ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By the Honorable Sir Leo Finn Bernard Cussen, K.B., as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, AS Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act relating to Municipal Endowment."

"An Act to make further provision with respect to Main Roads and Developmental Roads under the Country Roads Acts and to amend the said Acts."

"An Act to authorize the construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Warburton (La La Extension) to Big Pat's Creek."

"An Act relating to the borrowing powers of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works and to Superannuation and other benefits for Officers of the said Board and other persons."

"An Act relating to Municipal Sinking Funds."

"An Act to increase the Borrowing Powers of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners."

"An Act to authorize the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board to borrow a further sum not exceeding Fifty thousand pounds."

"An Act to amend the Schedule to the *Victorian Loan (Public Works) Act 1924*."

"An Act to amend Section Six of the *State Electricity Commission (Funds and Accounts) Act 1922*."

"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Works and Undertakings of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria and to sanction the Issue and Application of such Money."

"An Act to make provision for the Appointment of certain Persons temporarily employed in the Railway Service to Permanent Offices therein."

"An Act to amend and to extend the operation of the *Metropolitan Town Planning Commission Act 1922*."

"An Act to declare the Rates of Income Tax for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six and to continue the Income Tax Acts."

"An Act to amend the Sewerage Districts Acts and for other purposes."

"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Sewerage Works in Country Districts and to sanction the Issue and Application of such Money."

RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

ORDER OF 22ND DECEMBER, 1925, RELATING TO CERTAIN MATTERS ARISING OUT OF AWARDS (No. 8 AND NO. 13) OF THE RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

In the matter of the Railways Classification Board Acts and in the matter of References by the Victorian Branch of the AUSTRALIAN RAILWAYS UNION for interpretations of certain matters arising out of Awards (No. 8 and No. 13) of the Railways Classification Board.

THESE References having come on for hearing before the Railways Classification Board, and the said Board having heard the representations made on behalf of the parties concerned, it is ordered that the matters referred to be and the same are hereby interpreted as follows:—

AWARD No. 8.

Division XIX.—Relieving in Higher Positions.

The provisions of sub-clause (b) of clause 1 of this Division are not applicable to the duties performed by Signal Adjuster Thrupp, Flinders-street, when the Signal Ganger is absent at other locations, as he does not perform the duties of Signal Ganger on such occasions.

AWARD No. 13.

Salaries and Wages.—Rolling Stock Branch.—Employees.

The classification prescribed for the grade of Car Cleaner (cleaning sleeping cars or such other special cars as the Commissioners may determine), viz., 6d. per day in addition to the ordinary wage, is not applicable to all Car Cleaners cleaning sleeping cars or other special cars. Under the award it is the function of the Commissioners to determine to which cars it applies.

Salaries and Wages.—Way and Works Branch.—Employees.

The classifications prescribed for the grade of Skilled Labourer (Leading), viz., 1s. per day in excess of the wage of the employees under his control, is not applicable to employees who were previously in the grade of Leading Skilled Labourer, Class 2, and whose title was subsequently altered to Senior Skilled Labourer with a classification 6d. per day in excess of the maximum prescribed for the grade of Skilled Labourer (in bridge gang).

Salaries and Wages.—Refreshment Services Branch.—Employees.

The work at present performed by Miss Leonard is that of a Laundress, Class 1.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926.

By virtue of the Water Acts, By-law for Imposing, Levying, and Receiving Water Rates and Charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1926, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Seventeen shillings shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Seventeen shillings be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid.

6. Every consumer of water must provide meters; all excess water over allotment covered by the valuation rate to be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons.

The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1926.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

BROADFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1926 WITHIN THE BROADFORD URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Broadford Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1926 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates to be paid half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1926:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Seventeen pounds or under, according to the municipal value of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Thirty shillings.

2. On every house or tenement above the value of Seventeen pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of such annual valuation.

3. On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land, the sum of Ten shillings.

4. The following shall be the charge payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per year, or a quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of 250 gallons or under, One shilling.

(3) For each water-trough placed in the street outside business premises and provided with suitable ball tap, Twenty shillings.

(4) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Five shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or in the event of there not being any contract, Five shillings per cent. on the amount charged and paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

5. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid as agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 27.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Water Acts, and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1926 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(A) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Four shillings and sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be Two pounds five shillings.

