CITY OF RICHMOND.

BY-LAW No. 98.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under section 198 of the Local Government Act 1915 (as amended by the Local Government Act 1924) and section 228 of the Local Government Act 1915, numbered 98, for altering By-law No. 87 and prescribing the minimum area and minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house or any shop or any dwelling house and shop combined may hereafter be built.

 - (1) From and after coming into force of this By-law, no building intended to be used as a dwelling house or shop and dwelling house shall be built or erected so as to

front any street or road unless such dwelling house or shop and dwelling house have a frontage to such street or road of at least 22 feet, and a superficial area of at least 1,650 square feet.

- (2) Such dwelling house shall contain at least three rooms (bathroom, pantries and sculleries are not deemed to be rooms within the meaning of this sub-chause).

 (2) And provided also that when a dwelling house or a shop and dwelling house has been removed, or has been destroyed by fire or the elements, the Council shall exempt uestroyed by the of the elements, the Council shall exempt such allotment from the foregoing condition as to width or frontage, and permit a dwelling house to be erected or re-erected thereon if otherwise built in accordance with the provisions of this By-law and By-laws 81 and 87.

New Subdivisions.
