THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of the Colony of Hong Kong (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the *Imperial Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1920* extends) for the enforcement within such part of Maintenance Orders made by Courts within Victoria, do now, under the powers conferred by section 12 of an Act of the Victorian Parliament intitled the *Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1925*, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare the Colony of Hong Kong to be a reciprocating State within the meaning and for the purpose of the Act last referred to.

## BY-LAW No. 33.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1927 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:-

I. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds or under, the sum of Two pounds per annum.

II. For every house or tenement above Sixteen pounds and not more than Twenty-six pounds annual municipal value; a rate of Two shillings and ninepence in the pound according to such value.

III. For every house or tenement above Twenty-six pounds and not more than Thirty-six pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound according to such value.

IV. For every house or tenement of Thirty-six pounds and upwards annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.

V. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of Five shillings per thousand gallons shall be paid.

That the above rates and charges shall be paid half-yearly in advance, first payment on the first day of January, 1927, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1927.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The following rates are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1927 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundary of the Trust's district, that is to say:-

A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling, payable in two equal instalments on the 1st January and 1st July, 1927, shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Trust's district according to the municipal valuation of such properties.

The minimum rate to be paid shall be Thirty shillings (30s.) on all tenements; vacant land, where the main pipe passes the property, Twenty-five shillings (25s.); and within 100 yards of the main, Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.); stand-pipe rate, Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.).

All water supplied by the Trust for other than domestic purposes shall be by meter and charged at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons. Surplus water to Railway Department for engine purposes, Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

Water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes during January, February, March, November, and December shall be charged for by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), and the minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for such premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

3. The above rate is for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1927, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1927, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the 1st April and on the 1st October, 1927. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rate and charges.

## WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1927.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law for the year 1927:-

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such street are supplied by reticulation from such pipes:-

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of Seventeen pounds or under, municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any main or stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rates, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such main or stand-pipe, and within half a mile, one-fourth the before-mentioned rate.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate paid on such lands and tenements. All excess water supplied by measure by the Trust shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such owners or occupiers of lands or tenements not within the Trust area and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam-engines, or stock who are supplied by the Trust with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any), if, in the opinion of the Trust, such owners or occupiers are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using, such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable in advance, on the first day of January and not later than the thirtieth day of June, 1927. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN TRAMWAYS BOARD.

BY-LAW No. 7.

BY-LAW No. 2, made by the Hawthorn Tramways Trust and approved by the Governor in Council on 21st August, 1917, is hereby rescinded from the date of the following By-law coming into operation:—

By-law No. 7, made by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board pursuant to and under authority conferred by section 64 of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1918:—

CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF WATTLE PARK.

1. In this By-law, except where otherwise clearly intended, "the Board" means the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board. "Park" means the land belonging to the Board situated at corner of Boundary and Riversdale roads, Surrey Hills, and known as Wattle Park.

2. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, or such later time as the Board may from time to time determine. Save as aforesaid, no person shall be allowed in the Park unless authorized by the Board.

3. No person shall interfere with the surface of the Park, or with any trees, shrubs, ferns, lawns, flowers, or other plants, animals, birds, birds' nests, eggs, fish, or any property in the Park, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein.

4. No person shall light fires in the Park, or deposit therein any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, refuse, or any litter, except in places set apart by the Board.

5. No person shall climb the trees, or damage the seats, shelters, or fences in or around the Park, or affix bills or paint any notice on the buildings, shelters, conveniences, fences, or gates, or cut names, letters, or marks in the trees, seats, shelters, gates, posts, fences, or buildings, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

6. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in an indecorous or disorderly manner, or using obscene language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the Park any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the Board, or by a constable, and shall, in addition, be liable to prosecution for an offence against this By-law.

7. No person shall bring into the Park any dog unless securely held by a chain or cord, and effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or damage to any trees, plants, or lawns, or from pursuing, worrying, or disturbing any animal therein; and all dogs found in the Park not so held and restrained, and all goats and poultry or other stock (unless authorized in writing by the Board) found within the Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

8. No person shall offer for sale in the Park any goods or articles of any description, without the previous consent of the Board in writing.

9. No person shall in any part of the Park carry or discharge any firearm, or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Park, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult any Park keeper or other servant of the Board.

10. No person using any water tap in the Park shall neglect to turn off the same in a proper manner.

11. No person shall use any bicycle, motor car, or other vehicle within the Park except upon any road or roads appointed for such purpose. No such bicycle, car, or vehicle shall be propelled at a speed exceeding twelve miles per hour.

