Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 15th September, 1926, applied to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; the South Ward of the Borough of Box Hill; the township of Kangaroo Flat in the Shires of Marong and of Strathfieldsaye; the township of Spring Gully in the Shire of Strathfieldsaye; the Shire of Moorabbin; and such portions of the Shire of South Barwon and of the Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio as are within a radius of five miles of the Geelong Post Office.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest price or rates of payment for bread-making or baking" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 15th September, 1926, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) OVERTIME.—(a) That any employee (other than an apprentice) who works for any time in excess of the number of hours fixed in Clause 3, shall be paid for such extra time at the wages rate of double time.

(b) That any apprentice who works on any one night for any time in excess of 8 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of 5s. per hour.

(5) Weekly hours—

That the number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 48.

(6) TIME RATE.—That any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours, be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three per centum.

(7) SPECIAL RATES FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—That payment for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be at the rate of time and a half; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
