### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor, of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to revoke in part the reservation and Crown grant of certain land in the City of Footscray permanently reserved as a site for a Mechanics' Institute and to provide for the transfer of portion to the Minister of Public Instruction and to declare portion to be a public highway and for other purposes."

"51. Every arc welding apparatus must be so designed and arranged that the power factor at the beginning of the operation of welding will be not less than 0.5, and throughout the remainder of the operation not less than 0.7."

**EXTENSION OF THE POWERS OF THE SEWER BUILDERS BOARD.**

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order extend the powers of the Sewer Builders Board so that it may fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed as labourers in connexion with the construction of main storm water drains, whether open or closed, with a capacity not less than that of a circular drain of a diameter of two feet six inches, the occupation covered by this extension being, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, of the same or similar class or character as that for which the said Sewer Builders Board was appointed.

- (a) articles made of canvas or a substitute for canvas such as—  
Sails, tents, marquees, ships' gear, wings of aeroplanes, horse rugs, cow rugs, water bags, outside blinds (except Venetian blinds), filters, mail bags, tarpaulins;
- (b) any other kind of canvas goods except those subject to the jurisdiction of any of the following Boards:—  
Agricultural Implements Board,  
Country Agricultural Implements Board,  
Boat Board,  
Carriage Board,  
Leather Goods Board, and  
Rubber Trade Board;
- (c) flags.

**EXTENSION OF THE POWERS OF THE GARDENERS BOARD.**

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order extend the powers of the Gardeners Board so that it may fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in connexion with the laying out, cultivation, or keeping in order of a private garden, the part of the trade covered by this extension being, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, of the same or similar class or character as that for which the said Gardeners Board was appointed.

PARAGRAPHS REGARDING GUARDING OF BELTS OR ROPES  
REVOKED AND REMADE.

**W**HEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, make, alter and revoke Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: And whereas it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, if the Minister has certified that any manufacture, plant, process, or labour used in factories is dangerous to life or limb generally, may make such Regulations as may be deemed necessary and reasonably practicable to decrease or prevent danger from such manufacture, plant, process, or labour: And whereas the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, who was then His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, certified that the plant named in certain certificates dated respectively the 30th day of March, 1921, and the 31st day of March, 1924, is dangerous to life or limb generally: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor, of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited as well as under all other powers by the said Acts him enabling in that behalf doth by this Order revoke the paragraphs dealing with belts or ropes in the Regulations made on the third day of March, 1926, under the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations regarding such belts or ropes, that is to say:—

REGULATION REGARDING CERTAIN DANGEROUS PLANT.—  
GUARDING MACHINERY.

## Belts or Ropes.

(8) Where in any factory belts or ropes are used for transmitting power—

- (a) No such belt or rope, when not transmitting power, shall be allowed to rest on any revolving shaft.
- (b) No such belt or rope shall be joined or mended while the machinery is in motion, unless such belt or rope is suspended on a suitable and efficient perch during the whole of the time occupied in such joining or mending.
- (c) Except as provided in paragraph (d), no such belt or rope shall be placed by hand on any revolving pulley in the power transmission line between the primary motive power and the first driven pulley of any machine. Nothing in this paragraph, however, shall prevent belts running on stepped or cone pulleys from being shifted by hand.
- (d) In flour mills and in factories where the main power transmission line and the intermediate power transmission lines consist of rope drives the provisions of paragraph (c) shall not apply during such time as the following conditions are observed:—

- (1) That no person who is not an authorized belt placer, i.e., a qualified male person over 21 years of age duly appointed in that behalf by the occupier of the flour mill or factory, shall place a belt or rope by hand on any such revolving pulley.
- (2) That there is kept printed, painted, or affixed in legible Roman characters in each department and on each floor of every flour mill or factory affected and in such a position as to be easily read by the persons employed therein, a notice setting out the name of each authorized belt placer.
- (e) A true copy of this regulation shall be kept printed, painted, or affixed in legible Roman characters in each department and on each floor of every factory affected, and in such a position as to be easily read by the persons employed therein.
- (f) Any person who contravenes any of the foregoing provisions and the occupier of the factory shall be severally guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5.