(B) Occupied or unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Eight shillings.

(C) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

(D) For steam-boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power for each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(E) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made before a supply can be taken or used.

(F) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or make a special rate.

(G) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land supplied otherwise than by measure.

(H) The rate hereby made shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1926.

(I) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1926, No. 32.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law, viz.:—

A By-law for determining the rates which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the said Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Twenty pounds (£20).

2. A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Twenty pounds (£20).

3. On each unoccupied or vacant allotment or piece of land, a rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound on the net annual value of such rateable property, provided that no such allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).

4. Water to be supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for watering gardens, or for distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the water rate assessment of such land or premises for the time being, provided that the said assessment shall be the minimum charge for the year 1926, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such amount aforesaid.

5. For all lands and tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets on which the pipes of the water supply are laid, and which lands and tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter (¼) of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such lands and tenements are over a quarter (¼) of a mile and within half (½) a mile thereof, a quarter of the above-mentioned rates. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Donald for the time being.

Such rates are hereby made for the year 1926, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1926, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1926, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 1st day of January, 1926.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1926 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Melvor, but no rate in any case shall be less than Two pounds.

2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe has been laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one quarter but not exceeding one half of a mile distant from a stand-pipe shall be charged one quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust shall deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1926.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

RATING BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Leongatha Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 22.

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate—

(i) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partially as a domicile, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement shall be paid, provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to any tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building.

(ii) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid, the rate to be paid shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings each be payable, except where the municipal valuation is less than Three pounds each, in which case the said rate shall not be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

(iii) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in the streets or roads in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

The rates herein made are for the year ending 31st December, 1925, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 31st March, 1925.

Such person as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates.

MAFFRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 13.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Maffra Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

(1) The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1926 in respect of water supplied within the Urban District of the Trust:—

(2) For every house or tenement of an annual value of £14 or over, at the rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound of such value.

(3) For every house or tenement of a less annual value than £14, a minimum charge of £1 5s.

(4) For every vacant allotment of land of a less annual value than £5, a charge of 5s. For each additional allotment of land rated together with the first allotment, One shilling. Where the annual value of an allotment is £5 or over, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of the annual value thereof.

(5) For every water-trough supplied with water, £1. On vacant lands the rate of payment shall be considered as part of this charge of £1. In cases where a large quantity of water is used by the use of a trough, as in a paddock where a number of stock are kept, the Trust in its discretion may insist on a meter being installed.

(6) For water supplied by measure, Two shillings for each 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate, except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements. In cases where the occupier quits without having paid for the excess water registered by meter, the owner will be held to be liable for payment of the same.

(7) For using a hose for stable watering, Twenty shillings. This payment will entitle the user to an additional 10,000 gallons of water.

(8) For water supplied to new buildings being erected, £1 per centum on the contract price of all brick, stone, cement, mortar, or other work where water is used. In every case where a new building is erected, a minimum charge of Ten shillings shall be paid by the owner.

(9) Water supplied to manufactories, railways, livery stables, gardens, or clubs, or for other than domestic purposes, may be charged at a special rate, or by measurement, at the discretion of the Trust.

(10) The Trust may by notice in writing require any owner or occupier using water by means of a hose or for other than domestic purposes to install an approved meter within two weeks from the date of such notice, also shall require any owner or occupier to remove and re-install or repair any meter that is out of order. If any such meter is not so installed or repaired, the Trust may cause the water to be cut off from the premises. Where delay arises in repairing or re-installing a meter, the water shall be paid for by an average of past readings.

(11) No person shall use water by means of a hose or otherwise for watering gardens, washing cars or buggies, or for other than domestic purposes, unless such water is registered by an approved meter.

(12) Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises where such has wilfully or negligently been allowed to run to waste, or used in an unauthorized manner, or where a meter is not provided when required. When the water is cut off from any premises, the owner or occupier must pay the sum of One pound to the Trust for re-connection with the main. Water must not be used for gardens, lawns, or for other than domestic purposes between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m., nor between the hours of 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. For the purpose of conserving water during dry weather, or for extensions or repairs, the Trust may at its discretion cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

(13) For water supplied through any stand-pipe or hydrant, a charge of One shilling for each 100 gallons.

