SHIRE OF GLENLYON.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE FROM SHIRE OF GLENLYON AND ANNEXATION TO SHIRE OF NEWSTEAD AND MOUNT ALEXANDER.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the Parish of Yandoit, and they desire that the said parish may be severed from the Shire of Glenlyon and annexed to the Shire of Newstead and Mount Alexander.

The petitioners state that the area in question is in close proximity to the township and railway station of Newstead; that the business transactions and general interests of the ratepayers are more in keeping with those of Newstead than with Glenlyon; and that it is the desire of a majority of the said ratepayers to be severed from the Shire of Glenlyon and annexed to the Shire of Newstead and Mount Alexander.

Superannuation Act 1925 (No. 3408).

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS under section 52 of the *Superannuation Act* 1925 the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the State Superannuation Board, make Regulations not inconsistent with the said Act prescribing all matters required or permitted to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to the Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act, doth hereby make the following Regulations and provide that the said Regulations shall come into operation from the date of such approval:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the State Superannuation Regulations.

2. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—

- “The Act” means the *Superannuation Act* 1925.
- “The Board” means the State Superannuation Board.
- “The Schedule” means the Schedule to these Regulations.
- “The Fund” means the Superannuation Fund.
- “Approved” means approved by the Governor in Council.

Section 13 (2).

3. The time within which an officer to whom sub-section (2) of section 13 relates may elect as provided therein shall be TWO YEARS from the 1st January, 1926:

Provided that an officer appointed subsequent to 1st January, 1926, may exercise such right of election within TWO YEARS from the date of commencing duty as such officer.

Section 13 (4) (a).

4. The time within which an officer to whom paragraph (a) of sub-section (4) of section 13 relates may elect to increase the amount of his contributions in accordance with the said paragraph shall be THREE months from the date on which payment at the increased rate is actually made.

Provided that an officer whose salary was so increased prior to the date on which these Regulations are approved may exercise his right of election at any time within THREE months from the date of such approval.

Section 13 (6).

5. The time within which an officer referred to in sub-section (6) of section 13 may elect as provided therein shall be THREE months from the date on which these Regulations are approved.

Section 52 (1).

6. The time within which an officer having rights under any other Act may elect under section 52 of the Act to come under the Act for the purpose of the difference, as defined in the said section shall be THIRTEEN months from the 1st January, 1926.

Section 53.

7. The time within which an officer may elect under the provisions of section 53 of the Act to come under the Act for any of the limited purposes referred to in paragraphs (d), (e), and (f) of sub-section (1) of such section shall be THIRTEEN months from the 1st January, 1926.

Section 53 (2) (a).

8. The contributions which shall be paid by an officer in respect of a pension or pensions under section 53 of the Act shall be in accordance with the table of contributions set out in the Schedule hereto:

Provided that in the case of an officer who elected as provided in section 53 on or before the 31st March, 1926, the rate of contribution shall be the rate applicable to age 30 next birthday.

Section 58 (3).

9. Whenever any question arises as to whether an officer referred to in sub-section (3) of section 58 is unable by reason of ill-health or physical or mental incapacity to perform his duties, or whether such ill-health or incapacity is due to his fault, the question shall be determined by the Board (whether before or after the retirement of the officer) upon a report from a legally qualified medical practitioner appointed by the Board as a medical officer for the purpose:

Provided that upon receipt by the Board of an adverse report from the Medical Officer, and before the determination is made, the officer shall have the right to obtain a second report from a legally qualified medical practitioner mutually agreed upon by the officer and the Board.

Section 58 (3) (b) (ii).

10. The time within which an officer referred to in sub-section (3) of section 58 may elect under the provisions of sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of the said sub-section shall be THIRTEEN months from the 1st January, 1926.

Section 58 (3) (b) (iii).

11. The time within which an officer referred to in sub-section (3) of section 58 may elect under the provisions of sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (b) of the said sub-section shall be THIRTEEN months from the 1st January, 1926.

Provided that in the case of an officer who elected as provided in the said sub-section on or before 31st March, 1926, the rate of contribution shall be the rate applicable to age 30 next birthday.

