THE MELBOURNE HARBOUR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the Melbourne Harbour Trust Act 1915, the Melbourne Harbour Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called "the Commissioners") make the following Regula-

- 1. In these Regulations "Principal Regulations" means the Regulations made by the Commissioners and approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of December. 1916, and published in the Government Gazette on the 5th day of January, 1917, as altered or added to prior to the date
- 2. These Regulations shall, unless a contrary intention appears, be read and construed as one with the Principal Regulations and as part thereof.
- 3. Regulations 6, 40, 92, 272, 297, 299, and 300 of the Principal Regulations are hereby repealed. Provided always that such repeal shall not affect or alter any rights or liabilities acquired, accrued, or incurred thereunder before the coming into operation of these Regulations.
- 4. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 6 of the Principal Regulations:-
 - 6. The Treasurer shall make or cause to be made true entries in the books provided by the Commissioners for ' that purpose of all moneys or cheques paid to or received by him for and on behalf of the Commissioners, and he shall within twenty-four hours after receipt thereof, or such shorter period as the Commissioners may direct, pay the same moneys and cheques into such bank as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint to the credit of the Harbour Trust Fund. No money shall be drawn out of the bank save by cheque signed by one Commissioner and countersigned by the Secretary and Treasurer, or by such substitute or substitutes for the Secretary and/or Treasurer as the Chairman of the Trust shall from time to time appoint.
- 5. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 40 of the Principal Regulations:—
 - 40, (1) The master of a dredger having its moorings laid out, whether such dredger is at work or not, shall in the undermentioned circumstances cause the following signals to be exhibited in daytime and nightime respectively so as to be open to vision from vessels approaching from any direction.
 - (a) While the dredger is in a position which in the opinion of the master thereof would render it proper for any vessel which might approach from seaward to keep the dredger on the starboard side of such vessel in passing-

Any vessel approaching from whatsoever direction must not pass such dredger until one of the signals mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this sub-clause of this Regulation is exhibited.

- (2) A white light shall be shown on the outer rail of a silt barge moored to a dredger on the side upon which any signal indicates that such dredger should be passed.
- (3) Self-propelling dredgers under way when dredging and unable to manouvre as required by the Navigation (Collision) Regulations of the Commonwealth of Australia for the time being in force so as to keep out of the way of other vessels shall by nighttime show the lights and by daytime exhibit the shapes prescribed by such Regulations for vessels not under command.
- (4) The master of a dredger having its moorings laid out and being in or near a channel in which ships may be moving during fog, mist, or heavy rain, shall cause the following fog signals to be sounded by the ringing of a bell or gong at intervals of not more than two minutes:
- (a) While dredger is in a position which in the opinion of the master thereof would render it proper for any vessel which might approach from seaward to keep the dredger on the starboard side or such vessel in massing. such vessel in passing.
- (b) While dredger is in (b) While dreager is in a position which in the opinion of the master thereof would render it proper for any vessel which might approach from sea-ward to keen the dredger ward to keep the dredger on the port side of such vessel in passing.
- (e) When dredger is blocking a channel.

THE Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, in

1. A rate of One shilling and tempence in the pound shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust District according to the municipal valuation of such properties.

The minimum rate to be paid in respect of each tenement shall be One pound.

For all vacant allotments not supplied with water the minimum rate shall be Ten shillings.

- 2. Such rate is made for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1926, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1926, and shall be payable in one instalment in advance on the first day of January, 1926.
- 3. The numicipal value for the time being of the lands and tenements within the said district within the numicipal district of the Shire of Rodney in which such lands and tenements are situated, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of making and levying such rates.
- 4. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (i) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates. 293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

(a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the clector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid,

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the Riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the Local Government Act 1915 shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

- 297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—
- (1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

imspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

(a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he

- presides; and

 (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected;

and

(c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and

(d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and

(e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

(a) cartify a list of the number of such first preference

- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the Local Government Act 1915.
- (3) The returning officer shall—

(a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and

(b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable-

(a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference

votes given for each candidate; and
(b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so us to ascertain for the whole Riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him (11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the Local Government Act 1915 as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the can-didate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.
- (2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly. accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Common-THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Common, wealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prescribe the conditions and restrictions set out hereunder for regulating the taking or killing of opossums, the marketing of the skins of opossums, the licensing of trappers and dealers, and other matters in relation thereto. matters in relation thereto.

