AMENDMENT OF SCALE OF PILOTAGE RATES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 79 of the *Marine Act 1915*, and under all other powers it in that behalf enabling, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine as follows:—

- That on and after the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, the pilotage rate from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, for steamships or ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power up to 5,000 tons of the vessel's burthen, shall be One penny and five-eighths of a penny (1 $\frac{5}{8}$ d.) per ton, calculated on the vessel's net registered tonnage, and for every additional ton, One penny (1d.), subject in any case to a minimum charge of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.)
- The provisions of these presents shall take effect on and from the first day of March, 1926.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 277.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following by-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous by-laws as conflict therewith:—

- (1) **TERMINAL CHARGES ON CHAFF.**—A terminal charge of 1s. 6d. per truck shall be imposed in respect of all chaff consigned to Melbourne in addition to the rate and charge for unloading specified in By-Law 270.

The provisions of this clause shall become effective as from 12th October, 1925.

- (2) **STRAWBOARD** railed from McDougall, Fairfield Park, and Melbourne to Mile End (Adelaide) shall be charged under Class "A" less 15 per cent., subject to the following truck-load minimums:—

8 tons per 10, 11 or 12-ton truck ;
12 tons per 16-ton truck ;

and provided that a guarantee is furnished to the Commissioners that this traffic shall amount to at least 750 tons per annum.

- (3) **SHOP FRONTS** set up shall be charged under double Class "2" rate.

Mildura Vineyards Protection Acts 1918-1922 (Nos. 2959 and 3229).

BY-LAW No. 3.

By-law No. 3 of the Mildura Vineyards Protection Board, made under the powers conferred by section 16 of the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918* and extended by the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1922*, providing for the inspection of fruit, vegetables, trees, and plants, brought or being brought into the Shire of Mildura, and for prohibiting the importation of certain fruits, trees, vines, and cuttings from vines affected with or liable to introduce any disease into the said shire, and for regulating the importation of certain fruits, vegetables, fruit trees, plants, bundles, bales, and packages of nursery stock liable to introduce any disease into the said shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918* and the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1922*, the Mildura Vineyards Protection Board orders as follows:—

1. The words "Board," "Inspector," and "Vine" in these By-laws shall have the same meanings respectively as in section 2 of the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918*.

"Disease" in these By-laws means the disease in grape vines caused by the insect called *phylloxera vastatrix* and includes any disease affecting grape vines, trees, plants, fruit, or vegetables which the Governor in Council has declared to be a disease within the provisions of section 3 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1915* or section 2 of the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918*.

"Shire of Mildura" includes the Borough of Mildura and the Town of Mildura.

2. No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the Shire of Mildura any vine or vine cuttings without the permission in writing of the Board previously had and obtained. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty as provided by the Act or any proclamation.

3. Any person who brings or causes to be brought or attempts to bring into the Shire of Mildura any tree, plant, fruit, or vegetable affected with or likely to introduce any disease shall be guilty of an offence.

4. No tree or plant or nursery stock of any kind shall be introduced or brought into the Shire of Mildura unless a declaration in the form prescribed in the Schedule A to these By-laws or such modified form thereof as may from time to time be prescribed by the Board shall have been made by the consignor before a Justice of the Peace and posted to the Inspector of Vineyards at Mildura on the day of consignment.

5. No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the Shire of Mildura any mangoes, melons, granadillos, cocoa-nuts, citrus fruits, cucumbers, or tomatoes. This By-law does not apply to any fruit or vegetables that are dried, canned, or preserved.

6. No person shall introduce or bring or cause to be brought into the Shire of Mildura any bundle, bale, or package of nursery stock, trees, or plants unless such bundle, bale, or package is consigned to the quarantine ground at the Mildura Railway Station for the purpose of inspection or unless a declaration in the form prescribed in the Schedule A to these By-laws shall have been posted to the Inspector of Vineyards on the day of consignment. If it appears that such nursery stock, trees, or plants are affected with or likely to introduce any disease the inspector may destroy the same or direct that the same be destroyed or may cause any such nursery stock, trees, or plants to be fumigated at the expense of the consignee or owner.

7. Every person importing, introducing, or bringing or causing to be imported, introduced, or brought into the Shire of Mildura any nursery stock, trees, or plants shall give notice to the Board or to an inspector of the arrival of the same at Mildura and shall specify the place where the same are lying.

8. No person shall cause to be sent into the Shire of Mildura any plant, tree, or any part thereof which is or has been growing adjacent to vines known to be infected with the disease known as *phylloxera vastatrix*.

9. An inspector may require any person bringing or having brought any fruit tree or plant into the Shire of Mildura to submit such fruit tree or plant for inspection at such convenient time and place as may be required by such inspector, and if it appear to such inspector that the same be affected with or likely to introduce any disease he may require the same to be destroyed or fumigated at the expense of the consignee or owner or person in possession thereof.

