MAURITIUS DECLARED A RECIPROCATING STATE
WITHIN THE MEANING OF ACT No. 3397.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of Mauritius (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the *Imperial Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1920* extends) for the enforcement within such part of Maintenance Orders made by Courts within Victoria, do now, under the powers conferred by section 12 of an Act of the Victorian Parliament intitled the *Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1925*, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare Mauritius to be a reciprocating State within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act last referred to.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the seventeenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1927.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 45 fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the first day of January, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1927.

The rates and charges shall be payable by the occupiers and owners of the lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District who are supplied with water by the Trust, as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being a hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of £20 or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being a hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £20 and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being a hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of £30 or under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of £30, the sum of £6 per cent. on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands and lands on which there is no tenement erected nor water laid on, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings. Should the water be laid on the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this By-law for tenements.

7. On every livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each six feet to be considered one stall.

8. Water supplied by meter is to be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand (1,000) gallons, except to manufacturers, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the cost will be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied by meter separate from house connexions for irrigation for gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering, or should the Trust require a meter to be put on the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. The rates and charges shall be payable in one instalment in advance, on the first day of January, except in cases where the Trust has made special agreement regarding the time of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, or recover such rates or charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity at which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water was supplied other than by measure.

16. For a garden licence issued to occupiers of tenements under clause 1, rated at under £20 per annum, the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum, payable on 1st January. Water used under a garden licence to be used during daylight and through a hose held in the hand.

DIVISION 14 OF PART V. WITH REGARD TO COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING MADE APPLICABLE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS OF COUNCILLORS OF THE SHIRE OF SEYMOUR UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 148 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1915 (No. 2686) AS AMENDED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1918 (No. 2981).

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Seymour, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate, and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to Ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
 - seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
 - add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—
 (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
 (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
 (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the Shire of Seymour of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

DECLARATION OF A DEVIATION FROM THE UPPER TAMBO-ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF TAMBO.

WHEREAS by section 58 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) as amended by section 16 of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Acts has by Resolution declared a deviation to be a developmental road the said Board may also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of any existing road or part thereof named in such Resolution and that on publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order confirming such Resolution the existing road or part thereof shall cease to be a developmental road or be discontinued as provided in the Resolution: And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such Resolution to be a developmental road and has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule to such Resolution and that such part of the existing road as is described in the Third Schedule to such Resolution shall be closed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

Public Service Act 1915 and Teachers Act 1925.

REGULATION ADDED.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of section 149 of the *Public Service Act 1915* and section 44 of the *Teachers Act 1925*, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations under the aforesaid Acts, that is to say:—

REGULATION XII. (K)—SPECIAL COURSE OF TRAINING FOR TEACHERS IN MANUAL ARTS SUBJECTS.

1. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, award studentships during 1927 in a special course of training, to be conducted at such centre or centres in Melbourne as may be determined, for persons desirous of qualifying as teachers of manual arts subjects.

2. These studentships shall carry with them the salary, to which the holders would be entitled as teachers or junior teachers in State schools, and shall be awarded under the following conditions:—

- Applicants shall be either Fifth Class male teachers or First Grade junior teachers of at least one year's standing in the service of the Education Department, and shall be not less than eighteen years of age on the date of commencement of the course.
- They shall have passed the School Leaving examination or some higher examination of the University of Melbourne, or shall hold an approved equivalent qualification.
- They shall produce satisfactory evidence of having undergone sufficient preliminary preparation in manual arts subjects to enable them to enter on the course.
- They shall furnish satisfactory evidence of sound bodily health and of freedom from defects likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.
- They shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

3. The course of training shall be of about six months' duration, and shall include such subjects and work as the Director may determine.

4. Upon successfully completing the course of training, those students who, immediately prior to entering upon the course, were Fifth Class teachers, shall be transferred to positions as teachers in woodwork centres at the same salary as they were then receiving, whilst those who, immediately prior to entering upon the course, were First Grade junior teachers, shall, if qualified, be appointed as Fifth Class teachers in woodwork centres at the minimum salary of the Fifth Class in the Primary Schools Division.

