## NURSES REGISTRATION ACT 1923.

## Regulations relating to the Registration of Nurses.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria by virtue of the powers conferred by section 28 of the *Nurses Registration Act 1923*, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Nurses Registration Regulations 1926," and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be separated into Parts as follow:—

- Part I.—Preliminary.
- Part II.—Training Schools for Nurses.
- Part III.—Course of Training for Nurses.
- Part IV.—Examinations.
- Part V.—Registration of Nurses.
- Part VI.—Part-time Training Schools and Training Schools for Special Branches of Nursing.
- Part VII.—Registration of Nurses in Special Branches of Nursing.
- Part VIII.—Schedules.

### PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

2. All Regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed. Repeal.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:— Interpretation.

"Approval" means approval in writing of the Nurses Board; and

"Approved" has a corresponding interpretation.

"Austin Hospital" means the Austin Hospital for Incurables at Heidelberg.

"Children's Hospital" means the Children's Hospital at Carlton.

"Committee of Management" means the Committee, Board, or other body or person controlling the management of the hospital.

"Eye and Ear Hospital" means the Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital.

"General Training School" means any approved hospital which provides a complete course of training for nurses in accordance with the prescribed requirements.

"Intermediate Hospital" means a Hospital or Ward of a Public Hospital where patients are treated whose income makes them ineligible for admission to a Public Hospital, and is insufficient to allow them to pay ordinary medical fees or the usual private hospital maintenance charges.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by the Act or by the Regulations.

"Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital" means the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital at Fairfield.

"Queen Victoria Hospital" means the Queen Victoria Memorial Hospital for Women and Children.

"Register" means the Nurses Register under the Act.

"Registered Nurse" means a nurse (whether male or female) who is for the time being registered in the Register.

"Regulations" means Regulations made under the provisions of the Act.

"The Act" means the *Nurses Registration Act 1923*.

"The Board" means the Nurses Board constituted under the Act.

"The Registrar" means the person appointed by the Board to that office under the Act.

"Trainees" means a person passing through the prescribed course of training in order to become entitled to be registered as a nurse.

"Women's Hospital" means the Women's Hospital at Carlton.

## PART II.—TRAINING SCHOOLS FOR NURSES.

### A.—GENERAL TRAINING SCHOOLS.

4. Any hospital which fulfils the following requirements to the satisfaction of the Board shall be eligible for the approval of the Board as a general training school for nurses for the purposes of the Act, namely:—

- (a) That no person other than a registered nurse holds (except in cases of emergency) any appointment thereat whether honorary or otherwise as the Matron or Sister or Nurse in Charge of the nursing of patients.
- (b) That the Matron or Sister or Nurse in Charge of the nursing thereat has had not less than three years' training in a hospital or hospitals recognized by the Board for the purpose.
- (c) That the period of the course of training for nurses thereat is not less than three years.
- (d) That the daily average number of occupied beds therein is not less than 40.
- (e) That general surgical and medical cases, both male and female, are treated therein.
- (f) That trainees thereat receive practical instruction in the wards thereof from the Matron or other registered nurse, and take an active part in the preparation of patients for operations and assist during the progress of practical surgical work.
- (g) That trainees thereat attend a systematic course of lectures and receive instruction from legally qualified medical practitioners, and from the Matron or other registered nurse in accordance with the curriculum of study set forth in Part A of the Second Schedule to these Regulations, and pass the necessary examination.
- (h) That arrangements are made for the trainees to receive a course of instruction in invalid cookery by a qualified cookery teacher registered by the Department of Education or approved by the Board including not less than six lectures and instruction in the matters and subjects set forth in Part B of the Second Schedule hereto.

5. The Committee of Management of any hospital desiring approval of such hospital as a general training school shall make application in the prescribed form to the Board through the Secretary, and such application shall be accompanied by a statement signed by the Medical Superintendent or Senior Medical Officer or the Secretary, and by the Matron in accordance with the particulars set forth in Form No. 1 of the First Schedule hereto.

6. The Board shall cause a list of hospitals approved as general training schools for nurses to be published in the *Government Gazette*.

7. If any hospital which has been approved as a general training school for nurses does not fulfil to the satisfaction of the Board all the requirements of the Regulations as to general training schools for nurses, the Board may at any time by notice to the Committee of Management, through the Matron or Secretary, or to the person in charge of such hospital, cancel its approval, and thereupon such hospital shall cease to be a general training school from the date specified in that behalf in such notice, and a copy of such notice shall be published in the *Government Gazette*. Any nurse then in course of training in such hospital shall serve such additional period of training as the Board may require.

