FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1928 for Free Places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne. The number of officers that may be nominated is five.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these Free Places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his Free Place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his Free Place, and, if his Free Place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his Free Place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the Free Place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, and progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

Forms of application are obtainable at this office. Each application must be made in the prescribed form, and must be forwarded through the Permanent Head of the Department in which the applicant is employed, to the Secretary, Education Department, Melbourne, not later than 1st December, 1927.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in the exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law, viz:—

BY-LAW No. 33.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1928 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

I. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds or under, the sum of Two pounds per annum.

II. For every house or tenement above Sixteen pounds and not more than Twenty-six pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings and ninepence in the pound according to such value.

III. For every house or tenement above Twenty-six pounds and not more than Thirty-six pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound according to such value.

IV. For every house or tenement of Thirty-six pounds and upwards annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.

V. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of Five shillings per thousand gallons shall be paid.

That the above rates and charges shall be paid half-yearly in advance, first payment on the first day of January, 1928, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1928.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

ROMSEY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

A BY-LAW of the Romsey Waterworks Trust, made under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Romsey Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Romsey in which such lands and tenements are situated for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1928, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1928.

The rate hereby made shall be payable and collected in two portions or instalments of One shilling each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on 2nd January, 1928, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on 2nd July, 1928.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Romsey Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover all rates and charges due to the said Trust.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW NO 1 FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. A rate of One shilling and eightpence in the pound shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust District according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid in respect of each tenement shall be One pound. For all vacant allotments not supplied with water the minimum rate shall be Ten shillings.

2. Such rate is made for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1928, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1928, and shall be payable on one instalment, in advance, on the first day of January, 1928.

3. The municipal value for the time being of the lands and tenements within the said district within the municipal district of the Shire of Rodney, in which such lands and tenements are situated, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of making and levying such rates.

4. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

UPPER MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situated, the minimum rate to be Twenty shillings.

2. Water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes during January, February, March, November, December, shall be charged for by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons. The maximum quantity allowed each ratepayer shall be 100,000 gallons. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at One shilling and sixpence every 1,000 gallons.

3. The above rate is for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1928, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1928, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the 1st April and on the 1st October, 1928. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rate and charges.

YACKANDANDAH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Yackandandah Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law, viz:—

I. *General Rate.*—A rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year 1928 upon all property liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Trust; and such rate shall be based on the municipal valuation of such property by the Shire of Yackandandah in existence on the first day of January, 1928.

II. *Minimum Rate.*—The minimum rate payable on any property on which is erected any dwelling-house, shop, office, factory, stable, or other building shall be Forty-two shillings and sixpence. The minimum rate on any other rateable property whatsoever shall be Forty-two shillings and sixpence.

III. *Sale of Water by Agreement.*—The Trust may, in case where deemed necessary, supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.

IV. *When Payable.*—The foregoing rates shall be due and payable in half-yearly moieties, in advance, that is to say, on the first day of January, 1928, and the first day of July, 1928.

M. Clune, or such person or persons as may from time to time be employed by the Trust for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the rates hereby made.

YARRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Yarram Waterworks Trust do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1928 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Yarram Waterworks Trust, also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Alberton; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound ten shillings.

2. A rate of Fifteen shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. For the water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence for 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rates payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

5. The foregoing rate is made payable on the 1st day of April, 1928.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE STORAGE OF PETROLEUM,
ETC.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third
day of November, 1927.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.
Mr. Lemmon Mr. Webber.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Local Government Act 1921 (No. 3167) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations applicable to the whole of Victoria, or to such municipal districts (including the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong) as are specified therein for or with respect to regulating the keeping and storage of petroleum, or any product of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable liquids, and carbide or other combustible substances: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, and doth provide that the said Regulations shall apply and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Box Hill; and furthermore that such Regulations shall be deemed to be in substitution of any By-law or By-laws made by the said Council of the said municipality for the purpose for which these Regulations are now made, and shall take effect from the first day of November, 1927.

REGULATIONS.

Storage of More than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or More than
250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

1. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all buildings shall be first approved by the Council.
- (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick, concrete, iron, or other non-inflammable material except that in the case of a galvanized iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.
- (3) The floor of such buildings shall be made of earth, concrete, or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.
- (4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls to be without break or opening, the capacity of such enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored, or retained in any such buildings.

Storage of Less than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or Less than
250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

2. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of metal or other approved material including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits stairways or adjoining premises except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.

- (2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass, earthenware, or metal, and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, stairways, or adjoining premises.

Precaution to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in
Bulk Containers.

3. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

Precautions to be Observed in Buildings.

4. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test he shall observe the following precautions against fire:—

- (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and to be under the supervision of the Country Fire Brigade where practicable.
- (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry sand, shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
- (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the premises.
- (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

Containers to be Labelled for Retail Sale.

5. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers on premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire fighting appliances as mentioned in the preceding section and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—"Highly inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away."

Regulations not to Apply to Storage of Alcoholic Spirits.

6. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits.

Conditions to be Observed in the Construction of Tanks.

7. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.
- (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.
- (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank but such opening shall contain a liquid tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.

Portable Filling Tank.

8. Every person who shall have in or upon any building or premises any portable filling tank shall comply with the following requirements:—

No. portable filling tank shall exceed 50 gallons capacity, and shall be—

- (a) constructed of number 12 gauge galvanized steel or of iron not less than three-sixteenths of an inch in thickness, and oxy-acetylene welded or riveted with rivets not more than one inch apart measured from centre to centre;
- (b) mounted on all-metal wheels with rubber tires;
- (c) soldered and painted on the outside;
- (d) fitted with an approved pump for the removal of its contents.

Every such portable filling tank may be filled and refilled at the kerb line of the footpath by means of a pipe connexion from a similar approved tank, and in no other manner whatsoever, and its contents may be removed by means of such approved pump, and in no other manner whatsoever.

Every person who shall have in or upon any building or premises any such approved portable filling tank in which any such volatile fluid is being kept or stored, shall observe the following precautions against fire:—

- (a) One 2-gallon approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position in relation to the portable filling tank as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
- (b) At least four iron buckets filled with dry sand shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
- (c) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor, and shall, after being so used, be forthwith removed from the premises.
- (d) The use of sawdust for absorbing oils or petrol is prohibited.
- (e) The approved portable filling tank shall be at all times kept near a door leading into the street, and so as to be readily removable from the premises in the event of fire.

Power to Enter and Inspect.

9. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.

Offence.

10. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty.

11. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

Exemptions may be Made by the Council.

The Council may, if it considers reasonable care will be observed, exempt from any one or more of these Regulations inflammable liquids when kept for private use, provided the store is exclusively used for inflammable liquids, and not less than 50 feet intervene between the store and other buildings or an adjoining property boundary.

NOTE.—Private use does not include inflammable liquids kept for sale or for purely business activities.

Definitions.

In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, "approved" means, approved in writing by the engineer for the time being of the said City of Box Hill or any deputy appointed by the said Council of the said municipality to act for him. "Council" means the Council of the said municipality. "Person" includes firm, corporation, or company; and "volatile fluid" includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Methylated spirits, benzine, petrol, naphtha, or any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test.

And the Honorable John Percy Jones, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. No person shall build, erect, or construct, or cause or permit to be built, erected, or constructed, any building the external walls of which are of other materials than stone, brick, or concrete, on land within the area specified in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

SHIRE OF WARANGA.

BY-LAW 1/27.

A By-law of the Shire of Waranga (hereinafter referred to as the municipality) made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 1/27, for the purpose of carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in the said section as follows:—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection of buildings and erections.
- (b) For the requiring the pulling down of buildings and erections.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings or erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) For regulating and restraining the erection of removed buildings.
- (e) For appointing any fees to be charged and received by the Council of the municipality for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- (f) For other powers in connexion with the foregoing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Council of the municipality doth order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole of the areas set out in the first schedule hereto.

2. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Part 1.—Definitions.

In this By-law, save where the context is inconsistent therewith, "Alteration" means any change or construction in the plan of a building or erection, or any change in the purpose for which any building or erection or any part thereof shall be used.

"Approved" means approved by the surveyor subject to review by the council or approved by the council.

"Council" means the council of the municipality.

"External wall" means an outer wall or vertical enclosure of any building not being a party wall.

"Dwelling house" means a building used or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

"Foundation" applied to a wall having footings means the solid ground or artificially formed support, on which the footings of the wall rest.

"Lane" or "right-of-way" means a street, road, or passage less than 33 feet wide.

"Main rooms" shall be deemed to mean and include all rooms used or which in the opinion of the council or surveyor shall be intended to be used as bedrooms, diningrooms, or ordinary living rooms, including kitchens.

"Natural surface" means the mean level of the ground as determined by the surveyor.

"New building" includes (a) any building erected or commenced to be erected after the date of this By-law coming into operation; (b) any building which for more than half of its cubical contents has been pulled down or destroyed by fire or tempest or otherwise, and if re-erected or commenced to be erected; (c) any space between walls and buildings which is roofed or commenced to be roofed after the date of this By-law coming into operation.