12. In all calculations, a fraction of a penny being one-half or more shall be regarded as one penny, and a fraction of a penny being less than one-half shall be disregarded.

Section 77.

13. The time within which an officer desirous of being examined by a medical officer appointed under the provisions of the proviso to section 77 of the Act may exercise the right to obtain a second report from a legally qualified medical practitioner mutually agreed upon by the contributor and the Board shall be FOURTEEN days after the date of the communication from the Board that the report of the medical officer appointed by the Board is adverse to his retirement.

14. When required by the Board, evidence to the satisfaction of the Board shall be submitted in the manner required by the Board by every person in receipt of a pension under the Act—

- (a) that the person in respect of whom the pension is being paid is still alive; and
- (b) in the case of widows' pensions, that the person in respect of whom the pension is being paid has not remarried; and
- (c) in the case of children's pensions, that such children are still in the care of the person to whom the pension on their behalf is being paid.

LAWLOIT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1927 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF KANIVA.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Lawloit Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rate and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1927 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Kaniva, as such district has been proclaimed and defined.

(1) *Minimum*.—Every vacant allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, and being on the pipe line, 15s. per annum.

Every vacant allotment of land within the Waterworks District, and not being on the pipe line, 5s. per annum.

For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Sixteen pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Three pounds sterling per annum.

(2) *On Valuation Above Minimum*.—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of Sixteen pounds sterling or more than Sixteen pounds annual value, an amount equal to 3s. 9d. in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

(3) *Special Rates*.—For all tenements, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate; and where such tenements, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rate.

(4) *Minimum Meter Charge—Excess Meter Charge*.—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per one thousand gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of Three shillings per one thousand gallons for anything over that quantity.

(5) *Public Institutions and Others*.—Water supplied to all Government Departments, charitable or other institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure, at Three shillings and fourpence per one thousand gallons, or by special agreement.

(6) *Irrigation*.—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

(7) *Water Rate Outside Trust's Area*.—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per one thousand gallons.

(8) *Water Troughs*.—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 4,000 gallons per annum, at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons.

(9) *Interpretation Clause*.—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean the Lawloit Waterworks Trust—Urban District of Kaniva.

(10) *Excess Payments*.—Where water meters are affixed the excess payments shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Period of Rate.—That the above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1927, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1927, and shall be payable in one moiety due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1927.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1927.

A By-law for making a rate for the year 1927 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Morwell Waterworks Trust, which district has for the purposes of the Water Acts been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

A RATE of One shilling in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Morwell, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound and ten shillings (£1 10s.).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land the municipal value of which does not exceed Seven pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings (7s.). When such value is over Seven pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3. For every public water trough; the sum of One pound (£1).

4. For every livery, coach, and carrier's stables, the sum of Five shillings per annum for the first stall, and Five shillings per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds and for stabling, each 6 feet is to be considered one stall.

5. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the rate named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

7. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

8. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of January, 1927.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

MAFFRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Maffra Waterworks Trust under and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, and numbered 14, for making a rate for water supply purposes and for other purposes.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Maffra Waterworks Trust do hereby order as follows:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied for the year 1927 within the Urban District of the Trust:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds rateable annual value or under, 25s. per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual rateable value of Twenty pounds, a rate of 1s. 3d. in the £1 per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (c) On each allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same; provided that no allotment or piece of land shall be rated at less than Five shillings per annum.
- (d) For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.
- (e) For water supplied by the said Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), Two shillings per thousand gallons.
- (f) Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, and to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, livery and coach-horse stables, and to hotel premises (unless otherwise herein provided), shall be charged for by measurement.
- (g) For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, One shilling per load of 100 gallons or less.
- (h) For water supplied temporarily to buildings in the course of progress, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. Provided that the minimum charge hereunder shall be not less than £1.
- (i) For all lands or tenements in the said district situate otherwise than in streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and in which tenements are not supplied with water from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe or hydrant for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are more than a quarter of a mile and less than half a mile from such stand-pipe or hydrant, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates, or such other lesser rate as the Trust may in its discretion think fit.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure (excepting in the case of Government departments, hospitals, cricket clubs, and bowling greens, and for ornamental purposes) shall be:—