8. Every hospital approved as a general training school for nurses shall as soon as may be after the thirtieth day of June, but not later than the thirty-first day of August in each year, forward a report to

the Board, signed by the Matron and by the Medical Superintendent or Senior Medical Officer or Secretary, made up to the thirtieth day of June, and giving the particulars and in the form set forth in Form 2 of the First Schedule hereto.

B.—PART-TIME TRAINING SCHOOLS.

9. Hospitals which have not been approved by the Board as general training schools for nurses; schools for courses in special branches of nursing, and institutions such as fever hospitals, eye- and ear hospitals, and gynaecological hospitals, may be approved as part-time training schools for nurses or as training schools for courses in special branches of nursing provided conditions laid down by the Board in Part VI. of these Regulations are complied with, and the Board may cancel any such approval.

PART III.—COURSE OF TRAINING FOR NURSES.

10. The period of the course of training for nurses shall be—

I. In a hospital having not less than a daily average of 40 occupied beds and approved as a General Training School for Nurses—3 years.

II. In a hospital (other than the Hospitals referred to in subsections IV., V., and VI. of this section) with a daily average of from 20 to 39 occupied beds approved as a part-time training school—4 years in such hospital, or 3½ years in such hospital together with 1 year's previous training at the Eye and Ear Hospital, or 3 years in such hospital, together with—

(a) 1 year at the Infirmary Department of the Women's Hospital; or

(b) 1 year at the Queen Victoria Hospital; or

(c) 1 year at the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital or other Infectious Diseases Hospital approved by the Board.

III. In a hospital (other than the Hospitals referred to in subsections IV., V., and VI. of this section) with a daily average of from 10 to 19 occupied beds approved as a part-time training school, 3 years in such hospital, together with—

(a) 1 year at the Infirmary Department of the Women's Hospital, and 6 months at the Eye and Ear Hospital or the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital or other Infectious Diseases Hospital approved by the Board; or

(b) 1 year at the Queen Victoria Hospital, and 6 months at the Eye and Ear Hospital or the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital or other Infectious Diseases Hospital approved by the Board.

IV. At the Austin Hospital—2 years, together with—

(a) 1 year at the Infirmary Department of the Women's Hospital and 6 months at the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital or other Infectious Diseases Hospital approved by the Board; or

(b) 1 year at the Queen Victoria Hospital and 6 months at the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital or other Infectious Diseases Hospital approved by the Board.

V. At the Children's Hospital—3 years, together with—

(a) 1 year at the Infirmary Department of the Women's Hospital; or

(b) 1 year at the adult wards of the Queen Victoria Hospital; or

(c) 1 year in a hospital with a daily average of from 20 to 39 occupied beds approved as a part-time training school.

VI. At the Infirmary Department of the Women's Hospital or the Queen Victoria Hospital—2 years, together with—

1 year at the Austin Hospital and 6 months at the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital or other Infectious Diseases Hospital approved by the Board.

11. Nurses may commence their training at any of the above-mentioned hospitals and may transfer to any other or others of such hospitals according to the convenience of the Training Schools, and in such cases the period of training shall be four and a half years, provided that upon application in that behalf the Board may, if it thinks fit in any case, reduce such period. The training from the time of commencement until completion thereof shall be continuous, but in exceptional circumstances upon application in that behalf being made to the Board before such continuity is broken, the Board shall have power to grant an exemption from the Regulations under such conditions as the Board thinks fit.

12. Every trainee shall within 6 months of commencing training produce to the Matron of the Training School the Certificate of Merit of the Education Department of Victoria or other Educational Certificate recognized as equivalent thereto by the Board. And for this purpose the Board shall recognize as equivalent any certificate to the effect that the trainee is educated up to the standard of the Certificate of Merit aforesaid in English, writing, arithmetic, and composition, signed by a head teacher of a State School or other educational authority recognized for the purpose of the Board.

13. Every trainee shall during her course of training receive practical instruction in the wards of her training school or schools from the Matron or other registered nurse, and shall take active part in the preparation of patients for operations, and shall assist during the progress of practical surgical work.

14. Every trainee shall during her course of training attend a systematic course of lectures, and receive instruction from legally qualified medical practitioners and from the Matron or other registered nurse in accordance with and in the subjects and matters set forth in Part A of the Second Schedule hereto.

