Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE KNITTERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination, on the 2nd December, 1926, applied to the following parts of Victoria, viz.—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the process, trade, or business of knitting or crocheting any article for human wear," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 2nd December, 1926, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
