REGULATIONS UNDER THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS.

PARAGRAPHS REGARDING GUARDING OF CHAFFCUTTING MACHINES REVOKED AND REMADE.

REVOKED AND REMADE.

W HEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the Government Gazette, from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: And whereas it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, if the Minister has certified that any manufacture, plant, process, or labour used in factories is dangerous to life or limb generally, may make such regulations as may be deemed necessary and reasonably practicable to decrease or prevent danger from such manufacture, plant, process, or labour: And whereas the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Maiestv's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, has certified that the plant named in certain certificates dated respectively the 30th March, 1921, and the 31st day of March, 1924, is dangerous to life or limb generally: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited as well as under all other powers by the said Acts him enabling in that behalf, doth by this Order revoke the paragraphs dealing with chaffeutting machines in the Regulations made on the third day of March, 1926, under the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations regarding such chaffcutting machines, that is to say:—

Chaff-cutting Machines.

The occupiers of all places where power-driven machines are used for cutting chaff shall equip each of such machines with-

- (a) a guard which will at all times cover the feed-box for a distance of twenty-five (25) inches from the centre of the feed rollers; the height of this guard measured from the bottom of the feed-box to the top of the guard shall not in any case exceed twenty (20) inches (inside measurement);
- (b) a reversing lever, which must either be carried over the top of the guard, in line with and three (3) inches above the edge of the guard nearest the operator, or be connected with a foot control device of a pattern and make approved of by the Secretary for Labour;
- (c) guards which will efficiently cover all gear wheels so as to prevent hodily injury to any person in the vicinity.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN A RADIUS OF ONE MILE OF THE TORRITA RAILWAY STATION.

TORRITA RAILWAY STATION.

In NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shous Acts.