15. Every trainee shall during her course of training receive the course of instruction in elementary anatomy and physiology prescribed in Part A of the Second Schedule hereto, and shall produce a certificate satisfactory to the Board that she has passed an examination in those subjects.

16. Every trainee (unless she already possesses a certificate in cookery approved by the Board) shall, during her course of training and before applying for registration, receive a course of instruction and attend lectures and pass an examination in cookery by a qualified cookery teacher registered by the Department of Education or approved by the Board in accordance with and in the subjects and matters set forth in Part B of the Second Schedule hereto.

#### PART IV.—EXAMINATIONS.

17. No person shall be eligible for the examination unless—

- (a) She has completed the course of training for the period and in the manner prescribed in Part III. of these Regulations.
- (b) She has produced a certificate or certificates signed by the Matron of the hospital or hospitals where she has received her training that she has duly completed her course of training in accordance with these Regulations. Such certificate shall be in the form or to the effect of Form No. 4 in the First Schedule hereto.
- (c) She has paid the prescribed fees.

Provided that in the event of the date of completing her period of course of training falling between two examinations, the Board may permit her to present herself at the examination next preceding the date of the completion of her period of course of training, but in that event she must complete her period of course of training and produce her certificate or certificates to that effect before she is entitled to registration.

18. The subjects for examination shall be—

- (a) General Nursing.
- (b) Medical Nursing.
- (c) Surgical Nursing.
- (d) Hygiene.

19. The examination shall be written, oral, and practical. The written examination shall be held simultaneously at all centres throughout the State, and shall consist of two papers, one medical and one surgical.

20. Candidates shall make application to the Board in the form of or to the effect of Form No. 3 in the First Schedule hereto for admission to the examination, and such application shall reach the Registrar at least fourteen days prior to the date on which the examination is to be held.

21. Examinations shall be held in the months of May and November in each year, or at such other times as the Board may determine.

22. The fees for examination shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto.

23. Examinations shall be held at centres to be determined by the Board from time to time.

24. There shall be a Committee of Examiners and a Chairman of Examiners appointed by the Board for each examination.

25. The Committee of Examiners shall, subject to these Regulations, be responsible for the setting and marking of the written papers and the conduct of the examination generally.

26. Each examination paper shall be examined conjointly by two examiners, who shall submit the results to the Chairman of Examiners, and such Chairman shall have the right to revise such results, and his decision shall be final.

27. No examiner shall examine at either the oral or the practical examination candidates who have trained at a hospital of which she is the Matron or a nurse who has instructed trainees.

28. The examination question papers shall be sent sealed to the various centres where at the appointed time the seal shall be broken in the presence of the candidates, and the papers distributed by the supervisor appointed by the Committee of Examiners to be in charge of the examination.

29. After the examination the answers of candidates shall be forthwith placed in a sealed packet and forwarded to the Registrar.

30. Each candidate shall be provided with a numbered card which shall be presented to each examiner on the day of the practical and oral examinations for signature.

31. The candidate's number in figures and words shall be written at the right hand corner of each sheet of paper. The candidate's name shall not appear.

#### PART V.—REGISTRATION OF NURSES.

32. Application for registration as a nurse shall be made in the form set forth in the First Schedule, Form No. 5, hereto.

33. No person shall be registered as a nurse except as provided by the Act unless such person—

- (a) Has completed the prescribed course of training for the prescribed period in a hospital or hospitals approved by the Board.
- (b) Has passed at an examination of the Board in the prescribed subjects.
- (c) Has produced to the Board the Certificate of Education referred to in regulation No. 12 hereof, and also a certificate of efficiency in cookery from a qualified cookery teacher registered by the Education Department or a teacher recognized by the Board.
- (d) Has paid the fee for registration prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto, and
- (e) Has satisfied the Board that the provisions of section 14 of the Act have been complied with.

34. Each person registered as a nurse shall be entitled to receive a certificate from the Board in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto—Form No. 6—upon payment of the fee prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto.

35. The register shall be kept in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto—Form No. 7.

PART VI.—PART-TIME TRAINING SCHOOLS AND  
TRAINING SCHOOLS FOR SPECIAL BRANCHES OF  
NURSING.