1. In this Proclamation (if not inconsistent with the context)—"Chief Inspector" means the Chief Inspector of

Fisheries and Game.

"Official Mark" means the official mark hereinafter referred to or mentioned as being affixed to or branded on any opossum skin to notify that royalty has been paid thereon.

"Trapping Season" means the period of each year commencing on the 15th day of April and ending on the 15th day of June next following.

"Opossum" means the Short Eared or Mountain Opossum (Trichosurus Canina) and the Common Opossum (T. Vulpecula) but does not include the Ring-tailed Opossum or any of the species of Flying Opossum or Phalanger.

"Licensed Trapper" means a person licensed to take or kill opossums.

"Licensed Trapper" means a person licensed to carry on the

"Licensed Dealer" means a person licensed to carry on the business of dealing in opossum skins.

business of dealing in opossum skins.

2. A licence to take or kill opossums may be issued to any person on payment of the prescribed fee, provided that the Minister is satisfied that the applicant for a licence is of good character, and has not been convicted within the previous year of any offence against the Game Acts.

3. The fee payable for a licence to take or kill opossums shall be Five (5) pounds.

4. The licence to take or kill opossums shall be in accordance with Form A in the Schedule hereto, and shall remain in force for the current trapping season in the year in which it is issued and no longer and shall not be transferable.

5. The possession of a licence shall not authorize the holder to take or kill opossums in any locality proclaimed as a Sanctuary under section 5 of the Game Act 1915 as amended by section 4 of the Game Act 1917.

6. A licensed trapper shall not be entitled by virtue of the possession of a licence to enter upon any private land without the consent of the owner or occupier thereof.

7. (1) Opossums may be taken or killed only in the following manner:—

ing manner:

(a) By means of a running noose or snare fixed in such manner that the head of the animal will pass through

the noose;

(b) by means of traps placed on the ground.

(2) All snares and traps used for the purpose of taking opossums shall be visited by the licensed trapper at least once

each day.

8. (1) No person shall take or kill or assist in the taking

8. (1) No person shall take or kill or assist in the taking

each day.

8. (1) No person shall take or kill or assist in the taking or killing of opossums without having first taken out a licence.

(2) Any person found hunting or taking or killing any opossum shall, if so required by the Chief Inspector, or any assistant to such Inspector, or any member of the Police Force, produce his licence, and if such person fails to produce his licence when so required, or when afforded reasonable opportunity for so doing, he shall be liable to the penalty prescribed herein for a breach of this Proclamation.

9. (1) A licence to deal in the skins of opossums may be issued to any person on payment of the prescribed fee, provided that the Minister is satisfied that the applicant for a licence is of good character and has not been convicted within the previous year of any offence against the Game Acts.

(2) A fee of £10 shall be paid for each such licence.

(3) A dealer's licence shall be in accordance with Form B in the Schedule hereto and shall remain in force for the period specified therein. Such licence shall entitle the holder to receive opossum skins from licensed trappers and to offer and sell same at public auction, provided that if no offer is received which, in the opinion of the auctioner is satisfactory, the skins may afterwards be sold privately.

(4) Any person carrying on the business of dealing in the skins of opossums shall, if so required by the Chief Inspector, or any assistant to such Inspector, or any member of the

Police Force, produce his licence, and if such person fails to produce his licence when so required, or when afforded reasonable opportunity for so doing, he shall be liable to the penalty prescribed herein for a breach of this Proclamation.