All insects belonging to the order Lepidoptera, family Xyloryctidae, commonly known as Cherry Borer Moth (*Maroga unipunctana*, Walk).

## INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS ORDERING OILS.

In ordering Oils under this schedule care must be taken by officers requiring same to ascertain for what purpose the Oil is to be applied.

Should the officer accepting delivery be not satisfied that any supplies under this schedule are satisfactory in quality and description, a sample of not less than 2 pints, properly labelled with Item No., the scheduled description, and the purpose for which the Oil is required, may be forwarded to the Tender Board for analytical and testing purposes.

Where storage capacity admits, Oils should be ordered for 6 months' or 3 months' requirements, as the case may be, so as to minimize testing charges.

To ensure economy without sacrifice of efficiency, Oil once used on bearings, &c., and no longer suitable for the purpose for which it was ordered, must, where practicable, be filtered and again used for less important lubrications. The White Lead must be finely ground in the best quality of pure linseed oil, the proportion of which must not exceed seven and one half per cent. of the weight.

The surface of the lead when exposed to the air without water on the top of the lead shall not become brittle or crumbly after seven days' exposure.

The White Lead is to be of the best quality. The process by which it is made shall be branded on the packages in which the White Lead is delivered.

1. A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under the provisions of section 197 (sub-section 6), section 222 and section 604 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 50, for—

- (a) The management of public baths and swimming pool situated in Riversdale Park, between Riversdale-road and Prospect Hill-road, Camberwell, and all buildings, furniture, fittings, appliances, and other property or effects used in connexion therewith.
- (b) Preventing damage to such baths, swimming pool, buildings, furniture, fittings, appliances, and other property used in connexion therewith, and for preserving good order and decency therein.
- (c) Fixing the hours during which such baths or swimming pool shall be available to the public and the amounts to be charged for admission thereto.
- (d) Imposing a penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. The baths and swimming pool will be open to the public from the 1st day of November in one year to the 30th day of April in the succeeding year, during the following hours:—

- On week days—6.30 a.m. to 9 p.m.
- On Sundays—7 a.m. to 12 noon.

The Council may, however, by resolution, close the baths to the public on any day or days, or at any times, should it be considered necessary to do so, and may also vary the hours during which the baths are open to the public.

2. No person shall be admitted to the baths or swimming pool until such person has first paid to the caretaker (or other person in charge) the proper fee or charge as set out in the schedule hereto, and obtained a ticket or voucher entitling such person to admission.

3. No person shall enter or use the swimming pool in an uncleanly condition nor until such person has first used one of the cleansing shower baths provided.

4. No person shall use in the swimming pool any soap or any other substance or preparation that might cause the water to become discoloured, turbid, or otherwise unfit for its proper use by bathers.

5. No person suffering from any skin disease or any infectious or contagious disease will be allowed to use any portion of the baths or enter the swimming pool, and upon being so requested by the caretaker (or other person in charge) shall immediately retire therefrom.

6. No person shall spit in the swimming pool nor on the floors or walls of any part of the baths, nor deface any portion of the buildings by cutting or writing thereon.

7. No person shall smoke whilst in any part of the baths or buildings.

8. No person shall at any time whilst being upon any portion of the premises use any indecent or improper language, or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

9. No person shall wilfully or improperly commit any nuisance, or soil, defile, injure, or destroy any towel or bathing suit or costume, or any furniture or fittings in any portion of the building, or break, or injure, or improperly interfere with any lock, cock, valve, pipe, or any machinery in connexion with the baths.

