**GLENROWAN WATERWORKS TRUST.**

*BY-LAW FOR 1926.*

**T**HE Commissioners of the Glenrowan Waterworks Trust, constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1926 which the occupiers or owners of lands, tenements, or vacant allotments within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect to every such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Fifteen pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be paid.
2. For every house or tenement of more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two shillings in the pound on municipal valuation shall be paid.
3. The rate to be paid in respect of each and every vacant or unoccupied allotment of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.
4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one half of the beforementioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a main, one quarter the beforementioned rate to be paid.
5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.
6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1926.
7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**STREET ELECTRIC LIGHT AND POWER WIRES  
PROTECTION REGULATIONS 1926.**

IT is recommended that the Governor in Council, pursuant to the power by the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915*, read in conjunction with section 9 of the *Electricity Commissioners Act 1918*, conferred to make Regulations upon the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria for the protection of overhead electric wires or their attachments from injury, contact, or interference, by the conveying or carrying of any building or structure along or across any street or public thoroughfare, make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Street Electric Light and Power Wires Protection Regulations 1926."

2. No person or persons shall convey or carry, or cause to be conveyed or carried, along or across any street or public thoroughfare, any buildings or structure or loan of such height or character as may be capable of coming into contact with, or may require the temporary elevation, adjustment, or removal of, any overhead electric wire or wires, or its or their attachment or attachments, owned or used by any body or person or persons under the provisions of the *Electric Light and Power Act* or some other lawful authority (hereinafter referred to as the "Electric Authority"), unless such first-mentioned person or persons shall have first given to the several Electric Authorities for the time being concerned 24 hours' notice of the intention to undertake such conveyance or carriage, and has paid to the Electric Authority by way of deposit the sum of One pound ten shillings by way of deposit for the due observance and fulfilment of the requirements of these Regulations.

3. Every notice under these Regulations shall be in writing, and shall set out the route intended to be followed, the date when the work is intended to be undertaken, and the hour on such date at which the subject of the notice will, in the course of transit along the route named, reach the immediate vicinity of each overhead electric wire or its attachment of the Electric Authority notified, with which (unless temporarily elevated, adjusted, or removed) the subject of the notice would be capable of coming into contact, and shall also give particulars of the building, structure, or load intended to be dealt with, and the nature of the vehicle or appliance to be used to effect the transportation thereof, with measurements disclosing what, when ready for transport, will be the greatest height from the ground, and the extreme width of the matter to be moved. The expression "matter to be moved" lastly hereinbefore used shall be for measurement purposes taken to include all projections constituting any part of, and the appliances used to convey, carry, or secure in position the main subject of the notice.

4. Upon the receipt by the Electric Authority of a notice hereunder, such Authority shall arrange for an employee or representative to be present during the progress of the work of getting the building, structure, or load past each overhead electric wire or its attachment of such Authority capable of being come in contact with, or that may require to be temporarily elevated, adjusted, or removed, and such employee or

representative shall take or cause to be taken all such precautions as may be or seem necessary to ensure the safety of the public and to avoid any injury to or interference with any such electric wire or its attachment.

5. In or incidental to the work of getting the building, structure, or load past each overhead electric wire or attachment aforesaid, the person or persons concerned shall comply with all reasonable requirements of the said Electric Authority or its employee or representative, so as to avoid injury to or interference with the wires of such Electric Authority.

6. For the attendance and services of their employee or representative, the Electric Authority shall be entitled to make a charge not exceeding Three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) for each hour or portion of an hour so occupied, and in addition shall be entitled to charge the actual amount of any other expenditure involved in the temporary removal and subsequent restoration of any of their overhead lines where necessary.

7. If at the time fixed in the notice duly given hereunder to an Electric Authority as that at which the building, structure, or load to be removed will be in the immediate vicinity of an Electric Authority's overhead electric wire or its attachment capable of being come in contact with by the same, the building, structure, or load be then on the spot, and no representative or employee of the Electric Authority be present at such time or within fifteen minutes thereafter, the person or persons concerned in the moving of the building, structure, or load, observing all proper care and precautions to prevent injury, damage, or danger, may proceed with the work of getting the building, structure, or load past the overhead electric wire or its attachment referred to, in the absence of any such representative or employee.

8. No person or persons shall convey, or cause to be conveyed, along or across any street or public thoroughfare any house, structure, or load unless the roof or upper portion thereof, if of metal, be efficiently protected by an insulating device which shall effectually prevent any contact with any electric line.

9. If any Electric Authority other than the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, or if any person or persons make default in complying with any of the preceding Regulations, he or they shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every such default.

