Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SAND PIT BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 5th November, 1926, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in connexion with:—

A sand pit at labouring work, excavating sand, handling sand, or removing sand for trade or sale, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Carters Board," has made the following determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 5th November, 1926, the previous Determinations of the Sand Pit Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

PROVISION.

(Within any factory or place.)

Apprentices.

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than the minimum wage.

Improvers.

One improver to every five or fraction of five workers receiving not less than the minimum wage.

An indenture of apprenticeship prescribed by the Board was approved on 18th June, 1924.

(3) Time of beginning and ending work each day shall be:—

Time of beginning.

7.15 a.m.

Time of ending.

12 noon on Saturday.

5 p.m. on other working days of the week.

(4) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done:—

(a) Outside the hours fixed as times of beginning and ending work

(b) Within the hours fixed as times of beginning and ending work in excess of 48 hours in any week } Time and a quarter.

(5) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Years Day, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Good Friday, or Easter Monday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
