REGULATIONS UNDER THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS.

PARAGRAPHS REGARDING GUARDING OF CHAFFCUTTING MACHINES REVOKED AND REMADE.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: And whereas it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, if the Minister has certified that any manufacture, plant, process, or labour used in factories is dangerous to life or limb generally, may make such regulations as may be deemed necessary and reasonably practicable to decrease or prevent danger from such manufacture, plant, process, or labour: And whereas the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, has certified that the plant named in certain certificates dated respectively the 30th March, 1921, and the 31st day of March, 1924, is dangerous to life or limb generally: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited as well as under all other powers by the said Acts him enabling in that behalf, doth by this Order revoke the paragraphs dealing with chaff-cutting machines in the Regulations made on the third day of March, 1926, under the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations regarding such chaffcutting machines, that is to say:-

Chaff-cutting Machines.

The occupiers of all places where power-driven machines are used for cutting chaff shall equip each of such machines with:-

- a guard which will at all times cover the feed-box for a distance of twenty-five (25) inches from the centre of the feed rollers; the height of this guard measured from the bottom of the feed-box to the top of the guard shall not in any case exceed twenty (20) inches (inside measurement);
- a reversing lever, which must either be carried over the top of the guard, in line with and three (3) inches above the edge of the guard nearest the operator, or be connected with a foot control device of a pattern and make approved of by the Secretary for Labour;
- guards which will efficiently cover all gear wheels so as to prevent bodily injury to any person in the vicinity.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN A RADIUS OF ONE MILE OF THE TORRITA RAILWAY STATION.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the area which is within a radius of one mile of the Torrita Railway Station within the municipal district of the Shire of Walpeup, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke (in so far as such Regulations relate to the area which is within a radius of one mile of the Torrita Railway Station within the portion of the said municipal district which was formerly known as the West Riding), the Regulations made on the twenty-sixth day of October, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the West Riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Walpeup shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

Stopping Places on Route.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such

occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
