HENLEY ON THE MARIBYRNONG.

Notice to Boatmen, &amp;c.

No. 1 of 1927.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 6th February, 1927, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day shall observe the following regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed nor public safety or order endangered.

## THE BALLARAT SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

RATING BY-LAW No. 6.

*The Ballarat Sewerage District.*

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rates are hereby made under the provisions of the Sewerage Districts Acts, and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable properties within the Ballarat Sewerage District.

(1) Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District a Special Rate of Fourpence in the pound on the net annual value of all rateable properties within the said District.

(2) Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District a Sewerage Rate of One shilling and twopence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable "sewered property" within the said District.

(3) Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1927, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1927, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of March, 1927, at the office of the Authority, situate Water Supply Office, Ballarat.

(4) If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid Special Rate becomes, during the year 1927, a "sewered property," there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the Sewerage Rate for the portion of the year after it has become a "sewered property," and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.

(5) For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

(6) Such person or persons as The Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by The Ballarat Sewerage Authority on the Twenty-ninth day of November, 1926, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the Sixteenth day of December, 1926.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 1797.—CHILLINGOLLAH URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE TYNTRYNDER WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Chillingollah Urban District within the Tyntynder Waterworks District:—

1. 7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter, or meter of smaller size, Ten shillings;  
For any meter of larger size than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter

All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or fitting thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Twenty-four pence per 1,000 gallons.

17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be as follows:—

- (1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Twenty-four pence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding section, would give a sum of Twenty shillings for any continuous period of three months.

18. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter, or meter of smaller size, Ten shillings;  
For any meter of larger size than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12½ per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter

shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

10. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

11. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Commission, Ouyen, and a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

12. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.

14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or fitting thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Twenty-four pence per 1,000 gallons.

17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be as follows:—

(1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Twenty-four pence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding section, would give a sum of Twenty shillings for any continuous period of three months.

18. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 1801—WAITCHIE URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE  
TYNTYNDER WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Waitchie Urban District within the Tyntynder Waterworks District:—

All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper officer.

3. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

4. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commission, without the permission, in writing, of the Commission or its proper officer being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Commission, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leader or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter, or meter, of smaller size, Ten shillings;  
For any meter of larger size than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12½ per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except, as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be the quantity which, if charged for at Twelvepence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying a general rate if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure; and for all quantities in excess of such minimum quantity the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

18. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

## BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1927.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year 1927:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such land-holders or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements if not on such street are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1927, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1927, such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of £25 annual municipal valuation or under, Twenty-five shillings per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the municipal valuation of £25, at the rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.
- (c) On all vacant allotments of land, at the rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal value thereof with a minimum of Five shillings except where there is a water service to the allotment, when the minimum charge will be Twenty-five shillings.
- (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per hundred gallons, or Sixpence for every fractional part thereof, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
- (e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under the terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per One thousand gallons.
- (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, and butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other domestic purposes may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (g) Water supplied to government departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, bowling greens, shall be charged by agreement or measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (h) Private water troughs shall be charged for at the rate of Twenty-five shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed Twenty-five pounds; such trough charge of twenty-five shillings shall mean to include the rate of valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £25, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when in the opinion of the Trust a meter shall be necessary.
- (i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of 1s. per thousand gallons, by measurement, at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.
- (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of 1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete and plastering work, or any work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.
- (k) The service for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust to the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—
  1. For domestic premises with annual municipal value of £40 or over, a three-quarter inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust. For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal valuation, half-inch diameter.
  2. For the supply other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall order in each case.
- (l) Each house or tenement must be provided with separate rate service from the main.
- (m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or any other irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, in addition to the usual rate of a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for domestic supply may be allowed for at the discretion of the Trust.

2. The rate and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using supply of water.

3. The said rate and charges for water supplied otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, on the first day of January, 1927.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when owner or occupier shall become liable to pay rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust on the 17th day of December, 1926, and the corporate seal of the Trust was affixed in the presence of—

## BENALLA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1927.

THE Commissioners of the Benalla Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law for the making of the rate on all rateable properties within the Waterworks District of the Benalla Waterworks Trust.

A rate of One shilling (1s.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Benalla Waterworks District according to the valuation for the time being for all lands and tenements for the Municipal Rate for the Shire of Benalla, is hereby made for 1927, payable on the 1st day of January, 1927.

The minimum rate payable in respect of any property liable to be rated shall be One pound sterling for lands or tenements supplied with water from the pipes of the Trust, and Ten shillings for every piece of vacant or unoccupied land not so supplied, as fixed by the Governor in Council.