36. The conditions referred to in Part II. B. are as follows:—

I. Any hospital which fulfils the following requirements to the satisfaction of the Board shall be eligible for the approval of the Board as a part-time training school for nurses for the purposes of the Act, namely:—

- (a) That no person other than a registered nurse holds (except in cases of emergency) any appointment thereat, whether honorary or otherwise, as the Matron or Sister or Nurse in charge of the nursing of patients.
- (b) That the Matron or Sister or Nurse in charge of the nursing thereat has had not less than three years' training in a hospital or hospitals recognized by the Board for the purpose.
- (c) That the period of the course of training for nurses thereat is in accordance with Part III. of the Regulations.
- (d) That the daily average number of occupied beds is not less than 10.
- (e) That trainees thereat receive practical instruction in the wards thereof from the Matron or other registered nurse.
- (f) That trainees be required to pass an examination in anatomy and physiology as contained in schedule 2, part A, within eighteen months of the commencement of their course of training, or produce a certificate if they have already passed such examination.
- (g) That trainees thereat attend a systematic course of lectures and receive instruction from legally qualified medical practitioners and from the Matron or other registered nurse in the subjects which relate to the nursing received at such hospital, and pass an examination therein and receive a certificate to that effect.
- (h) That a certificate is issued to each trainee in the form set forth in Form No. 1 of the Fourth Schedule hereto.
- (i) That arrangements are made for trainees to receive a course of instruction in invalid cookery by a qualified cookery teacher registered by the Department of Education or approved by the Board, including not less than six lectures and instruction in the matters and subjects set forth in Part B of the Second Schedule.

II. Any hospital which fulfils the following requirements to the satisfaction of the Board may be recognized for the purposes of the Act as a school for a course in a special branch of nursing:—

- (a) That no person other than a registered nurse holds (except in cases of emergency) any appointment thereat, whether honorary or otherwise, as the Matron or Sister or Nurse in charge of the nursing of patients.
- (b) That the Matron or Sister or Nurse in charge of the nursing thereat has had not less than three years' training in a hospital or hospitals recognized by the Board for the purpose.
- (c) That the period of the course of training for nurses registered under Part V. of these Regulations does not exceed six months.
- (d) That trainees thereat receive practical instruction in the wards thereof from the Matron or other registered nurse.

- (e) That trainees thereat attend a systematic course of lectures and receive instruction from legally qualified medical practitioners and from the Matron or other registered nurse on the special subjects which relate to the nursing received at such hospital and pass an examination therein and receive a certificate to that effect.

- (f) That a certificate is issued to such trainee.

III. Regulations 5, 6, 7 and 8 shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to all hospitals applying for and obtaining approval under this Part.

#### PART VII.—REGISTRATION OF NURSES IN SPECIAL BRANCHES OF NURSING.

37. Applications for registration as the holders of special certificates under this Part shall be made in the form set forth in Form No. 5 of the First Schedule.

No person shall be registered as the holder of a special certificate unless such person—

- (a) Is a registered nurse.
- (b) Has, in addition to any training which may form part of her course of training under Part III. of these Regulations, completed the prescribed course of training for the prescribed period in a hospital approved by the Board as a school for a course in a special branch of nursing.
- (c) Has passed at an examination of the Board in the prescribed subjects.
- (d) Has paid the fee for registration prescribed in the Third Schedule.

38. Each person registered as the holder of a special certificate shall be entitled to receive a certificate from the Board in the form set forth in the Fourth Schedule, Form No. 2, upon payment of the fee prescribed in the Third Schedule.

The register under this Part shall be kept in the form set forth in Form No. 7 of the First Schedule.

## BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

*Rating By-law for 1926.*

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1926:—

1. For every vacant piece of land which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

2. For any shop which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount not supplied with water, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

3. For every house or tenement of under Fifteen pounds (£15) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.) per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.

5. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) and under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.) per annum.

6. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds fifteen shillings (£2 15s.) per annum.

7. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per annum.

8. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds five shillings (£4 5s.) per annum.

9. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds fifteen shillings (£4 15s.) per annum.

10. For water supplied to any house or tenement upon which no annual municipal value is made, the sum of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.) per annum.

11. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.

12. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.

13. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.

14. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.

15. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.

17. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

18. If any person who has provided any meter fail to give the notice required of any repairs required for such meter he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

19. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall permit or suffer water to run to waste, shall be liable to a penalty, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if the water is being allowed to run to waste, and, if such owner or occupier refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.

22. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.

23. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such work, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission.

24. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust, shall give notice to the secretary of his intention to do so.

