Medical Act 1915.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

FURTHER REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Medical Act 1915*, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") is empowered from time to time to make, alter, and rescind regulations for the purpose of carrying the said part of the said Act into effect: And whereas the said Board subject to the confirmation of the Governor in Council is desirous of rescinding the Regulations numbered 41, 42, 43, 44, and 44A relating to examinations in the Pharmacy Regulations 1917 as amended and in lieu thereof subject to such confirmation is desirous of making under the powers so conferred the regulations following: Now therefore the Board doth make Regulations as set forth hereunder and His Excellency the Governor in Council has by Order made on the 10th day of March, 1926, confirmed the said Regulations, that is to say:—

(1) These Regulations may be cited as "The Pharmacy Regulations 1926," and shall be read and construed as one with the Pharmacy Regulations 1917, and any amendment thereof, and shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of April, 1926.

(2) The Regulations numbered 41, 42, 43, and 44 of The Pharmacy Regulations 1917 and Regulation 44A added thereto in March, 1917, are hereby rescinded.

(3) After Regulation 40 of The Pharmacy Regulations 1917 there shall be inserted the following Regulations in lieu of the said Regulations numbered 41, 42, 43, 44, and 44A inclusive, namely:—

Examinations.

41. (a) The preliminary examination shall be held within one week before or after the first day of March, June, September, and December in each year on such days as may be fixed by the Board.

(b) The intermediate examination in chemistry, practical chemistry, *materia medica*, and botany shall be held within ten days before or after the first day of June and December in each year.

(c) The final examination shall be held in March, June, September, and December in each year on such days as may be fixed by the Board.

Preliminary Examination.

42. Subjects of preliminary examination.—Every person who is not entitled to exemption under Regulations 43 or 44 before he enters into articles of apprenticeship within the meaning of section 95 of sub-section (b) of the *Medical Act 1915* shall pass a preliminary examination before an examiner or examiners appointed by the Board in the following five subjects, i.e., Latin, English, Arithmetic, Geometry, and Algebra (the details of which are set out in Appendix A of the said Regulations), and before he enters into the said articles shall obtain a certificate from the Board that he has passed the said examination in the prescribed subjects.

43. Exemption.—Any person who has passed the School Intermediate or School Leaving examination, or some equivalent examination of the Melbourne University or some other University, College, Board, or Institute recognized by the Board, in any or all of the prescribed compulsory subjects of the preliminary examination, shall, on proof that he has passed in such subject or subjects—

- (a) be exempted from passing the corresponding subjects of the Preliminary examination; or
- (b) be required to pass the Preliminary examination in such subject or subjects as the Board in its absolute discretion may require.

44. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulations 42 and 43, the Board may, in its absolute discretion, exempt any person from passing the Preliminary examination who produces a certificate of having passed—

- (a) the Melbourne University School Leaving examination; or
- (b) the Melbourne University School Intermediate examination in at least six subjects, including English, in addition to one other language and one branch of mathematics;
- (c) some other examination of some University, College, Board, or Institute which, in the opinion of the Board, is substantially equivalent to the Melbourne University School Intermediate ex-

amination, and is of sufficient merit to justify the assumption that the person concerned is educationally properly qualified to become an apprentice within the meaning of the said section 95 of the said Act, and provided that in each case English shall be included as a compulsory subject in addition to one other language and one branch of mathematics.

The preceding Regulations were adopted by resolution of the Board at the meeting held on the tenth day of March, 1926.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1915*, as amended by section 3 of the *Tramways Act 1918* (No. 2995), it is provided that tramways (other than tramways within the meaning of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1918*) may be constructed in any municipal district including the City of Geelong when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council :

And whereas the Councils of the municipalities of the City of Geelong and the Shire of South Barwon have made an application under the common seal of the said municipalities in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal districts of the municipalities of the said City of Geelong and the Shire of South Barwon : And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Councils of the said municipalities, and that notice of the intention of the said Councils to make the said application, in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided by the said Rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained : Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say :—

That the Councils of the municipalities of the City of Geelong and the Shire of South Barwon shall be and are hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal districts of the City of Geelong and the Shire of South Barwon.

ROUTE.

Commencing at the intersection of Moorabool-street and Barwon-terrace, connecting with the existing tramway; thence southerly along Moorabool-street and south-westerly along Colac-road to a point approximately 250 links south-westerly from the southern boundary of Roslyn-road, as shown on plan No. 1 referred to in this Order.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans numbered from 1 to 3 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans are endorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans so deposited as the plans referred to in this Order, and which plans are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

BRAKES.

