ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieutenant-Colonel the Right Honorable Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Military Cross; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million four hundred and ten thousand two hundred and two pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fifth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventeenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

(b) To have had experience in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases and abnormal conditions of infants and of those associated with maternity.

(c) To have had experience in the conduct of ante-natal and infant welfare work.

Hours of Duty.—The hours of duty shall be equivalent to at least one half of the weekly hours required of professional officers of the Public Service, and the duties shall be carried out at such times as may be approved by the Chief Health Officer.

Private Practice.—The officer appointed will be exempted from the provisions of the Public Service Act, and will, on the recommendation of the Chief Health Officer, be eligible to accept such medical positions in relation to hospitals or institutions as may be approved by the Public Service Commissioner.

FUNERALS AND REMOVALS OF DESTITUTE PERSONS.

TENDERS will be received until Eleven o'clock a.m. on Friday, 20th August, 1926, from persons willing to undertake Funerals and Removals of Destitute Persons from Altona, Footscray, Little River, Newport, Sunshine, Werribee, Williamstown, and Yarraville, required by the several Departments of the Government, for the period ending 30th June, 1927, in the Melbourne district, as per Schedule No. 4.

Burials of deceased persons will take place at the Footscray or Williamstown Cemeteries, as the Police may direct.

Any removals of bodies that may be required are to be to the Melbourne Morgue, and the burials of same are to be made at the Necropolis, Spring Vale, by the Contractor for burials, south of the Yarra, and are to be carried by rail.

Tender forms giving full particulars and a list of places for which the burials are required are obtainable from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Gisborne-street, Melbourne.

Separate prices for funerals must be stated for adults, for children above five years, under fourteen years of age, and for children under five years of age including stillborn—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, railway charges, and all other charges whatsoever, except ministers' fees; also for funeral under clause 6 of the conditions.

Tenderers are advised to attach to their tenders lists of their business branches, specifying telephonic connexions, as accessibility and means of prompt communication will be considered in accepting the tenders.

Tenders must state the prices in words as well as in figures, without alterations or erasures.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board for £10 (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer withdrawing the tender before notification of acceptance, or, in the event of being successful, failing to complete the security or sign the contract within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, in the sum of £25, either in cash, Victorian or Commonwealth Government debentures, bank deposit receipt, or Savings Bank deposit book in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenders, endorsed "Tender for Funerals and Removals," are to be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury; or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and tenders addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under the *Cemeteries Act 1915* (No. 2626), section 50, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of poor persons buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while awaiting themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The bodies shall be taken direct to the Footscray or Williamstown Cemeteries, as the Police may direct, except those to be buried from the Melbourne Morgue, which bodies are to be taken to the Necropolis, Spring Vale, by the Contractor for burials, south of the Yarra, by rail, and interred therein. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 18.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water, or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1 inch in thickness.

7. The graves are to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Cemetery Regulations.

8. In the event of the Contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the Contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

9. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the Contractor.

10. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the Contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the Contractor gives the order for interment. The Contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

11. Should the religious belief, however, of the deceased preclude the burial being carried out in conformity with the above clause as regards the attendance of the officiating clergyman, the friends of the deceased shall, if practicable, be notified by the police with respect to the service. In the case of foreigners, the Consul of the country to which he is reputed to belong shall also be notified by the Police Department of his decease, in which case, when practicable, he may provide for such service as he may consider necessary.

12. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed by the Contractor before removal in shell coffins, zinc lined and water-tight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles. The Contractor shall send two men for the purpose of removing the body to the vehicle, and from the vehicle to the Morgue.

13. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the post-mortem examination.

14. Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will, on report of the Tender Board, subject the Contractor to the immediate cancellation of his contract, the forfeiture of the security money, or such other disqualification as the Hon. the Treasurer may direct. The decision of the Board as to whether any breach of the condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.

15. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

16. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the funerals or removals will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. Under no circumstances will a Contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the Contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the Contractor may be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling or other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all noxious weeds on the land, and on the half-width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of noxious weeds under the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922 in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each offer.
3. Offers must be at a price per ton, irrespective of the species of wattle, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge, and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 2nd December, 1926, and the second payment covering all bark stripped by 28th February, 1927, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.

