SECTIONS 326 AND 327 OF THE HEALTH ACT 1919.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919* (No. 3041) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Seizure (Claims Procedure) Regulations 1925" and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations all Regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.

3. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Authorized officer" means any officer authorized in writing either generally or specifically by the Commission or by a Council (as the case may be) and includes any authorized member of the Police Force.

"Claimant" means the person claiming the animal food drug substance or thing seized.

"Seizing officer" means any authorized officer seizing any animal food drug substance or thing.

"The Act" means the *Health Act 1919* (No. 3041).

4. (1) Where any animal or thing is seized the seizing officer shall forthwith give notice of seizure in the Form "A" contained in the Schedule hereto—

(a) to any person apparently in charge thereof; if there is no person apparently in charge thereof

(b) to any person appearing to be the consignor or owner thereof by any name and address attached thereto or to any package containing the same if such address is a place in Victoria and otherwise to the importer or consignee or his agent.

(2) Where any food drug or substance is seized the seizing officer shall forthwith—

(a) deliver or forward a portion thereof marked and sealed or fastened up in such manner as its nature will permit; and

(b) give notice of seizure in the Form "A" contained in the Schedule hereto—

- (i) to any person appearing to be the consignor or manufacturer by any name and address attached thereto or to any package containing the same if such address is in a place in Victoria; and
- (ii) otherwise to the importer or consignee or his agent.

Provided that anything herein contained shall not prevent any authorized officer from exercising his power to destroy any things so seized which are decayed or putrefied.

5. Such notice of seizure shall be signed by the seizing officer and shall set out—

- (a) the grounds of seizure;
- (b) an intimation that any person claiming any interest in any animal food drug substance or thing seized may object to such seizure;
- (c) the manner in which such objection shall be made;
- (d) the address of the seizing officer for service of any objection claim or summons; and
- (e) on the back thereof the form of summons required to be issued.

6. The claimant shall within 48 hours after the seizure issue a summons in the Form "B" contained in the Schedule hereto directed to the seizing officer.

7. Such summons shall—

- (1) set out the grounds of objection to such seizure; and
- (2) be made returnable before two justices—
 - (a) at such place at or near the place of seizure as may be fixed by the justice issuing it;
 - (b) on any day (subject to service as hereinafter provided) as may be fixed by the justice issuing it.

8. Such summons may be issued by a justice of the peace and shall be served in the same manner as an ordinary summons upon a complaint under the *Justices Act* 1915 not less than 48 hours before the time appointed in such summons for the hearing thereof but by consent in writing endorsed on the summons the same may be made returnable forthwith or so soon as the same can be heard and service may by like consent be dispensed with.

9. At the hearing of such summons the adjudicating justices shall hear such evidence as may be brought forward by the seizing officer and the claimant and shall make an order thereupon according to law.

REGULATIONS RE THE USE OF CERTAIN SPECIFIED NETS AND FIXED ENGINES IN LINDSAY RIVER, ETC., IN THE NORTH-WEST OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation permit the use of the nets and fixed engines specified hereunder from the first day of December in each year to the thirtieth day of September next following, for the purpose of taking fish in the waters, of—

- (a) Lindsay River and its effluents and affluents on Lindsay Island;
- (b) Wallpola Creek and its effluents and affluents on Wallpola Creek;
- (c) Potterwalkagee Creek and its effluents and affluents on Potterwalkagee Island.

DRUM OR HOOP NETS, SPRINGERS, AND CROSSLINES.

The use of such nets and fixed engines shall be subject to the following restrictions, viz.:—

1. The number of drum or hoop nets that may be used at any one time by a licensed fisherman in the above-mentioned waters shall not exceed twenty.
2. A drum or hoop net shall consist of not more than three hoops covered with net; such net and the attached wings shall be made of twine; the mesh of net on the hoops shall be not less than four inches and the mesh of the net in each wing shall be not less than six inches; the diameter of each hoop shall not exceed four feet and the outer hoops shall be not more than five feet apart when the net is set; the length of each wing shall not exceed ten feet.