(14) For all lands or tenements in the said district situate otherwise than in streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and in which tenements are not supplied with water from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe or hydrant for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are more than a quarter of a mile and less than half a mile from such stand-pipe or hydrant, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates, or to be charged at a rate at the discretion of the Trust.

(15) For every plumber's licence, £1 for the year ending 31st December, 1926. No unlicensed plumber shall lay pipes or tap the mains.

(16) The foregoing rates and charges are payable in two moieties, in advance, on the 1st February, 1926, and the 1st August, 1926. Interest at the rate of £6 per centum per annum will be charged on sums six months overdue. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum, in advance, on the 1st of February, 1926.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint shall be authorized to demand and collect the said rates and charges.

Every person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than Ten shillings for every day such breach is committed or continued.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1926 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

No. 1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

No. 2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Ten shillings.

No. 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds, a rate of 10 per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds, except where a meter is used.

No. 4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings shall be made.

No. 5. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds shall be made.

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such provision as may be deemed necessary.

No. 8. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 9. Such rate shall be payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1926.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1926 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the Trust:—

(1) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Forty shillings.

(2) For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound sterling; the minimum rate shall in no case be less than Forty shillings.

(3) For every unoccupied allotment of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Fifteen shillings be charged.

(4) For all the lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-quarter of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one-eighth of the full rate shall be paid.

(5) For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust there shall be paid the sum of £5 sterling, and all water used in excess of 95,000 gallons shall be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(6) All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be at the following rates:—30,000 gallons for the first Forty shillings of the assessed water rate, and for each additional Twenty shillings of assessed rate or portion thereof, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. All excess water shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessments.

(7) Water supplied to the Government Department, religious denominations, public parks, bowling greens, and persons outside the Trust District, and those being supplied off rising main, shall be by measurement or special agreement.

(8) The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1926. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied, except water taken from High-street stand-pipe, when a charge of 1s. per load will be made and payable to person in charge thereof.

(9) Such person or persons as the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

(10) No meter shall be affixed until it has been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works, or some authorized person, be produced for inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being, that such meter is in proper order.

(11) No person, without having previously affixed a water-meter to his service-pipe, shall use for other than domestic purposes water supplied by the Trust. Domestic purposes shall not extend to the supply of water for horses or cows.

(12) Any person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice in writing to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

(13) Every meter shall be fixed truly level with connexions above the ground, approved by the Trust's supervising officer, which must, wherever practicable, be level with the ground, and within 3 feet of the building line of the property. Two wrought-iron bends must be affixed on either side of the meter or lead connexion used; the use of elbows will not be permitted.

(14) All service-pipe connexions to Trust mains must (where being renewed or newly installed) be made not less than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, and same to extend from the main to a point where meter is affixed, or 3 feet inside the property frontage line.

SUNBURY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, in the Waterworks District of Sunbury, which has been proclaimed an Urban District under the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1926 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, and also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets on which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being on all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Bulla, the minimum rate to be paid in respect of any tenement to be not less than Twenty-five shillings.

2. For all unoccupied allotments, a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied, and where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be One shilling per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 40,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. For any public water-trough supplied by the Trust, a sum of Twenty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under the sum of One shilling shall be charged, and for each load in excess of 200 gallons *pro rata* on the above scale.

The foregoing rates are hereby made payable, in advance, on the first day of April, 1926, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

VIOLET TOWN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of Violet Town Waterworks Trust supplied other than by meter, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal district in which such rateable property is situated, for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1926, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1926.

2. The sum of One pound five shillings shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid for the year 1926 by every occupier or owner of any house or tenement liable to be rated, but the minimum rate on all vacant allotments shall be Two shillings in the pound sterling on the municipal valuation.

3. For every house or tenement supplied by measure the charge for the water supplied shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to 2,500 gallons, or up to an amount equal to the sum which would have been charged as aforesaid, whichever shall be the greater, for all water, and for all water supplied over and above such maximum amount the rate per 1,000 gallons shall be increased by One shilling for the first 1,000, Two shillings for the second 1,000, and so on.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied, a charge of 17s. 6d. per horse-power shall be made.

5. For water-troughs the supply shall be by measurement and through a meter approved by the Trust, except in cases of special agreement.