Water supplied to cricket, bowling, tennis, croquet, or other clubs operating in the Benalla Recreation Reserve, which is under the control of the Benalla Shire Council, to be charged at the rate of Threepence (3d.) per 1,000 gallons. The supply to be by meter.

Privately owned tennis courts to be charged the ordinary rate of Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons by measurement.

Water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by measurement, and charged at the rate of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

For a supply of water during the erection of new buildings there shall be a charge of Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons by measurement.

Except as otherwise provided hereinbefore the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

The fee to be paid for a plumber's license shall be One pound per annum, dating from the 1st day of January.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Water Acts, and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1927 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Four shillings and six pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be Two pounds five shillings.
- (b) Occupied or unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be eight shillings.
- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) For steam-boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power for each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made before a supply can be taken or used.
- (f) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or make a special rate.
- (g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land supplied, otherwise than by measure.
- (h) The rate hereby made shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1927.
- (i) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

## DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1927, No. 33.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law, viz.:—

The By-law for determining the rates which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the said Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Twenty pounds (£20).
2. A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Twenty pounds (£20).
3. On each unoccupied or vacant allotment or piece of land a rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound on the net annual value of such rateable property, provided that no such allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).
4. Water to be supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for watering gardens, or for distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per

1,000 gallons up to the amount of the water rate assessment of such land or premises for the time being, provided that the said assessment shall be the minimum charge for the year 1927, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such amount aforesaid.

5. For all lands and tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets on which the pipes of the water supply are laid, and which lands and tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, half of the above-mentioned rates: and where such lands and tenements are over a quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of a mile and within half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) a mile thereof, a quarter of the above-mentioned rates. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Donald for the time being.

Such rates are hereby made for the year 1927, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1927, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1927, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 1st day of January, 1927.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive and recover the said rates.

## HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.

A By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1927 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of McIvor, but no rate in any case shall be less than Two pounds.
2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.
3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.
4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding one-half a mile shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.
5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.
6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate in respect to the premises supplied.
7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the 1st day of January, 1927, and the 1st day of July, 1927.
8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

## BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1927.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz.:-

Clause 1.—The rates and charges herein specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1927. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable in advance on the 1st day of January, 1927, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by two half-yearly instalments, payable on the first day of January, and July, of the said year, without prejudice to its rights to recover the whole year's rate, that is to say:—

Clause 2.—On every house or tenement used wholly or partially as a domicile, a sum of Two shillings and one penny in the £1 on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty-five shillings.

Clause 3.—On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty-five shillings.

Clause 4.—On every saw-mill, cordial, or aerated water factory, motor garage, butter factory, or other business using water in connexion with its machinery or treatment a sum of £7 10s. or at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons for the first 500,000 gallons and 9d. (ninepence) per thousand gallons for every thousand gallons over 500,000; whichever is the greater. The supply shall in every case be by or through a meter fixed in the manner as provided in clause 12.

Clause 5.—On every steam-engine (not including any steam engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4) a sum of One pound.

Clause 6.—On every horse-trough a sum of Ten shillings.

Clause 7.—Only one service pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement rated herein, irrespective as to the area of land attached to such house or tenement, and such service pipe shall not exceed three-quarters of an inch in diameter except as provided for in clause 12.

Clause 8.—For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings and or additions and or alterations to existing buildings a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for concrete, stonework, brickwork, or plastering shall be made; or if there be no contract, then upon the value or amount charged or paid for such concrete, stonework, brickwork, or plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention so to do. The minimum charge under this clause shall be Five shillings.

Clause 9.—On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Fifteen shillings, and that no service pipe be connected to the Trust's mains unless a standard fitting, known as a "Tested lead connexion" be fitted, and in the case of renewal or repairs to old service connexion to the Trust mains a "Tested lead connexion", must be fitted.

Clause 9A.—A ferrule cock shall be fitted to all mains at the service connexion, and a stop cock affixed not more than 3 feet inside the boundary fence.

Clause 10.—On every rood or part of a rood of land, rated separately from any tenement and facing a street in which a water main is laid contiguous thereto, the sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Ten shillings. If the water be laid on such land described in this clause, the minimum charge shall be Thirty-five shillings.

Clause 11.—Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service pipe with water by the Trust, who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust's secretary, the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current half-yearly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full six months, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service pipe.