10. An inspector may remove any tree, plant, fruit, or vegetable brought or being brought into the Shire of Mildura to a place of quarantine for the purpose of examination and inspection, and if the same is affected with any disease or is in his opinion likely to introduce any disease may destroy the same or cause the same to be destroyed or fumigated at the expense of the consignee, owner, or person in possession thereof.

11. Every person having in his possession any box, crate, case, or other package or wrapping in which any nursery stock, trees, plants, fruit, wine or spirit, or vegetable brought within the Shire of Mildura have been enclosed shall have

such box, crate, cask, package, or wrapping burnt or thoroughly disinfected forthwith upon the removal of such nursery stock, trees, plants, fruit, wine, spirit, or vegetables.

12. Every person who ships, sends, or delivers, or causes to be shipped, sent, or delivered into the Shire of Mildura any trees, plants, fruits, wine, spirits, or vegetables shall cause to be placed upon or securely attached to any box, crate, cask, package or other parcel containing the same a distinctive mark, stamp, or label showing the name of the producer, grower, shipper, or sender and the locality where such trees, plants, fruits, or vegetables were grown.

13. No person shall for any purpose whatsoever bring or introduce, or cause to be brought or introduced, or knowingly assist in bringing or introducing into the Shire of Mildura any second-hand fruit case, box, or package previously used for packing fresh or dried fruit.

14. In these By-laws the singular includes the plural and masculine the feminine.

15. A person guilty of any breach of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence, save in the breach of clause No. 2 as above set out, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, as provided by the Act or any proclamation.

All that piece of land in the Parish of Barongarook and being a roadway generally one chain wide, the western boundary of which commences at a point on the eastern boundary of allotment 19A of the said parish distant 369 deg. 49 min. 435.3 links from the south-eastern angle of the said allotment; thence north-westerly through that allotment generally north-easterly through allotment 19 and north-easterly through the dam reserve to a point on the eastern boundary of that reserve distant 360 deg. 0 min. 31.4 links from the south-eastern angle of the said reserve.

NOTE.—The route of the portion of the roadway above described is more particularly delineated and shown coloured red on survey plan number 1794, lodged in the office of the Country Roads Board.

NEW DEVELOPMENTAL ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF KERANG.

Whereas the land the site of the road the course of which is below set out was taken by the Board under the provisions of the *Country Roads Acts* for the purpose of constructing such new road which new road has now been laid out and formed on the same: And whereas the said Board (being the Country Roads Board incorporated under the said Acts) thinks that the road aforesaid is fit to be used as a public highway such Board at a meeting now holden acting under the authority conferred upon it by section 21 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* and section 5 of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944) doth by this present Resolution hereby declare the said new road the course of which is described in the schedule hereto

with the commencing and terminating points thereof respectively specified to be part of a developmental road within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act*.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET GROUND AND FOR PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN AND PARISH OF BALLAN.

W. E. Edmond John Hogan, James Andrew Joseph Bence, Robert Shankland, James Henry Walsh, William Rose Fraser, John Thomas Cooper, and Phillip Spencer, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Cricket Ground and for purposes of Public Recreation in the Town and Parish of Ballan, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or hurling matches, shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding two shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every person over 16 years of age to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way trees, tree-guards, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, or seats in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor light fires in the Reserve, nor offer for sale any article, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. The Committee of Management may allow any duly recognized committee of any show, sports, fête, or holiday amusements to use the Reserve, and such committee shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference thereto, or to the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of a guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No person shall discharge any firearms in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. Any person committing in the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or other structures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such persons may have purchased a ticket, and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto:—(1) Assaulting any person. (2) Being drunk. (3) Using profane or obscene language. (4) Using abusive or insulting words. (5) Behaving improperly or riotously. (6) Obtaining admission to the Reserve, or any buildings thereon, when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper or other persons having authority of the Committee of Management to demand production of the same any ticket authorizing admission to the Reserve.

16. Clubs making regular use of the ground shall pay a fee of £1 1s. per season and 10 per cent. of the gross takings at all matches played on the ground. The minimum charge for the use of the ground by two visiting clubs shall be 10s. 6d. per match and 10 per cent. of the gross takings. For sports meetings a charge of 10s. per day and 5 per cent. of the gross gate takings shall be made.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

WE, John Sym Tait, William Lindsay, Augustus Percy Officer, and Frederick Thomas Hilary Redford, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for recreation purposes in the Municipal District of Warrnambool, known as the "Warrnambool Racing and Recreation Reserve," having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

(1) The reserve, which is parcelled out in the following divisions, shall be open to the public free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided, but no person shall be allowed on the first of the said divisions or to enter any of the buildings on the reserve on days on which admission fees are not imposed, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