The recovery of a penalty under these Regulations shall not affect the liability of the Electric Authority, person or persons, to make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

DIVISION 14 OF PART V. WITH REGARD TO COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING MADE APPLICABLE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS OF COUNCILLORS OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 148 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1915 (No. 2686) AS AMENDED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1918 (No. 2981).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of July, 1926.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the City of Richmond, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

*The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.*

## COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

*How Votes to be Marked by Voter.*

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

*Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.*

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

*Invalid Ballot-papers.*

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

*Ballot-papers Not Invalid.*

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

*Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.*

295. The returning officer (for the Ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

*Procedure where only Two Candidates.*

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Procedure where more than Two Candidates.*

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
  - (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
  - (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
  - (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
  - (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.
- (2) Each deputy returning officer shall—
- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.
- (3) The returning officer shall—
- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole Ward the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.
- (5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

*Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.*

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

*Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.*

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

*Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.*

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.



**Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.**

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—
- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
  - (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.*

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

**Deposit Moneys.**

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

**Voting by Post.**

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

**REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.**

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the City of Richmond of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

The ballot-paper so marked by or for the voter must be dropped by you into the ballot-box.

You must not take the ballot-paper out of the polling booth.

## ORDER APPROVING OF A DEVIATION FROM A MAIN ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF MORWELL.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to be desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Boolarra-Foster road in the Shire of Morwell (declared to be a main road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the Government Gazette of the 14th January, 1914, on page 92) should be made by the said Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring

the land and constructing the said deviation: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

All that piece of land in the Parish of Mirboo, and being a roadway generally two chains wide, the western boundary of which commences at a point on the eastern boundary of allotment 17a of the said parish, distant 1 deg. 1 min. 452 links and 331 deg. 57 min. 365.3 links from the south-eastern angle of the said allotment; thence south-westerly through that allotment, across a one-chain Government road, south-westerly and generally south-easterly through allotment 22, and south-easterly and south-westerly through allotment 22c to a point on the western boundary of that allotment; thence southerly along that boundary to the southern angle of the said allotment 22c.

NOTE.—The route of the portion of the roadway above described is more particularly delineated and shown coloured red on survey plan No. 1815, lodged in the office of the Country Roads Board.

## RESOLUTION FOR DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS.

The Country Roads Board incorporated under the Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance to be main roads, acting under the powers conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Country Roads Act 1915.

## SCHEDULE.

## Shire of Hampden.

6. Caramut-Lismore Road (7206).—Commencing at its junction with the Camperdown-Ballarat road at the north-eastern angle of allotment 4a, section 2, Parish of Tooliorook; thence westerly to and through the Township of Derrinalhun, south-westerly through the Parish of Geelong and westerly through the Parish of Darlington to the Township of Darlington; thence generally south-westerly through that township to and across the bridge over the Mount Emu Creek near the south-eastern angle of allotment 14, section 13, Parish of Darlington, on the western boundary of the shire.

## Shire of Warrnambool.

7. *Caramut-Lismore Road* (17907).—Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 2A, section 6, Parish of Hexham West, on the eastern boundary of the shire; thence north-westerly and westerly through the Parish of Caramut to the north-western angle of allotment 9, section 2, of that parish; thence generally north-westerly and northerly through the Township of Caramut to the south-eastern angle of allotment 7, section 1, Parish of Caramut, on the northern boundary of the shire.

## DECLARATION OF A DEVIATION FROM THE YARRAGON-LEONGATHA ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF NARRACAN.

WHEREAS by section 58 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635), as amended by section 16 of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Acts has by Resolution declared a deviation to be a developmental road the said Board may also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of any existing road or part thereof named in such Resolution and that on publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order confirming such Resolution the existing road or part thereof shall cease to be a developmental road or be discontinued as provided in the Resolution; And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such Resolution to be a developmental road and has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule to the said Resolution and that such part of the existing road shall be discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

## RESOLUTION FOR DECLARATION OF DEVIATION.

Whereas the land the site of the road the course of which is below set out was taken by the Board under the provisions of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* for the purpose of constructing such a road deviation which road deviation has now been laid out and formed on the same: And whereas the said Board (being the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1915*) thinks that the road aforesaid is fit to be used as a public highway such Board at a meeting now holden acting under the authority conferred upon it by section 58 of the said cited Act doth by this present Resolution hereby declare the said road deviation the course of which is described in the First Schedule hereto with the commencing and terminating points thereof respectively specified to be part of a developmental road within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*: And the said Board doth also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of the existing road or part thereof described in the Second Schedule hereto, and further that such part of the existing road shall be discontinued.

*Education Act 1915.*  
REGULATIONS ADDED.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of July, 1926.*

WHEREAS by the *Education Act 1915* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind Regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the following Regulations be added to the Regulations under the aforesaid Act, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXXIV. (A)—HIGHER ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS.