- (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which at the charge of Two shillings per thousand gallons would produce an amount equal to the amount of the water rate which under the Trust's By-law would be payable for the said lands and tenements, if so supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, the Trust may grant special supplies of water (the charges for which shall be in addition to the assessment rates aforesaid) according to the following terms and conditions:—

- (a) To manufactories, railways, livery stables, public gardens, and clubs, or for other than domestic purposes, at such special rates as the Trust, in its absolute discretion, shall determine.
- (b) To gardens not exceeding 150 square yards in area in which one tap only is erected on payment of a special rate of Fifteen shillings per annum, and for each additional tap a further amount of Five shillings. Any garden above such area shall be supplied only by measurement.
- (c) For every private water trough, the sum of £1 per annum, unless such water be supplied by measurement.
- (d) For using a hose for stable watering, the sum of £1 per annum.

4. Otherwise than herein provided, no person shall use water by means of a hose or otherwise for watering gardens, washing horse-drawn vehicles, motor cars, or motor vehicles, or for other than domestic purposes, unless such water is duly measured by a meter duly approved and erected in accordance with the Trust's requirements.

5. For every plumber's licence there shall be paid the fee of £1 for the year ending 31st December, 1927, or for any portion of such year.

6. In the event of the supply of water being cut off or disconnected by the Trust for breach of any of its By-laws, the owner or occupier shall pay a sum of £1 for re-connection with the main.

7. No water shall be used for gardens, lawns, or for other than domestic purposes between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m., nor between the hours of 11 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless the Trust shall otherwise direct or permit in writing. For the purpose of conserving water, or for extensions or repairs, the Trust may at its discretion cut off the supply of water at or during such hours as it shall deem expedient.

8. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law shall be paid by and be recoverable from the owner of the premises, or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

9. The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance by equal instalments on the first day of February, 1927, and the first day of August, 1927 (except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust from time to time), and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned. Interest at the rate of Six pounds per centum per annum will be charged on sums six months overdue. Amounts under £2 shall be paid in one sum, in advance, on the first day of February, 1927.

A rate of Twopence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied upon all rateable property within the Dimboola and Lowan Divisions respectively of the Waterworks Trust District of the said Trust, and such rate shall be based upon the valuation for the time being of the property rated.

Such rate shall be payable upon the 1st day of January, 1927.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing By-law was made on the 18th day of November, 1926, by the Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust.

CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW No. 36.

THE Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has for the purpose of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of land and tenements shall pay in advance in one instalment for the period from the first day of October, 1926, to the thirtieth day of September, 1927, in respect of water supplied by the Council (that is to say):—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Thirteenpence (1s. 1d.) in each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) sterling.

(b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the first day of October or the first day of April, shall be charged two-thirds rate.

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Thirteenpence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(e) Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Council shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.

(f) For water supplied by the Council by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

(g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons, and the ratepayers shall be charged for a quantity of water which, at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from the stand-pipe.

(h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(i) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(j) For a supply of water for building purposes the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per centum on the contract price for all stonework, brickwork, and plastering, and in the absence of any such contract on the sum paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering. The Council may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement at the rate of 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons consumed. The minimum charge on the per centum basis to be 5s., and, as per measurement, 20s. Such charges to be paid by the owner of the building. Payment in either case to be made in advance.

(k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum of Five shillings. With paid meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified therein must be paid for at such rate as the Council shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Council before a supply can be taken or used.

(m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Council shall have power to decide to make a special charge.

(n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons, is equal to the amount of the assessed rate for the period which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(o) For water supplied to public parks and show grounds the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

(p) For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens, the Manifold-street Reserve, and Flagstaff Hill Reserve, the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

(q) The before-mentioned rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January of the said year, and such charges shall be payable the fourteenth day of January of the said year.

