SHIRE OF CHILTERN.

BY-LAW No. 33.

A By-law making rates and charges for water supplied within the Water Supply District of the Shire of Chiltern.

THE Council of the Shire of Chiltern, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (Nos. 2747 and 2852), do hereby make the following rates upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Chiltern, for the year ending 31st December, 1926, and to come into operation on 1st January, and to be due and payable half-yearly in advance on 1st January, 1926, and 1st July, 1926.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, other than by measure, for domestic purposes:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds and under, 10 per cent. per annum on the amount of 1915 valuation.
2. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds, One pound per annum.
3. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds and not exceeding Thirty pounds, One pound five shillings per annum.
4. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Thirty pounds and not exceeding Forty pounds, One pound ten shillings per annum.
5. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Forty pounds and not exceeding Fifty pounds, One pound fifteen shillings per annum.
6. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Fifty pounds and not exceeding Sixty pounds, Two pounds per annum.
7. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Sixty pounds and not exceeding Eighty pounds, Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
8. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Eighty pounds and not exceeding One hundred pounds, Three pounds per annum.
9. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred pounds and not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds, Four pounds per annum.
10. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred and fifty pounds and not exceeding Two hundred and fifty pounds, Five pounds per annum.
11. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Two hundred and fifty pounds, Six pounds per annum.
12. For every vacant piece of land which has a separate municipal value of any amount and past which the main is laid, but not connected therewith, Three shillings per annum.
13. Water from the stand-pipes and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates:—
Licence to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand-pipes, One pound per annum.
Licence to cart water (with horse and dray) for use of licensee only, Ten shillings per annum.
Licence to cart water away from the public taps other than by horse and dray, Five shillings per annum.
14. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.
15. Water troughs, Five shillings per annum (providing ball regulating taps are used).
16. Livery stables, Ten shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).
17. Hotel with stabling, not being a livery stable, Four shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

DIVISION 14 OF PART V. WITH REGARD TO COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING MADE APPLICABLE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS OF COUNCILLORS OF THE TOWN OF PRESTON UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 148 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1915 (No. 2686) AS AMENDED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1918 (No. 2981).

At the Government Cottage, Macedon, the tenth day of February, 1926.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the Town of Preston, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the Ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
 - (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
 - (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
 - (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
 - (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.
- (2) Each deputy returning officer shall—
- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.
- (3) The returning officer shall—
- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
 - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
 - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole Ward the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.
- (5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot boxes.

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—
- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
 - (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the Town of Preston of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

The ballot-paper so marked by or for the voter must be dropped by you into the ballot-box.

You must not take this ballot-paper out of the polling booth.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Dried Fruits Acts to make Regulations for all matters and things necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the Act into effect, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

REGISTRATION OF DRIED FRUIT DEALERS.

1. The Regulations for the Registration of Dried Fruit Dealers, dated 10th March, 1925, are hereby and the same shall be repealed.
2. The following Regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the Registration of Dried Fruit Dealers, and shall come into operation on and from the 10th day of February, 1926.

Definitions.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—

“Dried fruits” means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias.

“Dealer” means any person not being a grower of dried fruits who sells in any one year whether on his own behalf or as agent for some other person more than 5 tons of dried fruits but does not include a person who sells only such dried fruits as he buys from dried fruit dealers who are registered as such with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board.

4. Every person who on the date on which these Regulations came into force was engaged in business as a dealer in dried fruits shall register with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins-place, Melbourne, on or before the 20th day of February, 1926, and such registration shall be renewed annually.

5. Every person who, after the date on which these Regulations came into force, engages in the business of a dealer in dried fruits shall register with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board. Such registration shall be made within seven days after the date on which he commences to engage in such business, and shall be renewed annually.

6. Every dealer as aforesaid shall apply for registration in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations, and shall furnish the particulars therein required, which shall be verified by statutory declaration.

7. Every person to whom this Regulation applies shall furnish such returns relating to the dried fruits owned by them or in their disposal or under their control, as may be prescribed by the Victorian Dried Fruits Board from time to time.

