Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE BAG MAKERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 19th February, 1926, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to persons employed in making or repairing jute, hessian, or cotton bags" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 19th February, 1926, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) OVERTIME .-

Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work
Within the hours so fixed in excess of the number of hours as fixed for a week's work Time and a half. No. 20,-1659,

- (5) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.
- (6) SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—That double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 28th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (7) Piece-Work.—The lowest piece-work prices to be paid to any person for doing work of the description referred to in the following Schedule shall be—

(8) PIECE-WORK WHICH MAY BE FIXED BY AN EMPLOYER.—The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at repairing by machine bags other than those for which the Board has fixed a piece-work price (employer to provide twine), provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.