(r) For water supplied to the Warrnambool State Schools, Warrnambool High School, Warrnambool Technical School, the charge shall be Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the water must be taken through a meter.

(s) Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

Cemeteries Act 1915.

NHILL PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Nhill Public Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of 21st August, 1891, and make the following Rules and Regulations:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made, when an order in accordance with the Trustees' requirements will be given to the applicant upon payment of the charges set out in the scale of fees.

2. Before any interment shall take place, application for permission shall be made to the sexton at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made, and no free interment shall be allowed unless the period of notice mentioned is given.

3. The usual hours of interment for week days shall be from Eight a.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year, unless by special permission of the Trustees.

4. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the said cemetery without a certificate from a registrar of deaths or coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary or gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery. No interment shall be permitted in a private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence, and, if required, a statutory declaration shall be made that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.

5. Any two Trustees of the cemetery may, by written order addressed to the secretary, direct the burial of any poor person in such cemetery free of any charges whatsoever, provided after due inquiry they are satisfied such person, his relatives, or friends are unable to pay such charges; and if such person shall be known or believed to have belonged to any particular religious denomination he shall be buried in the part (if any) of the cemetery set apart for such denomination. All orders for free burial given under these regulations or by justices under section 50 of the *Cemeteries Act 1915* shall be recorded by the secretary.

6. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the cemetery or to stand opposite the entrance gates except by authority of the Trustees first had and obtained. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

7. That unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance shall be open daily from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.

8. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

9. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, the Trustees having full power to destroy same.

10. That every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep for one interment and at least 7 feet for two interments, and no coffin shall be interred within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in same grave, and in the case of a tomb or vault a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left above and around the uppermost coffin.

11. That the Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under directions of the sexton on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, and be air and water tight.

12. That any person desiring to construct, add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect, add to, or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence or any other construction or erection on any part of the cemetery, shall apply in writing to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work.

13. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of owner. Should the owner's residence not be known or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the owner.

14. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the side

entrances, and no vehicle conveying any such materials or soil shall be permitted to enter the cemetery during wet or unfavorable weather.

15. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once at the expense of the person causing the same.

16. That any workman not employed by the Trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the Trustees or person authorized by them, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

17. That any person prior to placing any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the cemetery, shall apply in writing to the Trustees and submit a copy thereof to the Trustees, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.

18. No person shall promote or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by advertising, solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or by any other means of advertisement whatsoever.

19. No person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border, railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place.

20. The Trustees reserve to themselves the power to decorate graves from time to time when desired by the owners so to do, and when the owners do not desire, the Trustees to carry out such work they may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees to do such necessary work, but no trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave without the permission of the Trustees. The Trustees further reserve to themselves the right to remove any monument, stone, border rail, or fence which they consider beyond repair, unsightly, or in any way objectionable.

21. That no person, except relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, and those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

22. That no person employed under the Trustees shall, without their consent, be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees.

23. That the secretary shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and carry out and enforce these rules, and subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, the direction of such person shall in all such matters and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

24. That any person committing any breach of any of these rules or regulations, or of any other rules, regulations, or By-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the cemetery by the Trustees, secretary, or sexton, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

25. The Trustees reserve to themselves the right of determining the extent of land to be purchased by any one applicant over and above four allotments.

26. A plan of the ground and a register, also a register of all certificates of rights of burial which are issued, will be kept by the secretary and may be examined upon payment of the charges fixed.

27. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time to these charges and regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.

BY-LAW No. 184.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII, Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 184, to further amend or add to the provisions of By-law No. 179 with reference to street traffic.

WHEREAS it is desirable to further amend or add to the provisions of By-law Number 179 Now therefore the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by Act 6 George V. Number 2686 and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law Number 179 intituled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII, Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and under Part I. of the *Carriages Act 1915* and numbered 179 to amend and consolidate the By-laws and Regulations with reference to street traffic."

