgment and the judge on such application if satisfied that the case comes within one of the cases in which under Section 3 (2) of the Act no judgment can be ordered to be registered or that it is not just or convenient that the judgment should be enforced in Victoria or for other sufficient reason may order that the registration be set aside or execution on the judgment suspended either unconditionally or on such terms as he thinks fit and either altogether or until such time as he shall direct: Provided that the judge may allow the application to be made at any time after the expiration of the time herein mentioned.

Summons to

13. The summons referred to in rule 12 shall be intituled in the same manner as the affidavit referred to in rule 3.

Execution.

14. No execution shall issue on a judgment registered under the Act until after the expiration of the time limited for applying to set aside the registration: Provided that the judge who makes the order for such registration or a judge at Chambers may at any time order that the execution shall be suspended for a longer time.

Affidavit of service.

15. Any party desirous of issuing execution on a judgment registered under the Act must file in the Prothonotary's office an affidavit of the service of the notice of registration and of a copy of the order authorizing registration.

Form of writ of execution,

16. A writ of execution on a judgment registered under the Act may be thus varied:—Instead of "which said sum of money and interest were lately before us in our Supreme Court" &c., insert "which said sum of money and interest were lately in \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_(describing the court in which judgment was obtained)" &c., "and which judgment has been duly registered in our Supreme Court pursuant to the Supreme Court Act 1923."

Certified copy of judgment.

17. Any application under Section 4 of the Act for a certified copy of a judgment obtained in the Supreme Court shall be made ex parte to a judge on an affidavit made by the judgment creditor or his solicitor giving the particulars of the judgment and showing that the judgment debtor is resident in some (stating what) part of His Majesty's Dominions outside Victoria to which the Act extends and stating to the best of his information and belief the title, trade, business or occupation of the judgment creditor and judgment debtor respectively and their respective usual or last known places of abode or business.

18. The certified copy of the judgment shall be an office copy and shall be scaled with the seal of the Supreme Court and shall be certified by the Prothonotary as follows:—-

"I certify that the above copy judgment is a true copy of a judgment obtained in the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria and this copy is issued in accordance with section 4 of the Supreme Court Act 1923.

The following new rule shall be added at the end of order LIV. :--

29A. Whenever any order is made on any originating summons or on any application originating in Chambers and in any other case of an order made in Chambers where the judge at any time before the signing of the order so directs there shall be left with the Associate a copy of such order which shall be forwarded to the Prothonotary to be duly filed.

RULES OF PROCEDURE IN DIVORCE AND MATRIMONIAL CAUSES

Rule 78A shall be repealed and the following rule shall be substituted therefor:—

78A. In every case where a decree nisi for dissolution of marriage or a decree nisi or absolute of nullity of marriage is pronounced a draft thereof shall be lodged with the chief clerk within fourteen days of such pronouncement and a fair copy (duly stamped) of the draft decree as settled by the chief clerk together with the original draft shall be lodged at the Prothonotary's office within seven days after such decree has been settled and such times shall be deemed to be the times prescribed under Section 10 of the Marriage Act 1923. In case of non-compliance with the foregoing provisions within the time prescribed the chief clerk or the Prothonotary (as the case may be) may permit a subsequent lodging to be made and shall permit subsequent lodging which has been ordered by a judge.

(1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first
- preference only; and
  (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

### Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's lirst preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two 'candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the Local Government Act 1915 shall have full force and effect.

### Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

- 297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—
- (1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

(a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides: and
  (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected;

- and
  (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
  (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
  (c) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.
- (2) Each deputy returning officer shall-
- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the Local Government Act 1915.
- (3) The returning officer shall-
- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable-
  - (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.
- (5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

### Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

- Gounting of Votes by Keturning Officer.

  (6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

  - (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballotpapers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballotpapers made up by himself: and
    (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent
    votes are also given for all the remaining candidates
    omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected;
    and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated
    candidates next in order of the voters' preference.
- (7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.
- (8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected. clared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

### Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) .The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes-
- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballotboxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-boxes or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.
- (13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the Local Government Act 1915 shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the Local Government Act 1915.

### Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the Local (tovernment Act 1915 as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

### Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness' cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the can-didate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.
- (2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballotpapers accordingly.

ALTERATION OF NETTING BOUNDARY AT THE MOUTII OF THE NICHOLSON RIVER.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke so much of the Proclamation relating to the alterations of netting boundaries of certain rivers which was made the eighteenth day of July. 1919, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of twenty-third July, 1919, pages 1673-4, as relates to the Nicholson River, and in lieu thereof do prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing for the whole of each year within an area at the mouth of the Nicholson River bounded as follows:—

Commencing at a post on the northern shore of Jones Bay approximately 610 yards from the mouth of the Nicholson River; thence by a line bearing south 48 deg. east (mag.) to the outer beacon marking the entrance to the said river; thence by a continuation of such line for 100 yards to a point; thence by a line bearing north 44 deg. east (mag.) to a post situated on the eastern shore of Jones Bay, approximately 460 yards from the mouth of the Nicholson River;

and do further prohibit the use of mesh or set nets within 60 yards of either shore of Jones Bay at any place within half-amile of the mouth of the Nicholson River.

