7. The areas are given as more or less, and all appropriated, alienated, or licensed lands (if any) within the boundaries are excluded.

8. The outgoing tenant has the option to remove any existing fencing owned by him within one month, or to require the incoming tenant to pay for it in accordance with the provisions of section 124, Land Act 1915.

This does not apply to cases where the land was the subject of an expired Grazing Area Lease. In all such cases, the incoming tenant will be held responsible for the care and maintenance of any improvements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Council of the City of Bendigo specially order as follows:—

1. That Regulation No. 26 passed on the seventh day of September, 1888, and confirmed on the nineteenth day of October, 1888, and Regulation No. 49 passed on the eleventh day of May, 1916, and confirmed on the eighth day of June, 1916, be and the same are respectively repealed.

CATTLE MARKET REGULATION.

General.

2. The drawing for order of sales of both sheep and cattle shall take place at the Inspector's office on Monday of each week at the hour of Eight a.m. during the months between September and February in each year and at the hour of Nine a.m. during the remainder of the year.

3. The Inspector shall have the general superintendence and full powers of management of all necessary preliminary arrangements for each sale day and shall fix the times of sales.

4. Each auctioneer shall notify the Inspector at the time of such drawing of the respective numbers of fat and store sheep and of lots thereof to be offered by him on such sale day, and also before the close of the sheep sales of the respective numbers of fat and store cattle to be so offered.

5. In the event of the proposed number of sheep or cattle so notified to the Inspector exceeding the number actually yarded or penned or offered for sale the auctioneer shall be guilty of an offence and shall in addition be liable to pay the additional fees hereinafter provided.

6. Any timekeeper or timekeepers employed by any auctioneer or auctioneers and each auctioneer shall conform strictly to the times allotted as hereinafter provided and shall in all things be under the supervision and control of the Inspector whose decision shall be final and binding upon all whom it may touch and concern and any person guilty of any contravention of any such order shall be guilty of an offence.

7. The market shall be opened by the ringing of a bell by or by the direction of the Inspector.

8. Any auctioneer failing to complete his sale within the time allowed for his sale of the expiration of which time three minutes' notice shall be given him by the Inspector shall upon the ringing of the bell or blowing of the whistle discontinue his sale and the ringing of the bell or the blowing of the whistle shall be the signal for the auctioneer next in order to commence his sale.

9. Any lots unsold within the allotted time shall be offered at the end of the market by the auctioneers in the same order as that drawn for sales during the market and shall have precedence in time to any lots yarded or penned but not drawn for in the ordinary manner.

10. An auctioneer may offer stock for sale as often as he chooses before his allotted time expires.

11. Every auctioneer shall conform strictly to the order of selling as drawn and shall not sell other than in the order so fixed.

12. No auctioneer shall sell on behalf of any other auctioneer other than in the order allotted to such other.

13. That every dispute or difference arising between the said auctioneers or between any persons upon any matter within this Regulation shall be referred to the Inspector for the time being of the said market whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties.

Cattle.

14. The auction sales of fat cattle shall commence promptly at Twelve noon each Tuesday.

15. The time allowed for the sale by auction of fat cattle shall be 24 minutes for each pen allotted as adjudged by the Inspector with five minutes grace added to the time of the agent drawing first sale, reasonable time to be allowed by the Inspector in transferring buyers from one salesman to another.

16. The auction sales of dairy cattle and milch cows shall commence at Two p.m. and two minutes shall be allowed for the sale of each lot of dairy cattle offered.

17. Auction sales of store cattle shall commence at Three p.m. or on the completion of the sales of fat cattle whichever shall be the earlier. Two and a half minutes shall be allowed for each pen of stores within a minimum of four to a pen. Five minutes to the first of yard of stores and three minutes to each yard after. All store cattle to be sold in rotation and to be penned up in such pens as allotted by the Inspector.

18. All fat cattle left over from all agent's first sale shall be penned up in "A" lane and offered in the same order as the first sales prior to any store cattle being offered.

Sheep.

19. The auction sale of fat sheep shall commence at Twelve noon on Monday of each week.

20. The auction sale of store sheep shall commence at Two p.m. on Monday of each week or at the completion of the sale of fat sheep whichever shall be the earlier. The times allowed to each auctioneer shall be as follows:—

To sell the first yard—Five minutes.

To sell each subsequent yard—Two and a half minutes.

To sell each pen of at least fifty sheep—Two minutes.

Provided that the Inspector may in his discretion when on any sale day the yarding is above the average reduce the time for selling each of such pens to one minute.

21. The times allowed for selling fat sheep and lambs shall be fixed by the Inspector but shall not exceed eight minutes per one hundred sheep, and the time allowed for any lesser number shall be calculated *pro rata*.

22. Where any lots of sheep or lambs are offered for sale by auction in the outside yards or on extended terms or terms other than those ruling in the municipal yards the order of selling shall be the same as drawn for fat sheep and the sales shall be made in such pens and yards as are allotted by the Inspector.

CATTLE MARKET DUES.

23. The following tolls, dues, and sums of money shall be demanded, received, and had by the said Council from every person who shall at any time use the said cattle market or markets for all stock or other animals sold or exposed for sale therein, that is to say:—

And in each case where the number of sheep or cattle submitted to the Inspector by any agent exceeds the number actually penned or yarded in addition to those set forth above:—

For every stated head of stock by which the submitted number exceeds the actual number yarded or penned, that is to say:—

For every head of store or fat cattle or calves ..	6d.
For every head of fat or store sheep ..	1d.

24. It shall be lawful for the Inspector for the time being of the cattle market of the said City appointed by the said Council to demand, collect, and receive from every person who shall at any time use for the sale of any stock or other animals included in the preceding section any yards or premises within the City boundaries and outside any market provided by the said Council the cattle market dues as hereinbefore provided.

25. Unless inconsistent with the context hereof and throughout this Regulation wheresoever occurring and without limiting the generality of the terms:—

Inspector includes the person for the time being acting as such and his assistant or assistants.

Auctioneer includes any stock and station agent or agents in whose name as such any stock is sold or offered for sale or any person or persons actually carrying out any sale on his or their account whether such person is or is not in fact a licensed auctioneer.

SHIRE OF MULGRAVE.**By-LAW No. 23.**

A By-law of the Shire of Mulgrave made under sub-section 21 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 23 for prohibiting, regulating, or controlling quarrying and blasting operations.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mulgrave order as follows:—

1. Except with the written consent of the Council no person or persons shall within the Shire of Mulgrave carry on any quarrying operations for the removal of rock, stone, gravel, clay, soil, or other materials, or use explosives for blasting.

2. Provided that the provisions of this By-law shall not apply to any such operations in connexion with works commenced before the 4th day of January, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, or to works carried on by any Government Department of the Commonwealth of Australia or the State of Victoria, or by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the Victorian Railways Commissioners, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, the Metropolitan Gas Company, the Colonial Gas Association, the Brighton Gas Company, or any electric light corporation, under any order or by the Mulgrave Shire Council.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Mulgrave.

4. Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds. And if such offence is a continuing one to a further penalty of not less than One pound per day and not exceeding Five pounds per day for each day such offence is continued.

5. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately on its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

A BILL relating to the Corporation known as the "BANK OF NEW SOUTH WALES."

To constitute the said Corporation a company deemed to have been incorporated outside the State of Victoria and to make applicable to such Corporation section 270 of the Companies Act 1915 of the Parliament of the State of Victoria in the same manner in all respects as if having been so incorporated the Corporation had commenced to carry on business in Victoria immediately after the passing into law of the above-mentioned Bill.
