ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieutenant-Colonel the Right Honorable Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Military Cross; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act relating to the Corporation known as the Bank of New South Wales.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventeenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1927 for Free Places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne. The number of officers that may be nominated is five.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should not be more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these Free Places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his Free Place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his Free Place, and, if his Free Place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his Free Place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the Free Place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, and progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF LORQUON.

WE, Thomas George Marshall, Edward Sullivan, Alfred Ernest Duthie, Allan Barber, James Thomas Duthie, William John Hartley Treloar, Carston Howard Roodiger, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreation purposes in the Township of Lorquon, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
- For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection,

or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations; and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK, WILSON'S PROMONTORY.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1915* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations or to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to or vested in Trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees or other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following additional Regulation to be observed and enforced in respect of the Reserve for a National Park in the Parishes of Beek Beek, Warreen, Kulk, and Tallang, and of the Reserve in the Township of Seaforth and Parishes of Beek Beek, Warreen, Kulk, Tallang, and Yanakie South for a National Park and on which to establish when required pilot stations, lighthouses, and other aids to navigation and of the Reserve for National Park purposes in the County of Buln Buln, being the islands adjacent to Wilson's Promontory, known respectively as Shellback Island, Norman Island, Anser Island, Wattle Island, and Rabbit Island, and the islands in Corner Inlet, known respectively as Benison Island, Granite Islands, and Do-Boy Island, and of the Reserve in the Parish of Yanakie South as an extension of the site for a National Park at Wilson's Promontory, all of which Reserves are hereafter referred to as the "National Park."

SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

A By-law of the Shire of Mansfield made under Part VII. Division 1, of the Local Government Act 1915, and also as rules and regulations under section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1915, and numbered 20, for the regulation of street traffic.

"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle.

"Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

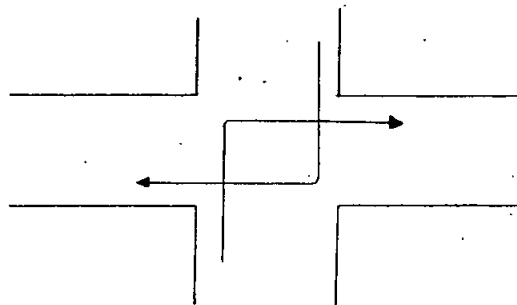
"Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Township of Mansfield, other than a footway.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.

"Reserve" means any piece of a road or street enclosed or partially enclosed by a fence other than a tree-guard.

1. The driver of a vehicle or motor car or traction engine upon any of the streets within the said boundaries, and the rider of a horse or other animal upon any of the streets within the said boundaries, shall, except as shall be necessary for the purposes of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause—

- (a) before stopping or turning round in any street or turning from one street into another, or turning into or from any passage through any reserves, give notice of his intention so to do by holding up his whip or his hand so that the same may be seen by any person following him, and (in the case of the driver of a vehicle or motor car) upon stopping so place his vehicle or motor car as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle or motor car, he shall, upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or motor car, or by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, remove his vehicle or motor car so as to permit such other vehicle or motor to pass, and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic, remove his vehicle or motor car so as to discontinue such interruption or delay;
- (b) before turning to the right or off side from one street to another, or from or into any passage through any reserves into any street, drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left-hand side of the street which he is entering, as shown on the subjoined diagram, or in the case of any passage as aforesaid drive or ride parallel to the near side (left side) of the street or passage (as the case may be) which he is entering; as shown on the subjoined diagram—



2. The driver of any vehicle or motor car shall not bring such vehicle or motor car to a standstill, and shall not allow it to stand in any of the streets within the said boundaries unless the wheels on the left or near side of such vehicle or motor car, or in the case of a motor cycle unless the two wheels thereof are not more than 2 feet distant from the footway or from the outer edge of any water channel or gutter (if any) by the side of such footway on the left or near side of such vehicle or motor car.

3. No horse, vehicle, or motor car shall be drawn up or stopped on the outer edge of any other horse, vehicle, or motor car already standing in any street, road, highway in the Township of Mansfield.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of clauses 2 and 3 hereof, where there is a formed gutter between any of the said reserves and the road, the portion of the street between such gutter and the reserve shall be deemed a parking area, and the cars may be left there unattended providing that such cars shall be left facing the direction of the traffic correctly proceeding on the part of the road nearest such gutter. For the purpose of this clause such parking areas shall be shown on and determined by a plan deposited in the office of the secretary of the said shire, which plan is open for inspection.

5. No horse, vehicle, or motor car shall be drawn up or stopped in the passages between any reserves.

6. Any constable or Council officer may remove such unattended or unlawfully placed horse, vehicles, or motor cars from the place where the same have been left by the person in charge, and may deposit the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and the costs incurred in so removing the said horse, vehicle, or motor car and of placing and storing the same may be recovered from the person in charge, in addition to any fine.

7. Any person committing an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