8. Any person to whom this Regulation applies who fails, neglects, or refuses to register as a dealer shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Dried Fruits Acts to make Regulations for or with respect to the registration, and the renewal or the transfer of registration of packing sheds, and for other purposes, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

REGISTRATION OF PACKING SHEDS.

General.

1. The Regulations for the Registration of Packing Sheds which came into operation on the 10th day of March, 1925, are hereby and the same shall be repealed.
2. The following Regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the Registration of Packing Sheds, and shall come into operation on the 10th day of February, 1926.

Definitions.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—

“Dried fruits” means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias.

“Packing shed” means any building or erection in which dried fruits are stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of trade or sale, whether such building or erection is or is not used for any other purpose.

4. Applications for registration or renewal of registration of dried fruits packing sheds for the year 1926, which must be accompanied by a fee of £1, must be lodged with the Secretary to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins-place, Melbourne, before or on 20th day of February, 1926, and be in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations.

5. Applications for registration must be made in the name of the owner or occupier of the packing shed, or where the owner or occupier carries on business under the name of a registered firm, or under the name of a public company, in the name of such firm or company.

6. Registration by the Board of any packing shed shall, amongst other things, be subject to any conditions which may be imposed with respect to—

- (a) the observance by the owner or occupier of the packing shed of determinations made from time to time under the Dried Fruits Acts regarding the proportion of the output of dried fruits to be marketed within the Commonwealth;
- (b) the payment of the contributions chargeable under the Dried Fruits Act, No. 3418;
- (c) the furnishing of returns from time to time regarding the quantities of fruit received by and forwarded from such packing shed;
- (d) the inspection and regulation of packing sheds;
- (e) the suitability of the premises for the stemming, processing, grading, sorting, and packing of dried fruits; and

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Dried Fruits Acts to make Regulations for all matters and things necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the Acts into effect, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

RETURNS TO BE FURNISHED BY PACKING SHEDS.

1. The Regulations regarding the furnishing of returns by Packing Sheds which came into operation on the 10th day of March, 1925, are hereby and the same shall be repealed.
2. The following Regulations shall come into force on the 10th day of February, 1926.

Definitions.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—
"Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias.
"Packing shed" means any building or erection in which dried fruits are stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of trade or sale, whether such building or erection is or is not used for any other purpose.
4. Every owner or occupier of or person in charge of a packing shed shall, not later than the Wednesday in each week during the whole of the packing season, furnish to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board—

- (a) a return of the quantities of dried fruits actually packed in such packing shed during the week ended each Saturday since the date of the last previous return.

(b) a return of the quantities of dried fruits delivered by him from such packing shed during the week ended each Saturday since the date of the last previous return.

5. Such returns shall be furnished in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations, and the particulars contained therein shall be verified by statutory declaration when required.

6. Any person to whom this Regulation applies who fails, neglects, or refuses to make a return shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

In accordance with the provisions of sections 4, 6, 7, and 44 of Act No. 3416, the following declarations are hereby made concerning the classification of schools and teachers as primary, secondary, and technical respectively:—

1. A primary school is a school or part of a school in which is provided the whole or part of the course of study as set out in Regulation I.—General Course of Study. Every school unless otherwise expressly declared by the Minister to be a secondary school or a technical school shall be deemed to be a primary school.

2. A secondary school is a school (other than a school declared to be a technical school) in which a course of study is provided higher than that prescribed for the qualifying examination in Regulation IV., clause 1.

The following schools are hereby declared to be secondary schools:—

- (a) District high schools.
- (b) Junior technical schools.
- (c) Schools of domestic arts.
- (d) Higher elementary schools and central schools so far as classes taking courses other than that mentioned in (1) above are concerned.

3. A technical school is a school other than a junior technical school which has been proclaimed by Order in Council as a technical school.

4. A teacher whose chief work as certified by the Director consists in teaching the subjects of the course of instruction prescribed for primary schools (Regulation 1), or in organizing such work, shall be deemed to be engaged in primary school work. In any case the decision of the Director shall be final.

5. Unless specially exempted a teacher whose chief work as certified by the Director consists in teaching subjects included in the courses of instruction provided for district high schools, junior technical schools, schools of domestic arts, or other schools or institutions declared to be doing secondary work shall be deemed to be engaged in secondary school work. In any case the decision of the Director shall be final.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