6. The Trust may require a meter approved by it to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any allotment, house, or tenement in any case or cases where it may deem necessary.

7. Meters may, in the discretion of the Commissioners, be supplied by the Trust, and the cost of same shall be repaid by the owner of the allotment, house, or tenement in respect of which a meter has been supplied, but the Trust may permit such repayment to be made by One pound deposit and the balance in four equal quarterly instalments, with interest at 8 per cent. per annum on unpaid balances added.

8. Water supplied by the Trust, except in the case of water-troughs, steam-boilers, and others by agreement, shall be solely for domestic purposes.

9. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in one sum on the first day of January, 1926.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 17.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

(a) For every house, building, or tenement, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house, building, or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound five shillings and sixpence per annum, and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer owning or occupying one house, building, or tenement only shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation, and computed at 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

(b) For every piece of land, occupied or unoccupied, upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.

(c) And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings, or tenements within the Waterworks District to each of which water-meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed, either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of the said houses, buildings, or tenements (and in all cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure), shall for that part or the whole of the year, as the case may be, during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings, or tenements, but for no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of the total sum of the municipal valuations and computed at 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons of all the said houses, buildings, or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantity be exceeded, the excess shall be paid for by measure at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(d) For water supplied by measure a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid. Provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 17,000 gallons per annum, and that the minimum charge for Government premises supplied with water shall be Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied by measure to all consumers outside the water area and the water area and Urban District, a rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum charge shall be Three pounds per annum for such service.

2. The rates and charges herein are made for the year ending on the 31st December, 1926, and shall be payable in one sum on the 1st day of January, 1926.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rates.

TRAFALGAR WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Trafalgar Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take and carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose, and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

4. Where water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through service-pipes of the following diameter, according to the assessed annual municipal value of the property supplied, viz.:—

- (1) for premises so assessed at or under £20, half-inch pipe;
- (2) and over £20 per annum, three-quarters of an inch pipe;

except where a special agreement is made.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery stables or carriers' stables, or manufacturing or irrigation purposes, or for public baths.

6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering, nor shall any such person water by means of such hose or pipe the ground, trees, plants, or shrubs, or wash any house, walls, or carriage, or use such hose or pipe for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach. This clause shall be enforced in case of a shortage of water after notice is given by advertisement in a newspaper circulating through the Waterworks District.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing in any manner, interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Before any licence is granted by the Trust, the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have power to cancel such licence at any time.

9. Each licence issued by the Trust shall be for the period ending on the 31st December next ensuing after the date of the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of a holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be the sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of Five pounds (£5), and for each renewal the sum of One pound (£1).

10. The quality of material required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service-pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized-iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.
- (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 500 feet.
- (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
- (6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 18 inches.

(7) A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed to each service immediately within the property served, properly secured and covered with an approved cap.

11. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved of by a duly authorized officer of the Trust; each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

12. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

14. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

15. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

16. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any land or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provisioning and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

17. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenement supplied by such pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

18. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. Any person wilfully or carelessly breaking, injuring, or opening any lock, valve, pipe, or other work belonging to the Trust, or turning any tap, or carelessly or wilfully doing any other act whereby the water of the Trust may be wasted, or who carelessly or wilfully does any of the aforementioned acts with the intent that the water of the Trust may be wasted, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 (Five pounds).

20. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all times between sunrise and sunset to any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect or examine if there is any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

21. The water supply in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with this By-law, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with this By-law, and not otherwise.

22. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole. The word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf, and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Trafalgar Waterworks Trust.

23. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. Before any person licensed under clause 9 of this By-law shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust a sum not to exceed Two pounds (£2), and in case he shall not proceed with the laying on of such water as aforesaid, or shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid make good and restore the said road or

footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the sum so deposited shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath, or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

25. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to supply such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

26. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, weir, channel, reservoir, settling basin, or injure the property of the Trust, and who shall wilfully trespass on the Trust's works or property, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT OF THE CLUNES BOROUGH COUNCIL.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Water Supply District of the Clunes Borough Council do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 25, fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the district, such rate being made for the year ending on the 30th day of September, 1926, and the following rates and charges shall be paid by the occupiers or owners of lands or tenements, viz.:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds and not exceeding Eighty pounds the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound, and One shilling in the pound on the value exceeding Eighty pounds.