12. No person shall use a motor car or other vehicle for the purpose of carrying passengers for hire or fee within the Park without first obtaining the consent of the Board in writing.

13. No person shall leave any motor car in the Park except in a place set apart for the purpose. A parking fee of One shilling per car shall be paid to the curator or other authorized officer, who shall issue an official receipt therefor. The Board accepts no responsibility for damage or theft in respect to cars so parked.

14. No person shall expectorate on the paths or seats, or on any structure or erection, within the Park, nor smoke in any building where smoking is prohibited by a notice exhibited in or upon such building.

15. No person shall play any unlawful game within the Park, nor shall any person, whether on his own behalf or on behalf of any other person, wager or bet, or offer to wager or bet, or promise to pay any wager or bet.

16. No person shall enter into or upon plots of ground specially enclosed or set apart for plantations and/or for other purposes in the Park, and no assemblies for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Park without the permission in writing of the Board first obtained.

17. No person shall play cricket, football, or other games in the Park, except in such portions thereof as may be set apart for the purpose, and under such conditions as the Board may direct.

18. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within the Park without the consent of the Board.

19. No person over the age of fourteen (14) years shall make use of the swings or other appliances erected for the amusement of children.

20. Any person wilfully offending against, or attempting to offend against, this By-law, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

## SHIRE OF CORIO.

## REGULATION NUMBER 2.

*Regulating Charges for Admission to and Conduct of Persons at "St. Helen's Park."*

A Regulation of the Shire of Corio, numbered 2, made under section 11 of Part 4 of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the Shire by virtue of a By-law of the above-named Shire, numbered 9, and under section 652 of the said Act, for regulating the conduct of persons whilst using or being upon or in "St. Helen's Park," and for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees for persons using or entering in or upon such Park.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Corio make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

*Definitions.*

1. In the construction of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

"The Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Corio.

"The Park" shall mean that part of Crown allotment fifty-eight, Parish of Moorpanyal, County of Grant, known as "St. Helen's Park," and any additions thereto, and being at the date hereof the land described in certificates of title, volume 2599, folio 519769, volume 4301, folio 860121, volume 2314, folio 462745, volume 4301, folio 860120, volume 3320, folio 663982, and part of the land described in certificate of title, volume 4396, folio 870197.

"Unauthorized person" means any person other than a person for the time being duly authorized in writing by the Council or an officer of or a person or a servant of a person employed by the Council in or about any work in connexion with laying out, planting, improving, or maintaining the Park.

*Musical Performances, Sports, &c., and Charges for Admission.*

2. The Council shall have power to hold musical performances in the Park, and the Park may on any specified day or at any specified time be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday day amusements, and on any of such occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged for the admission of every adult to the Park, and on any such occasion no unauthorized person shall enter the Park without paying the fee charged for admission.

*Hours when Park Opens.*

3. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

*Acts Prohibited if Done by Unauthorized Person.*

4. No unauthorized person shall do any of the following acts, matters, or things in the Park:—

- (1) On any day on which the Park may be open to the public enter the Park before the time hereinafter appointed for the opening thereof or enter the Park or remain therein after the time hereinafter appointed for the closing thereof.

*Injuring Trees or Flowers.*

- (2) Cut, pluck, injure, or destroy any tree, bush, or flower growing therein.

*Cutting Turf, &c.*

- (3) Dig, cut, or remove any sod, turf, loam, sand, gravel, or other substance thereon or therefrom.

*Causing Fire.*

- (4) Light any fire or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.

*Leaving Rubbish.*

- (5) Deposit or leave therein or on any part thereof any rubbish, bricks, manure, timber, or other substance or material whatsoever.

*Drying.*

- (6) Bleach or place out to dry any article or thing.

*Carpet Beating.*

- (7) Beat, shake, sweep, brush, or cleanse any carpet, rug, or mat or any other fabric retaining dust or dirt.

*Interference with Birds or Game.*

- (8) Catch or trap any bird or lay or place any trap for the taking of birds or take any bird's egg or nest or shoot or chase or disturb and game or other animal.

*Allowing Animals to Stray.*

- (9) Cause or suffer any horse, pony, mule, ass, bull, ox, cow, calf, heifer, steer, sheep, lamb, goat, hog, or sow belonging to him or in his charge to enter or go thereupon.
- (10) Encamp thereon or erect or place thereon any booth, tent, shed, stand, screen, post-rail fence, swing chair or seat (other than a camp-stool), or other portable chair or seat, or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or make any enclosure of any part thereof.