Clause 12.—Water supplied to nurseries, and market and other gardens, and to all lucerne, sorghum, and other fodder crops whatsoever shall be in every case by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer

after having been approved by the Trust. Such meter shall in every case be fixed as near to the tenement boundary as possible, and in a position to be approved by the Trust, and no supply pipe shall be affixed between such meter and the Trust's mains. The service pipe for the supply of such water shall not exceed 1 inch in diameter.

Clause 13.—No person shall irrigate from the Trust water mains any nurseries or other gardens whatsoever, nor shall any person use any water from the said mains for watering such gardens by means of a hose or conduit affixed to the service pipe unless a meter is affixed to the service as provided in clause 12 hereof.

Clause 14.—The charge for water supplied to the Bowling Club, situated in Annesley-street, and the Grass Tennis Courts situated in Victoria Park, shall be 7d. (sevenpence) per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge in each case of Ten pounds, such supply shall be by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer after it has been approved by the Trust.

Clause 15.—The Trust may require a meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any house or tenement in any case where it deems the same necessary, and in every such case the consumer shall install such meter within fourteen days of receiving a notice, in writing, from the Trust to do so. In such case, the provisions of clause 12 shall apply to such house or tenement.

Clause 16.—For water supplied by the Trust for domestic, or other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or where otherwise especially provided for in these By-laws) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of lands and tenements within the Trust district shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied by the Trust by measure in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

Clause 17.—The Trust shall not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of the clauses 12, 13, or 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

Clause 18.—The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each 100 gallons.

Clause 19.—In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, or other By-laws complied with, the water may be cut off until such payments are made or such By-laws complied with.

Clause 20.—If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until repaired or re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous half-year, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

Clause 21.—Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the above-mentioned rates and charges.

Clause 22.—Any person committing or suffering a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Clause 23.—In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1927. The word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust; and the word "tenement" as used herein shall be deemed to include the whole of the land held or used by or on behalf of one person, as one contiguous property, whether divided into two or more parts by fences or not.

(ii) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid, the rate to be paid shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings each be payable, except where the municipal valuation is less than Three pounds each, in which case the said rate shall not be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

(iii) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in the streets or roads in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

The rates herein made are for the year ending 31st December, 1927, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 31st March, 1927.

Such person as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates.

4. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust, a sum of Twenty shillings per annum shall be charged unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of One shilling shall be charged, and for each load in excess of 200 gallons *pro rata* on the above scale.

The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of April, 1927, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

5. The said rate and charges shall be payable in two equal portions, the first on the first day of January and the second on the first day of July, 1927.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint shall be authorized to receive and demand the rate.

**A** RATE of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate for the Shire of Traralgon, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound five shillings (£1 5s.).

For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed Five pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over Five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

When the water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charges shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during the year ending 31st of December shall be 10,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand of the Trust.

The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

When water is supplied for use on any land exceeding 5 acres in area, such water will be supplied by measure only, and the owner or occupier of such land must provide a meter.

For the supply of water during the erection of a new building or alterations to or additions to existing buildings the charge shall be, for a stone or brick building, Five shillings per centum on the cost of the stone or brick building, including plastering, or the same shall be fixed by agreement with the Trust. For the supply of water for the erection of a wooden building with plastered walls, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence for each room or passage and Five shillings for each chimney. For a supply of water for wooden buildings where no plaster is used, the charge shall be Five shillings for each chimney in such building. All payments shall be made in advance. No person shall take or use any water for or in connexion with the erection of any new buildings or alterations to or additions to existing buildings till he has obtained the receipt of the Trust's officer for payment of the amount payable for the use of such water, or the consent, in writing, of the Trust or its officer. Any person offending against the provisions thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such offence. All charges shall be additional to all rates or other charges payable by the owner or occupier of the premises upon which the building is being erected, and shall in the first instance be payable by the builder or contractor, and if unpaid by the builder or contractor shall be charged to and paid by the owner of the premises whereon such building is being erected, but such charge to the owner shall not prejudice the right of the Trust to proceed at its option against either the builder or the contractor or the owner or occupier for the amount payable.

In all cases not herein provided for the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

The service-pipes from the mains, being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the owner or occupier shall, in every instance in which damage caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be guilty of an offence.

If any person neglect to repair such service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from the proper officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water flowing into the premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected.