That each car shall be fitted with three brakes, viz. :—

- (1) a wheel handbrake.
- (2) An air brake or hand track brake.
- (3) A rheostatic electric emergency brake.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be twenty (20) miles in the hour, excepting on curves, where the speed must be reduced sufficiently to ensure the safety of the public.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within the period of two years from the date of delegation by the Councils of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

TRAFFIC.

That such tramway shall be used for passengers, passengers' luggage, light goods, and parcels.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of the passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Councils of the said municipalities.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop, for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, at such points upon the route of the said tramway as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the sum of Fourpence (4d.) for the whole or any part of the journey. Children under twelve (12) years of age, half fare; and children in arms, free of charge.

ADDITIONAL FARES.

On Sundays and any day on which under any award the Councils are bound to pay increased rates of wages to their employees, the Councils are authorized to charge an additional fare of One penny (1d.) for the whole or part of the journey. Children under twelve (12) years of age, half fare; and children in arms, free of charge.

FOR THE CARRIAGE OF LUGGAGE, LIGHT GOODS, AND PARCELS THE CHARGE SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS :—

If in charge of passenger, when the weight exceeds 28 lbs. or size exceeds 18 inches by 18 inches by 18 inches, the like fares as for one passenger for each article or package or luggage taken on the car. Where no passenger, but sent in charge of conductor, the like fares as per passenger for each article or package so sent. On Sundays and such other days as aforesaid similar increased fares as for adult passengers may be charged.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and, for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the reference made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of, or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Councils of the said municipalities of the City of Geelong and the Shire of South Barwon shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

CHAPTER VII.

DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS 1926.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of April, 1926.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Poisons Act 1920* (11 Geo. V. No. 3113), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following, which have been recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria:—

These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1926, and shall come into force when published in the *Government Gazette*.

CONSTRUCTION.

In the construction of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Act” means the *Poisons Act 1920*.

“Board” means the Pharmacy Board of Victoria.

DEFINITIONS.

“Dangerous Drug.”—In Part I. of these Regulations any of the substances and preparations included in paragraph 1 of the Second Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1920* as are specified in the said Regulations is referred to as a “dangerous drug.”

“Specified Drug.”—In Part II. of these Regulations any of the substances and preparations included in paragraph 2 of the Second Schedule to the said Act as are specified in these Regulations is referred to as a “specified drug.”

“Potent Drug.”—In Part III. of these Regulations any of the substances and preparations included in the Third Schedule to the said Act as are specified in these Regulations is referred to as a “potent drug.”

“Prescription Book.”—The book prescribed for the recording of prescriptions under the Pharmacy Regulations 1921.

“Poisons Book.”—The book required to be kept under section 8 of the *Poisons Act 1915*.

“Register.”—The register of dangerous drugs required to be kept under Part I. of these Regulations.

PART I.

Application.

1. The dangerous drugs to which Part I. of these Regulations apply are as follow:—

(a) Morphine, cocaine, eegonine, and diamorphine (commonly known as heroin), and their respective salts, and medicinal opium and any preparation, admixture, extract, or other substance containing not less than one-fifth per centum of morphine or one-tenth per centum of cocaine, eegonine, or diamorphine. For the purposes of the foregoing provision the percentage in the case of morphine shall be calculated as in respect of anhydrous morphine.

(b) Any other substance or preparation added by proclamation to section 1 of the Second Schedule to the Act.

Manufacture.

2. No person shall manufacture any of the dangerous drugs mentioned in the next preceding Regulation—

(a) unless he is licensed by the Chief Secretary on the recommendation of the Board, or is authorized by the *Poisons Act 1920* or any Regulations made thereunder so to do;

(b) except on premises licensed for the purpose;

(c) unless such manufacture is conducted under expert supervision;

(d) otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

Sale, Possession, and Distribution.

3. No person shall supply or procure, or offer to supply or procure, any dangerous drug to or for any person—

(a) unless he is a duly qualified medical practitioner, a registered dentist or person “recorded” by the Dental Board of Victoria under the provisions of the *Medical Act 1915*, Part II., a registered pharmaceutical chemist, a registered veterinary surgeon, a person holding a certificate as general dealer in poisons under the provisions of the *Poisons Act 1915*, a person holding a permit under section 31 of the *Poisons Act 1915*, or is the holder of a licence or authority to manufacture any of the dangerous drugs referred to in Regulation 1.

