The scheme of local works proposed for such district is a system of channels and appurtenant works.

The estimated cost of such works, including portion of the cost of Glenmaggie Weir and main channels for the supply of this and other districts, is £100,000.

The quantity of water proposed to be assigned to such district is 50 cubic feet per second.

The source of supply is to be the Macalister River and Glen-maggie Reservoir, by way of the Northern Main Channel. The season at which such supply is to be received is to

embrace the whole year.

- 1. The Proclamation made the eleventh day of June, 1913, and published in the Government Gazette of the 18th June, 1913, re Restrictions on Fishing, &c., in Western Port so far as concerns that portion of paragraph 4 commencing "and that the quantity of oysters" to the end of the said paragraph.

 - (b) No person licensed to take oysters from any place in Victorian waters shall in any one week take, sell, offer for sale, consign or market more than 15 bushels of oysters;
 - (c) The storing of cysters in bags either in or cout of water for more than three days after the day on which such cysters shall have been taken shall be prohibited.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF ROSEDALE, AT ROSEDALE.

E, Henry Roddan Anderson, William Arthur Allen, and Charles Ayres, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Rosedale, at Rosedale, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, excepting on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricketh or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, paste bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management be first obtained; providing always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management be first obtained.
- 8. No person shall perform in any band of music or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management be first obtained.
- 9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection, in the Reserve.
- 10. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of the law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1915.
- 11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management in writing, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.
- 12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
- 13. Persons hiring or renting any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so trenting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

By-Law No. 53.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts for regulating traffic and processions, suppressing nuisances, prohibiting spitting or expectorating on footpaths, prohibiting the throwing, placing or leaving upon any public highway of orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter, prohibiting or regulating the drawing or hauling of any sledge, timber, or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage way, prohibiting or minimizing noises in any public highway including the prohibition or the regulation of the use on vehicles of brakes which are calculated to cause noises, and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality and for repealing By-laws Nos. 26 (clauses 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5); 34 (clauses 2 and 3); 35, 36, and 51.

DEFINITIONS.

- 1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires:-
- "Cattle" includes every animal of the horse, ass, mule, ox. sheep, goat, and swine species respectively.

 Girens animal" includes every animal not included in the meaning of the word "cattle" as above defined except fowls, geese, turkeys, ducks, pigeons and other domestic birds of similar species.

 "City" means the City of Essendon.

 "Council" means the Council of the City of Essendon.

 "Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle.

 "Footway" includes werry footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the City habitually used by pedestrians, and not vehicular traffic.

 "Horse" includes mule and donkey.

 "Licensed" means licensed by the Council.

 "Motor Car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

 "Public Place" includes and applies to every public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage or thoroughfare notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare may be formed on private property and also any public park, garden or reserve.

 "Safety Zone" means a place of refuge for pedestrians established by the Council in any street in accordance with this By-law or any By-law hereby repealed.

 "Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

 "Street" includes every highway, road, carriageway, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the City other than a footway.

 "Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal or mechanical power and includes a motor car, but does not include perambulators, gocarts or invalid chairs.

 "Writing" includes printing, lithography and other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form. Words importing the masculine gender include females and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.



B,-REGULATION OF TRAFFIC GENERALLY.

- 3. (1) It shall be lawful for the Council by resolution from time to time as may be convenient or necessary to fix or appoint in any street—
 - (a) One or more safety zones.
 - (b) One or more stopping places for picking up or setting down passengers by licensed omnibuses.
 - (c) One or more parking areas for motor cars, and
 - (d) One or more purking areas for motor cars, and
 (d) One or more public stands for licensed motor cars or other licensed hackney carriages plying for hire which said stands may be in addition to or in substitution for all or any of the public stands for licensed hackney carriages or motor cars heretofore fixed or appointed by the Council by or under any Ry-law. By-law.
 - (e) Probibit the parking of motor cars in any area.
- (2) Any safety zone, stopping place, parking area, public stand or prohibited parking area as aforesaid heretofore fixed or appointed under any By-law may be indicated by such notice as aforesaid and shall thereupon be deemed to have been duly fixed or appointed under this By-law.
- (3) Any such safety zone, stopping place, parking area, public stand or prohibited parking area as aforesaid whether fixed or appointed under this By-law may be discontinued or abolished at any time by the discontinuance or removal by the Council of the notice relating thereto.

