Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Thirty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—A rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such lands shall not be less than the sum of Fifteen shillings per year.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1926, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1927, and shall be payable on the 29th day of October, 1926, at the office of the said Commission, at Red Cliffs.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuations for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1927 FIXED BY THE COMMISSIONERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POWERS CONFERRED ON THEM UNDER THE WATER ACTS.

THE following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1927 in respect to water supplied to them by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant lands, of the annual municipal valuation of £20 and under, the sum of Two pounds (£2).
2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal valuation of £20 and upwards to £75, the sum of 2s. in the £1 shall be paid.
3. From £75 upwards the sum of 1s. 6d. in the £1 shall be paid on the municipal valuation, provided that in all cases the minimum rate shall be not less than Seven pounds ten shillings (£7 10s.) per annum.
4. The rate to be paid in respect to vacant lands shall be 2s. in the £1 according to municipal valuation, provided that in no case the rate shall be less than £1 per annum.
5. For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of Two pounds (£2) per annum shall be paid.
6. The water supplied to troughs other than public troughs shall be paid for by meter or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and persons requiring the supply may agree to adopt.
7. For water supplied by meter a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that no person shall pay an amount other than that based upon 2s. in the £1 on the municipal valuation, or less than the minimum rate; any quantity over the foregoing amount to be charged in excess.
8. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1927.
9. Water must not be used for other than strictly household purposes during the hours of 1 o'clock a.m. and 8 p.m. on Sundays during the months of January, February, March, October, November, and December.

For the purpose of conserving the water, the Trust may in its discretion cut off the water during certain hours of each day.

Such persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges, and enforce regulations.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 54, for amending By-law No. 38 (Building By-law).

(1) In Schedule B, clause 1 ("Brick Areas") the following shall be added thereto:—

Woodland-street, south side, from Lincoln-road to Amelia-avenue.

CITY OF PORT MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 96.

A By-law of the City of Port Melbourne made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and under sections 2 and 3 of the *Local Government Amending Act* 1924, and numbered 96, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting within such areas the use of any land, or the erection, adaptation for use, or the use of any building for the purpose of all trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, and sections 2 and 3 of the *Local Government Amending Act* 1924, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Port Melbourne, order as follows:—

1. The areas within the municipal district of the City of Port Melbourne as set out in the Schedule hereto, are hereby prescribed as, and declared to be, residential areas:—

Within such residential areas the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements is hereby prohibited; provided, however, that this By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership, or for such purpose as the Council thinks reasonable in the circumstances. Provided, further, that this By-law shall not preclude the use of any dwelling-house, or any part of any dwelling-house, for the purposes of his profession by any barrister and solicitor, medical practitioner, dentist, civil or hydraulic engineer, surveyor, architect, accountant, auditor, teacher, or any other legalized profession.

2. If any building or buildings be erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to the last preceding clause, the Council or any officer thereof, or other authorized agent, may give to the owner of such building or buildings, or leave upon the site of such building or buildings, seven days' notice in writing to pull down or remove the same, and if after seven days after service of such notice the said building or buildings have not been pulled down or removed as required by such notice, then the said Council, by its officers or workmen, may cause such building or buildings to be pulled down or removed, and it shall be at liberty to sell the materials of which such building or buildings were constructed, and to apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such building or buildings and in paying to the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof, and shall pay the balance (if any) to the owner.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any Court in respect of such offence.

4. By-law No. 93 is hereby repealed.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE ERECTION OF BATHING-BOXES, BOAT-HOUSES, AND OTHER BUILDINGS ON THE POINT LONSDALE FORESHORE RESERVE, AND THE LEASING AND/OR LICENSING OF SITES THEREFOR.

THE Council of the Borough of Queenscliffe, the duly appointed Committee of Management (hereinafter called the Committee) of the Point Lonsdale Foreshore Reserve (hereinafter called the Reserve), pursuant to the Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve made by the Board of Land and Works on the 28th day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, at pages 2970-71, doth hereby make the following Regulations, namely:—

1. No person shall erect any building on the Reserve unless such person be the holder of a licence issued to him in accordance with these Regulations.

2. No person shall use any such building unless he be the holder of the said licence, or the bona fide tenant of such holder, residing in the house in respect of which such licence is issued.

3. No licence shall be granted to any person to erect any building on any site within the Reserve except within the areas set out in the First Schedule hereto.

4. No licence shall be granted to any one not being the owner of a dwelling-house within the Borough of Queenscliffe, and not more than one licence for the same class of building shall be granted in respect of any one dwelling-house.

5. All buildings so erected shall have doorways fronting the sea, and shall have the following dimensions:—

Boat-house—10 feet x 20 feet.

Bathing-box—6 feet x 8 feet.

Double bathing-box—10 feet x 10 feet.

In the event of any building erected prior to the coming into force of these Regulations not complying therewith, the licence shall not be renewed until such building has been altered to accord with these Regulations.

6. A distance of three (3) feet shall be reserved between all such building sites, and no licence shall be granted to any person to erect any buildings on the space reserved.

7. All bathing-boxes hereafter to be erected in pursuance of such licence shall be of the design and of the material set out in the Second Schedule hereto, and every building shall be in accordance with a plan approved by the Committee. A copy of such plan shall be attached to every licence when granted and renewed by the Committee, and the licensee shall pay the Committee the sum of Five shillings (5s.) therefor.

8. The amount payable under such licence shall be—

(a) Boat-house—£2.

(b) Bathing-boxes—10s.

(c) Double bathing-boxes—£1.

A fee of Five shillings (5s.) shall be payable for every assignment on any such licence.

9. Every licence shall be granted for one (1) year only, and shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of each year, and shall be in the form or to the effect and shall be issued subject to the conditions set out in the Third Schedule hereto, which conditions shall be endorsed on the licence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