(b) Otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

Sale and Distribution.

4. Except where any of the dangerous drugs are lawfully dispensed in pursuance of a prescription given by a duly qualified medical practitioner, registered dentist, or person “recorded” by the Dental Board of Victoria under the provisions of the *Medical Act 1915*, Part II., or registered veterinary surgeon, in accordance with the conditions hereinafter specified:—

No person shall supply or procure, or offer to supply or procure, any of the dangerous drugs to or for any person who is not licensed or otherwise authorized to be in possession of dangerous drugs, except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence or authority. Provided that administration of any of the dangerous drugs by or under the direct personal supervision of a duly qualified medical practitioner, or by or under the direct personal supervision of a registered dentist (or person “recorded” by the Dental Board of Victoria) in dental treatment, or by or under the direct personal supervision of a registered veterinary surgeon in the treatment of any animal, shall not be deemed to be supplying the dangerous drug within the meaning of these Regulations. Provided also that a person holding a licence as a general dealer in poisons under the *Poisons Act 1915* may supply tincture of opium for veterinary purposes without a prescription, provided he is satisfied that the drug is required for legitimate purposes and an entry is made in the poisons book and in the register required to be kept under these Regulations.

Conditions as to the Giving and Dispensing of Prescriptions.

5. Except in the case of emergency as hereinafter provided, a prescription for the supply of any of the dangerous drugs must comply with the following conditions:—

(a) The prescription must be in writing, must be dated and signed by the medical practitioner, registered dentist, person “recorded” by the Dental Board of Victoria, or registered veterinary surgeon (as the case may be), and must specify the name of the person for whom the prescription is given.

(b) A prescription shall only be given by a registered dentist or person “recorded” by the Dental Board of Victoria for the purposes of dental treatment, and shall be marked “for local dental treatment.”

(c) A prescription shall only be given by a registered veterinary surgeon for the purposes of treatment of animals, and shall be marked “for animal treatment only.”

(d) No prescription shall be given for the supply of any dangerous drug otherwise than in accordance with the foregoing conditions.

(e) A medical practitioner, dentist, or veterinary surgeon who dispenses any medicines to which these Regulations apply shall enter particulars thereof in the register hereinafter specified.

(f) Every medical practitioner who writes a prescription containing any dangerous drug shall write on such prescription the maximum number of times such prescription shall be dispensed.

(g) In an emergency case where a prescription is issued orally or by telephone to any pharmaceutical chemist, such prescription shall be forthwith reduced to writing and despatched without delay to the person dispensing the same by the person issuing it.

(h) The use of a rubber stamp in lieu of the written signature on a prescription for dangerous drugs is hereby prohibited.

6. The following conditions shall be observed by persons dispensing prescriptions:—

(a) A dangerous drug shall not be supplied more than once on the same prescription. Provided that if the prescription so directs, the dangerous drug may be supplied on more than one but not exceeding four occasions, as directed in the prescription.

(b) The prescription shall be stamped, marked, or inscribed in writing with the date on which it is dispensed with the name and address of the person who dispenses it.

(c) The person who dispenses the prescription for the last occasion as determined by the maximum mentioned in Regulation 6 (a), shall, in addition to the requirements mentioned in Regulation 6 (b), also write, stamp, mark, or inscribe in durable and legible letters across the prescription the word “cancelled.”

(d) No person shall dispense any prescription containing any dangerous drug within the scope of these Regulations if he has any reason to believe that the prescription is not genuine.

Records.

7. Every person who supplies any dangerous drug shall comply with the following provisions:—

- (a) He shall enter or cause to be entered in a register kept for the sole purpose all supplies of the dangerous drugs purchased or otherwise obtained by him.
- (b) The register may be kept in the form of Schedule 1, or in any simple form of debit and credit entry.
- (c) The entries shall be made in the register on the day on which the dangerous drugs are received or disposed of, or, when that is not necessarily convenient, on the day immediately following.
- (d) Where business is carried on at more than one set of premises, a separate register shall be kept in respect of each set of premises.
- (e) In the case of wholesale druggists the ordinary stock and sales records required to be kept by them under the provisions of the Customs Regulations shall be deemed to be a sufficient record for the purposes of these Regulations.
- (f) The register shall be kept in some part of the premises to which it relates, so that it shall at all times be available for inspection in accordance with the provisions of the Poisons Acts.
- (g) No entry which is untrue in any particular shall be made in the register; no entry shall be obliterated or cancelled or altered. Any mistake in an entry may be corrected by a marginal note or footnote giving the correct particulars and dated.
- (h) For the purpose of seeing that the provisions of these Regulations are observed, all information in regard to any purchases made and all stocks held, and all transactions effected by such person of any of the dangerous drugs, shall be furnished on application to any person specifically authorized in writing by the Board to obtain the same.