The Trust may at any time, when found necessary, repair or renew any pipes and stop-cocks laid for conveying a supply of water to any tenement, and may charge the owner thereof with the cost of providing and laying, repairing, or renewing the same, and such cost shall be a debt due by such owner to the Trust, and shall be recoverable in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of March, 1927.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

#### TOORA WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1927.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Toora Waterworks Trust do hereby, under the provisions of the Water Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Toora Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, and with the minimum charges and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust:—

1. For every township residence, house, shop, garage, office, hotel, saloon, or coffee palace with an annual municipal valuation of not less than Eighteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in every pound of such valuation.

2. For every vacant township holding with an annual municipal valuation exceeding Five pounds the rate shall be Two shillings and threepence in every pound of such valuation.

3. For every farm property with an annual municipal value of Eighteen pounds and over, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in every pound of such valuation.

4. For every dwelling, office, shop, or building with an annual municipal value of less than Eighteen pounds, the rate shall be Two pounds per annum.

5. For every vacant township holding with an annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the rate shall be Eleven shillings and threepence per annum.

6. The charge for water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons; provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

7. In the event of any dispute which may arise regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special charge.

8. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

9. The rates and charges herein mentioned shall be payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of March, 1927, except in cases of water supplied by measure, the charges for which shall be payable on demand in each year.

10. The Trust may, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for domestic or other purposes that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within twenty-one days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified and at his own expense, provide and affix an approved meter, failing which the property shall be disconnected until such meter is installed.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

## WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1927.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

## BY-LAW No. 18.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) For every house, building, or tenement a rate of One shilling and threepence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being of such house, building, or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound five shillings and sixpence per annum, and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer owning or occupying one house, building, or tenement only shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation, and computed at 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.
- (b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.
- (c) And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings, or tenements within the waterworks district to each of which water meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of the said houses, buildings, or tenements (and in all cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure), shall for that part or whole of the year, as the case may be, during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings, or tenements, but for no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of the total sum of the municipal valuations, and computed at 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, of all the said houses, buildings, or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantity be exceeded the excess shall be paid for by measure at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) For water supplied by measure a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid. Provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 17,000 gallons per annum, and that the minimum charge for Government premises supplied with water shall be Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by measure to all consumers outside the water area and Urban District a rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum charge shall be Three pounds per annum for each service.

2. The rates and charges herein are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1927, and shall be due and payable in one sum on the 1st day of February, 1927.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time are hereby authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover such rates and charges.

## WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1927.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—

- (1) For every house and tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the shire assessment; minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Thirty shillings.

(2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Thirty shillings per boiler per annum.

(3) For each vacant allotment abutting on a water main, Five shillings.

(4) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in case of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

(5) Any person who shall obtain water, or shall be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Thirty shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be—

(a) If for domestic or other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per annum.

3. Such rate is made for the year 1927 commencing the first day of January, 1927, as also the charges for every steam boiler, and for water supplied from the public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on the first day of January, 1927.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid on the first day of January, 1927.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RESTRICT THE USE OF MESH OR SET NETS IN WESTERN PORT BAY.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency, the Governor in Council, to make a Proclamation restricting the use of mesh or set nets in the waters of Western Port Bay as follows:—

1. The maximum length of mesh or set net to be used at any one time by any person shall not exceed six hundred (600) fathoms, provided that where two licensed fishermen are working together as a crew in any fishing boat, the maximum length of mesh net, which they may together use, shall not exceed 900 fathoms.

## REGULATION No. 5.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Railways Classification Board Act 1919, make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

## INTERPRETATION.

## 1. In these Regulations—

“Act” shall mean the Railways Classification Board Act 1919.

“Board” shall mean the Railways Classification Board.

“Officer” or “employee” shall mean officer or employee as defined in the Act.

## ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS.

2. The Minister of Railways shall be returning officer for the purpose of any election under the Act, and he may, in writing under his hand, appoint a substitute to act for him.

3. (a) Within fourteen days of the passing of the Act, the returning officer shall invite nominations for any member or members of the Board, who in accordance with the provisions of the Act are to be elected, and shall appoint a day, not later than a further fourteen days, for the reception of such nominations.

(b) Within fourteen days of any vacancy occurring for a member of the Board, the returning officer shall invite nominations for such vacancy, and shall appoint a day, not later than a further fourteen days, for the reception of such nominations.

4. Every nomination shall be made in writing, and shall be signed by at least 25 officers or employees eligible to vote.

Every nomination shall be endorsed with the written consent of the candidate to his nomination, and shall be delivered or forwarded to the returning officer so as to reach him before noon on the day appointed for the receipt of nominations.

5. If the number of nominations do not exceed the number of members to be elected, the returning officer shall report accordingly to the Governor in Council.