10. No person shall wilfully, carelessly, or negligently injure or destroy any towel, bathing suit, or costume, or other article supplied for use in the baths, and all towels, bathing suits or costumes supplied to persons using the baths shall be returned by such person to the caretaker (or other person in charge) before leaving the baths.

11. No person shall by forcible or improper means seek admission to any room or compartment which may be occupied or is being used by some other person.

12. No person shall remain in the baths or swimming pool for a longer period than one hour, except with the consent of the caretaker (or other person in charge).

13. No person using the baths, nor any officer, servant, or other person employed thereat shall at any time introduce or bring into the building any spirituous or intoxicating liquors, and no person shall enter or remain in the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

14. No person shall bring into or allow to remain in any portion of the buildings any dog or other animal belonging to such person or under their control.

15. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any officer, attendant, or servant who is employed at the baths whilst in the due performance of their duties whilst so employed.

16. Every person using the swimming pool shall wear an approved bathing suit or costume.

17. No officer, attendant, or servant employed at the baths shall receive from any person resorting thereto any payment for the hire or use of any article, or for any purpose whatsoever unless such officer, attendant, or servant is duly authorized on that behalf, and then only for and on behalf of the Council.

18. Any person finding anything which may have been left in any of the dressing rooms, or in any other part of the building, shall immediately after finding such article deliver the same to the caretaker (or other person in charge) who shall thereupon enter a description of same and all necessary particulars in a book kept for that purpose, and any person claiming such article, upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership, shall be entitled to have such article returned by the caretaker upon the claimant signing the book in acknowledgment of having received same.

19. The Council will not accept any responsibility for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.

20. The ordinary charges for admission to the baths shall be as follow, provided always that when the baths are in use for fêtes, galas, or other entertainments, such scale of charges will be suspended and ordinary tickets or passes will not be available for admission:—

Boys under the age of 15 years will be admitted free of charge on Wednesday in each week between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon.

Girls under the age of 15 years will be admitted free of charge on Thursday in each week between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon.

21. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) and not less than Five shillings (5s.) for each such offence.

22. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell, that is to say:—All that portion of Riversdale Park situated between Riversdale-road and Prospect Hill-road, on which is erected public baths and buildings used in connexion therewith and the curtilage thereof.

23. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

#### CITY OF KEW.

##### BY-LAW No. 56.

A By-law of the City of Kew, made under section 197, sub-section (6), section 222 and section 604 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 56, for preserving good order and decency in the Public Baths, off High-street, in the City of Kew, including any land or building used in connexion with the said baths, and preventing damage to such building or to the furniture or fittings thereof, and for the management and use of the said baths, buildings, furniture, fittings or other property or effects used in connexion therewith, and for fixing the amounts to be charged for admission to and for use of the same, or any part thereof, and for imposing a penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Kew order as follows:—

1. Every person shall, before being admitted to any bath or bathroom, pay the proper charge for such admission, and obtain by payment from the authorized money-taker a ticket authorizing the admission of such person to such bath, and such person before being admitted to use such bath, shall, upon the application of any person appointed or acting as attendant of such bath, deliver such ticket to such attendant.

2. No person shall enter or use the swimming bath without having previously used one of the cleansing shower baths erected at the baths.

3. No person in an uncleanly condition shall use the swimming bath, and no person whilst suffering from any skin, infectious, or contagious disease, shall use any portion of the baths, and any such person shall immediately retire from the baths upon being requested so to do by the caretaker or other person in charge.

4. No person shall use soap in any part of the baths other than in the cleansing shower baths provided for that purpose.

5. No person shall at any time, while being in the swimming bath, use any substance or preparation whereby the water in such swimming bath may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of bathers.

6. No person shall wilfully or improperly commit any nuisance, or foul or pollute the water in the swimming bath, or wilfully or improperly soil, defile, injure, or destroy any towel, bathing trunk, drawers, or bathing gown, or any bathroom, closet, box, compartment, or any furniture or article therein, or break or injure or improperly interfere with the efficient action of any lock, cock, valve, pipe, or any machinery in connexion with the baths.