25. All connexions from the Trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.

26. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the best quality, and approved by the secretary and chairman of the Trust.

27. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.

28. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

29. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of an officer of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

30. For any breach of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

31. The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1926, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1926, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1926, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1926. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

WHEREAS by the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act* 1917 (8 Geo. V. No. 2916) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, set apart any area of Crown land for the purpose of being disposed under the said Act to discharged soldiers in the manner thereafter provided: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 6 of the Act aforesaid, doth hereby set apart for the said purpose the land set out in the Schedule hereunder:—

## SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2686), sections 16 and 35, and acting on a petition signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are on the municipal roll of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh (notice of which was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st March, 1926), doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into four (4) separate Ridings, to be named the—

Parwan Riding,  
Pentland Hills Riding,  
Coimadai Riding, and  
Bacchus Marsh Riding.

the several proposed boundaries of which are herein set forth and described, that is to say:—

## PARWAN RIDING.

Commencing on the Werribee River at the north-east boundary of the Parish of Parwan; thence westerly by the Werribee River to a point in line with the north-east angle of allotment 11, section 1, Parish of Parwan; thence south by that line and the eastern boundaries of allotments 11 and 13 to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence easterly along a three-chain road to the north-east angle of allotment 12, section A; thence by a road south and south-westerly through that allotment to a road on the east boundary of allotment 13; thence south by that road to the south-east angle of allotment 51, section C1; thence west by a road to the west boundary of allotment 4B, section 4; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 3A, section 4; thence westerly, north-westerly, and south-westerly by a three-chain road to the western boundary of allotment A, section 9, Parish of Gorrockburkhgaph, being the western boundary of the shire; thence by that boundary, southerly, easterly, northerly, easterly, northerly, easterly, and northerly to the point of commencement.

**H**IS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the City of Mordialloc, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

*The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.*

## COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

## (Part V.—Division 14.)

*How Votes to be Marked by Voter.*

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

*Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.*

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

*Invalid Ballot-papers.*

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

*Ballot-papers Not Invalid.*

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to accord ing to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

*Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.*

295. The returning officer (for the Ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

*Procedure where only Two Candidates.*

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Procedure where more than Two Candidates.*

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole Ward the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

*Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.*

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

*Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.*

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

*Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.*

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

*Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.*

## (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

(a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and

(b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.*

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

*Deposit Moneys.*

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

*Voting by Post.*

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

(a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and

(b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

**REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.**

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the City of Mordialloc of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

## REGULATIONS AMENDING THE FOOD AND DRUG STANDARDS REGULATIONS 1924.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919* (No. 3041) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, doth hereby amend the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1924 as follows:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1926, and shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1924 and any Regulation amending the same, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The definition of "Preservative" in Regulation 5 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

"Preservative" means any substance which when added to food prevents, arrests, or impedes the fermentation, putrefaction, or acidification of such food, and includes benzoic acid, boric acid, glycerine, nitrite of potassium, nitrite of sodium, sulphur dioxide, and salicylic acid, but does not include acetic acid, salt, saltpetre, sugar, spice, vinegar, and wood smoke.

3. Regulation 9 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

## 9. PRESERVATIVES.

(1) No food may contain any preservative unless its presence therein is specifically permitted; nor shall any food contain more than one preservative except as hereinafter provided.

(2) Where any food specifically permitted to contain a preservative is used in the manufacture or preparation of any compound food, such compound food may contain the preservative introduced by the use of the former food, but the amount of any one preservative present in the compound food shall not be greater than is permissible in the quantity of each preserved food used in manufacturing or preparing the compound food; provided that the provisions of this sub-clause shall not apply to reconstituted milk or cream.

(3) Wherever by these Regulations the presence of a specified maximum weight of sulphur dioxide in any food is permitted, such permission shall be taken, unless inconsistent with the context, to allow in lieu thereof the presence of—

(a) sulphites which calculated as sulphur dioxide are not in excess of the weight of sulphur dioxide so permitted; or

(b) a similar weight of benzoic acid or benzoate of soda calculated as benzoic acid.

(4) Every package of food containing a preservative shall bear a label in which shall be written a statement in the following form:—

"This food contains not more than [here insert the number] grains of [here insert the chemical name of the preservative] to the [here insert the word 'pound' in the case of solid food, or the word 'pint' in the case of liquid food]."