Additions to Regulation XXXIV. (A)—Higher Elementary Schools—(to be read as clauses 13 and 14 and numbered as sections 577 (A) and (B)).

*Establishment of Special Classes.*

577 (A), Clause 13.—The Minister may establish a special class in any Higher Elementary School in any subject approved by the Director under the following conditions:—

- (i) Before it is established, the Director's approval must be obtained for each class.
- (ii) The class shall not be held during the ordinary school hours except with the special permission of the Director.
- (iii) The minimum number of students for which a class may be established shall be seven.
- (iv) The class shall be held for one session of two hours' duration in each of ten weeks during each school term.
- (v) The fee per student shall be Fifteen shillings per term if at least twelve students enrol, or One pound per term if fewer than twelve, but not less than seven, students enrol.
- (vi) The fees prescribed must be paid in advance.
- (vii) The continuance of a class during a second or any subsequent school term shall be subject to the attendance of a minimum number of seven students and to satisfactory reports upon the progress of the students in attendance.

577 (B), Clause 14.—The Instructor shall be paid such gratuity as may be determined by the Public Service Commissioner.

REGULATION XXXV.—DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS.

ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS.

Additions to Regulation XXXV.—District High Schools—(to be read as clauses 29 and 30 and numbered as sections 618 (A) and (B)).

*Establishment of Special Classes.*

618 (A), Clause 29.—The Minister may establish a special class in any District High School in any subject approved by the Director under the following conditions:—

- (i) Before it is established, the Director's approval must be obtained for each class.
- (ii) The class shall not be held during the ordinary school hours except with the special permission of the Director.
- (iii) The minimum number of students for which a class may be established shall be seven.
- (iv) The class shall be held for one session of two hours' duration in each of ten weeks during each school term.
- (v) The fee per student shall be Fifteen shillings per term if at least twelve students enrol, or One pound per term if fewer than twelve, but not less than seven, students enrol.
- (vi) The fees prescribed must be paid in advance.
- (vii) The continuance of a class during a second or any subsequent school term shall be subject to the attendance of a minimum number of seven students and to satisfactory reports upon the progress of the students in attendance.

618 (B), Clause 30.—The Instructor shall be paid such gratuity as may be determined by the Public Service Commissioner.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF THE TILELAYERS BOARD AND OF THE BRICKLAYERS BOARD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order adjust the powers of the Tilelayers Board and of the Bricklayers Board by depriving the said Tilelayers Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed laying or fixing faience or majolica on floors, walls, or ceilings, and conferring such power exclusively on the Bricklayers Board.

REMISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF BEECHWORTH.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Beechworth, within the municipal district of the Shire of Beechworth, of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the fifth day of February, 1924, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Beechworth, within the municipal district of the Shire of Beechworth, shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

REMISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF BEECHWORTH.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all

the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Township of Beechworth, within the municipal district of the Shire of Beechworth, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the fifth day of February, 1924, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within the Township of Beechworth, within the municipal district of the Shire of Beechworth, shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF LILLIMUR NORTH.

WE, George Lannin, Allan Stevenson, Henry Nicholls, Henry Hercules Davis, and John William King, all of Lillimur, the duly appointed Committee of Management of a Reserve for Public Recreation in the Town of Lillimur North, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

## TOWN OF SALE.

## REGULATION No. 6.

A Regulation of the Town of Sale, and numbered 6, made under Division (1) of Part X. of the 13th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the Town by virtue of a By-law of the above-named Town, and numbered 26, for regulating the control of hackney carriages.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Sale make the following regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Town of Sale:—

*Interpretation.*

The words "the Council" shall be understood to mean the Council of the Town of Sale, the words "Town Clerk" shall be understood to mean the town clerk of the Town of Sale, the word "Inspector" shall mean any person who by appointment of the Council of the Town of Sale shall be an Inspector of Hackney Carriages, the words "Hackney Carriages" and "Licensed Carriage" shall mean and include every wheeled carriage, whatever may be its form or construction, used in standing or plying for hire for a passenger within the prescribed space for the Municipality.

*Standings for Hackney Carriages.*

The following places shall be and are hereby appointed Standings for Licensed Hackney Carriages:—

Macalister-street, south side, between Raymond and Desailly streets; Cuminghame-street, north side, between Raymond and Desailly streets.

*Licence Fees.*

For the licence of every hackney carriage, and for the renewal thereof, there shall be paid the following fees, viz.:—  
For every horse-drawn vehicle, Twenty shillings; for every motor vehicle, Thirty shillings.

*Licensed Number to be Exhibited.*

Every licensed hackney carriage shall display the name of the municipality and its licensed number in letters and figures one and a half inches high in a prominent position on the back of every hackney carriage.