8. A duly qualified medical practitioner or registered veterinary surgeon who records in a day-book particulars of any of the dangerous drugs supplied by him to any patient, together with the name and address of the patient and date of the supply, may (in lieu of keeping the register required by the preceding Regulation) enter separately in a book to be kept for the purpose references under the appropriate dates to the records in the day-book of any supply of the dangerous drug.

9. A registered pharmaceutical chemist may, in lieu of keeping the register in the form required by Regulation 7, enter separately in the register particulars identifying such entry with the corresponding entry in the "poisons book" or "prescription book" kept by him, provided that the entries made in the prescription book are in the proper sequence and contain the name of the person for whom the prescription was issued, the date on which the medicine was dispensed, the number of the prescription, and such other requirements as are prescribed by Regulations made under the *Pharmaceutical Chemists Act 1920*.

Sale, Manufacture, or Possession of Dangerous Drugs.

10. No person shall manufacture, sell, or possess any dangerous drug, except such manufacture, sale, or possession (as the case may be) be sanctioned by law, statutory or otherwise, unless these Regulations so permit, or he hold a licence or authority under the same.

General Authorization.

11. Any person lawfully keeping open shop as a pharmaceutical chemist is hereby authorized—

- (a) to manufacture at the shop in the ordinary course of retail business any preparation, admixture, or extract of any of the dangerous drugs;
- (b) to carry on at the shop the business of retailing, dispensing, or compounding any of the dangerous drugs, but subject always to the provisions of these Regulations.

The supply by a registered pharmaceutical chemist keeping open shop to a medical practitioner, registered dentist, person "recorded" by the Dental Board, registered veterinary surgeon, registered midwife, or any of the persons and institutions mentioned in the next following Regulation, shall be deemed to be within the scope of this authority, but subject always to the provisions of these Regulations.

12. Any duly qualified medical practitioner or any registered pharmaceutical chemist employed or engaged in dispensing medicines at any public hospital or other public institution, or any registered dentist or person "recorded" by the Dental Board of Victoria, or any registered veterinary surgeon, or certificated nurse or registered midwife, or any person in charge of a laboratory for purposes of research or instruction attached to any university, college, public hospital, or other institution, approved by the Board for the purpose, or any person appointed by the Health Commission as a public analyst, or nurse employed by the Victorian Bush Nursing Association, is (until such authority is withdrawn as is hereinafter provided) hereby authorized, so far only as is necessary for the practice of his or her profession or employment in such capacity, to be in possession of any of the dangerous drugs, subject to the provisions and limitations of these Regulations.

Withdrawal of Authorities.

13. In the event of any person (authorized by Regulation 12) being convicted of an offence against the Act or Regulations, the Chief Secretary may, on the recommendation of the Board, withdraw the authority conferred by these Regulations to be in possession of any dangerous drug.

Applications for Licences and Authorities.

14. The following rules shall apply to licences to manufacture any dangerous drug, namely:—

- (a) Any person desirous of obtaining a licence to manufacture any dangerous drug shall apply in writing to the Chief Secretary in the form or to the effect of the Third Schedule to these Regulations.
- (b) The application in the first place shall be sent with the prescribed fee to the Board for its recommendation. The Board shall then consider the application, and if it thinks fit it may recommend the Chief Secretary to issue it, either with or without conditions.
- (c) A licence shall be in the form or to the effect of the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (d) A licensee desirous of obtaining a renewal of his licence shall apply in writing to the Board, with the prescribed fee. The Board, on being satisfied that the licensee is a fit and proper person to continue to hold such licence, may recommend the Chief Secretary to renew it.
- (e) The prescribed fee is hereby fixed at the sum of One pound.

