REGULATIONS.*

U NDER the powers conferred by section 6 of the Street Trading Act 1925 (16 Geo. V. No. 3421), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

INTERPRETATION.

In these Regulations-

- "Street trading" means any of the acts hereinafter set forth if done in a public place by any male person under the age of 14 years, or any female person under the age of 21 years:—
 - (a) The selling, offering, or exposing for sale of-
 - (i) any newspaper, card, book, ticket, programme, or other printed matter, or any picture; or
 - (ii) any matches or flowers;
 - (b) Playing, singing, or performing for profit, or boot or shoe cleaning;

but does not include-

- (a) the occasional selling of any of the articles aforesaid, or the occasional playing, singing, or performing as aforesaid, if the net proceeds thereof are to be or are wholly applied for any charitable or public purpose, or for the benefit of any school or church; or
- (b) anything done by any person-
 - (i) in the discharge of his duty as: an employee of the Council of a municipality;
 - (ii) under the authority of any Act of Parliament (other than this Act) or of any licence, registration, permit, or authority granted or issued under any such Act.

Board.

- 1. It shall be the duty of the Board to examine the testimony as to the age of each applicant for a street trader's licence, and to satisfy itself that his moral and material welfare will not suffer by street trading, and that his attendance at school will not be thereby injuriously affected.
- 2. No members of the Board shall be absent from three consecutive meetings without reasonable excuse or leave of absence.
- 3. No person shall obstruct, hinder, impede, resist, or oppose any member of the Board, or any officer or persons appointed, employed, or authorized by or under these Regulations in the performance of anything which such member, officer, or person is empowered or required to do.

LICENCES.

- 4. No male person of or over the age of 12 years and under the age of 14 years who is not a licensed street trader, nor any male person under the age of 12 years, nor any female under 21 years, shall engage in street trading.
- 5. Every application for a licence to engage in street trading shall be made to the secretary of the Board on Form "A" of the schedule hereto, and no licence shall be issued without the approval of the Board.
- 6. Every licence issued shall be in the form of the schedule (Form "B"), and shall be accompanied by a folder (Form "C"), and, subject to Regulation 13 hereafter, shall have force and effect for one year only from the date of issue.
- 7. The folder must be carried by the street trader while engaged in street trading, and must be produced by him whenever required by any member of the Board, or any officer or other person duly authorized in writing by the Board.
- 8. The hours during which street trading may be carried on shall be from 6 a.m. to 8.15 a.m. and from 4 p.m. to 7.30 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday; from 6 a.m. to 8.15 a.m. and from 4 p.m. to 9 p.m. on Friday, except when such days are school holidays; street trading shall cease on school holidays and Saturdays at 9 p.m. Street traders liable to attend school shall not trade during school hours:

- 9. The licence and the folder shall be signed in the presence of the secretary of the Board by the street trader in whose name they are issued, and shall not be transferable. The secretary of the Board shall also sign them.
- 10. Any licensed street trader trading without having his folder with him or trading during prohibited hours, or engaging in any street trading of a description not authorized by his licence, may be deprived of his licence or fined for a breach of the Regulations, or both.
- 11. A register containing the name, address, and date of birth of every licensed street trader, and the purpose and date of expiry of his licence, shall be kept by the secretary of the Board, and any change in the street trader's address or employment shall be at once notified to the secretary in writing.
- 12. Personal application may, at the discretion of the secretary of the Board, be sufficient for the renewal of a licence, provided that the expired licence and folder are surrendered when such application is made.
- 13. The Board may at any time cancel or suspend a street trader's licence, if it considers it desirable so to do. Upon cancellation or suspension of any licence, the licensee shall thereupon surrender the licence and folder to the secretary.

STREET TRADERS, AND EMPLOYERS.

- 14. No person, whether licensed under this Act or not, shall employ in street trading any male person of or over the age of 12 years and under the age of 14 years who is not licensed, or any male person under the age of 12 years, or any female person under the age of 21 years.
- 15. Every person employing in street trading a street trader under the age of 14 years shall keep a record in writing, in a permanent form, showing the name, address, and number of licence of such trader, and shall produce such record for inspection whenever required by any person authorized in writing in that behalf, whether generally or in any particular case, by the Chief Secretary or Minister of Public Instruction.
- 16. A licence issued under these Regulations may be suspended or cancelled by the Board if the holder of such licence—
 - (a) trade without being clean and decently clothed;
 - (b) enter for the purpose of street trading any premises licensed for the sale of intoxicating liquor;
 - (c) enter or ride upon a moving train, train, or bus for the purpose of street trading;
 - (d) beg or solicit gifts or presents from the public while engaged in street trading;
 - (e) fail to remove from the street any waste paper, or any débris or litter which results from the operation of his street trading;
 - (f) make any unnecessary noise in the calling of his wares in a public place, or obstruct any street or thoroughfare to the inconvenience of the public using the same.
 - (g) absent himself from school without reasonable excuse;
 - (h) refuse to comply with the direction of any officer duly appointed to supervise street trading under this Act;
 - (i) be convicted of an offence, or be proved to the satisfaction of the Board to have been guilty, of dishonesty in street trading, or of unseemly behaviour, or of the use of bad language whilst engaged in street trading.