*Defacing Notices.*

- (11) Injure, deface, or remove any seat, notice, or notice-board, post, chair, railing, fence, barrier, or other thing which may be from time to time erected or placed thereon by or by the authority of the Council.

*Bill-posting.*

- (12) Post or paint any bill, placard, or notice thereon or on any fence, erection, or tree thereon.

*Carving Names, &c.*

- (13) Paint, write, cut, carve, or in any manner inscribe letters, figures, or marks upon or otherwise disfigure any rock or tree or any wall or fence or other structure or erection in the park.

*Beasts of Draught or Burden not to be Brought into Ground.*

- (14) Ride, drive, or bring or cause or suffer to be ridden, driven, or brought into the park any beast of draught or burden.

*Prohibition of Vehicles, except Perambulators and Wheeled Chairs.*

- (15) Drive or wheel or cause or suffer to be driven or wheeled into the park any barrow, truck, or machine or any vehicle other than a wheeled chair drawn or propelled by hand or a perambulator or a chaise drawn or propelled by hand and used solely for the conveyance of a child or children or an invalid. Provided that this and the last preceding rule shall not be deemed to prohibit the riding or driving of any horse, pony, ass, or mule or the driving or wheeling of any bicycle, tricycle, or other similar machine or of any other vehicle in any part of the park which is for the time being appointed or intended or adapted to be used as a horse-ride, bicycle-track, or carriage road, subject to such conditions as the Council may prescribe and as may be indicated in a notice or notices affixed or set up in a conspicuous position at or near to the several entrances to the park.

*Brawling, &c.*

- (16) Brawl, fight, use indecent language, or act in an indecent, disorderly, or offensive manner, or sell, distribute, or exhibit any indecent or infamous book, picture, or representation.

*Firearms.*

- (17) Fire or discharge any firearm or throw or discharge any missile.

*Climbing.*

- (18) Climb any wall or fence in or enclosing the park or any tree or any barrier, railing, or post in the park.

*Selling, &c., without Licence.*

- (19) Sell or let or ply for hire with any article, animal, and/or cart or distribute any bill or like thing or place any chair or seat for hire.

*Collection of Money.*

- (20) Solicit or gather money or other thing.

*Public Addresses.*

- (21) Deliver or read any public address, speech, lecture, prayer, or sermon or address of any kind, or sing any song or enter into any public discussion or play any musical instrument.

*Wading and Bathing—Pollution of Water—Fishing—Disturbing Fowl.*

- (22) Bathe, wade, or wash, or wash clothes or other articles in any lake, pond, stream, or other ornamental water in the park, or foul or pollute any such water, or take, injure, or destroy, or attempt to take, injure, or destroy or wilfully disturb any fish in any such water or wilfully disturb or worry or ill-treat any fowl in any such water or elsewhere in the park.

*Dogs.*

- (23) Cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the park unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control.

*Smoking.*

- (24) Smoke tobacco or any like substance in any building in the park whereby a notice or notices affixed or set up in some conspicuous position the Council may prohibit smoking in such building.

*Betting.*

- (25) Frequent or use the park for the purpose of betting or wagering or of agreeing to make any bet or wager.

*Playing Games.*

- (26) Play or take part in any game of football, quoits, bowls, hockey, cricket, tennis, or any other game, and no person shall play, practise, or engage in any game of sport in the park on Sundays.

*Trampling on Plants or Flower-beds.*

- (27) Walk or run over or stand, sit, or lie upon any part of any flower-bed or any shrub, underwood, fern, or plant or any ground in course of preparation or cultivation as a flower-bed or for the reception or growth of any shrub, underwood, fern, or plant.

*Obstruction of Officers, Disturbance, or Interruption.*

- (28) Obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the reserve or obstruct, disturb, or interrupt any officer of the Council in the proper execution of his duty, or any person or servant of any person employed by the Council in the proper execution of any work in connexion with the laying out, planting, improvement, or maintenance or caretaking of the park.

*General Clause.*

- (29) Do aid in or abet any act or thing which may not in these rules be specifically mentioned and which may tend to the injury or disfigurement of the reserve or to interfere with the use thereof by the public for the purposes of exercise and recreation.

*Improper Intrusion.*

5. A male person other than a boy under the age of seven years shall not enter or use any play-ground, place, room, or building set apart for the use of females, and a female person shall not enter or use any play-ground, place, room, or building set apart for the use of males.

*Penalties.*

6. Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall for each offence be liable to the penalty imposed therefor by the above-mentioned By-law, namely, a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Resolution for passing these Regulations agreed to by the Council the 29th day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

Confirmed the 27th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

## Boiler Inspection Act 1915 (No. 2621).

## REGULATION FOR THE INSPECTION AND TEST OF BOILERS.

At the Law Courts, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of November, 1926.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria.