10. A licensed trapper shall not dispose of the skins of opossums to any person other than a licensed dealer.

11. All skins of opossums taken in accordance with this Proclamation by a licensed trapper shall be consigned or forwarded by him to a licensed dealer in opossum skins, together with particulars in accordance with Form C in the Schedule hereto; the trapper shall at the same time forward a duplicate of such particulars to the Chief Inspector.

of such particulars to the Chief Inspector.

12. (1) The licensed dealer on receiving a consignment of opossum skins and particulars as required in Form C shall cause such particulars to be entered in a book to be kept for the purpose. Such book shall be open at all reasonable times for inspection by the Chief Inspector or any assistant to the said Inspector or any member of the Police Force.

(2) Every licensed dealer shall on each Monday during the currency of his licence send a notification in accordance with Form D in the Schedule hereto to the Chief Inspector, giving particulars of all opossum skins received by him during the previous week, and shall at the same time pay to the Chief Inspector a royalty of One shilling for each opossum skin received by him.

received by him.

(3) The Chief Inspector upon receiving a notification in Form D from a licensed dealer shall arrange for the opossum skins referred to in such notification to be branded with an official mark; the affixing of the official mark shall be deemed proof that the royalty in respect of any opossum skin so

marked has been paid.

(4) No licensed dealer shall sell or dispose of any opossum skin in any way whatsoever until the royalty thereon has been paid and the official mark affixed.

13. Every licensed dealer in opossum skins shall record in the book referred to in paragraph 12 the date on which the royalty is paid, the name and address of the person to whom the skins are sold or disposed of, and the price at which such skins are sold.

14. No person other than the Chief Inspector or any officer authorized by him shall perforate or otherwise stamp or mark any opossum skin in such a way as to suggest that the official mark has been affixed thereto.

15. When the prescribed royalty on any opossum skin has been paid to the Chief Inspector, and the official mark affixed thereto, such skin may be sold or disposed of without restric-

16. Every licensed trapper shall within three days of the expiration of his licence forward to a licensed dealer in opossum skins all skins taken by him and not previously forwarded dealer in the skins taken by him and not previously forwarded dealers.

17. No person shall tan or preserve or prepare for tanning or preservation by any method whatsoever any opossum skin unless the official mark is affixed to such skin.

18. Any person committing a breach of any part of this Proclamation shall be liable for every such offence to a penulty of not more than £20, and any opossum skins in respect of which the offence has been committed shall be forfeited to the Grown.

19. (1) Any licence granted under this Proclamation may be revoked by the Minister if the holder thereof is convicted of any offence against the Game Acts or any Proclamation made thereunder, or if the Minister is satisfied that the said holder is not a fit and proper person to hold such a licence.

(2) Notice of the intention to revoke a licence shall be given to the licence holder by delivering it to him personally or by sending it by post in a prepaid registered letter addressed to him at his last known residence or place of business.

(3) On the expiry of three (3) days from the delivery of such notice or the sending of the registered letter as aforesaid, the licence referred to therein shall thereupon be revoked and all rights and privileges granted thereby shall cease and determine.

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of October, 1925, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the fourth day of November, 1925, the Governor in Council did. in pursuance of the provisions of the State Electricity Commission Acts, make Regulations for or with respect to prescribing the quality of materials, fittings, and apparatus to be used in connexion with electrical installations, and the methods to be followed in carrying out electrical installations:

And whereas by No. 74 of such Regulation it is provided, inter alia, that after a date to be proclaimed by the Governor in Council the further installation will not be permitted of anchor, bow, chamber, or other types of fuses which require the connecting of the fuse wire to terminals mounted on the base block; and that fuses of all sizes thereafter installed must be of the removable and safe-replacement type of an approved design:

And whereas by No. 78 of such Regulations it is provided, inter alia, that after a date to be announced by the Governor in Council, holders intended to be used with adaptors, with gas-filled lamps of 150 watts and upwards and with radiator lamps, will be required to be of such pattern and construction as can be approved as adequate and suitable for sustained service and protracted use.

- Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation declare the following date, viz., the first day of February, 1926, as the date upon which the above recited provisions of the said Regulations Nos. 74 and 78 shall come into force and have effect.