PENALTIES.

17. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done, by these Regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Two pounds for the first offence, and not more than Five pounds for a second or subsequent offence.

The whole of the above route is prescribed for the period ending the 31st December, 1926, and will be reviewed at the end of the period specified.

Stopping Places on Route.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

II IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of the Education Act 1915. doth hereby rescind clauses 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 (b) and (c), 23, 24, 25, and 26 of Regulation XXI.—Scholarships, under the aforesaid Act, and in lieu thereof make the following clauses to take effect as from the 1st day of January, 1927, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXI.-SENIOR SCHOLARSHIPS.

7. There shall be awarded annually forty-four senior scholarships, or any less number, of which-

(a) Twenty shall be open only to candidates who are holders of Junior Scholarships under clause 1 above or who were holders of such scholarships for at least two

(b) Twenty shall be open both to candidates who are holders of Junior Scholarships under clause I above or who were holders of such scholarships for at least two years, and to candidates in attendance at district high schools or registered schools; and

schools or registered schools; and

(c) Four shall be open to candidates who have been in regular attendance for at least three years at a senior technical school in Victoria and who have completed an approved course of study in some branch of engineering or science or architecture and who are qualified for admission to courses for degrees in engineering or in science or for the Diploma of Architecture at the University of Melbourne. Not more than one of these four scholarships shall be awarded in any one year to candidates for a course in science or in architecture.

Provided that, notwithstanding anything contained in this regulation, the holder of the "Simon Fraser the Younger" scholarship shall be awarded, if he has not previously been awarded, one of the Senior Scholarships under sub-clause (c) of this clause.

- 18. (a) Applications for Scholarships under clause 7 above shall be made on a prescribed form before the first day of December in each year.
- (b) Candidates for Senior Scholarships under clause 7 above unist be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter at the University of Melbourne.
- (c) No Senior Scholarship under clause 7 (a) or (b) above shall be awarded to any candidate whose age, as attested by a certificate of birth, will exceed eighteen years and six months on the first day of January in the year in which the scholarship is to be awarded.
- 9. (a) The Senior Scholarships under clause 7 above shall be awarded on the recommendation of a Board, consisting of the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, and a representative of the teaching staff of the University of Melbourne, appointed for the purpose by the Director.
- (b) The recommendation of the Board mentioned in sub-clause (a) of this clause shall be based on the age and suit-ability of the candidates and on their school records as de-termined by the following:—
 - (i) For each subject (up to nine) passed at the School
 Intermediate Examination—1 point.
 (ii) For each subject passed at the School Leaving
 Examination—2 points.
 (iii) For each subject in which honours are obtained at
 the School Leaving Examination—

3rd Class Honours 2nd Class Honours 1st Class Honours ... 3 points; ... 4 points; ... 6 points;

one point extra being allotted in each case where the exhibition in the subject is gained.

Provided that points shall be allotted for other examinations passed on a basis of equivalence to be determined by the Board, and provided also that the Board shall take into consideration the circumstances of the parents of the candidates and any difficulties which the candidates have had to overcome by reason of their family circumstances or of their school environment, and shall give such weight to such consideration as, it thinks fit.

- 10. The Senior Scholarships under clause 7 above shall be of the value of £40 per annum, and shall be tenable for such period, not exceeding six years, as will enable the holder to complete an approved course at the University of Melbourne under the following conditions, namely:—
 - (a) That the holder shall, at the commencement of the term immediately following the award of the scholarship, enter as a student at the University of Melbourne, and that he shall, during the currency of his scholarship, attend lectures regularly in as many subjects as he must pass in to complete the year of the course he is pursuing; and
 - (b) That the continuance of the scholarship shall be subject to the consideration of an annual report from the Professional Board of the University of Melbourne.
- 11. (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in the above clauses, Senior Scholarships may, in special cases determined by the Director and approved by the Minister; be made tenable at a University other than the University of Melbourne.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF GOYURA (HOPETOUN).

Thomas Hatcher, Henry William Talbot, William Arthur Hallam, and Albert Snell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land reserved as a site for a Race-course and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Goyura (Hopetoun), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1...The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements; on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, sents, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of uny kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Prowriting, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve. and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1915.

- 7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
- 12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
- or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

 13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any demand or injury sustained by such stand, buildings. and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, buildings, crection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
- 14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be en-closed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915,—for each-offence-be-liable to a penalty-of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person—who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he

has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