*Carriage Must be Licensed.*

No carriage shall ply for hire as a hackney carriage within the Town of Sale until and unless the same be duly licensed by the Council of the said town.

*Proper Carriage.*

No licence shall be granted in respect of any carriage which, in the opinion of the Council, shall be unsafe or in bad repair, or otherwise unfit for the accommodation and conveyance of passengers.

*Form and Duration of Licences.**Substitution of Carriage.*

Licences for hackney carriages shall be in the form contained in the Schedule hereto annexed (marked A) or to the like effect, and shall be in force from the date of each such licence until the thirty-first day of December next ensuing and no longer, and no such licence shall include more than one carriage; provided that when the licensed carriage shall be under repair, or for any other reason if the owner shall so desire, he may be permitted to substitute another carriage for a period to be specified by endorsement on the licence, and signed by the town clerk, but not unless the inspector shall previously have examined such other carriage and certified to its being in good repair and suitable for the purpose.

*Duration of Licence.*

The licence of every such owner, at whatever period of the year the same may be granted, shall remain in force only until the thirty-first day of December thereafter.

*Renewal of Licence.*

The holder of any such licence desiring to renew the same for the succeeding year must signify such desire in writing at the town clerk's office, on or before the tenth day of December; and submit his carriage, horses and harness for inspection by the inspector at such time and place as may be directed.

*Owner Must Keep His Licence.*

No owner shall be at liberty to part with or lend his licence and any owner who shall sell his licensed carriage shall report in writing the name and address of the purchaser to the town clerk.

*Owner Must Give Notice of Change of Residence.*

When any person named as the owner or one of the owners of a licensed hackney carriage shall change his place of abode, he shall, within one week next after any such change, give notice thereof in writing, signed by him, to the town clerk, specifying his new place of abode, and shall at the same time produce his licence to the town clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

*Licence Revocable.*

The licence of any owner, or that of any carriage, shall be subject to suspension for any period not exceeding fourteen days and to longer suspension, revocation, or cancellation by the Town Council of Sale, for any infringement of the provisions of this regulation, after notice given to such owner, to show cause why the same should not be suspended, revoked, or cancelled, and opportunity thereupon given to him to show such cause.

*Application for Licence.*

Before any licence is granted by the Council of the municipality, an application for the same in the form, prescribed in Schedule B hereunder, shall be made and signed by the owner or one of the owners of the carriage in respect of which such licence is applied for, and in every such application shall be truly stated the christian name and surname and place of abode of the person applying for such licence, and of every owner of such carriage, and any person who states in such application the name of any person who is not an owner of the carriage in respect of which he applies or wilfully omits to specify truly in such application the name of any owner of such carriage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

*Inspection of Carriage.*

The Council upon receipt of an application for a licence, shall cause an inspection to be made of the carriage to which the same relates, and shall not grant the licence unless such carriage be found to be in a fit and proper condition for public use.

*Occasional Inspection of Carriages.*

The Council of the municipality may as often as they may deem it necessary cause an inspection to be made of all hackney carriages licensed by them, and if any such carriage or the harness of the horses used in drawing the same at any time be in a condition unfit for public use, the Council shall give notice to that effect to the owner thereof, which notice shall be personally served on such owner or delivered at his usual place of residence, and if after notice as aforesaid any owner use or let to hire such carriage as a hackney carriage or use or let to hire such harness or horses whilst respectively in a condition unfit for public use, the Council may suspend for such time as may seem proper the licence of such carriage, and every owner plying for hire with any such carriage which is at the time unfit for public use shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

*Plying Without Licence.*

If any owner of any carriage permits the same to be used as a hackney carriage plying within the prescribed space for the municipality without having a licence in force in respect of such carriage from the Council, or without having the name and number aforesaid painted or marked on such carriage as aforesaid, or if any person be found driving, standing, or plying for hire within such prescribed space with any hackney carriage for which no such licence is in force, or without having the name of the municipality and the number of such carriage as aforesaid openly displayed on such carriage, every such person so offending shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

*Inspector.*

Such person or persons as may from time to time be in that behalf appointed by the Council shall, during the Council's pleasure, be the Inspector or Inspectors of all hackney carriages plying for hire within the Town of Sale, and such Inspector or Inspectors shall from time to time examine all such carriages, and shall at all times see that, as far as possible, the By-law of the Council relating to hackney carriages shall be duly observed. And no owner, driver, or conductor of any such carriage, or any person using such carriage, shall obstruct any such Inspector in the execution of his said duties, or refuse or fail to comply with any lawful order or direction given by him in conformity with the provisions of the said By-law.

The resolution for passing this Regulation was agreed to by the Council of the Town of Sale on the 8th day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and was confirmed by such Council on the 6th day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.