5. Every person awarded a studentship shall be required, as a condition of such studentship, to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety that he will observe the conditions of tenure of his studentship, that he will not relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and that for the three years next after the termination of his studentship he will teach in any school to which he may be appointed by the Minister.

6. Students shall be required to attend such lectures, courses of instruction, discussion lessons, practical work, and teaching practice as may be prescribed.

7. The Minister may require the withdrawal of any student who shows unsuitability for the course, or who fails to make satisfactory progress, or who is guilty of misconduct or of idleness.

(2) In the following cases notice of the change shall be given by notice in the *Commonwealth Gazette* and the *Victoria Government Gazette* and in some newspaper circulating in the part affected—

- when a subdivision is abolished and all electors whose names are on the roll for that subdivision are changed to another subdivision roll; or
- when by reason of the alteration of the boundaries of a Division, or of an Assembly District, any subdivision is changed from one Division or Assembly District to another Division or Assembly District, and all the names of electors which are on the subdivision roll for the first-mentioned Division or Assembly District are changed to a subdivision roll for the last-mentioned Division or Assembly District; or
- when in consequence of a proclamation for the preparation of new rolls or action thereunder (other than action by an elector), the enrolment of any electors is changed to a subdivision or Division or Assembly District which differs in name from the subdivision or Division or Assembly District for which they were enrolled prior to the proclamation, and in the opinion of the Officers charged with the preparation of the new rolls a reasonably effective notice, generally applicable to all electors in a subdivision whose enrolments have been changed, can be so given.

(3) In any case to which the last preceding sub-regulation does not apply, notice of the change shall be sent by post to each elector concerned, and may be in accordance with Form 10.

SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN ORDERED.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922 (No. 3195)* it is enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land from time to time to destroy all vermin on any land occupied or owned by him and on the adjacent half-width of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and to keep such land and half-width of roads clear and free of all vermin and for such purpose to do all necessary or proper acts or things: **Provided** that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert cutting embankment channel drain or work or any stone gravel wood or material

deposited on the road to be used in the construction or maintenance thereof is a harbour or cover for vermin it shall be the duty of the council of the municipality in the municipal district of which such harbour or cover is situate to destroy all vermin therein and to keep the same clear and free of all vermin.

And whereas by section 12 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* specify a day on from and after which any duty specified in the next preceding section shall in the whole or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land within the whole or such part of Victoria (as the case may be):

REGULATION OF TRACTION ENGINE AND MOTOR TRACTOR TRAFFIC.

A By-law of the Shire of Orbost, made under sub-section 30 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 30, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines, motor tractors, or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Orbost order as follows:—

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No persons shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine, motor tractor or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

- (a) Any traction engine or motor tractor used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine or tractor consist only of bars at least two inches in width and not more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness and extending to but not beyond the full width of the tyre and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or
- (b) Any traction engine, motor tractor or other vehicle the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than two inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness and extending to but not beyond the full width of the tyre and the space intervening between such bars not exceeding five inches provided in such last-mentioned case—

(1) That the owner of such engine, motor tractor or other vehicle has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used and that the engine, motor tractor or other vehicle is being used on one of the highways so specified.

(2) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge or culvert by such engine or tractor or any vehicle drawn by it.

(3) That such engine, motor tractor, or other vehicle is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles.

(4) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine or tractor does not exceed two tons each on each of two vehicles or three tons on one vehicle including the weight of such vehicle unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer duly authorized by the Council in that behalf a greater weight than that herein specified is allowed for any particular vehicle.

(5) That the load carried by any such motor tractor or other vehicle shall not exceed two tons unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer duly authorized by the Council in that behalf a greater weight than two tons is allowed for any such motor tractor or other vehicle.

Any person shall, for any breach of this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding £3.
 - (b) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding £10.
