WORKERS COMPENSATION ACTS.

A DDITION to Rule 8 of the rules under the Workers Compensation Act 1915—

"Sa. Provided that the Judge may at any time direct that an infant shall appear either as applicant or respondent in the same manner as if he were of full age."

We, William Henry Moule, George James Dethridge, and Casimir Julius Zichy Woinarski, being three Judges of County Courts of the State of Victoria, having made the foregoing rule for the purpose of carrying into effect the Workers Compensation Act in certain matters affecting the County Courts, and the Judges and officers thereof, and certain proceedings in County Courts, or before a Judge thereof, do hereby certify the same under our hands and submit it to the Attorney-General.

MARINE ACT 1915.

Amendment of Regulations Relating to the Examination of Engineers.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1915, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. These regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Engineers" made by the Board on the 2nd day of September, 1920, and published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd day of September, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations), and shall be read and construed as one therewith, and shall take effect on and from the date of their publication in the Government Gazetic, on which date Regulations 24, 25, and 26 of the aforesaid Regulations shall be repealed.
- 2. For regulation 24 of the principal Regulations, there shall be substituted the following, namely:—
 - 24. Third Class Engine-driver.—Third Class Engine-drivers' Certificates will be of four classes, and applicable for service respectively in the following classes of steamships, namely:—
 - Class (a). "River Steamships," being steamships not exceeding 15 tons gross registered tonnage, plying on any river or on any inland waters in the State of Victoria.
 - Class (b). "River Steamships" being steamships of less than 100 nominal horse-power, plying on any river or on any inland waters in the State of Victoria, not being salt water.
 - Class (c). "River and Bay Steamships," being steamships of less than 100 nominal horse-power, plying in any port or on any river, lake, or bay in the State of Victoria.
 - Class (d). "River and Bay Ships" of less than 100 nominal horse-power or 560 brake horse-power, propelled by internal combustion engines, plying in any port or on any river, lake, or bay in the State of Victoria.
- 3. For Regulation 25 of the principal Regulations, there shall be substituted the following, namely:—
 - 25. Qualifications.—(1) A candidate for a Third Class Engine-driver's Certificate of any class must be not less than 22 years of age—
 - (a) A candidate for a Certificate restricted to service in a "River Steamship" not exceeding 15 tons gross registered tonnage must have served afloat three years as a fireman, or have performed such service which, in the opinion of the Board, is equal to the service first mentioned.
 - (b) A candidate for a certificate applicable to a "River Steamship" or to a "River and Bay Steamship" of less than 100 nominal horse-power, must have served afloat two years as a fireman and two years in the engine-room as assistant engineer, donkeyman, or greaser, or such service as in the opinion of the Board is equivalent thereto, provided that not less than one year of such service must have been service in the engine-room afloat as assistant engineer, donkeyman, or greaser.
 - (c) A candidate for a certificate applicable to a "River and Bay Ship" of less than 100 nominal horse-power, or 560 brake horse-

power, propelled by internal combustion engines, must have not less than four years' experience with internal combustion engines in the capacity of fitter, assistant engineer, or oiler, provided that not less than one year of such experience must have been service afloat in one of the aforesaid capacities on a ship propelled by internal combustion engines.

- (2) All candidates for Third Class Enginedrivers' Certificates must—
 - (a) produce satisfactory testimonials for the whole of the period of service;
 - (b) be able to write a legible hand and understand the first four rules of arithmetic and their application in solving suitable simple problems in—

Consumption of oil and fuel. Capacities of bunkers and tanks. Speed of ships.

Weights and measures, costs of materials.

Wages, accounts, &c., &c.

- (c) in the case of a certificate applicable to steamships
 - be able to explain the functions of all principal parts of engines and boilers, steering gears, and auxiliary machinery, including all valves, cocks, connexions, pumps, and fire-appliances in the engine-room;
 - to understand the use of the Salinometer and to satisfy the examiner that he is in every way competent to take charge of the boilers and machinery of any steamship within the limits specified on his certificate;
- (d) in the case of a certificate applicable to ships propelled by internal combustion engines
 - be able to explain the principles on which oil, gas, or other internal combustion engines work, including the different means of supplying air and fuel to the cylinders, and methods of ignition adopted in each particular type;

understand the different methods of starting and reversing, and also the means for cooling the cylinders, pistons, exhaust pipes, &c.;

- be familiar with the properties of the various oils, &c., in general use, and have a knowledge of the explosive properties of the vapours given off by these oils, &c., when mixed with air;
- understand how to guard against the danger of fire, and what action to take in an emergency;
- know what attention is required by the various parts of the machinery, and understand the use of the different valves and connexions;

be able to state the chief causes which may make the engine difficult to start, and explain how to remedy any defects which might arise;

satisfy the examiner that he is in every way competent to take charge of any ship having internal combustion engines within the limits specified on his certificate.

- (3) Service which has been performed in steamships under 15 tons gross registered tonnage, plying on any inland water or on any river, will not be accepted as qualifying service for Certificates as Engine-drivers on steamships exceeding such tonnage; only such service as has been performed on steamships plying in the ports of Port Phillip, Melbourne, Geelong, Western Port, or Gippsland Lakes, or on Sea-going Steamships will be accepted as qualifying service for Certificates of Competency for Third Class Engine-drivers on "River and Bay' Steamships."
- 4. For Regulation 26 of the principal Regulations, there shall be substituted the following, namely:—
 - (1) The holder of a Third Class Engine-driver's Certificate restricted to service on "River Steamships" of less than 100 nominal horse-power, desirous of obtaining a certificate applicable to "River and Bay Steamships" (Class c) may have his Certificate exchanged therefor on his producing satisfactory evidence of having served for a further period of not less than twelve (12) months as leading fireman or assistant engineer on a Steamship plying in the ports of Port Phillip, Melbourne, Geolong, Western Port, or Gippsland Lakes, or on Sea-going Steamships and on his showing to the satisfaction of the Board's Examiner that he has acquired practical knowledge and experience in the working of engines and boilers of the class of Steamships plying in any such ports.
 - (2) The holder of a Third Class Engine-driver's Certificate applicable to "River Steamships" or "River and Bay Steamships" of less than 100 nominal horse-power, may have his certificate endorsed as applicable to "River and Bay Ships" of less than 100 nominal horse-power, or 560 brake

horse-power propelled by internal combustion engines on his producing satisfactory evidence of having served for a period of not less than two years in the engine-room of a ship solely propelled by internal combustion engines in the capacity of fitter, assistant engineer, or oiler, and upon his passing the examination prescribed in sub-clause (2) of Regulation 25; provided, however, that it shall not be necessary to undergo the examination in arithmetic.

- (3) The holder of a Third Class Engine-driver's Certificate applicable to "River and Bay Ships" of less than 100 nominal horse-power, or 560 brake horse-power, propelled by internal combustion engines, may have his certificate endorsed as applicable to "River Steamships" or "River and Bay Steamships" of less than 100 nominal horse-power, on his producing satisfactory evidence of having served two years in the engine-room of a steamship in the capacity of assistant engineer, donkeyman, or greaser, and upon his passing the examination prescribed in sub-clause (2) of Regulation 25; provided, however, that it shall not be necessary to undergo the examination in arithmetic.
- (4) On and after the coming into force of these Regulations, Certificates of Competency as Third Class Engine-drivers applicable to "River Steamships" and "River and Bay Steamships" shall not entitle the holders thereof to take charge of machinery of "River and Bay Ships" propelled by internal combustion engines unless endorsed for the purpose.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this fifteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. - 6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision.