2. Section 4 of By-law Number 179 shall be amended by inserting immediately after sub-section (15) thereof the following new sub-section that is to say:—

(15a) Not load or unload or permit to be loaded or unloaded from his vehicle goods for delivery or stop except for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers on the west side of that section of Swanston-street lying between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street between the hours of forty-five minutes past Eight o'clock in the morning and forty-five minutes past Nine o'clock in the morning on any day of the week Sundays excepted.

3. Sub-section (16) of the said section 4 is hereby repealed and the following new sub-sections shall be inserted and read in lieu thereof that is to say:—

(16) Not stop except for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers or for loading or unloading goods or in obedience to the direction of such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council as aforesaid in any street (parking areas excepted) within the area bounded as follows, viz., on the south by that section of the south side of Flinders-street lying between Russell-street and Queen-street, on the west by that section of the west side of Queen-street lying between Flinders-street and Lonsdale-street, on the north by that section of the north side of Lonsdale-street lying between Queen-street and Russell-street, and on the east by that section of the east side of Russell-street lying between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street—between the hours of Two o'clock in the afternoon and half-past Six o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and between the hours of half-past Ten o'clock in the morning and half-past One o'clock in the afternoon on Saturdays provided that this sub-section shall not apply to drivers of licensed motor cars or hackney carriages while plying for hire on any stand fixed or appointed by the Council under any By-law.

(16a) Not stop except for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers or in obedience to the direction of such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council as aforesaid (notwithstanding anything contained in the last preceding sub-section hereof) on the east side of that section of Swanston-street lying between Lonsdale-street and Batman-avenue between the hours of half-past Four o'clock in the afternoon and half-past Six o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and between the hours of half-past Eleven o'clock in the morning and half-past One o'clock in the afternoon on Saturdays.

4. Sub-section (17) of the said section 4 is hereby repealed and the following new sub-section shall be inserted and read in lieu thereof that is to say:—

(17) Not turn to the right at the following street intersections or junctions respectively, viz.:—

- (a) Lonsdale-street and Swanston-street.
- (b) Flinders-street and Elizabeth-street.
- (c) Bourke-street and Swanston-street.
- (d) Collins-street and Swanston-street.
- (e) Flinders-street and Swanston-street.

The provisions of this sub-section shall in the case of sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof respectively apply only between the hours of half-past Four o'clock in the afternoon and half-past Six o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and between the hours of half-past Eleven o'clock in the morning and half-past One o'clock in the afternoon on Saturdays, and in the case of sub-paragraphs (c) (d) and (e) thereof respectively shall apply thereto between the aforesaid hours respectively and also between the hours of forty-five minutes past Eight o'clock in the morning and forty-five minutes past Nine o'clock in the morning on each of such days respectively.

5. Sub-section (18) of the said section 4 is hereby repealed and the following new sub-section shall be inserted and read in lieu thereof that is to say:—

(18) Not turn to the left—

- (a) From Collins-street, Bourke-street, or Flinders-street respectively to proceed south into Swanston-street.
- (b) From Flinders-street to proceed north into Swanston-street.
- (c) From Swanston-street to proceed west into Flinders-street.

The provisions of this sub-section shall in the case of sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof apply only between the hours of half-past Four o'clock in the afternoon and half-past Six o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and between the hours of half-past Eleven o'clock in the morning and half-past One o'clock in the afternoon on Saturdays, and in the case of sub-paragraph (c) thereof shall apply thereto between the aforesaid hours respectively and also between the hours of forty-five minutes past Eight o'clock in the morning and forty-five minutes past Nine o'clock in the morning on each of such days respectively.

6. Section 16 of the said By-law 179 shall be amended by deleting therefrom the words "Swanston-street" wheresoever appearing therein and inserting in lieu thereof "Russell-street," and by adding at the end thereof the following words "or any part of Bond-street respectively."

7. Immediately after section 16 the following new section shall be inserted that is to say:—

(16a) Every driver who shall draw up his vehicle (except for the purpose of loading or unloading goods) in any part of the streets mentioned in the last preceding section to which the provisions of such section shall apply shall do so only on the left or near side of the same respectively.