7. No person shall, at any time carelessly or negligently injure or destroy any towel, bathing trunk, bathing gown, or other article supplied for use in the baths.

8. No person shall smoke while in any part of the baths.

9. No person shall spit in the swimming bath or on the floors or walls of any portion of the baths, or deface any wall fittings or any portion of the baths by cutting or writing thereon.

10. No person using the baths, nor any officer or servant or other person employed thereat, shall at any time introduce into the building any spirituous or intoxicating liquors, and no person shall enter or remain in the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

11. No person shall at any time while being upon any portion of the premises use any indecent or improper language, or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

12. No person shall, by forcible or improper means, seek admission to any bathroom or compartment which shall be occupied by any other person, or seek admission to any bath before any person who, by priority of payment, shall be entitled to prior admission to such bath.

13. No person shall remain in the baths for a longer period than one hour, except with the consent of the caretaker or attendant.

14. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person, or under his or her control, to enter or remain in any bath, bathroom, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment, or in any passage leading to or from any bath or bathroom.

15. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any attendant, officer, or servant employed at the baths in the performance of his duty at the baths.

16. Every person using the swimming bath must wear proper bathing trunk, or drawers, or bathing gown.

17. Every person supplied with a towel, bathing trunk, or drawers, or bathing gown, shall, before leaving the baths, return same to the attendant.

18. No bath attendant, officer, or servant employed at the baths, other than a duly authorized money-taker, shall receive from any person resorting thereto any payment for the hire or use of any articles, or for any purpose whatsoever, without the knowledge and consent of the caretaker of the baths, and then only for and on behalf of the council.

19. Any person finding anything which may have been left in any bath-room or dressing-room, or in any other part of the establishment, shall, immediately after finding such article, deliver same to the caretaker, or other person acting on his behalf, who shall thereupon register a description of the same and all particulars relating thereto in a book kept for that purpose; and any person claiming such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership, receive such article from the caretaker (or other authorized person) upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to.

20. The council shall not be held responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.

21. The hours for admission to the baths during the swimming season (commencing 1st day of November and ending 30th day of April) shall be 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. on week days, and 7 a.m. to 10 a.m. on Sundays.

22. The charges for admission to and for the use of the baths shall be as follows, provided always that when the swimming baths are in use for galas or other entertainments, such charges will be suspended, and tickets and passes will not be available for use:—

*Ladies.*—The baths will be reserved for use by females only at the above rates, on Wednesdays from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., and on Fridays from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.

#### Free Admission for Juniors.

Girls under the age of 15 years shall be admitted without charge on Wednesday in each week between the hours of 4 p.m. and 6 p.m.

Boys under the age of 15 years shall be admitted without charge on Friday in each week between the hours of 3 p.m. and 5 p.m.

23. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default, contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for each offence.

24. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of that part of the municipal district wherein are erected the Public Baths, and buildings used in connexion therewith, situated off High-street.

#### BOROUGH OF CARRUM.

##### BY-LAW No. 15.

##### Fencing By-law.

A By-law of the Borough of Carrum, No. 15, made under section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921* (number 3167), for requiring vacant land within certain areas as specified hereunder within the municipal district to be enclosed with a substantial fence.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Carrum order as follows:—

1. The areas within the municipal district herein specified shall be and are hereby declared to be populous or residential areas, that is to say, all land situate within the Borough of Carrum.

2. Any person being the owner or occupier of any land within the municipal district of the Borough of Carrum shall, upon notice signed by the Town Clerk or some other duly appointed officer of the Council of the said Borough in that behalf, cause or have such land enclosed with a substantial fence.

3. Any person being the owner or occupier as aforesaid not complying with the requirements of the notice mentioned in paragraph two hereof within twenty-eight days from the date of the service on any such person as aforesaid shall be guilty of wilful default contrary to this By-law and liable as hereinafter mentioned.