WHEREAS by section 45 of Act No. 2621, *Boilers Inspection Act 1915*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations prescribing the mode in which the pressure which boilers are calculated to sustain is to be ascertained, and the method of reckoning the horse-power of boilers and prescribing the appurtenances, fittings, and connexions proper for boilers and the placing of identification stamps thereon; prescribing the forms of notices to be given under this Act in any case where the same is not expressly provided for; and generally for carrying this Act into execution: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulation, and furthermore that such Regulation shall be deemed to be in lieu of Regulation No. 1 previously approved by the Governor in Council on 28th March, 1916, which reads thus:—"The pressure which boilers are calculated to sustain is to be ascertained by applying the British Board of Trade Rules relating to Steam Boilers," and shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

## REGULATION NO. 1.

The pressure which boilers are calculated to sustain is to be ascertained by applying the British Board of Trade Rules relating to Steam Boilers, excepting in the case of Tubes and Tube Plates, to which the following rules shall apply:—

(1) Parts to be Stayed.—(a) All flat tube plates, except those of loco-type boilers and of other boilers in which the total gross area of surface occupied by tubes in any one plate, being the sum of one or more areas enclosed within lines touching the outsides of the outer rows of tubes, does not exceed 7 square feet, shall be stayed within the nests of tubes except as provided in the Board of Trade Rules for Water Tube Boilers.

(b) The parts of tube plates which lie outside the nests of tubes shall be stayed or supported wherever the size of the area of plate subject to steam pressure necessitates staying or support, either by marginal stay tubes or other means.

(c) Where stay tubes are required they shall be strong enough to support the load due to the steam pressure on the plate without taking account of any aid from the plain tubes contained in the areas.

(d) The stiffness of the tubes, plates, and pitch of stays within the nests of tubes where stay tubes are required, and where marginal stay tubes are required in support of blank spaces adjacent to or between the nests, shall be determined by flat plate rules under Board of Trade Rules.

The requirements for stay tubes shall be as specified in Board of Trade Rules.

(e) Tube plates within the nests of tubes, whether fitted with stay tubes or not, shall comply with requirements of paragraph (2) in regard to thickness and cross section between tubes.

(2) Minimum Thickness and Cross Section.—To provide a secure attachment for plain tubes in the tube plates, the thickness and cross section of the plate between the tube holes shall not be less than—

Steel tube plate—

$$.125D + .2 = \text{minimum thickness in inches.}$$

$$.17D + .025 = \text{minimum cross section in square inches.}$$

Copper tube plates—

$$.2D + .4 = \text{minimum thickness in inches.}$$

$$.527D - .263 = \text{minimum cross section in square inches.}$$

D is the diameter in inches of the tube at the part of attachment to tube plate.

(3) Holding Power of Plain Tubes.—(a) Where tube plates are not specially stayed in nests of tubes, the working pressure, based on the holding power of the tubes, shall not exceed that found by the following formula:—

$$W.P. = \frac{C \times D}{A}$$

D is, the diameter of tube, at the part of attachment to tube plate in inches.

A is the area in square inches of tube plate supported by each tube, which generally may be taken as the product of the horizontal and vertical pitches of the tubes less the area of the tube itself:

C = 470 for tubes expanded into parallel holes in steel or iron tube plates.

C = 530 for tubes expanded into taper holes in steel or iron tube plates.

For copper tube plates or copper or brass tubes the appropriate co-efficient should be reduced 20 per cent.

Where the thickness and cross section of the tube plates are less than the minimum prescribed in paragraph (2), the appropriate co-efficient shall be reduced in proportion to the deficit.

Where no stay tubes are fitted the tubes at the fire-box end shall be beaded over or bell-mouthed.

(b) In the unstayed tube plates of loco-type boilers and in other tube plates in which stay tubes are not required, the support afforded by the plain tubes shall not be taken to extend beyond the lines enclosing the outer edges of the tubes. Parts of flat plate outside this line shall either lie in the plate margin or be separately supported. No account need be taken of the stiffness of tube plate in the nests of tubes when the above conditions are fulfilled.

Ordinarily the requirements of this clause are applicable only to expanded smoke and water tubes in flat continuous tube plates containing more than one row of tubes. See Board of Trade Rules for Water Tube Boilers.