- 4. The driver of a vehicle upon any street or the rider of a horse upon any street shall, except in so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause
 - (1) Keep the same as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side.
 - (2) When meeting a vehicle, tramcar, horse or pedestrian keep on the left or near side of the street.
 - (3) When passing by any vehicle, horse or pedestrian going in the same direction, go on the right or off side of such vehicle, horse or pedestrian.
 - (4) When passing by a tramear going in the same direction, pass the same on the left or near side thereof.
 - (5) Before stopping or turning round in any street or turning from one street into another, give notice of his intention so to do by holding up his whip or his hand so that the same may be seen by any person immediately following and (in the case of the driver immediately following and (in the case of the driver of a vehicle) upon stopping so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle he shall, upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or by any member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council, remove his vehicle so as to permit such other vehicle to pass, and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic he shall remove his vehicle so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.
 - (6) Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another, drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left-hand side of the street which he is entering as shown in the subjoined diagram:—




- (7) When drawing up at any street intersection to await the signal of the Police Officer or Officer of the Couneil directing the traffic to proceed, if desirous of turning to the left into an intersecting street, stand as near as practicable to the kerb.
- (8) When approaching an intersection which he intends to cross grant the right of way to a vehicle approach-ing from his right with the exception of at inter-sections where a traffic officer is stationed.
- (9) Not enter any safety zone with his vehicle or horse or any part thereof respectively.
- (10) Not stop on or within a distance of forty feet from the approach side of any licensed motor omnibus stopping place fixed or appointed by the Council unless (being the driver of a licensed motor omnibus) for the purpose of duly taking up or setting down passengers nor within ten feet of the other side thereof.
- (11) Not stop on any licensed motor car stand fixed or appointed by the Council under this or any other By-law unless (being the driver of a licensed motor car and such stand being vacant) for the purpose of duly taking up his authorized position thereon.
- (12) Not stop on any licensed cab stand fixed or appointed by the Council under this or any other Bylaw unless (being the driver of a licensed cab and such stand being vacant) for the purpose of duly taking up his authorized position thereon.
- (13) Not leave such vehicle stationary at the kerb within a distance of twenty feet of an intersection.

 (14) Not leave the same unattended unless it is left in such a position as not to obstruct traffic.

 (15) Cause the same to be drawn as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side of the street and parallel thereto and brought to a standstill on the approach of and during the passing of any fire engine or other vehicle apparently proceeding in charge of a fireman to the scene of any fire,

. (16) When crossing from one side to the other side of such street, make the complete turn so that when stationary at the kerb his vehicle shall be headed in the same direction as the traffic is proceeding as shown in the subjoined diagram:—



- 5. The driver of a vehicle upon any street shall-
 - (1) When stopping for the purpose of taking up or set-
 - ting down any passengers, do so as near as may be to the footway on his left or near side.

 (2) Not drive the same in competition with or to the annovance of any other person so as to block or immediately and closely precede or follow or intentionally conform to the progress of any other vehicle.

 6. Every driver of a motor car or bicycle upon any street shall within reasonable distance and before passing any other vehicle, horse or pedestrian or when approaching any intersection give audible and sufficient warning of his approach by sounding a horn, bell or other instrument.

 7. No person shall between sunset and sunrise drive any vehicle upon any street or permit any vehicle to be upon any street unless a good and serviceable lamp suitable to such vehicle is securely fixed at the right or off side of the front of such vehicle and is lighted and is so placed that the light therefrom is distinctly visible to persons in front of such vehicle as a white light, and to persons at the rear of such vehicle as a red light. Provided that in any case where a red tail light is used it shall not be necessary that the lights fixed as aforesaid shall be visible from the rear. Provided further that where any part of a vehicle or any load on a vehicle projects more than three feet beyond the rear wheels of such vehicle a lighted lamp shall be kept attached to the rearward extremity of such part or load respectively in such a position and manner as to show a red light clearly visible to any person approaching such vehicle from the rear or passing such vehicle from the rear or passing such vehicle from the rear or permit any vehicle to be driven upon any street upless are red.