15. In the event of any person authorized by these Regulations or by any licence granted by the Chief Secretary to manufacture, supply, or be in possession of dangerous drugs, or any of them, being convicted of any offence against the Act or Regulations, or of an offence under the enactments relating to Customs as applied to the importation of dangerous drugs, the Chief Secretary may, on the recommendation of the Board, by notice in the *Gazette*, withdraw the licence or authority in respect of such person if in his opinion such person cannot properly be allowed to manufacture, supply, or be in possession of the dangerous drugs or any of them.

Delivery to Messengers.

16. No person shall deliver any dangerous drug to any one not licensed or otherwise authorized to be in possession thereof who purports to be sent by a licensed or authorized person, unless he produces an authority in writing signed by the licensed or authorized person to receive the dangerous drug on his behalf, and unless the person supplying the dangerous drug has no reason to believe that the authority is not genuine. This Regulation shall not be deemed to apply to medicines dispensed in pursuance of the foregoing Regulations, or to wholesalers in the ordinary course of wholesale dealing.

Non-application of Regulations.

17. The foregoing Regulations shall not apply to preparations containing less than one-fifth per cent. (one part in five hundred) of morphine, or one-tenth per cent. (one part in a thousand) of cocaine, ecgonine, or diamorphine, nor to prescriptions which when dispensed result in the finished product containing not more than one-fifth per cent. (one part in five hundred) of morphine, or not more than one-tenth per cent. (one part in a thousand) of cocaine, ecgonine, or diamorphine, nor to the substances and preparations included in the Second Schedule to these Regulations and Part II. of the Second Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1920*.

Nor to any sale or delivery of any dangerous drug by a registered pharmaceutical chemist on the certificate or written authority signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner stating that any such drug is required for a person suffering from an incurable or malignant disease, provided that such certificate or authority is dated and is delivered to the registered pharmaceutical chemist prior to the first sale or delivery of such drug, and is retained by him, and is attached by him to the prescription book opposite the entry required to be made by him under the Regulations made under the *Pharmaceutical Chemists Act 1920*, and provided that all such sales or deliveries are made within six months from the date of the said certificate or authority.

PART II.

Regulations governing the sale and supply of specified drugs, namely, chloral hydrate, ergot, paraldehyde, diethyl-barbituric acid, sulphonal and its homologues, and any salt compound or derivatives of such substances.

18. No person shall sell or dispense any of the following specified drugs:—

- Chloral hydrate,
- Ergot,
- Paraldehyde,
- Diethyl-barbituric acid (whether described as veronal, propional, medinal, or by any other trade name or designation),
- Sulphonal and its homologues (whether described as trional, tetronal, or by any other name, mark, or designation),

and any salt, compound, or derivative of such specified drug, or any admixture containing any of the foregoing specified drugs, or any other substance or preparation added by proclamation to paragraph 2 of the Second Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1920*, except upon the written prescription of a registered medical practitioner or registered veterinary surgeon. Such prescription shall contain the date when written, the name of the person for whom or the purpose for which prescribed, and the signature in full of the said medical practitioner or veterinary surgeon. When dispensed the prescription shall be entered forthwith in the prescription book, and the person dispensing it shall comply with the requirements of the *Pharmaceutical Chemists Act 1920* and Regulations made thereunder so far as they apply to the recording of prescriptions.

19. Provided that so far as these Regulations are concerned the foregoing restriction shall not apply to the sale by an authorized person to a duly qualified medical practitioner, a registered veterinary surgeon, or a registered pharmaceutical chemist, or to any scientific or public institution or public hospital, or, to any Government Department, on the signed written order of the superintendent or nurse in immediate charge of any such institution, hospital, or Department, or to a nurse employed by the Victorian Bush Nursing Association who furnishes a written order signed by a medical officer of the association, nor to a wholesale druggist licensed under this Act selling or supplying to persons authorized to sell or supply any of the specified drugs.

20. Every medical practitioner or veterinary surgeon who writes a prescription containing any specified drug shall write on such prescription the maximum number of times such prescription shall be dispensed.

21. (1) No person shall dispense any prescription containing any specified drug (a) unless such prescription bears the signature of the medical practitioner or veterinary surgeon by whom it purports to be given, and (b) he has no reason to suppose that the prescription is not genuine.

(2) Such prescription shall not be dispensed more than twice unless the prescription so directs.

(3) The prescription shall be marked, stamped, or legibly inscribed with the name of the chemist dispensing it, and the date on which it is dispensed.

