## Dried Fruits Acts 1924 and 1925.

## NOTICE.

IN accordance with the provisions of section 5 of the *Dried Fruits Act 1925* (No. 3418), notice is hereby given that the proportions of the output of dried fruits (currants, sultanas, and lexias) produced in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six to be marketed outside the Commonwealth have been fixed as follows:—Currants and sultanas, 85 per cent.; lexias, 80 per cent.

The percentages of the crop which may be sold upon the Commonwealth market are, therefore, as follows:—

Currants—15 per cent.  
Sultanas—15 per cent.  
Lexias—20 per cent.

These percentages are tentative and will be reviewed from time to time throughout the year.

**REGULATIONS ADDED.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighth day of March, 1926.*

WHEREAS by the *Education Act 1915* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind Regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the following Regulations be added to the Regulations under the aforesaid Act, that is to say:—

**REGULATION XII. (H).—NOMINATED COURSES FOR ART TEACHERS AT THE WORKING MEN'S COLLEGE (MELBOURNE TECHNICAL SCHOOL).**

1. For the purpose of enabling teachers in Applied Art in the service of the Education Department to undertake courses in Advanced Art (chiefly for the Department's Art Teacher's Certificate, or the Art Teacher's Diploma) at the Working Men's College (Melbourne Technical School), the Director may, with the approval of the Minister, nominate annually qualified teachers for such courses.

2. Such teachers will be required to teach as assistants in schools to which they will be attached while undergoing such courses, and the time spent in such courses will be regarded as service in the Department. They may be granted permission to attend at the College during such hours as may be authorized by the Director.

3. Teachers so nominated will be granted full pay during their courses.

4. Every teacher so nominated will be required to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish his nominated course without the permission of the Minister, and for the four years next after the termination of such nominated course to teach in any school to which he may be appointed.

5. All such nominations will be for one year only, but may be renewed until the course is completed, provided:—

- (a) that the performance of his duties as a teacher is satisfactory; and
- (b) that the progress of his studies at the College is satisfactory.

6. Teachers nominated for such courses may be granted a remission of their fees at the College.

**REGULATION XII. (I).—SPECIAL COURSE OF TRAINING.**

1. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, establish special courses of training to be conducted at the Teachers' Colleges in Ballarat and Bendigo, and in such other institutions as the Director may determine, for persons desiring to qualify as teachers in Primary schools. These courses will be under the supervision of the Principals of the Colleges and such other officers as the Director may appoint.

2. Studentships at the rate of £72 per annum for country candidates and £40 per annum for candidates living in Ballarat and Bendigo will be awarded under the following conditions:—

- (a) Applicants must be at least 17½ years of age and not more than 30 years of age on the date of the commencement of the course upon which they desire to enter.
- (b) They must have passed the School Intermediate or some higher examination of the Melbourne University, or must possess an equivalent qualification; and
- (c) They must furnish satisfactory certificates that they are of good moral character, are of sound bodily health, and free from defects likely to impair their usefulness as teachers, and must furnish a certificate from an inspector of schools, or from the head teacher of a State school, or other approved school, that they are temperamentally suitable and possess aptitude for the work of teaching.

3. (a) All candidates selected for studentships under clause 2 above shall be on probation during the whole period of their course of training in the College.

- (b) On commencing the course of training each candidate must enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish the course of training, and, for a period of three years after the completion of his training, to serve the Department in any school to which he may be appointed.

4. The Minister may require the withdrawal of any candidate who shows unsuitability for the work of a teacher, or who fails to make satisfactory progress, or who is guilty of misconduct or of idleness.

5. The work to be undertaken during the course of training shall be—

- (a) Professional Training.—Lectures on the principles and on the general and special methods of education; preparation of notes of lessons; practice in teaching and observation with special reference to the work of the small school.
- (b) Instruction in English, nature-study, drawing, voice production, hygiene, physical training, and such other subjects as the Director may from time to time determine.

6. Students who, upon the completion of the course of training, pass a satisfactory examination in the subjects set out above, and pass an examination in the practice of teaching, will be granted the certificate to which they may be entitled under Regulation XI., but will, in addition, be granted a Trained Teacher's Certificate subject to their passing the Leaving Certificate examination of the Melbourne University, or its equivalent, and completing three years of satisfactory service as a teacher after leaving the College.

7. On successfully completing their course of training, students will be classified as teachers in the fifth class, and in accordance with their reports and records will be placed in either the second or third subdivision of this class, and be paid the salary attached to such subdivision, viz.:—

For men ... ..	£168 or £192 per annum.
For women ... ..	*£132 or £156 per annum.

\* Women head teachers in the second subdivision shall, in addition to the salary of the subdivision, be paid an allowance at the rate of £24 per annum.

## SHIRE OF MILDURA.

A By-law of the Shire of Mildura made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 52, for prohibiting the grazing or wandering of cattle upon public streets and roads.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura order as follows:—

1. If any cattle are found wandering or grazing or without any person having charge of them—

- (a) In or upon any street, road, bridge, or culvert, or
- (b) Upon any land (not being a common) which is not enclosed or fenced with some sufficient fence within the meaning of the *Fences Act 1915*, or any amendment thereof, and the openings (if any) in such fence are not secured or barred with gates or other fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with the fence, the owner of such cattle and any person having charge of the same shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1 1s. for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and impound them, or place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody.

2. If the owner of such cattle be not known, any justice, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases, and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if awarded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so awarded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjusted or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

3. A clause identical with clause 43 of the Thirtieth Schedule—Part I.

Clause 43.—If such cattle by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