1. The Grand Stand and Lawn (surrounded with a close fence) and all approaches thereto.
2. The Hill, the enclosures pertaining to the Hill (surrounded with a close fence) and all approaches thereto.
3. The Saddling Paddock, the Birdcage, and all approaches thereto (surrounded with a close fence).
4. The Weighing Yard, the Judge's Box, the Stewards' Stand, the Stewards' Room, the Secretary's Office, the Jockeys' Room, the Casuality Room, the Committee Stand, the Scales Platform (surrounded with a close fence), and all approaches thereto.
5. The Inner Public Carriage Paddock and approaches (surrounded with a close fence).
6. The Outer Public Carriage Paddock and approaches.
7. The Course proper and approaches enclosed and reserved.
8. The Training Track and the remainder of the reserve which is enclosed.
9. The Members' Reserve and Carriage Paddock.

(2) No person shall enter at any race or other meeting into any of the said divisions, nor bring any horses or vehicles therein except on production of a ticket to be issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing him in that behalf, and then only in such part or parts of the said divisions as shall be indented on the ticket, and only on the days for which the ticket is issued; but the ticket-holder shall not remain in any of the said divisions, or any part thereof, for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run, unless with the consent of the Committee of Management.

(3) No person except the Judge and any persons he may call to his assistance shall enter the Judge's Box at any race meeting.

(4) No person shall enter the weighing-stand, or the weighing-yard, or the approaches thereto except persons authorized by the Committee of Management so to do, the jockeys requiring to be weighed and the owners and trainers of horses whose jockeys are being or are about to be weighed.

(5) No person driving a vehicle plying for hire shall, with his vehicle, enter the inner public carriage paddock or the members' carriage paddock unless with the consent of the Committee of Management.

(6) The following persons shall not be admitted to any division of the reserve:—

1. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing or who has been disqualified by any competent racing tribunal.
2. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to be a defaulter.
3. No person shall remain on the said reserve after having been warned off the same under this regulation.

(7) All persons paying for admission to any of the said divisions, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he or she shall, on demand, produce, and if required surrender to all gatekeepers and other persons having authority from the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of same.

(8) Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the Grand Stand, or any portion thereof, or any booth or building in the reserve, and persons allowed to train or exercise horses in the reserve, shall abide by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the reserve and the buildings and other erections for the time being thereon.

(9) No person shall take any dog into any part of the said divisions or into any building thereon.

(10) No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(11) No person shall damage in any way any trees, shrubs, or flowers at any time planted or growing in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(12) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

(13) No person shall put in the reserve any live stock without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(14) No person shall erect or place any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure or stand, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for any other purpose, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(15) No person shall offer for sale any goods, chattels, articles or provisions on any part of the reserve without having first obtained a permit, in writing, from the Committee of Management.

(16) No person except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

(17) Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall, together with any horses or vehicles in his possession or care, be liable to be removed from the reserve notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and is, or may be, in possession of, a ticket of admission to any of the said divisions, or any part thereof:—

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Riding, crossing, or trespassing on the racing track or any part of it during a race meeting.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Being found in any part of any of the said divisions and not producing upon demand, or if required not surrendering to any gatekeeper, or other person having authority from the Committee of Management, to demand production of same a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part of the said divisions where such person shall be so found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management or any person deputed by them that the proper charge for admission has been paid by such person and that such person's ticket has been lost.
8. Obtaining admission to any part of any of the said divisions when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.

(18) No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the reserve other than upon the portion of the Stand and Lawn enclosures or the Hill enclosures set apart for the bookmakers, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or those authorized by such Committee of Management.

(19) Every person carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker whether in the Stand and Lawn enclosures or the Hill enclosures shall, during the time he shall be so carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or by those authorized by the said Committee of Management, which ticket shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

(20) The following is the scale of charges or fees which may be levied and taken for admission to each of the said divisions and the buildings thereon respectively:—

For admission to the first of the said divisions for each person a sum not exceeding . . .	£1 0 0
For admission to the second of the said divisions for each person a sum not exceeding . . .	0 5 0
For admission to the third of the said divisions for each person a sum not exceeding . . .	0 5 0
For admission to the fifth, sixth and seventh, eighth divisions, for each person . . .	0 2 6
For admission to the second of the said divisions of every truck or hand-barrow . . .	0 2 6
For admission to the second, fifth, and sixth of the said divisions, and to any approach thereto of any vehicles, a sum not exceeding . . .	0 10 0
For admission to the training ground for training or exercising horses, for each quarter of a year a sum not exceeding for each horse . . .	1 0 0

(21) Provided always that the Committee of Management may exempt any member of a race club wholly or partially from the payment of all or any of such charges or fees, and that the moneys so received shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied in the permanent improvement of the reserve for racing and other recreation purposes or in the erection, maintenance, or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the reserve, or in such other manner in or upon the reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing and other recreation purposes.

(22) Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with section One hundred and eighty-one of the *Land Act* 1915, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