6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse, or so as to obstruct any road or track.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under section 228 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for altering By-law No. 80, for prohibiting the deposit of refuse or rubbish on or requiring the removal of refuse or rubbish from streets, roads, lanes, or passages or on any land, and for maintaining the good rule and government of the Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—

That By-law No. 80 be and is hereby altered by eliminating the following:—

"For covering refuse or rubbish at the rubbish dépôt, 5s. per ton, with a minimum charge of 1s., or such other charges as the Council by resolution shall fix from time to time."

and substituting therefor the following:—

"For trenching, covering with lime and good clean filling, and so rendering innocuous decayed or decaying vegetable or animal matter, including fruit pulp, 10s. per ton, with a minimum charge of 1s., or such other charges as the Council by resolution shall fix from time to time."

"For tipping clean filling and spoil from excavations—Nil."

2. Such fees shall be paid to the Town Clerk by any person making application for such registration, renewal, or transfer respectively.

Health Act 1919.
SHIRE OF BALLAN.

BY-LAW NO. 17, RELATING TO THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL
OF NIGHT-SOIL.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Ballan, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township area of Ballan.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Inspector” means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“The Commission” means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of night-soil, and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the dépôt, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22-gauge or other approved material or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious, hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be water-tight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

Each such pan shall have a capacity of $\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an air-tight lid to be affixed.

The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant, or lime, sawdust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place, or cause or permit to be placed, any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

(a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and

(b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises, and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause

nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved dépôt.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the dépôt and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such night-soil be disposed of in trenches, such trenches shall be not less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed 2 feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken up soil upon the night-soil and pan washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the night-soil and washings in any trench such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops, or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve, shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil has been deposited, provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

21. Every pan after the disposal of its contents, and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid, and before it again leaves the dépôt or disposal ground, shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

(a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water, subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60-lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam-tight box or chamber; or

(b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of acrol, cyllin, korol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or

(c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or

(d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the dépôt to be properly constructed, kept clean, and disinfected daily at the dépôt, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any night-soil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

25. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury nor cause to be buried any night-soil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

26. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

27. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

SHIRE OF ROCHESTER.

BY-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Shire of Rochester, made under Part VII. Division of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 14, for regulating traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rochester order as follows:-

1. In the construction of this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle.
 - "Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human animal or mechanical power and includes a motor cycle.
2. The driver of any vehicle shall not bring such vehicle to a standstill and allow the same to stand for a period exceeding twenty minutes in—
 - (a) Those parts of the west side of Moore-street, Rochester, extending from a point opposite the Railway Station entrance to a point opposite the north boundary of the drapery premises of S. L. Johnstone & Co. and from a point opposite the south boundary of Messrs. Holdenson & Neilson's premises to a point opposite the north boundary of A. H. White's premises.
 - (b) That part of the east side of Moore-street, Rochester, extending from Fraser-street to a point opposite the northern boundary of Heney's boot shop.
 - (c) That part of Gillies-street, Rochester, between Moore and Mackay streets, Rochester.
 - (d) That part of the west side of Mackay-street extending from a point opposite the south boundary of Niemann's store to a point opposite the north boundary of Laurence's butcher's shop.
 - (e) That part of the east side of Mackay-street extending from a point opposite the south boundary of the Shire Hall to Bridge-road.
3. The driver of any vehicle shall not allow it to stand in any street of the Township of Rochester unless the same be drawn up with front wheel against kerb of outer edge of any channel or gutter on his left or near side of the street and at an angle of 45 degrees to the street.
4. The driver of any vehicle upon any street in the Township of Rochester shall—
 - (a) When stopping for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passengers do so as near as may be to the footway on his left or near side.
 - (b) Not drive the same in competition with or to the annoyance of any person so as to block or immediately and closely precede or follow or intentionally conform to the progress of any other vehicle.
5. Any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall render the offender liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the Township of Rochester within the Municipal District of the Shire of Rochester.

SHIRE OF WARRAGUL.

BY-LAW No. 31.

A By-law of the Shire of Warragul, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 31, for the purpose of regulating and installing rubbish receptacles for house refuse, and removal of same.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power therein enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Warragul, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):-

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Central Riding of the Shire of Warragul and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.
4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.
 - "Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.
5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle approved of and supplied by the Council at the cost of such proprietor, who shall be liable to the Council for such cost, in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.
6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.
7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.
8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.
9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.
10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.
11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.
12. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside of the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.
13. No person shall place or cause to be placed in any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.
14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council. Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.
15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable vehicle covered in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor, where as soon as practicable the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of fire or such other method as may be approved by the Commission and in such manner as not to create a nuisance.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

21. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

The Licensing Acts.

ORDER TO EXEMPT A REGISTERED CLUB FROM CERTAIN OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE LICENSING ACT 1915 (Section 270, Act 2683).

IN THE LICENSING COURT FOR THE LICENSING DISTRICT OF HAWTHORN.