The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
13. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

For funerals separate prices must be stated for adults, for children above five years under fourteen years of age, and for children under five years of age including still-born—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, railway charges, and all other charges whatsoever, except ministers' fees. For removals separate prices must be stated for adults and children under seven years of age.

Tenders are advised to attach to their tenders lists of their business branches, specifying telephonic connexions, as accessibility and means of prompt communication will be considered in accepting the tenders.

Tenders must state the prices in words as well as in figures, without alterations or erasures.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under the *Cemeteries Act 1915* (No. 2626), section 50, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of poor persons buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; *but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while availing themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.*

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 16.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. *In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water, or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1 inch in thickness.*

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, excepting bodies buried from the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue.

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.

9. In the event of the Contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the Contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

10. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the Necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the Contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the Contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the Contractor gives the order for interment. The Contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

12. Should the religious belief, however, of the deceased preclude the burial being carried out in conformity with the above clause as regards the attendance of the officiating clergyman, the friends of the deceased shall, if practicable, be notified by the police with respect to the service. In the case of foreigners, the Consul of the country to which he is reputed to belong shall also be notified by the Police Department of his decease, in which case, when practicable, he may provide for such service as he may consider necessary.

13. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed by the Contractor before removal in shell coffins, zinc lined and water-tight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles. The Contractor shall send two men for the purpose of removing the body to the vehicle, and from the vehicle to the Morgue.

14. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the *post-mortem* examination.

15. Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will, on report of the Tender Board, subject the Contractor to the immediate cancellation of his contract, the forfeiture of the security money, or such other disqualifications as the Hon. the Treasurer may direct. The decision of the Board as to whether any breach of the condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.

16. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

17. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the funerals or removals will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

CITY OF MELBOURNE.

By-Law No. 176.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, numbered 176, for the prevention and suppression of the nuisance resulting from the emission of loud and offensive noises by motor cars.

WHEREAS by the 91st section of the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 6 Victoria, No. 7, intitled "An Act to incorporate the inhabitants of the Town of Melbourne," it is enacted that the Council of the Town (now the City) of Melbourne should have power to make by-laws for (*inter alia*) the prevention and suppression of all nuisances whatsoever. And whereas under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* the Council of the City of Melbourne is empowered to make By-laws for (*inter alia*) suppressing nuisances. And whereas a practice has recently arisen of driving motor cars for racing or speed testing purposes on certain lands within the City of Melbourne adjacent or contiguous to other lands, shops, warehouses, dwelling houses, and tenements which said motor cars emit loud and offensive noises to the great annoyance and inconvenience of residents, tenants, and owners of such other lands, shops, warehouses, dwelling houses, and tenements and of other the citizens of the said city which practice is therefore a nuisance, and it is expedient to prevent and suppress the same.

Now therefore the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by 6 Victoria, No. 7, and by 6 George V., No. 2686, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, make the By-law and orders as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"City" means the City of Melbourne.

"Driver" means any person in charge of a motor car.

"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle.

"Owner" includes any person who is registered under the provisions of the *Motor Car Act 1915* as the owner of a motor car.

"Person" shall include company or corporation.

Words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine, and words importing the singular number shall include the plural number and vice versa.

2. The owner or driver of any motor car used or intended to be used for racing or speed testing purposes on any land or premises within the city shall take all reasonable precautions to prevent the emission of offensive noises from such motor car, including the use on such motor car of a silencer or of any other known invention suitable for such purpose, whether or not such silencer or other invention may have the effect of reducing the speed of the motor car or not.

3. No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the city which is used or intended to be used for racing or speed testing purposes shall admit any motor car to such land or premises for the purpose of racing or of speed testing unless and until all reasonable precautions have been taken by the owner or driver of such motor car to prevent the emission of offensive noises therefrom in accordance with the provisions of the last preceding section of this By-law.

4. (1) Where any motor car upon any land or premises (other than a highway) within the city emits any offensive noise in such a quantity or extent as to be an annoyance or inconvenience to the public or to any resident, tenant, or owner of any land, shop, warehouse, dwelling house, or tenement in the city (except from some temporary or accidental cause) the owner and driver of such car shall each be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

(2) The owner or occupier of the land or premises within which such offence is committed shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

5. Any wilful contravention of any of the provisions of this By-law by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

6. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city.

