Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BILLPOSTERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 16th April, 1926, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of billposting," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 16th day of April, 1926, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

<i>Apprentices.</i>							
One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 87s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.							
<i>Improvers.</i>							
One improver to the first four or fraction of four workers and thereafter one improver to every five or fraction of five workers receiving not less than 87s. 8d. per week of 48 hours.							

(3) CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual employees (*i.e.*, persons employed during any week for not more than 24 hours) shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(4) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK ON EACH DAY Time of beginning. 6 a.m. Time of ending. 6.30 p.m.

(5) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done—

(a) Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work 4s. per hour
 (b) Within the hours fixed as times of beginning and ending work in excess of 48 hours in any week Time and a half.

(6) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