6. If the number of nominations exceed the number of members to be elected, the returning officer shall cause the names of the candidates to be published in the next issue of the *Government Gazette*, and of the weekly notice issued by the Victorian Railways Commissioners, and shall appoint an hour and day, which shall not be later than ten days from the date appointed for the receipt of the nominations, by which all voting papers referred to hereinafter shall be returned to him.

7. For the purposes of the election of members the Victorian Railways Commissioners shall, on request, furnish the returning officer with a roll (hereinafter referred to as the roll of electors) containing the name, grade, and official address of every officer and employee eligible to vote.

8. Immediately after the nominations have closed, the returning officer shall cause a voting paper, showing the number of members who are to be elected, and, in alphabetical order, the name of each of the persons nominated for election, to be forwarded to every officer and employee whose name is included on the roll of electors.

9. Each elector shall strike out on the voting paper forwarded to him all the names except those of the person or persons for whom he desires to vote, and shall deliver or forward such voting paper to the returning officer. No vote shall be valid if more or fewer names are left uncanceled on the voting paper than the number of persons to be elected, or if received by the returning officer after the day and hour fixed in accordance with clause 6 of these Regulations.

10. The returning officer shall, as soon as practicable after the hour fixed for receiving the voting papers, count the votes received, and report to the Governor in Council the name of the person or persons elected.

11. In the event of two or more candidates receiving an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall have a casting vote.

12. In all matters not herein provided for, the rules and usages at parliamentary elections shall be followed so far as they may be applicable in the election of members of the Board.

13. Regulations made the twenty-first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of October in that year, are repealed.

14. This Regulation shall be deemed to have become effective as from the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND  
MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK  
AND RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF JIKA JIKA,  
KNOWN AS THE "YARRA BEND NATIONAL PARK."**

**W**E, Thomas Tunnecliffe, John Cain, William Thorn, Albert Emanuel Corben, Thomas Joseph Kane, Thomas Anthony McAllen, John Coate, and George Frederick Pitcher, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Park and Recreation in the Parish of Jika Jika, known as the "Yarra Bend National Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in

any one year) as the Reserve or part or parts thereof may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve or part or parts thereof set apart for the purposes aforesaid.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall disfigure, damage, injure, or destroy in any way, or remove the whole or any part of any trees, shrubs, flowers, grass, or other vegetation in the Reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills or cut names on the fences, seats, or other improvements therein, or in any way damage or otherwise disfigure or injure or remove any of the gates, fences, seats, buildings, or other improvements or any survey pegs or permanent marks in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein, or do anything to cause any annoyance to any member of the public using the Reserve.

5. No person shall leave or deposit, or cause to be left or deposited, any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management.

6. No person shall put or cause to be put on the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals, save as hereinafter set out in clause 7.

7. The Committee of Management or its officers or servants may from time to time, notwithstanding any regulation herein to the contrary, issue permits, in writing, to such persons, and for such periods of time as they may deem fit, for the purposes of enabling persons to graze cattle, horses, or sheep on such portions of the Reserve, and for such periods of time, and under such conditions, and the payment of such fees as the Committee of Management may determine; such terms, conditions, times, and fees to be set out on such permit, and the number of horses, cattle, or sheep permitted to be grazed given in such permits, and the holder of such permits shall not be liable to the penalties incurred under these Regulations as regards wandering cattle, so far as the locality fixed in his permit is concerned, during the currency of such permit and the payment of fees in connexion therewith.

8. No cattle, horses, or sheep with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the Reserve.

9. No person shall depasture any bull or entire horse over the age of six months on the Reserve.

10. The Committee of Management or its officers or servants shall have full power to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.

11. Certain portions of the Reserve may be set apart by the Committee of Management for the accommodation of vehicles and horses in the care and custody of those using the same, provided that the owner or user for the time being shall tie up such horse in such a way as not to cause or permit any damage to fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, and the owner or user for the time being of any horse found wandering without restraint on any portions of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

12. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for any purpose whatsoever, or offer for sale therein any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine; such written permission shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand the production of same.

13. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any portion of the Reserve.

15. No assemblies for sports, shows, fêtes, holiday amusements, concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any purpose, or meeting of a like character, shall take place in any portion of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only subject to such terms, conditions, and the payment of such fees as the Committee of Management may determine.

16. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any sports, fêtes, picnics, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

17. The Committee of Management may provide and build such fireplaces in the Reserve as the Committee of Management think necessary, and any person lighting or using fires, or causing or permitting fires to be used on the Reserve, save in such fireplaces, except by special leave or direction of the Committee of Management, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

18. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone or any hard substance in the Reserve, and no person shall play at cricket, hockey, golf, rounders, tennis, or any other similar game, nor play football in the Reserve, except in such area or areas as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management for such purposes, and such permission may be granted subject to such fees, terms, and conditions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

19. No person, except workmen employed by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots in the Reserve which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs.

20. No person shall carry or discharge any fireworks, firearms, air guns, or other lethal weapons in any part of the Reserve.

21. No person shall bathe from the Reserve unless decently attired.

22. No person shall use or cause to be used, any bathing box, dressing shed, or boat shed for other than bathing or boating purposes.

23. No person shall use the closets or urinals, or any part of such closets or urinals, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then only use such portion of such closets and urinals as are specially constructed for such purpose.

24. A sum not exceeding One penny may be charged and taken by the Committee of Management or its officers from every person for the use of the closets in connexion with the latrines provided in the Reserve.

25. Certain portions of the Reserve may be set apart by the Committee of Management for the accommodation of vehicles and horses in the care and custody of those using the same, provided that the owner or user for the time being shall tie up such horse in such a way as not to cause any damage to fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, and the owner or user for the time being of any horse found wandering without restraint on any portions of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

26. No person or persons shall park motor cars within the Reserve excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose, and shall, on demand, pay a fee not exceeding One shilling per motor car for entrance to or use of such parking areas.

27. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Reserve, or in or on any part of any building on the Reserve.

28. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

## BOROUGH OF CARRUM.

## BY-LAW No. 12.

A By-law of the Borough of Carrum, numbered 12, and made under and by virtue of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and every other statutory power it thereunto enabling, for regulating the keeping or storage of volatile fluids in or upon any premises within the municipal district of the Borough of Carrum.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and of any and every power thereunto then authorizing, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Carrum order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 34 of the Shire of Dandenong, having operation throughout the municipal district of the Borough of Carrum, is hereby repealed.

2. That this By-law shall have operation and be in force through the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Carrum.

3. That in the construction of this By-law the words "volatile fluids" shall be construed to mean and include all or any of the following substances or fluids, namely: Petroleum, kerosene, paraffin (solid or liquid), benzene, naphtha (mineral or vegetable), gas oil (produced from gas tar), turpentine, or any other similar volatile fluid, the flash point of which, according to the "Abel-Pensky" test, is not less than 73 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. That from and after the coming into force of this By-law, no person being the occupier or having the use or control of any premises or building whatsoever within the said municipal district, shall place or cause or permit to be placed or allow to remain upon such premises or within such building, at any one time one or more of the volatile fluids specified in this By-law greater in aggregate measure than 50 gallons, unless with the consent in writing of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Carrum, and then only if such volatile fluid be stored in a receptacle of the description and in the situation hereinafter specified and unless the following conditions are complied with.

5. That no such receptacle in the said municipal district shall be used as aforesaid unless it be situated and constructed in the manner following, that is to say:—

The receptacle shall be one story only, with walls not more than 9 feet in height from the floor level, and having a floor area of not more than 100 square feet. All walls to be of brick or concrete not less than 9 inches thick. The walls to have vents cut through them, each vent to be covered on the inside with fine copper wire gauze of a mesh of 800 to the square inch or 28 to the lineal inch. The whole of the roof to be of concrete and doors to be of iron. No artificial light to be used in the building. The floor to be of cemented concrete or of bricks on edge laid and jointed in loose sand and to be sunk at least 18 inches below the ground level. The receptacle to stand not less than 30 feet from any adjoining building, and all ground with a radius of 20 feet from the centre of the receptacle to be completely cleared of all living and dead trees, undergrowth, or other vegetable matter.

6. No person shall carry any matches into such receptacle or shall smoke or ignite any material or do anything whatsoever within such receptacle or within the circle of which the 20 feet from the centre of the floor is the radius or elsewhere which would endanger such receptacle or the volatile fluids stored therein. And no person who occupies or has the use or control or management of such receptacle shall permit any person to carry any matches or smoke or ignite any material or do anything as aforesaid within such circle.

7. That such receptacle shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection and view of the Council of the said borough or the duly authorized officer of such Council.

8. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to kerbside petrol pumps and the apparatus connected therewith which have been erected pursuant to licence in that behalf duly granted under the authority of the Borough of Carrum.

9. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall for each such act or default be liable to a penalty of not more than £20 nor less than £5.