Parking of Vehicles in Station-street.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and also as Rules and Regulations under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and numbered 71, to regulate traffic in Station-street, in the City of Sandringham.

Definition of Vehicle.

Vehicles Not to be Left in Station-street.

2. The driver of a vehicle shall not leave the same unattended, or keep the same in one position in Station-street, in the said city, except for a period of fifteen minutes.

Application of By-law.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout Station-street, in the said city.

Penalty.

4. Any person who is guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable for every offence to a penalty of not less than £1, and not more than £20.

CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 223.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1921* and the *Local Government Act 1924*, for the purpose of prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting within the whole or any part of any such residential area the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactories, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in the By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 216 of the City of South Melbourne be and the same is hereby repealed.
2. The area within the municipal district of South Melbourne herein specified shall be a residential area, that is to say:—

All that area embraced within the following streets, viz.:—From the corner of Fraser-street and Beaconsfield-parade, along Fraser-street to Canterbury-road, along Canterbury-road to Albert-road, along Albert-road to Clarendon-street, along Clarendon-street to Bridport-street, along Bridport-street to corner of Merton-street and Victoria-avenue, along Victoria-avenue to Beaconsfield-parade, and along Beaconsfield-parade to the point of commencement at the corner of Fraser-street and Beaconsfield-parade, subject to the exemptions and conditions provided for in the following clauses and schedules included in this By-law.

3. No person shall, except as provided in schedules 1 and 2 of this By-law, use any land, or erect, adapt for use, or use any building for the purpose of any trade, industry, manufacture, business or public amusement within the area prescribed in clause 2 of this By-law.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to the business of any solicitor, doctor, dentist, teacher, or similar profession.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law, shops, workrooms, places of amusement, or factories may be erected or established on land fronting any of the streets specified in schedule 1, and shops and factories of the type embraced under schedule 2 may be erected or established on land fronting any of the streets specified in such schedule.

6. All buildings erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall be removed and pulled down by the owner thereof within seven days from notice served upon him by the Council to that effect, and the Council is hereby authorized to pull down and remove such buildings erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to such By-law and/or not pulled down and removed as required by this By-law, and to sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings to the municipal fund.

7. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, and a further

penalty not exceeding £10 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the Commission of the offence, or after a conviction has been obtained at the Court in respect of such offence (as the case may be).

Streets in which shops, workrooms, places of amusement, or factories in respect of all classes of trade, industry, or manufacture may be erected, used, or established:—

Bridport-street, (from Ferrars-street to Merton-street).
Dundas-place (from Montague-street to Merton-street).

Mills-street.
Moubray-street (from Victoria-avenue to Richardson-street).
Ferrars-street (from Bridport-street to Kerferd-road).
Montague-street (from Dundas-place to Kerferd-road).

Type of factories which may be erected, used, or established on land fronting or abutting on the aforesaid streets:—

Millinery
Tailoring
Dressmaking

Any other factory where not more than four persons are employed and no smoke stack is erected.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 19th June, 1925, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture or in repairing any new or secondhand article of furniture, usually made or partly prepared by cabinetmakers, chair and couch makers, upholsterers, wood carvers, frenchpolishers, and wood turners," has made the following Determination, namely:—

- (1) That on the 19th June, 1925, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) (a) Any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture or in preparing any new or secondhand article of furniture shall be paid Sixpence per hour in addition to the lowest rate fixed by the Board, unless the following are provided by the employer, if required in the performance of the work :—Benches, wood or iron cramps over 2 ft. 6 in., hand screws (in excess of four), glue pots and glue brushes, and varnish brushes.

(b) Any employee engaged at frenchpolishing shall be supplied with all materials, including rags, brushes, and kit-box.

(4) DEFINITION OF A JUVENILE WORKER.—A juvenile worker is a person under 21 years of age (other than an apprentice or an improver) engaged in the following work :—
