Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BRICKLAYERS BOARD.

Note.—(1) This Determination, on the 5th November, 1926, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(2) On the 7th July, 1926, the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed laying or fixing faicnce or majolica on floors, walls, or ceilings, was taken from the Tilelayers Board and conferred exclusively on the Bricklayers Board.

'In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than labourers) wherescover employed in the process, trade, or business of a bricklayer" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 5th November, 1926, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (3) ALLOWANCES .-- The following allowances shall be paid to persons employed on work away from their employers' place of husiness:
 - (1) The fares, exceeding 4d. per day, necessarily expended in going from and to the employee's residence to and from his work.

 (2) For work done at a distance from the employer's place of business if the employee is unable to return to his home the same night:—6s. per day for the first seven days, and thereafter 30s. per week extra.
- (4) Time of Beginning and Ending Work.—The time of beginning and ending work for persons (other than those employed on sewerage work, drainage work, or underground work not connected with building construction) shall be—