"Shop" means a building in which or in part of which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale, or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payments, and also includes saloons or shops of barbers and hairdressers, and offices of agents and auctioneers. A bona fide private boardinghouse shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied for payment to persons other than boarders.

"Square" applied to the measurement of any area means the space of 100 square feet.

"Street" or "road" means and includes street and road and private street and private road as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 3.

"Surveyor" means the building surveyor or acting building surveyor for the time being of the municipality or other officer having for the time being the administration of this By-law.

Part 2.—Minimum Area and Width of Frontage for Dwellings and Shops.

1. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling house only except in conformity with the following:—

2. The site or curtilage of such dwelling house shall have a superficial area of at least 5,000 feet, and have a frontage of not less than 50 feet to a street or road, and that except

in the case of corner sites the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site.

3. The dwelling house or other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any corner site or curtilage fronting to two streets or roads shall cover not more than one-third of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

4. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection which shall be, or be intended in the opinion of the council or surveyor to be used as a shop or shop and dwelling unless the site or curtilage of such building has a superficial area of not less than 1,584 square feet, and has a frontage to a street or road of not less than 16 lineal feet, and has a depth of not less than 99 feet.

Part 3.—Plans, Fees, Permit, Duties of Surveyor, &c.

1. No person shall commence or cause to be commenced any buildings or erections, or any alteration or addition to any building or erection, or remove or cause to be removed any building or erection without first having paid to the council the necessary fees in accordance with the scale set out in the schedule hereto. The decision of the surveyor, subject to review by the council as to the area of a new building or the value of an addition, shall be final and conclusive.

2. No person shall erect or construct, remove, or make any alteration or addition to or to be erected, built, or constructed or removed, or make any alteration or addition to any building or erection without first obtaining written permission from the council so to do, or without first submitting to the council or its surveyor the plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection, alteration, or addition, together with such further particulars, in writing, regarding the same as shall be necessary to enable the council or its surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law applicable thereto are being complied with.

3. A copy or tracing of the plan showing ground plan of building and boundaries of the land and position of buildings thereon, shall be left with the council for its own use. A written permission obtained pursuant to clause 2 of this part shall expire after twelve months from its grant unless extended by resolution of the council.

4. The surveyor shall, upon receipt of such plans as aforesaid, and also upon any work being observed by or made known to him which is affected by the provisions of this By-law, but in respect of which no plans have been submitted from time to time during the progress of any work affected by such provisions as often as may be necessary for securing the due observance of such provisions, survey any such building, structure, erection, or work, and cause all such provisions to be duly observed.

5. The surveyor at all reasonable times before or after the completion of any building, structure, erection, or work effected by any of the provisions of this By-law, or by any terms or conditions on which the observance of any such provisions may have been dispensed with, may enter and inspect such building, structure or work.

6. The surveyor may for the purpose of ascertaining whether any building, structure, or erection is in such a situation or possesses such characteristics as are required in order to exempt it from the operations of any of the provisions of this By-law, at all reasonable times enter any premises, and do therein all such things as are reasonably necessary for that purpose.

Part 4.—General Provisions as to Buildings.

1. No person shall erect, build, or construct, remove, or make any alteration or addition to, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, removed, or made any alteration or addition to any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

2. No building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling house, and no addition to any building shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of fifteen feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to, or shall front, or nearer than twenty feet to the back boundary line of the allotment on which it stands.

3. Except as hereinafter provided no building with an external wall of wood which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling house, and no addition with an external wall of wood to any building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling house, shall be built, constructed, or erected—

- (a) Within a distance of five feet measured horizontally of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of any such building.
- (b) Within a distance of five feet measured horizontally of land not in the same possession or occupation.
- (c) Within a distance of ten feet measured horizontally of another building or erection with an external wall of wood.

4. Provided that any such building or addition may abut on the building line of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of such building, or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom, or from land not in the same possession or occupation, or from a building or erection with an external wall of wood used or intended to be used wholly

or partially as a dwelling; provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance, such street, road, lane, or right-of-way land not in the same possession or occupation, or building or erection as the case may be, shall be of concrete of approved thickness, or of brick or stone or concrete at least 8½ inches in thickness projecting in all cases at least 1 inch beyond the wood work front, and back at least 1 foot through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same.