8. No person shall drive any vehicle upon any street or permit any vehicle to be driven upon any street unless such vehicle is so constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full and uninterrupted view of the street traffic, in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle and no person while driving any vehicle upon any street shall occupy such a position as will prevent or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid.

9. No person shall ride or lead any horse or other animal, or drive any horse or cattle or drive or impel any vehicle upon any footway. Provided however that a bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.

C.—Pedestrian Traffic.

10. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his left-hand side of the footway, and shall when meeting or overtaking any person pass on the right-hand side of such person.

11. (1) Every pedestrian shall on leaving the footway proceed by the shortest line from the point on the kerb line from which he left the footway to a point on the other kerb line of the street immediately opposite the first-mentioned point, unless at such diagonal intersections where a crossing has been defined by the Council.

12. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or otherwise.

D.—STREET PROCESSIONS.

- 13. (1) No processions of persons, or of vehicles or of any combination of persons and/or vehicles shall, except for military or funeral purposes, parade or pass through any street unless the following conditions have been complied with, that is to say:-
 - (a) One calendar month's notice in writing shall be previously given to the Town Clerk of the intention to hold such procession specifying the proposed duration of such procession, the time and the place of starting, the route proposed to be followed and the time and place of completion thereof.

 (b) Twenty-four hours' notice in writing at least shall be given with such particulars as aforesaid to the Chief Commissioner of Police.
- (2) Not more than one procession shall parade or pass through the City on any one day.
 (3) Should two or more notices be given to the Town Clerk of intention to hold processions on the same day only the notice first received by the Town Clerk shall be deemed to be validly given.

LAWFUL DIRECTIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH.

.14. Every person in the City shall-

- (1) At all times obey and conform to any notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Mayor or in his absence or in the case of sudden emergency under the hand of the Town Clerk or of the Chief under the hand of the following the control of the Ohlor Commissioner of Police in respect of all or any of the following matters, that is to say:—

 (a) Approaching or departing from any footway or street, or

(3) Upon any members of the Police Force or Officer of (3) I pon any members of the Police Force or Officer of the Council in order to enforce the due observance of any law, by-law, regulation or lawful notice, holding up his hand or giving an order or direction, stop for so long or proceed in such manner and direction as such member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council deems necessary to allow free space between any persons, procession or vehicles, or for cross traffic or for any other like purpose.
 (4) If any horse or vehicle in his charge is causing or likely to cause an obstruction to the traffic upon any

likely to cause an obstruction to the traffic upon any street, and if he is directed by any member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council to remove such horse or vehicle remove the same either from the vicinity or to some such adjacent part of that or some neighbouring street as is indicated by the member of the Police Force or Officer of the

member Council.

(5) On the request of any member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council, produce to him for inspection any order, leave, licence, or other written authority relating to traffic in the City and held by such

Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with or wilfully disabeys any notice, direction, order or request given or made as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

E.-Prevention of Nuisances and Accidents.

15. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footway or on any street crossing habitually used by pedestrians.

16. No person shall put, throw, or allow to fall and remain upon any footway the skin or peel or stem of any fruit or the leaves or any part of any vegetable.

17. No person shall wear or carry in any street or footway any pin or other article or any implement in such a manner as is likely to inflict injury by coming in contact with any other person.

18. (1) No person shall feed any horse in a street except by means and out of a mosebag containing the forage and attached to the head of the horse.

(2) No person shall remove the blinkers or bridle of any horse in a street.

(3) Every driver of a vehicle to which a vicious horse is attached shall keen the horse efficiently muzzled while it is

norse in a street.

(3) Every driver of a vehicle to which a vicious horse is attached shall keep the horse efficiently muzzled while it is standing upon any stand in the City or standing in a street.

19. (1) No person shall when driving a vehicle in any street use any brake the application of which to such vehicle produces a noise calculated to cause annoyance to persons in such street, or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto.

(2) The employer of the driver of any vehicle on which a brake is used contrary to the foregoing provision of this section shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

20. (1) No person shall drive upon any street a vehicle which is loaded or partly loaded with steel or iron rails or other material of any sort or description unless such rails or other material are or is so packed or stowed either by being separated by sacks or bags or by some other appropriate means as to prevent such rails or other material from producing a noise calculated to cause annoyance to persons in such street or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto.