4. Any person being the owner or occupier of such vacant land as aforesaid situate within the municipal district of the Borough of Carrum for wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable upon conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and not less than Five pounds.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Carrum.

6. Service of any notice prescribed by this By-law may be effected either personally or by leaving the same with some person an inmate apparently not less than sixteen years of age residing at the abode or dwelling of the person to be served or by sending such notice in a prepaid registered letter addressed to the person being such owner or occupier as aforesaid at his last or most usual known place of abode.

7. (1) Fence shall mean and include—

(a) A substantial wire fence at least three feet six inches in height, having wires tightly stretched with no greater distance between each of the three lowest wires or the bottom wire and the ground than seven inches and the posts or standards or binding wires of which are not more than eleven feet from each other, with straining posts not more than one hundred yards apart.

(b) A substantial paling or picket fence at least three feet six inches in height with no greater distance between the palings or pickets than four inches.

(c) A bank or wall of substantial materials at least four feet in height and not less than two feet wide at the bottom and nine inches at the top.

(d) A close hedge or live fence at least four feet six inches in height, capable of resisting the trespass of cattle.

(e) A combination of any of the above-mentioned fences at least four feet in height.

(f) A fence commonly known as a cyclone fence.

7. (2) Town Clerk shall mean the Town Clerk for the time being of the Borough of Carrum.

## SHIRE OF BROADFORD.

## BY-LAW No. 12.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919* and of any other power thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Broadford, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the Township of Broadford.

4. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the Township of Broadford, being part of the Shire of Broadford, shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent materials, and each receptacle not to exceed 56 pounds in weight when filled, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.

5. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

6. Once a week, on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance of such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council.

7. No person shall place, or cause to be placed, any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

8. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5).

Passed by the Council of the Shire of Broadford on the 9th day of March, 1927, and confirmed by the said Council on the 13th day of April, 1927.

4. Such manure pit shall be provided with a suitable lid or cover and shall be kept constantly covered, except when manure is being deposited therein or removed therefrom.

5. The proprietor of every stable shall from time to time deposit, or cause to be deposited, in such manure pit all manure produced on the premises.

6. Every stable shall have the floor constructed of an impervious material, properly graded and drained.

7. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and to a penalty not exceeding One pound (£1) sterling for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

If in the opinion of the Council the removal of a poultry yard, any part of which is within twenty-five (25) feet of a dwelling-house be possible and be necessary for the health of any of the residents in the vicinity, the Council may order the owner or occupier of the premises of which such poultry yard forms part to remove or alter it so that no part thereof shall be within twenty-five (25) feet of any dwelling-house.

3. All poultry shall be kept in a secure enclosure.

4. Every person who shall disobey such an order of the Council, or shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every such breach, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) and not less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day during which breach shall be committed or continued.

1. All former By-laws made by the Council of the Shire of Broadford so far as they relate to the matter and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the Township of Broadford being part of the Shire of Broadford, and unless exempted by the Council, shall apply to every house, building, or premises therein.
4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
5. The Council shall cause every closet to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto an appliance or apparatus which, when closed, effectually covers the seat of such closet or privy, whereby disinfectant and deodorizing fluid is automatically discharged into the pan in such closet or privy.
7. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in such appliance or apparatus a supply of disinfecting and deodorizing fluid efficient for disinfecting and deodorizing the contents of such pan.
8. The occupier aforesaid or the person having the control or management of the premises shall from time to time after the said closet or privy has been used close or cause to be closed the said appliance or apparatus, and keep such appliance or apparatus closed on the seat of such closet or privy.
9. The Council shall at least once in every week cause the pan in use to be closed with a tight fitting lid, and removed with its contents from the premises at the said time and another pan to be left in its place.
10. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause same to be properly cleansed and tar-painted inside, or treated by some other equally efficient means.
11. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
12. The Council shall have the power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of the night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.
13. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or it shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5).