5. The roof of every building or erection shall be covered on the outside with incombustible coverings.

6. Stables, coach houses, and outbuildings shall be subject to the like conditions as are hereinbefore imposed in regard to dwelling houses by the last two preceding clauses, except that clause 3 shall not apply to them, as it relates to distance from any lane or right-of-way. No stable shall be erected or placed within a distance of fifty feet measured horizontally from any dwelling house.

7. Main rooms, ventilation, and windows—

(a) The main rooms in every building hereafter built or rebuilt shall be in every part not less than 10 feet from floor to ceiling.

(b) Provided that in case of buildings of more than one story hereafter built or rebuilt, living rooms wholly or partially in the roof may be less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling throughout not more than two-thirds of the area.

(c) No main rooms shall have less floor area than 100 square feet.

(d) Every main room in a dwelling house shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air with a total superficies of glass clear of sash frames free from obstruction to light equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room, and so constructed that a substantial part of the windows equal to at least one-twentieth of the floor area can be opened for ventilation. The requirements of this sub-clause may under special circumstances be dispensed with or modified by the council or the surveyor subject to review by the council, but in cases, other approved provision for lighting or ventilation may be made.

(e) The provisions of this clause in reference to the height, lighting, and ventilation of main rooms in dwellings shall as far as applicable be extended to all shops save that windows need not be constructed so as to open if other approved provisions for ventilation be made.

8. Materials, foundations, &c.—

(a) The exposed faces of interior walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used as a dwelling house, or shall be used as a dwelling house, shall be constructed of lath and plaster or approved wood or fire-resisting materials.

(b) The foundations or footings of buildings other than wood shall be not less in width than eight inches wider than the wall standing thereon, and shall be not less in depth than an average of eighteen inches below the natural surface of the ground.

(c) Bricks used in any buildings shall be good, hard, and well burnt, and if old shall be thoroughly cleaned before being used.

(d) All timbers used in any buildings shall be of good sound material free from rot, large and loose knots, shakes, or any imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

(e) The following conditions shall apply as to spacings and scantlings of timber:—

(1) Stamps shall be not less than 4 inches by 4 inches red gum, jarrah, or other approved timber spaced to 4 feet centres, and fixed on 6-in. by 6-in. by 1½-in. sole plates.

(2) Studs and ceilings joists shall be not less than 4 inches by 1½ inches, spaced not more than 18 inches apart, centre to centre, and properly spaced.

(3) Rafters shall be not less than 4 inches by 1½ inches, spaced 3 feet centre to centre in the case of iron roofs, and 18 inches centre to centre in case of slate, tile, or other similar roofs securely braced with purlins and collar ties.

(4) Floor joists shall not be less than 4 inches by 2 inches, spaced 18 inches apart centre to centre on 4-in. by 3-in. bearers spaced 6 feet apart.

(f) Floors to be fixed level, and in all buildings to be in no part less than 9 inches over the surface of the ground.

(g) The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

(h) Every wall of brick or stone shall have an approved damp course or courses of asphalt or other impervious material above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor, and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level, then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the ends by a vertical course of the same materials.

(i) Chimneys must be of concrete of approved thickness or of brick or stone at least eight and a half inches in thickness from the hearth up to the height of twelve inches above the mantel. Every chimney shaft or smoke flue shall be carried up in brick at least four and a half inches thick throughout to a height of not less than three feet above the roof flat or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the highest point in the line of junction with such roof flat or gutter. The jambs of every fire-place opening shall be at least eight and a half inches wide on each side of the opening thereof.

(j) The surveyor shall have the power to condemn and to order the removal of, or to remove at the expense of the owner, any material which in his opinion is not suitable for the purpose for which it is intended to use the same, and no person shall use any material so condemned for any building, alteration, or addition.

9. No building shall be erected in such a position that it shall be between another building or any part thereof, and a street unless such other building has a direct and unobstructed access to some other street of at least 33 feet wide.

10. Two but not more buildings or houses may be erected together in one block provided that they shall be separated from each other by a wall of concrete of approved thickness, or of brick or stone at least eight and a half inches in thickness projecting in the case of wooden houses at least one inch through the woodwork front and back, and in all cases (unless otherwise approved by the council) projecting at least one foot through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same whether belonging to the same owner or not. Each building or dwelling house in a block shall be subject to the provisions of this By-law.

11. No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any portico or verandah over the footway of any streets without first obtaining the consent of the council in writing, and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, figure, and dimensions and materials as set forth in the plan and specifications for the time being adopted by resolution of the council, but the lowest part of which portico or verandah shall in no case be less than nine feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway. No opening shall be made in the roof of such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such opening be properly framed and glazed with approved glass protected underneath with fine mesh wire netting or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the surveyor.