2. On every house or tenement below the annual value of Twenty pounds the sum of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be charged.

3. On unoccupied land or lands on which no tenements are erected and water laid on the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual value shall be charged, minimum, Fifteen shillings per annum.

4. On unoccupied land on which no water is laid on or tenement thereon, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual value.

5. For water supplied to factories or trade premises using steam, the following amounts shall be charged in addition to the amount assessed on the annual value, viz., One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons per rated horse-power of the boiler or boilers up to 20 horse-power, on every horse-power in excess of 20, the sum of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, minimum, 10,000 gallons per horse-power in excess of 20.

6. For water supplied for irrigation for market gardens and orchards, the following charges shall be paid in addition to the amount assessed on the annual value of the land:—

For one half-inch service, £2 per acre; minimum, 15s.
For two half-inch services, £3 per acre; minimum, 20s.
For every additional half-inch service, £1 10s. per acre.
For one three-quarter-inch service, £3 per acre; minimum, 20s.
For two three-quarter-inch services, £4 per acre; minimum, 20s.
For every additional three-quarter-inch service, £2 per acre.

Not more than two services per acre to be allowed unless by written consent of the Commissioners, who shall have regard to the size and locality of the main to supply the extra services.

7. For water supplied to troughs in the streets of the borough, Eighteen shillings per annum in addition to the amount charged for domestic purposes.

8. For water supplied to Government Departments—

Railways, One shilling per 1,000 gallons by meter.
Post Office, One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per annum.
Police Station, One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 120,000 gallons per annum.
State School, One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 80,000 gallons per annum.

9. Provided the occupier or owner provides a suitable iron trough with ball-cock and locked cover, the following charges per annum shall be paid for stock purposes in addition to the amount charged on the annual value of the land:—

On land not exceeding 20 acres—Twelve shillings and sixpence.
On land above 20 and not exceeding 50 acres—Eighteen shillings.
On land above 50 and not exceeding 75 acres—Twenty-five shillings.
On land above 75 and not exceeding 100 acres—Thirty shillings.
On land above 100 acres—Forty shillings.

The rates and charges shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1926, at the Town Hall, Clunes, and if not paid within six months from due date will bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum.

The annual value of lands and tenements shall mean the net annual value of the properties as appearing in the valuation or rate-books of the Borough of Clunes adopted for the year ending 30th September, 1925.

Such person as shall be appointed from time to time for that purpose by the Commissioners is hereby authorized to demand and receive, collect, and sue for the recovery of the rates and charges made.

Passed at a meeting of the Commissioners of the Clunes Water Supply, Wednesday, 23rd December, 1925.

THE BALLARAT SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

RATING BY-LAW No. 5.

The Ballarat Sewerage District.

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rates are hereby made under the provisions of the Sewerage Districts Acts and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable properties within the Ballarat Sewerage District:—

- (1) Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District, a special rate of Sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of all rateable properties within the said District.
- (2) Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District, a sewerage rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable "sewered property" within the said District.
- (3) Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1926, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1926, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of March, 1926, at the office of the Authority, situate at Water Supply Office, Ballarat.
- (4) If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid special rate becomes during the year 1926 a "sewered property" there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the rate for unsewered properties for the portion of the year it remained an unsewered property, and also a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.
- (5) For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.
- (6) Such person or persons as The Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by The Ballarat Sewerage Authority on the third day of December, 1925, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the seventeenth day of December, 1925.

ORDER FOR DEVIATION OF PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

BRUNSWICK MECHANICS' INSTITUTE AND FREE LIBRARY.—FREE LENDING LIBRARY.

(Act Victoria 2806, Section 10.)

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

A Regulation of the Brunswick Mechanics' Institute and Free Library made under section 10 of Act Victoria 2806, for the establishment of a Free Lending Library in connexion with the said institute, and for the administration of the same.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Brunswick Mechanics' Institute Act 1915* and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the committee of the Brunswick Mechanics' Institute and Free Library order as follows:—

1. The Brunswick Mechanics' Institute and Free Library, belonging to and under the control of the Brunswick Mechanics' Institute, shall be subject to the supervision and direction of the library committee of the Brunswick Mechanics' Institute and Free Library, acting by and through the secretary.