(4) The person who dispenses the prescription for the last occasion as determined by the maximum in Regulation 21 (2) shall, in addition to the requirements mentioned in Regulation 21 (3), also stamp, mark, or inscribe in durable and legible letters across the prescription the word "cancelled."

PART III.

Regulations governing the supply and sale of "potent drugs," namely, acetanilide, adrenals (extracts and preparations of), oil of tansy, pituitary extract, any serum or vaccine for human use, thyroid gland (preparations of), and any other substance or preparation added by proclamation to the Third Schedule to the said Act.

22. In the sale by retail of any "potent drug," every pharmaceutical chemist or person holding a certificate as a dealer in poisons under the provisions of Division 1 of Part I. of the *Poisons Act 1915* or other person shall attach to the label on the bottle, box, cover, wrapper immediately containing any potent drug the following direction, namely:—"This preparation is a potent drug, and care must be exercised in using it."

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to any potent drug dispensed or delivered by a registered pharmaceutical chemist on the written prescription of a duly qualified medical practitioner.

PART IV.

General.

23. Any dangerous drug or specified drug or potent drug in the order or disposition of any person shall be deemed to be in his possession.

24. These Regulations shall not apply to the preparations named in the first part of Schedule 2 of these Regulations, nor to any dangerous drug or specified drug when denatured in a manner recommended by the Board and approved by the Governor in Council.

Nor to the preparations specified in the second part of Schedule 2 of these Regulations when dispensed or supplied by a registered pharmaceutical chemist under the conditions set out in the second part of the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE 1.

The Register of Dangerous Drugs.

Health Act 1919.

SHIRE OF DEAKIN.

A By-law of the Shire of Deakin made under Part IV. Division I. of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered nine, to provide for the collection, removal, and disposal of night-soil.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Deakin in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in all that area in the County of Rodney and Parish of Tongala, commencing at the north-west angle of section A of the Tongala Estate Township Subdivision, bounded thence by a road forming the northern boundary of the said township bearing ninety degrees three and a half minutes, four thousand one hundred and twenty-four links and nine-tenths of a link to the north-east angle of section D; thence by a road forming the eastern boundary of the said township bearing one hundred and seventy-nine degrees fifty-seven minutes three thousand six hundred and ninety-three links and six-tenths of a link to the south-east angle of section F; thence along a road bearing one hundred and thirty-six degrees fifteen and a half minutes, four hundred and thirty-four links and seven-tenths of a link across a road and south-west boundary of lot 69 of Tongala Estate Subdivision; thence by a road forming the southern boundary of the said township bearing two hundred and seventy degrees four thousand four hundred and twenty-five links and four-tenths of a link to the south-west corner of Channel Reserve in section L of the said township; thence across a road and along a road bearing two hundred and seventy degrees and twelve minutes six hundred and fifty links; thence by a line bearing three hundred and fifty-nine degrees fifty-six and a half minutes, four thousand and eight links and three-tenths of a link; thence by a line bearing eighty-nine degrees fifty-six and a half minutes six hundred and fifty links to the commencing point.

4. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of night-soil; and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the *dépôt* so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than twenty-two gauge or other approved material or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious, hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be watertight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles. Each such pan shall have a capacity of one and a quarter cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of fourteen inches, a diameter of not less than fourteen inches and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an airtight lid to be affixed. The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, saw dust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

- (a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and
- (b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within two and a half inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the council with its contents from the premises and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance danger to health or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved dépôt.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the council for the removal of night-soil shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the dépôt and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the regulations.

16. If such night-soil be disposed of in trenches such trenches shall be not less than nine nor more than eighteen inches in depth nor exceed two feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than six inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least six inches in depth of clean thoroughly broken up soil upon the night-soil and pan-washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the night-soil and washings in any trench, such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than twelve inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed or grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such form of vegetable life as the council shall direct or approve shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil has been deposited, provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

21. Every pan after the disposal of its contents and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid, and before it again leaves the dépôt or disposal ground, shall on every occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

- (a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at sixty pounds pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam-tight box or chamber; or
- (b) thoroughly washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in aqueous solution containing not less than one per cent. of acrol, cyllin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or
- (c) thoroughly washing and scrubbing in water and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or
- (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the council for the removal of night-soil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the dépôt to be properly constructed, kept clean, and disinfected daily at the dépôt, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any night-soil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

25. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury or cause to be buried any night-soil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the council.

26. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

27. If any person or the council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