8. (1) Drivers may park their vehicles in such streets or parts thereof respectively as hereinafter mentioned, viz.:—

Queen-street—Centre of street from Flinders-street to Collins-street and from Little Collins-street to Bourke-street.

Russell-street—Centre of street from Flinders-street to Collins-street.

(2) The Council may appoint from time to time such attendants as it thinks proper to supervise such parking areas and every driver shall pay to the Town Clerk or such other officer as the Council shall from time to time direct a fee of 1s. per day or portion of a day for such vehicle parked by such driver in such parking area.

9. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

10. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS made by the Council of the City of Melbourne in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and other public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof.

1. These Regulations shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with the Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne on the third day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, intituled "Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne in pursuance of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, for the route to be observed by all carriages carts vehicles and persons and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and other public places and for preventing any obstruction thereof."

2. Clause 2 of the above-mentioned Regulations shall be amended by inserting immediately after sub-clause (15) thereof the following new sub-clause, that is to say:—

(15a) Not load or unload or permit to be loaded or unloaded from his vehicle goods for delivery or stop except for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers on the west side of that section of Swanston-street lying between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street between the hours of forty-five minutes past Eight o'clock in the morning and forty-five minutes past Nine o'clock in the morning on any day of the week, Sundays excepted.

3. Sub-clause (16) of the said clause 2 is hereby repealed and the following new sub-clauses shall be inserted and read in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

(16) Not stop except for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers or for loading or unloading goods or in obedience to the direction of such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council as aforesaid in any street (parking areas excepted) within the area bounded as follows, viz.:—On the south by that section of the south side of Flinders-street lying between Russell-street and Queen-street, on the west by that section of the west side of Queen-street lying between Flinders-street and Lonsdale-street, on the north by that section of the north side of Lonsdale-street lying between Queen-street and Russell-street, and on the east by that section of the east side of Russell-street lying between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street—between the hours of Two o'clock in the afternoon and half-past Six o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and between the hours of half-past Ten o'clock in the morning and half-past One o'clock in the afternoon on Saturdays, provided that this sub-clause shall not apply to drivers of licensed motor cars or hackney carriages while plying for hire on any stand fixed or appointed by the Council under any By-law.

(16a) Not stop except for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers or in obedience to the direction of such member of the police force or officer of the Council as aforesaid (notwithstanding anything contained in the last preceding sub-clause hereof) on the East side of that section of Swanston-street lying between Lonsdale-street and Batman-avenue between the hours of half-past Four o'clock in the afternoon and half-past Six o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, and between the hours of half-past Eleven o'clock in the morning and half-past 1 o'clock in the afternoon on Saturdays.

4. Sub-clause (17) of the said clause 2 is hereby repealed and the following new sub-clause shall be inserted and read in lieu thereof that is to say:—

(17) Not turn to the right at the following street intersections or junctions respectively, viz.:—

- (a) Lonsdale-street and Swanston-street.
- (b) Flinders-street and Elizabeth-street.
- (c) Bourke-street and Swanston-street.
- (d) Collins-street and Swanston-street.
- (e) Flinders-street and Swanston-street.

The provisions of this sub-clause shall in the case of sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof apply only between the hours of half-past Four o'clock in the afternoon and half-past Six o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and between the hours of half-past Eleven o'clock in the morning and half-past One o'clock in the afternoon on Saturdays, and in the case of sub-paragraph (c) thereof shall apply thereto between the aforesaid hours respectively and also between the hours of forty-five minutes past Eight o'clock in the morning and forty-five minutes past Nine o'clock in the morning on each of such days respectively.

6. Clause 14 of the said Regulations shall be amended by deleting therefrom the words "Swanston-street" wherever appearing therein and inserting in lieu thereof "Russell-street," and by adding at the end thereof the following words, viz.: "or any part of Bond-street respectively."

7. Immediately after clause 14 thereof the following new clause shall be inserted that is to say:—

(14a) Every driver who shall draw up his vehicle (except for the purpose of loading or unloading goods) in any part of the streets mentioned in the last preceding clause to which the provisions of such clause shall apply shall do so only on the left or near side of the same respectively.