2. The Free Lending Library shall be open for the exchange of books daily from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 9 p.m., Saturdays 10 a.m. to 12 noon and 7 p.m. to 9 p.m., except on Sundays and public holidays, and such other days as the library committee may from time to time direct.

3. Any ratepayer of Brunswick, satisfying the librarian of same, or any other person being a resident, having reached the age of fifteen years, who shall deliver to the librarian a guarantee signed by one ratepayer of Brunswick, may borrow books from the Lending Library.

Any student in attendance at the Brunswick Technical Art School shall be allowed to borrow books of an educational or technical character from the Lending Library, upon tendering the usual application form, signed by the principal of such school.

4. The librarian may issue to any person entitled to borrow, on his or her personal application, a borrower's ticket, which shall be retained by the librarian, and which during twelve months shall allow the person so named on it to borrow books, subject to the regulations of the Lending Library.

5. A borrower's ticket may be issued to any person who is physically incapable of applying personally, provided that a statement in writing of the reason for not attending in person be given to the librarian, accompanied by a reference from a local magistrate or clergyman.

6. Borrowers upon entering the Lending Library must first return books and obtain borrower's ticket before selecting other books. Borrowers must return books personally or by messenger. The librarian will neither undertake to receive nor issue books by post.

7. All books borrowed must be returned within fourteen days (Sundays and holidays included) from the latest date stamped in the book. All borrowers not complying with this condition shall incur a fine, to be paid to the librarian, of Threepence for each day or portion of a day. In case of loss or damage, the borrower or his guarantor must replace the book or pay to the librarian the value of any book, set, or series, lost or damaged, within one week on which the injury has been notified to him. The librarian shall have the power to assess the value of such book or books.

8. No books can be obtained from the Lending Library by a borrower who has not paid all fines incurred, and made full compensation for any loss, damage, or cost of repair.

9. Borrowers must not lend books taken from the Library, nor exchange them with each other, and must under no circumstances transfer their tickets for use to any person.

10. There shall be no obligation to send notice of any fine incurred by a borrower, and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of fines.

11. Borrowers changing their residence are required to notify, on forms supplied for the purpose, the change to the librarian, and to have their addresses entered on their tickets. The right to borrow may be forfeited for failure to comply with this condition.

12. No borrower shall be allowed to have more than one volume at the same time. When, however, the connexion of two or more volumes of one work makes the use of the whole work necessary, several volumes may be issued together.

13. Borrowers must see that books are in good order before taking them from the library. If any book be found to be written upon, or otherwise injured, borrowers must report the same to the librarian.

14. Any borrower returning a book which has been written upon, or otherwise injured, shall, within one week of the date upon which the injury has been notified to him, replace such book, set, or series injured, or shall pay such sum for the cost of repair as may be assessed by the librarian.

15. The borrower shall be entitled to the injured book, set, or series on depositing with the librarian its full value or a new and satisfactory copy.

16. Any borrower ceasing to use the library is required to leave ticket with the librarian in order to have same cancelled, as until tickets are returned borrowers and their guarantors remain responsible for any books taken out in their names.

17. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book is required by another borrower. Books may not necessarily be re-issued on the same day.

18. The librarian has power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the Lending Library, or who, in his opinion, for other reasons should not be entrusted with books.

19. No person shall be allowed to take any book into or out of the library other than those belonging to same.

20. Not more than two members of any one family (living in the same residence) shall be permitted to become borrowers at the same time.

21. Books shall not be issued to any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease. Borrowers must report at once to the librarian in the event of the outbreak of any such disease in the house in which he or she may be dwelling, and if there be a book in the possession of such borrower such book must either be destroyed within two days of the outbreak of such infectious or contagious disease, and its value paid to the librarian, or it must be fumigated and returned.

22. Every book must, under penalty of Five shillings, be returned to the librarian at such times as shall be publicly announced.

23. Borrowers are notified that a book may be reserved on giving notice to the librarian and leaving Twopence for post-card. Borrower will then be informed when book is available.

24. The librarian may issue to the holder of a borrower's ticket a non-fiction ticket, which shall entitle such holder during the currency of such borrower's ticket to borrow, subject to the provisions of the library rules, an extra book from any section in the library other than fiction section.