(5) No substance other than benzoic acid, boric acid, glycerine, nitrite of potassium, nitrite of sodium, sulphur dioxide or salicylic acid shall be used as a preservative, nor shall any such substance be advertised, described, or sold as a preservative unless it is contained in a package which bears a label in which is written—

"This preservative contains [here insert the percentage present] per centum of [here insert the name of the preservative]."

4. Regulation 10 (4) is hereby repealed, and following substituted therefor:—

(4) "Colourings" for the purposes of these Regulations mean caramel, cochineal, saffron, chlorophyll, and every harmless vegetable colour extractive, and include the coal-tar dyes prescribed hereunder:—

5. Regulation 28 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

## REGULATION 28.—MEAT.

## Meat.

(1) "Meat" means the wholesome edible parts of any member of the animal kingdom ordinarily used for food.

## Fresh Meat.

(2) "Fresh meat" means sound, wholesome raw meat that has not been subjected to any treatment nor exposure to artificial cold.

## Chilled Meat.

(3) "Chilled meat" means meat which is or has been artificially cooled to near its freezing point.

## Frozen or Refrigerated Meat.

(4) "Frozen or refrigerated meat" means meat which is or has been cooled below its freezing point.

Meat Treated with SO<sub>2</sub>.

(5) (a) Carcass meat may be treated with sulphur dioxide; provided that such treatment is applied forthwith after slaughter and before the meat sets.

(b) Meat so treated shall not contain more than three grains of SO<sub>2</sub> per pound in the raw state, nor more than one grain and a-half in the cooked state.

(c) Every person who exposes for sale any meat so treated in any market, shop, stand, stall, vehicle, or elsewhere shall, in the case of carcasses or half carcasses of lamb, mutton, pork, and veal, and in the case of quarters of beef, affix thereto a label having the word "Preserved" in letters of not less than 72 points, and shall in the case of smaller portions of meat exhibit a similar label in a conspicuous position in relation to such meat.

(d) Every person who sells any meat so treated to any purchaser at any market, shop, stand, stall, or elsewhere, or who delivers such meat at any house, shall affix to the meat or to the package enclosing the meat a label bearing the word "Preserved" in letters of not less than 48 points, followed by the words—"This meat contains not more than three grains of sulphur dioxide per pound."

#### Corned Meat.

(6) "Corned meat" means fresh, chilled, or frozen meat prepared with salt, and with or without saltpetre, sugar, vinegar, or spices, and includes pickled or salted meat.

#### Smoked Meat.

(7) "Smoked meat" means corned meat treated with smoke.

#### Manufactured Meat.

(8) "Manufactured meat" means fresh, chilled, frozen, corned, or smoked meat, cooked or uncooked, chopped or minced or not, singly or in combination, prepared with or without smoke, salt, saltpetre, sugar, vinegar, spices, herbs, edible oils, or fat, and includes saveloys, frankfurts, German, Belgian, fritz, Strasburg, black puddings, white puddings, and any similar sausage, and brawn, potted meat, pressed meat, galantine of tongue, or any meat similarly prepared.

#### Limitation of Nitrate or Nitrite.

(9) (a) Corned, smoked, or manufactured meat may contain saltpetre or nitrite of potassium or nitrite of sodium.

(b) Where any such meat contains saltpetre it shall not be present in any larger proportion than 14 grains per pound calculated as  $\text{KNO}_3$ , and where it contains a nitrite such nitrite shall not be present in any larger proportion than one grain per pound calculated as  $\text{KNO}_2$ .

#### Minced Meat or Sausage Meat.

(10) (a) Minced meat or sausage meat is chopped or minced fresh, frozen, or chilled meat mixed or not with salt, sugar, spices, herbs, or wholesome farinaceous substance. It may contain not more than six parts per centum of starch.

(b) If it is enclosed in a skin of animal origin, such skin shall be deemed to be an integral portion of the said meat.

(c) Sausage-skins may be coloured without declaration.

#### Preservative.

(11) Minced or sausage meat and manufactured meats may contain in the raw state not more than 3.5 grains of  $\text{SO}_2$  per pound, and in the cooked state not more than 1.8 grains per pound.

#### Meat Extract, Meat Essence, or Meat Juice.

(12) Meat extract, meat essence, or meat juice is the product obtained from meat by extraction, expression, or concentration. It shall contain the protein of flesh, but no extract of yeast. It may contain salt and condiments, and, in the case of meat juice, glycerine, provided that the presence and amount per centum of glycerine are declared.