(4) Tube Plates, other than Ends, of Vertical Boilers Forming Parts of Outer Shell.—(a) When vertical boilers have a nest or nests of horizontal tubes so that there is a direct tension on the tube plates due to the vertical load on the boiler ends, or to their acting as horizontal ties across the shell, the thickness of the tube plates and the spacing of the tubes shall be such that the section of metal taking the load is sufficient to keep the stress within that allowed on the shell plates.

(b) Each alternative tube in the outer vertical rows of tubes shall be a stay tube. The tube plates between the stay tube shall be in accordance with the rules for tube plates, and in addition, considered as part of shell, the maximum working pressures—

$$W.P. = \frac{17.24 (t - 2) \times (P - D) \times S}{R \times P}$$

T is the thickness of the tube plate in 32nds of an inch.  
P is the vertical pitch of the tubes in inches.  
D is the diameter of the tube holes in inches.

S is the minimum tensile breaking strength of the tube plate in tons per square inch, or whatever is allowed for them.

R is the radial distance of the centre of the outer row of tube holes from the axis of the shell in inches.

(5) Copper Tubes.—Copper tubes up to 1 inch in external diameter may be used for small boilers; such tubes shall not be less than 12 S.W.G. (.104 inch) thick.

(6) Brass and Copper Tubes.—The thickness of tapered brass and copper smoke tubes for locomotive boilers shall, in the case of tubes of an external diameter of 1½ to 1¼ inches inclusive, be not less than 12 S.W.G. (.104 inch) at the smoke-box end and 10 S.W.G. (.128 inch) at the other; and in the case of tubes of an external diameter of 2 to 2¼ inches inclusive, the thickness at the smoke-box end shall not be less than 11 S.W.G. (.116 inch), and at the other end not less than 9 S.W.G. (.144 inch).

And the Honorable George Louis Goudie, His Majesty's Minister of Mines for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas by the *Local Government Act 1921* (No. 3167) it is provided that when any portion of Victoria is, pursuant to the *Local Government Acts*, annexed as a new subdivision to any subdivided municipal district, the Governor in Council, if he thinks fit, may by Order provide for the election forthwith of councillors for such new subdivision, and give all such directions therefor as are necessary or expedient: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Acts are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the rate-payers of a portion of the Shire of Corio with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been duly published: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the said shire a certain area therein described, being part of the Moorpanyal riding, and doth annex and constitute the portion so severed from such shire to the Town of Geelong West as a separate ward to be called the West Ward, and doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Corio and its Moorpanyal Riding as reduced, and of the said Town of Geelong West as enlarged with the West Ward thereof as constituted, in the manner hereafter set forth and described, and doth appoint Thursday, the twentieth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven as a day for holding an election of three councillors for such West Ward, and furthermore doth appoint Mr. Howard Robert Hill French, Town Clerk of Geelong West, to prepare, make out, and sign a voters' roll for such West Ward, such roll to be prepared from the voters' roll in force in the Shire of Corio (with respect to the portion so severed) at the date of this Order, and such roll so signed shall be deemed to be the voters' roll for the West Ward of the Town of Geelong West.

His Excellency doth by this Order further appoint the said Mr. Howard Robert Hill French Returning Officer for the said West Ward by and before whom an election of three councillors shall be conducted in conformity with the provisions of the *Local Government Act*, and doth order that a poll for the election of such councillors shall commence at the hour of Eight o'clock in the forenoon and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon, and that the voting by post provisions as made applicable to the Town of Geelong West shall apply to such election.

**CORIO SHIRE (REDUCED AND REDEFINED).**

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.

No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
  5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvements of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
  6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
  7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
  8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
  9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
  10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
  11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
  12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF PORTION OF THE FORESHORE RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF WANNAEUE, KNOWN AS THE "TOOTGAROOK FORESHORE RESERVE."**

WE, George Albert Luscombe, David Cairns, William Chatfield, and William Trueman, the duly appointed Committee of Management of portion of the foreshore reserve in the Parish of Wannaeue as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked W/9.7.26 attached to Lands Department correspondence C.76257, and known as the "Tootgarook Foreshore Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as portion of the Reserve exclusive of the beach may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to such portion of the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or be under the influence of liquor.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the written consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as incorporated by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any tent, boat-shed, bathing-box, or any other building without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee of Management, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee of Management consistent with these Regulations, and no person shall use a boat-shed or bathing-box for residential purposes.
9. No motor cars or vehicles shall be permitted to use any track or pathway in any part of Reserve excepting in parking areas set apart for them. The sum of One shilling per day may be charged for the parking of motor cars or vehicles.
10. No person shall engage in betting in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall erect in the Reserve any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

13. No person shall carry or discharge firearms in the Reserve.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

15. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