25. Subject to the directions from time to time of the library committee, the librarian of the said Brunswick Mechanics' Institute and Free Library, or the person for the time being in charge of the said library, shall be charged with the carrying into effect of these rules and regulations.

26. No person shall use any ink in the library except by express permission of the librarian.

27. No person shall remain, or attempt to remain, within the library after the appointed time for closing.

28. No person shall enter or remain in the library who is not decently attired and cleanly in person and habits, in the opinion and judgment of the librarian, or the person for the time being in charge of the library.

The aforesaid rules were duly passed at a meeting of the said institute committee convened for that purpose, and held on the twenty-ninth day of July, 1925.

REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN A RADIUS OF HALF A MILE OF THE KERANG POST OFFICE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the Municipal Clerk of the Municipal District of the Shire of Kerang as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) The Regulation made on the 15th day of August, 1922, relating to the closing hours of shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within a radius of half a mile of the Kerang Post Office, within the Municipal District of the Shire of Kerang, shall from and after the date hereof be and the same is hereby repealed.
- (2) All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat with a radius of half a mile of the Kerang Post Office, within the Municipal District of the Shire of Kerang, shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
- (a) Five o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday;
- (b) Nine o'clock on the evening of Friday.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924 (No. 3378)*, doth by this Order prescribe a further route within the metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the *Motor Omnibus Act* may ply for hire, also sections and terminal points and stopping places on such routes, time-tables to be observed by owners of motor omnibuses plying for hire, fares to be charged, and the maximum number of motor omnibuses which may be licensed to ply for hire on such prescribed route, as set forth in detail in the Schedule hereunder:—

The whole of the above route is prescribed for the period ending the 31st December, 1926.

Stopping Places on Route.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 11 (1) (c) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924*, the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the licensing authority full power and authority for carrying into effect by the said licensing authority all of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF LEONGATHA.

W E. Thomas Riggall, Daniel Spencer, Arthur Cowan Bair, Arthur John Wright Simmons, and Ernest Septimus Callanan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 4th day of July, 1905, as a site for public recreation purposes in the Township of Leongatha, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be divided as follows:—

1st Division—The Grandstand.

2nd Division—The remainder of the Reserve.

2. All persons shall be admitted to the Reserve (but not to any stand or buildings erected thereon) from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

3. The Committee of Management may appoint not more than thirty days in any one year upon which the Reserve shall be set apart for the purpose of agricultural shows, cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, races, or holiday amusements, and on any of the said days the following charges may be made and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve, namely:—

For admission to the second division of the Reserve, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.

For admission to the first division of the Reserve, such additional sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.

4. Any person, club, or association renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the Reserve for the occasion of any agricultural show, cricket or football match, fête, sports, races, holiday amusement, or other purpose may be required to deposit with the Committee of Management any sum, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), which the Committee of Management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Committee of Management may repair or make good any damage caused or done to such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such renting or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage from the sum of money so deposited by way of guarantee as aforesaid, and all persons, clubs, or associations so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the said Reserve or any stand, building, erection or enclosure thereon, and every such person, club, or association shall see that all rubbish, paper, glass, or other debris is removed from the Reserve at the conclusion of such renting or hiring.

5. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who shall or may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

6. No person shall damage in any way any tree, shrub, flower, treeguard, fence, gate, seat, building, or stand in the Reserve, or jump or climb upon or over, or stick bills upon any of the fences or gates of the Reserve, or leave or deposit any rubbish, paper, or glass, or other debris in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stone or missile of any kind therein.

7. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, or train or exercise any horse or horses in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

10. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or for the holding of any performance or exhibition, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, or make use of, or enter into, any building, booth, or stand on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in and on such portion or portions thereof as may be set apart for that purpose.

14. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

15. Any person committing any of the following offences within the Reserve or any building, booth, or stand thereon shall (in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable therefor) be liable to be expelled from the Reserve, namely:—

(a) Being drunk.

(b) Using profane, abusive, insulting, threatening, indecent, or obscene language.

(c) Assaulting any person or behaving in a riotous or disorderly manner.

(d) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or crossing or trespassing upon the racing track during a race or when crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground or racing track would be injurious to or an undue interference with the playing ground or racing track as a cricket, football, or sports ground, or racing track.

(e) Obtaining admission to or being found in any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission thereto under these Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly or wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