(13) Every package of meat extract, meat essence, or meat juice shall bear a label stating the name or names of the kind or kinds of meat from which its contents have been prepared.

#### Meat Paste.

(14) Meat paste is a paste prepared with meat, farinaceous material, and other wholesome food and flavouring substances.

(15) Every package of meat paste shall bear a label stating the kind or kinds of meat, and the proportion of meat or meats, contained in the paste, in the following form:—

"This paste contains not less than [here insert the name or names of the meat, accompanied by a statement of the approximate proportion]."

#### Dripping.

(16) Dripping is clean fat rendered from mutton or beef. It shall not contain fat derived from offal, but may contain caul fat. It shall be free from rancidity, and shall contain not more than one part per centum of substance other than mutton or beef fat unavoidably incorporated with it in the course of rendering, and not more than two parts per centum of water.

#### Lard.

(17) Lard is clean fat rendered from the meat of swine. It shall not contain fat derived from offal, but may contain caul fat. It shall be free from rancidity, and shall not contain more than one part per centum of substance other than swine fat unavoidably incorporated with it in the course of rendering, and not more than one part per centum of water.

And the Honorable Stanley Seymour Argyle, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RESCISSON OF REGULATION OF BOOKSELLERS AND NEWS AGENTS' SHOPS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

RESCISSON OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN A RADIUS OF ONE MILE OF THE LAKE BOLAC POST OFFICE.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC RESERVES AND PORTION OF FORESHORE IN PARISH OF PUEBLA, AT TORQUAY.

**W**E, Alfred Gilbert White, Harry William Buckland, Ernest John Taylor, John Robert Harrison, and Frederick Arthur Taylor, the majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the "Torquay Foreshore Reserve," and of such other Reserves in the Township of Torquay, Parish of Puebla, as are indicated on plans marked A/8.2.24 and P/5.11.08 with Lands Department correspondence C.73164, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as any portion of the Reserves may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 2s. 6d. may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to such Reserve.
2. No person who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall enter or remain in the Reserves.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserves, nor—excepting in such portion of the Reserves as may be made available by the Committee of Management for camping parties—shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, gates, fences, seats, swings, see-saws, or any other erection within the Reserves; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall erect within the Reserves any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall hawk or sell or offer for sale any article of any description in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any of the plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserves on Sundays.

10. No person shall remove any stone, soil, or sand from the Foreshore or Reserves.

11. Horses shall not be allowed on the Foreshore for racing or bathing purposes.

12. Horse, motor, and bicycle racing, and/or any other sport which the Committee of Management may consider a menace to the safety of the public, shall not be allowed on the Foreshore.

13. Applications for permission to erect bathing-boxes on the Foreshore shall be made, in writing, to the Committee of Management, and such permission may be granted, subject to the following conditions, to owners of land within the Township of Torquay:—

- (a) Owners shall have the right to apply for only one (1) site in respect of any one dwelling-house.
- (b) All buildings shall be erected to specifications and plans as set out by the Committee of Management.
- (c) Boxes shall be erected only on sites allotted, and shall be aligned, spaced, and levelled as directed.
- (d) All paint used for external woodwork shall be of oil colour, to shade as directed. Red oxide may be used on roof only.
- (e) Bathing-boxes shall not be used for residential purposes.
- (f) Each permit shall be granted for one year only, and shall expire on the 31st day of December of each year.
- (g) The amount of fees payable in respect of bathing-box sites allotted shall be as fixed by the Committee of Management from time to time, and shall be payable in advance.
- (h) All changes of ownership shall be immediately notified to the Committee of Management, and a fee of 5s. (Five shillings) shall become payable on transfer.
- (i) Should any occupier fail to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, or with any requisition by the Committee of Management, the Committee shall have the power to cancel the permit, and to give the occupier one (1) month's notice to remove the box or building from the site.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the tenderer withdrawing the tender before notification of acceptance, or, in the event of being successful, failing to complete by lodging the security and contract form, duly signed, within the prescribed period. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period when notified of acceptance, may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and the prices are considered reasonable.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in an envelope, and *having the words "Tender for at" (as the case may be) written thereon*, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the *Health Act 1919*, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogs-heads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.
6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds; as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.
7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him.
8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
9. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts (except for the gaols) the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor.
10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. 12. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
13. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.
14. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 11.
15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 11. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.
16. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 11.
17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.
18. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.
19. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 11.