12. No fowl house or building designed for the use of poultry shall be erected or allowed to remain at a less distance than fifty feet from any building used or intended for a dwelling. No building of the description referred to in this clause shall be erected except to the rear of any dwelling house on the same allotment.

13. No privy, closet, or urinal shall be erected or allowed to remain at a less distance than 40 feet from the door or window of any dwelling house, and no such privy, closet, or urinal shall be erected at a less distance than nine feet from any street except than in case there is a right-of-way abutting on such allotment the privy, closet, or urinal may be erected on the boundary between such allotment and the right-of-way. Each privy, closet, or urinal shall be effectively screened from public view, and shall be constructed in such manner as shall be approved.

14. Proper provision shall be made and maintained for effectively removing storm water and sanitary drainage from every building.

15. For the purpose of computing distances from any building the furthest outside edge of the verandah eaves or any other projection shall be taken as the point from which measurements are to be taken.

16. No dwelling house shall consist of less than three main rooms, and no buildings or rooms thereof shall be occupied until at least two main rooms shall have been completed according to plans and specifications submitted to and approved by the Council.

Fences.

17. Within the area deferred in Schedule I, all blocks upon which a dwelling house or shop is erected shall be enclosed with a substantial fence, such fence to be at least five feet high, and shall be constructed in such manner as shall be approved.

18. No building or erection shall be removed into the portion of the municipality affected by this By-law unless the owner or person carrying out the removal first obtain written permission from the council so to do, and shall in

applying for such permission give to the council or the surveyor not less than ten clear days' notice, in writing, of his desire to remove and re-erect such buildings, and shall accompanying such notice supply the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) The situation and plan of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building, showing the proposed position thereon, and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the council.
- (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the buildings and proposed alterations or additions thereto, and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the council.
- (d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building, and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is re-erected.
- (e) Satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation.
- (f) Such further particulars, in writing, regarding the same as shall be necessary to enable the council or its surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law of the municipality applicable thereto are or will be complied with.

19. No building or erection that has been condemned as unfit for human habitation, dilapidated, or insanitary shall be removed or re-erected within the municipality.

20. No building or erection in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months shall be removed or re-erected within the municipality unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner approved by the council.

21. Every building or erection to be adapted to be used as a dwelling house which shall be removed and re-erected within the portion of the municipality affected by this By-law shall, when completed, comply with all the provisions of this By-law in the same manner as if it were a building or erection originally built, constructed, or erected in the part of the municipality to which it is removed and re-erected. Such building shall be properly framed, and all timber and material which, in the opinion of the surveyor is unsound or defective, shall be removed and replaced with sound material.

22. No removed building shall be occupied until the surveyor shall have certified, in writing, that all the provisions of this By-law have been observed and complied with in respect of such building.

23. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands, provided that in its altered position it shall comply with this By-law, and that in the progress of such removal the building be not taken on to any street, road, or public place.

24. If the surveyor shall certify to the council that any building or erection has been removed into or erected within the area affected by the By-law, or occupied contrary to the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owner of such building, erection, or structure upon receiving from the council or any officer thereof a notice, in writing, requiring such owner to alter, repair, or pull down such building, erection, or structure within such time as is limited by such notice, shall comply with such notice within the time therein limited.

25. If any building or erection shall be wholly or partly built or erected, added to or altered contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the council or any officer thereof, or other authorized agent may give to the owner or builder or leave upon the site of such building fourteen days notice, in writing, to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building or erection.

26. If default be made in complying with any notice mentioned in the last two preceding clauses then, notwithstanding the imposition or recovering of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said council, by its surveyor, officer, or other authorized agent to enter upon any building, erection, or structure, and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and for that purpose, to break any fence surrounding the land on which such building, erection or structure is situated, and to demolish and pull down the said building, erection, or structure, or any parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the council, in its discretion, thinks fit to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit, and all the expenses incurred by the council, its officer, surveyor, or other authorized agent in demolishing and pulling down the said building, erection, or structure, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due to the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the council shall restore the surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner or builder, or to such other person legally entitled thereto on demand.

27. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, fernery, aviary, or to outbuildings which outbuildings are on an area of not less than five acres used for agricultural or similar purposes only or to temporary and removable offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding twelve months.

28. Any building which shall be re-erected or commenced to be erected wholly or partially shall be subject to this By-law to the same extent as if it were a new building.

29. This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the State of Victoria, or of the municipality.

30. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound, and not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is a continuing one to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

31. Any matter or thing arising under this By-law may be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the council by resolution either generally or for any class or cases, or in any particular case.