(2) The employer of any person acting in contravention of the foregoing provisions of this section shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

21. No person except between the hours of eight o'clock in the afternoon and eight o'clock in the morning shall carry in any street upon a vehicle or otherwise any load or structure exceeding ten feet in height or fifty square feet in area.

22. No person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle having less than four wheels any material article or thing exceeding twenty-five feet in length.

23. No person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle any material article or thing which whether forming the whole or part only of the load projects more than two feet outside the line of the wheels or line at side of the vehicle, whichever is the outermost.

24. No person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle anything in such a manner that any part of the thing carried touches or comes in contact with the surface of the street.

25. (1) No person shall at one and the same time act as driver or have the sole charge of more than one cart, dray, or vehicle each drawn separately by animal power on any public road or street in the City, and no person in charge of any horse, cart, dray, or vehicle during the time he is in charge thereof, and whilst such cart, dray, or vehicle is in motion ride in any eart, dray, or vehicle other than the one he is in charge of, or be at any time whilst such cart, dray, or vehicle is in motion away therefrom so as to be unable to have full control of such horse, cart, or vehicle.

(2) No persons under fifteen years of age shall in any

(2) No persons under fifteen years of age shall in any street act as the driver or have the sole charge of any vehicle driven within the City for business or trade purposes.

26. No person shall at any time between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the afternoon of any

day cause interruption or annoyance to passengers upon any street or footway by raising or discharging dust, or causing water to flow upon or across such street or footway whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

27. (1) No person who is the owner of or has the care or management of any lift or tackle shall permit such lift or tackle shall permit such lift or

tackle to project over any footway or lane in the City.

(2) No person shall swing or hoist goods across or over any footway or lane in the City by means of any lift or tackle which so projects or shall otherwise use such lift or tackle.

28. (1) No person shall—

 (a) Place on any street or footway or
 (b) Carry on any vehicle or otherwise any placard board or other thing by way of advertisement on any street or footway.

(2) The employer of any person contravening in any manner the foregoing provisions of this section shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

(3) Every person who shall in any manner authorize or purport to authorize any act or thing contrary to the foregoing provisions of this section shall also be guilty of an offence

29. (1) No person upon any street, footway or other public place shall give out or distribute to bystanders or passers-by any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers.

(2) No person shall litter any street or footway by scattering or throwing dawn handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers.

30. It shall not be lawful to drive into or through the said City any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria to any other part, on any Sunday between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and nine o'clock in the evening, nor on the other days of the week between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and five o'clock in the evening between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of October, and between the hours of seven o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock in the evening between the 30th day of September and the 1st day of April.

(2) Every such person shall move on upon being so required by any Officer of the Council or any member of the Police Force.

36. (1) No owner or occupier of any land upon which there is growing or standing any tree, hedge, vine, shrub, creeper, or other plant of any kind whatsoever shall permit any branch or part thereof to overhang any street or footway so as to be likely to cause inconvenience or annoyance to any person using such street or footway.

(2) Every such owner or occupier shall keep all streets and footways clear from all seedlings, suckers and other offsets from such trees, hedges, vines, shrubs, creepers, and plants as

(3) In the event of seedlings, suckers or offsets from any such tree, hedge, vine, shrub, creeper, or other plants as aforesaid growing upon or of any branch thereof overhanging any street or footway, the City Engineer or other Officer of the Council may cause a written notice to be served on the owner or occupier requiring him to remove the same within fourteen days, and in default may cause the same to be removed and such owner or occupier shall in addition to any penalty which may be imposed upon him for breach of this By-law be liable to pay the expense of such removal.

37. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

38. Every person who is guilty of a wilful offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not expendity. ceeding Five pounds.

39. This By-law shall except as herein expressly provided apply to and have application throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Essendon.

(b) A register of such shops is to be kept. (c) Consent of Council is to be obtained to extensions to or rebuilding of existing premises or use of shops for any purpose other than that for which it was used when By-law camp into operation.