Note.—Any description of net used as a mesh or set net is included in this prohibition.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF WABDALLAH, AT WABDALLAH.

W. E., Hugh Herbert Bufton, Walter Gordon Sharpley, Ernest Maidment Jones, Henry Moreillon, Louis Henry Pilloud, Samuel Donald Gillett, and William George Edward Marshall, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Wabdallah, at Wabdallah, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, excepting on such days (not exceeding twenty-six days in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and, taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or, other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of

committee of Alanagement first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or apparent on the part of the committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1915.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve; and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays:

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fetes, sports, or holiday or enclosure on the occasions of any fétes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose

Persons renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use of the ground, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the sum of fee any deep. of £2 2s. per day.

15. No persons, except labourers or workinen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Five pounds £51, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

#### TOWN OF GEELONG WEST.

#### .BY-LAW No. 46.

A By-law of the Town of Geelong West, numbered 46, made under section 75 of the *Health Act* 1919 (No. 3041), for the prevention of nuisances arising from filth, dust, and rubbish, and for the prevention of the keeping of animals and birds on any premises so as to be injurious to health or offensive.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1919, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Geelong West, with the approval of the Commission of Public Health, order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole of the municipality, and shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of July, 1925.

#### Manure Bins.

Manure Bins.

3. (a) Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept, shall provide, in connexion with such building or premises, a suitable impervious receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of any such animals in such a building or upon such premises.

(b) He shall cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle.

(c) He shall cause such receptacle to be constructed in such a manner and of such materials, and to be maintained at all times in such a condition as to prevent any escape of the contents thereof, or any soakage therefrom, into the ground or into the wall of any building.

(d) He shall cause such receptacle to be furnished with a suitable cover, and when not required to be open, to be kept properly covered.

properly covered.

(f) He shall cause all fifth to be swept up daily and placed in the receptacle provided for same.

#### Draining of Stables, &c.

4. He shall likewise provide in connexion with such building or premises a sufficient drain, constructed in such manner and of such materials, and maintained at all times in such a condition as to effectually convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a sewer or other approved receptacle.

#### Removal of Dung, &c.

5. He shall once at least in every week remove or cause to be removed from the receptacle provided in accordance with the requirements of this By-law, all dung, manure, soil, fifth, or other offensive or noxious matter produced in or upon such building or premises and deposited in such receptacle.

#### Paving of Yards and Open Spaces.

6. The owner of every dwelling-house in connexion with which there is any yard or open space shall, where it is necessary for the prevention or remedy of insanitary conditions that all or part of such yard or open space shall be paved, forthwith cause the same to be properly paved with a hard, durable, and impervious pavement, and so sloped to a properly constructed channel as effectually to carry off all rain or waste water therefrom.

#### Swine.

7. The occupier of any premises shall not keep any swine or deposit any swine's dung within 100 feet from any house.

#### Poultry.

8. (a) The occupier of any premises shall not keep nor permit the keeping of any poultry within the distance of 20 feet from any wall of a building used as a dwelling-house.

(b) The occupier of any premises shall not keep nor permit the keeping of any poultry within the distance of 10 feet from any wall of any building used for the purpose of manufacture, preparation, or storage of food for human consumption.

(c) The occupier of any premises shall not keep nor permit the keeping of any poultry within the distance of 10 feet from the frontage of any residential street.

(d) The occupier of any premises where poultry is kept shall provide a substantial enclosure wherein such poultry shall at all times be kept.

(e) The term "poultry" under this By-law shall include fowls, turkeys, ducks, geese, and pigeons.

#### Removal of Rubbish.

9. (a) The occupier of any premises who shall remove or cause to be removed any filth, dust, ashes, or rubbish produced upon his premises shall not, in the process of removal, deposit such filth, dust, ashes, or rubbish upon any footway, pavement, or carriage-way.

(b) Every person who shall convey any filth, dust, ashes, or rubbish through or along any street shall use a cart, carriage, or other means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents therefrom.

(c) If, in the process of such removal or conveyance as aforesaid, any filth, dust, ashes, or rubbish be slopped or spilled or fall upon any footway, pavement, or carriage-way, he shall forthwith remove any such filth, dust, ashes, or rubbish from the place whereon the same may have been slopped or spilled or may have fallen, and shall immediately thereafter thoroughly sweep or otherwise cleanse such place.

#### · Penalty.

10. Any person contravening the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds (£10) for each offence under this By-law, and to a further penalty of Two pounds (£2) per day for each day during which the offence is continued after notice of the offence has been given to the defaulter by the Council.
